We have to adhere to New York state law as well as the town codes on how to get a resolution here. So while it may seem as though it's moving quickly -- no one came to the board meeting to be heard on any of these resolutions, we interpret that as the residents are very, very happy in the way we're running government, and there's enormous trust, and they see the product out there and the quality of the services -- but there is a long process by when a proposal is

We vote each year on the budget at a hearing; we do a morning hearing and a night hearing so people can come. It's the year before, it's done in October for the following year. And then when we do each expenditure that we already passed in the budget, we put it up for a hearing again at a town board meeting within certain parameters, so we can listen to the public a second time on expenditures of their tax dollars.

We've also gone seven years in a row -- we cut taxes in our 2018 budget. Seven years in a row without raising taxes during the most dramatic, the largest increase in inflation, meaning the cost of all the services: The gasoline, the healthcare, all the different things we provide. It goes up and up and up. And yet we have held the line and frozen taxes for seven years in a row, and we continue to do that. We're very proud of that record.
