Dear Resident,

The Town of Oyster Bay is truly fortunate to have among its more than 290,000 residents men and women who reach out and give of themselves as volunteer firefighters and auxiliary police officers. These selfless individuals are an important line of defense in an emergency. And, while these volunteers are an elite and well-trained group, there is always a need to replenish their ranks with fresh recruits.

If you are 18 years of age or older and love a challenge, the fire service or auxiliary police force may be perfect for you. There is no greater feeling than helping your neighbors in their time of need. Volunteering gives individuals a sense of community and of belonging.

The Town of Oyster Bay is protected by 18 volunteer fire departments and fire companies. The phone numbers of all the local departments are included in this brochure. These organizations train all volunteers to provide professional service to everyone in the community. The Nassau County Fire Service Academy trains firefighters to a nationally recognized level. The Nassau County EMS, through New York State, also provides medical training to individuals interested in becoming Emergency Medical Technicians and Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians.

Auxiliary police officers also receive comprehensive training through a 19-session basic training course administered at the Nassau County Police Academy. Recruits are soon in the field, assisting with special events, directing traffic and helping reduce criminal activity by being the 'eyes and ears' of the police department.

To inquire about becoming a volunteer firefighter, contact your local fire department and arrange to meet with officers, tour the department and receive a brief overview of what will be expected of you as a member. It could be one of the most rewarding things you will ever do.

Interested individuals can obtain more information about the volunteer fire service by calling 1-800-FIRELINE. A volunteer will contact you.
