A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 233 – TRAFFIC, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY.

Be it enacted by the TOWN BOARD of THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY as follows:

Section 1. Amend Chapter 233 – Traffic, of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay, as follows:

§233-2 Penalty for violation of chapter.

By Resolution No. 192-2019, adopted on March 21, 2019, (attached), the Town Board authorized the Supervisor to enter into a license agreement ("Agreement") with ISLAND TIME-1 OCEAN PKWY LLC, an affiliate of ISLAND TIME HOSPITALITY GROUP, LLC to provide food and beverage service at the Town of Oyster Bay TOBAY Beach Concession Facilities located at the Town of Oyster Bay TOBAY Beach.

The term of the initial Agreement runs from April 18, 2019 through April 18, 2024, with two options to extend, each for a five (5) year period, upon the mutual consent of the parties. By letter dated September 12, 2023 (attached), Mark Miller, Member, ISLAND TIME HOSPITALITY GROUP, LLC, requested that the first option to extend be exercised and the Agreement be extended for a five (5) year term from April 18, 2024 through April 18, 2029 under the terms and conditions of the current Agreement.

ISLAND TIME-1 OCEAN PKWY LLC has successfully provided food and beverage services to the Town. At this time the vendor is current in its monetary obligation to the Town and it is the determination of this department that the Town would benefit from the continuation of this service if the Town were to exercise the first five (5) year extension option at a fee of \$ 115,927.41 for the first year of the five (5) year contract extension with a contractual 3% increase each subsequent year of the term of the first extension period (attached).

In addition to the established fee payment, the concessionaire by contract is required to make capital improvements, in the minimum value of \$265,000, over the term of the agreement extension. The improvements are subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Parks and/or his designee and shall be completed in full during the five (5) year term of the Agreement extension.

This Department requests and recommends that the Town Board authorize the Supervisor or his designee to exercise the contract provision to extend the Agreement through April 18, 2029 under the same terms and conditions as the current Agreement.

Oyster Bay shall pay its 2022 share of \$703,788.80, its 2023 of \$720,312.06, and its first-half amount for 2024 of \$389,330.31, for a total of \$1,813,431.17, by March 29, 2024.

FIFTH: Hempstead shall defend and indemnify Oyster Bay against any and all claims arising out of this agreement and the use of the properties, facilities, and equipment of the Joint District.

SIXTH: This agreement shall be for a term beginning January 1, 2022 and terminating on December 31, 2026, shall be subject to all necessary approvals of the respective Towns, and may be renewed by mutual agreement for a successive period of five years by Hempstead, Oyster Bay, and the Joint District, subject to Town Board authorization of same.

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

Pursuant to Resolution 721-2020, the Town of Oyster Bay's dental insurance agreement with Cigna expired on December 31, 2023. Accordingly, Kurz Planning Inc., on behalf of the Department of Human Resources, prepared and published a request for proposals for dental insurance coverage for the Town's employees and retirees for a one-year period with two (2) one-year extensions commencing January 1, 2024, nunc pro tunc, through December 31, 2026. Kurz Planning Inc sent the RFP to more than 20 dental insurance carriers and received nine proposals. Four dental Insurance carriers were interviewed by a joint Association/Town Committee, pursuant to the Agreement by and between the Town of Oyster Bay and CSEA, Local 1000 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Town of Oyster Bay Local 881 (January 1, 2022-December 31, 2028).

Upon completion of the review and rating of the proposals pursuant to and in compliance with Guidelines 6 and 9 of the Town's procurement policy, it is the recommendation of the joint Association/Town Committee and the Department of Human Resources to continue using Cigna as the dental insurance carrier for the Town of Oyster Bay employees and retirees for the next three years. The proposed Cigna rates are as follows:

#### Year 1 (PPO) – January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024:

SINGLE \$ 46.67 FAMILY \$130.95

#### Year 1 (DHMO) - January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024:

SINGLE \$ 35.92 FAMILY \$ 91.08

Therefore, it is hereby requested that the Town Board approve the recommendation of the Committee and the Department of Human Resources to authorize the Supervisor or his designee to enter into an agreement with Cigna to provide dental insurance coverage to all Town of Oyster Bay employees and qualified retirees for one year with two (2) one-year extensions. There were specific bid requirements that were also adjusted as bids came in to get the best long term offers for the town. Requirements included matching or exceeding the current DPPO and DHMO benefit structure, large network, good administrative and customer service ability. All offers are effective 4/1/24 except Cigna's which will go retro-active to 1/1/24 (worth about 1.2%).

Below are the best offers from the respective carriers all are offering similar benefits unless noted.

1) Cigna- Current Carrier has been servicing the Town since 2009. The trend is going the right way with the DHMO getting more enrollment and that is reducing town costs. The reason it works is because it offers a \$0 copay on all services including braces. The DPPO program seems to be slowing in claim load and seeing a migration of the higher claims people into to DHMO, because of this financial benefit to the employees. Below they are offering a 3-year rate guarantee. There is also a 1 year and 2 year rate guarantee offer in the proposal attached. Though the 3 year one seems to be the one of the most value. This is 5% lower than current rates





2) Met Life- This was your carrier 2007 and 2008. You had a good experience with them. They are offering a slightly weaker DHMO. The DHMO benefits Met is offering are financially (from the employees' perspective) substantially better than the DPPO and you should still see migration continuing from the DPPO to the DHMO. We would expect a short-term issue for the first year or two as people still remember the \$0 copays from Cigna. They are offering a 2-year rate guarantee and a 7% rate cap for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

4) Sun Life - This is a large dental company. Their DHMO offered is much lesser then Cigna's. Two-year rate guarantee. Third-year rate cap 9%. They offered a in network only plan as an option to run alongside the current Cigna DHMO. It might not be strong enough to entice employees out of the DPPO.

5) Solstice- This is a middle size company based out of Florida. We had a customer about your size that just moved from Solstice for service issues. Financially they have offered three-year rate guarantee.

6) The Standard- They are a good company, <u>but offering no DHMO</u>. Two-year rate guarantee and 3<sup>rd</sup>year rate Cap of 8%.

Total Costs after 3 years \$6,230,538 No savings compared to Cigna offer.

- 7) Ameritas-Offering 24 Month rate guarantee. DPPO Monthly Rate- Single \$48.60 Family \$136.32 Annual cost \$2.127,779 3 year estimated cost (15% in 3<sup>rd</sup> year) \$6,702,503. This is 5% more than the current Cigna program
- 8) Aetna-Offering 12 month Guarantee and a 6.5% 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 6.5% 3<sup>rd</sup> year rate cap. They have a DHMO offered.
  - DPPO Monthly Rate Single \$47.93 Family \$134.48

    DHMO Monthly Rate Single \$22 Family \$55.79 Cost over 3 years \$6,715,032 This is 5% more than the current Cigna program.
- 9) United Healthcare- 24-month rate guarantee. DPPO Monthly Rate-Single \$56.05 Family \$157.27 \$2,454,630 Annually 3 year estimated cost (15%-year 3 increase) \$7,732,083 this is 24% more than current Cigna program.
- 10) Declined to Quote-Lincoln Financial, Principal
- 11) Provided no bid upon solicitation- Dent Max, Renaissance Dental, Anthem, Humana. This happens usually because they are uncompetitive and do not release a Decline to Quote letter.

In conclusion, we feel offers one through four above are quality offers and are quality offers when compared to your current Cigna DPPO. There are DHMO benefit issues for the 3 non-Cigna offerings where they aren't similar to Cigna's benefit structure. Met Life is the closest in DHMO benefits. Cigna has offered to retain the DHMO coverage if you do switch the DPPO part of the program. We recommend you retain the Cigna DHMO. Most of the financial cost for the town is the DPPO program. This part of the offerings from all the proposals is similar in benefits. The DPPO non-Cigna offers the annual average savings is 1.7% to 4.1% or an Adjusted 0.5% to 4.1% savings. This adjustment is due to the 1.2% that Cigna is willing to make retro actively to 1/1/24 for the Town. There is no wrong choice here. If you wanted to switch, we would recommend Guardian because of past history of good service, and 3-year savings of 4.1% net. That said, staying with Cigna is a good plan also. It promotes stability and there are about 5% of members who's in network dentist that would become out of network on the Guardian switch. This gives you budgeting certainty for

3 years on a fixed rate. This is also a win for the tax base and the employees. This rate would be retroactive to 1/1/24 for the town.


For some historical reference this would be less than the rate the town was paying in 2013 for the same dental benefits. This might be the only line item to have no cost increase for over 10 years in the town.

if you are asking me what I would decide if I was the sole decision maker, we would recommend DPPO Guardian, second Cigna third Sun Life, forth Met Life and DHMO should stay with Cigna as stated earlier. Remember all 4 are great offers and will do the job hired for. All the other proposals are options also, but have less to much less merit. There is also an internal cost in switching plans in Town employee labor to consider. Please be aware switching carriers takes about 4-6 weeks to implement well.

As the Town's approved consultant for the above referenced contract, D&B Engineers and Architects (D&B) is pleased to present this proposal to the Town of Oyster Bay (the Town) to conduct Post-Termination groundwater monitoring and reporting at the Old Bethpage Landfill. D&B previously completed several years of quarterly groundwater monitoring in accordance with the Town's Consent Decree with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), and assisted the Town in obtaining approval from the NYSDEC in 2016 to enter into three years of semi-annual Post-Termination groundwater monitoring for which sampling and reporting has now been completed. Based upon ongoing correspondence with the NYSDEC, the Town has been requested to continue Post-Termination monitoring and reporting until an approval to conclude this effort is issued. Our work will additionally include supporting the Town with negotiations with NYSDEC on an as-needed basis on groundwater sampling and contamination issues at this property.

As requested by the Town, D&B proposes the following Post-Termination groundwater monitoring tasks for the 2024 reporting year, unless otherwise modified by the Town as a result of NYSDEC correspondence and negotiation.

### Old Bethpage Landfill Groundwater Monitoring and Reporting

- 1. Post-Termination Groundwater Monitoring:
  - Semi-annual groundwater quality sampling of monitoring wells will be conducted for VOCs, total and dissolved metals and leachate parameters.
  - b. The following 13 wells will be sampled during each sampling round: LF-1, LF-2, MW-5B, MW-6A, MW-6B, MW-6C, MW-6E, MW-6F, MW-8A, MW-8B, MW-8

9B, MW-9C and OBS-1. Note that Well MW-6A has been observed to be dry during several sampling events and will only be sampled if sufficient groundwater is present in the well.

- c. Two semi-annual sampling rounds are anticipated to be completed in 2024.
- 2. Groundwater Monitoring Reports:
  - a. Draft Semi-annual Groundwater Monitoring Reports for each of the two (2) sampling events will be prepared and submitted to the Town for review.
  - b. Each semi-annual report will be a stand-alone report and will include the data obtained from all the previous Post-Termination monitoring and reporting events.
  - c. D&B will prepare trend graphs and spider diagrams for key contaminants and analyze Post-Termination monitoring concentration trends.
  - d. After Town review, D&B will revise each semi-annual report, as required, and submit the final report to NYSDEC, no more than 90 days from each sampling event.
  - e. A maximum of five (5) copies of each final report will be submitted.
- 3. Laboratory analyses for all samples will be conducted under a separate contract, as follows:
  - a. VOCs, metals and wet chemistry analyses will be conducted by Pace Analytical Services, Inc. (Pace), located at 575 Broadhollow Road in Melville, NY 11747, under direct contract with the Town.

### Post-Termination Monitoring and Coordination with NYSDEC

- 1. Coordinate with the Town and the Town's oversight consultant to develop and respond to correspondence related to proposed post-termination and emerging contaminant monitoring and reporting obligations as necessary.
- 2. Attend meetings and represent the Town's interests with regard to merit and justification of future sampling and monitoring at the landfill, as may be necessary.

The proposed fees to complete the above tasks will be based upon time and expenses actually incurred in relation to the above scope in accordance with our On-Call Agreement with the Town and will not exceed a value of \$45,000 for the 2024 anticipated scope activities defined above.

D&B intends to utilize Pine Environmental Services, Inc. for specialized sampling equipment rental needs and is hereby requesting the Town's approval of this proposed subcontractor. Pine Environmental Services, Inc. is located at Windsor Industrial Park, 92 North Main Street, Building 20, Windsor, NJ 08561.

Laboratory analysis will be performed by Pace Analytical Services, Inc. under contract with the Town and therefore, costs for laboratory analyses are not included in this request.

Our funding request includes a total of \$3,000 or approximately 17 hours of staff effort to assist the Town with emerging contaminant work plan support and coordination, meetings or correspondence with the NYSDEC, as may be necessary.





Dear Commissioner Lenz:

Pursuant to Town Board Resolution No. 921-2023, Cashin Associates, P.C. (CA) is pleased to present this fee proposal for providing the required engineering services under the above referenced contract. The proposed fees are for calendar year 2024 and are based upon 1) our Technical Proposal of November 8, 2023, 2) the tasks undertaken and accomplished by CA under the previous on-call contract, and 3) our understanding of the important tasks which lie ahead in 2024.

In 2023, the following tasks were addressed and completed by CA in coordination with the Town of Oyster Bay Department of Public Works and Department of Sanitation:

- Preparation of annual scale house reports, per NYSDEC requirements, of waste types and tonnages as recorded at the OBSWDC scale house in CY 2022.
- LSWMP biennial revisions.
- Transfer Station noise study in response to NYSDEC comments on the Part 360 Engineering Report.
- Review and critique of the proposed NYSDEC SWMP.
- Attendance at OBSWDC meetings with Winters Bros. Recycling (WBR) and DOS representatives to review the operational status of the MSW transfer/haul/disposal contract (DPW 09-999).
- Inspection and recommendation for approval of the Alliance and Conestoga landfills and Covanta Delaware Valley waste-to-energy plant for disposal of the Town's MSW.
- Research into "implementation tasks" as outlined in the Town's approved SWMP, especially with respect to food waste and commercial waste.
- Transfer station replacement cost estimates.
- Development of a master plan for a new waste disposal complex at the north end of the OBSWDC.

For CY 2024, CA anticipates being called upon to assist the Town with the following solid waste task groupings (per our technical proposal for November 8, 2023):

### Task Group A. Oversight of Facilities and Operations, Including Maintenance, Engineering Inspections, Meetings with Solid Waste and Recyclables Hauling Companies, and Technical Assistance with Tenant Issues

- CA's oversight activities will be directed at ensuring that operations at the OBSWDC are conducted in accordance with the applicable contract documents (for vender-operated facilities), with site-specific facility operation and maintenance manuals (where such documents exist), with manufacturer's operation and maintenance manuals for the individual system components, with the requirements of the permits and consent decrees that govern remedial activities at the OBSWDC, with the provisions of other applicable regulations, and as otherwise specified by the Town. All oversight activities, findings and recommendations will be coordinated with the personnel designated by the Town.
- As requested by the Town, CA will conduct supplemental engineering inspections of the facilities at the OBSWDC. These inspections will typically entail more intense field observation than applies to general oversight activities, such as the supervision of major repairs, punch list inspections for contract close-outs, or trouble-shooting tenant related issues. In general, such inspection work may require that CA assign additional field engineering personnel to the OBSWDC, besides those responsible for general oversight. On occasion it may be necessary to engage a subconsultant for soil boring investigations and/or laboratory analyses. Prior approval from the Town will be obtained if such services prove necessary.
- CA will attend regular meetings with the Town and the solid waste and recyclables contractors. These meetings will be held at intervals to be determined by the Town, as required, to ensure smooth continuous operations or to address any significant problems. Such meetings typically include the following agenda items: conditions of transfer station and haul roads, changes in key personnel, and status of vendor subcontracts. Since many of the waste transfer operations involve Town personnel loading vendors' trucks, coordination of all personnel is crucial to the successful disposal of all components of the waste stream. CA's main responsibilities under this task will be to provide the Town with technical consultation, to record meeting notes and issue written minutes, and to ensure that the haulers' operations are in conformance with their contracts with the Town.
- For several years CA has been assisting the Town Attorney and outside counsel in negotiating new leases or license agreements with private vendors occupying parcels at the OBSWDC. Our input to this process has drawn upon our detailed knowledge of site operations, environmental issues, and regulatory permit conditions. We propose to continue this technical assistance going forward as required for any remaining or replacement tenants. CA will regularly continue to monitor tenants' activities to ensure that they pose no threats to the environment, create unsafe conditions, or interfere with landfill operations. In the past we have called attention to unauthorized construction activities and threats to the integrity of the landfill capping system, and will continue to do so. For any vacated parcels, we are available

to continue the program of environmental testing to ensure that all properties are remediated to appropriate standards.

# <u>Task Group B. Preparation and Management of Waste and Recycling Contracts, Including Evaluation of Waste Disposal Facilities and Liaison to Private Vendors</u>

• CA will assist the Town with contract negotiations and preparation of contracts needed for management of the waste streams entering the OBSWDC, including municipal solid waste, yard waste, e-waste and recyclable materials. CA's work with the Town has historically involved assistance with procurement of long-term contracts for waste disposal, and CA is very familiar with the contract requirements as well as the OBSWDC operations. In 2023, the Town implemented significant changes to its disposal protocol for recyclables, i.e., for cardboard and paper products as well as commingled metal, plastic and glass containers, when it signed a new contract with Great Northern Fiber, LLC (GNF). We understand GNF has attained all necessary permits to construct a new recyclables processing facility in West Babylon, as called for in the contract, which will eventually trigger rebates to the Town for the disposal of commingled metal, glass and plastic containers. CA will monitor this new development as requested by the Town.

It should also be noted that WBR is currently providing MSW disposal services under a three year extension to its contract with the Town (DPW 09-999). This extension expires on May 31, 2024; therefore the Town must decide shortly whether to exercise the renewal options in the contract or seek other arrangements. CA will assist the Town in its deliberations.

- CA will be available to provide engineering, environmental and technical evaluation of facilities in use and/or proposed by private vendors. CA can provide whatever back-up technical evaluation is required by the Town including: condition surveys, environmental compliance assessments, code compliance inspections, review of designs for facility modifications, predemobilization surveys, and operational efficiency reviews. Potential waste disposal facilities include sanitary landfill(s), recycling facilities and waste to energy plants, as well as intermediate waste transfer stations. Recently, CA followed an established protocol to evaluate alternative MSW disposal sites proposed by Winters Bros. Recycling. We have also visited and assessed MRF's, including Brookhaven's and Great Northern Fibers' on behalf of the Town.
- CA will serve as the Town's liaison to on-site private vendors providing services at the OBSWDC. This liaison role will pertain to long-term vendors (e.g., the firm operating the solid waste transfer station and the comingled recyclables and yard waste disposal contractors), as well as short-term vendors that may be called in during the course of the year to undertake smaller or temporary tasks. CA's liaison responsibilities will typically entail monitoring the work progress and the quality of services provided by the private vendors, reporting to the Town any deficiencies in the vendors' work, meeting with the Town to discuss problems with the vendors' work, and conveying the Town's requirements for correcting deficiencies back to the vendor.



### Task Group C. Implementation of Town of Oyster Bay SWMP

The Town's Solid Waste Management Plan, which attained final NYSDEC approval in May 2020, has been updated several times. CA submitted a biennial report as required in April 2022. On January 1, 2023 the Town implemented dual stream collection of recyclables. Because of this change, NYSDEC requested that the Town submit a revised biennial update. This was submitted to the NYSDEC on February 1, 2023 and approved by the NYSDEC on February 22, 2023. At the time, the Town was informed that the next biennial update was due on May 1, 2024. However, under the revised solid waste regulations effective July 22, 2023, biennial updates are now due by October 1<sup>st</sup>. Therefore, the next LSWMP biennial update is due October 1, 2024. CA will prepare and submit the biennial update for submission to the NYSDEC.

CA also proposes to undertake the following SWMP related tasks in 2024:

- Continued assessment of the transition to dual stream recycling, including quantities of material collected, rebates collected and overall success of the transition.
- Continued efforts on data collection on commercially generated waste within the Solid Waste Disposal District (SWDD).
- Data collection from private, permitted solid waste facilities in the SWDD.
- Continued research into food waste and latest developments concerning the NYS Food Donation and Food Scraps Recycling Law.
- On-going recommendations concerning level use improvements at the OBSWDC.

# <u>Task Group D. Analysis/Recommendations on Policy Issues and Miscellaneous Consultation on SWM Issues</u>

If called upon, CA and its subconsultant, Germano & Cahill, P.C., will assist the Town in tracking and reacting to the following policy issues:

- Regulatory changes within New York State relating to waste management and recycling such as the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act
- Regional trends in solid waste management
- Union contract work rules
- Waste collection equipment and maintenance procedure
- Regulatory changes in interstate restriction and flow control, including over-the-road weight limitations

Also, CA will be available in an on-call capacity to provide technical assistance to the Town with regard to any unexpected issues that may arise relative to the Town's solid waste management program. Of particular importance will be assisting the Town in conforming to Part 360 permit requirements with regard to its solid waste management facilities including responding to any questions NYSDEC may have regarding the Part 360 renewal application submitted in December 2022. (The Town is still awaiting issuance of the replacement permit for the facility). At the Town's direction, CA will review permit requirements for new and modified facilities, provide technical assistance in preparing permit applications, respond to

notices of violation, interact with NYSDEC regarding other permitting issues, and similar activities. CA will also monitor the Town's licensing and permitting of local landscape contractors for the purpose of regulating delivery of commercially collected yard waste to the OBSWDC.

# Task Group E. Coordination and Correspondence with Town and Regulatory Agencies

- CA is available to meet with the Town as requested to report on the progress of operations at the OBSWDC. CA will also be available for any additional meetings as deemed necessary by the Town to address operational deficiencies, contract issues, emergencies, or similar situations. At the Town's request, CA will attend meetings with representatives of regulatory agencies (e.g., U.S. EPA, NYS Department of Law, NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, Nassau County Department of Health, Nassau County Department of Public Works, etc.). CA will prepare minutes of each such meeting in order to provide a written record of the participating personnel, issues discussed, and the understandings reached.
- This task also entails drafting letters for transmitting documents or otherwise simply updating regulatory agencies on the status of the Town's solid waste progress. It is also recommended that notices be provided to these agencies advising them of any milestones achieved by the Town in its efforts to comply with regulations. In past years, at CA's recommendation, the town has pre-emptively advised NYSDEC of changes in the vendors for MSW and bagged yard waste hauling, has kept the NYSDEC apprised of its efforts to keep bagged yard waste inside the transfer station, notified the State that a baler was to be installed at the Transfer Station, and has notified the agency of the several changes its recycling program has undergone.

## Task Group F. Revisions/Modifications and Renewal of Town's Permits

• For many years, CA has successfully obtained a series of NYSDEC Part 360 operation permits for the OBSWDC. The most recent five-year permit was issued in June 2018 and technically "expired" in June 2023. CA prepared the permit renewal application and associated engineering reports in a timely fashion and submitted all documentation to NYSDEC six months prior to June 2023. As noted previously, the state has yet to issue the new permit. CA will also assist the Town with any and all aspects of maintaining permit and regulatory compliance as requested by the Town. This task includes the preparation of engineering reports required in support of some permits.

## Task Group G. Planning and Design of New Solid Waste and Recycling Facilities

In light of the creeping obsolescence of the Town's current Transfer Station, and with the imminent demolition of the two incinerators and compactor/baler at the north end of the site, CA anticipates that the Town will desire a major evaluation of how best to optimize the entire scope of its solid waste management responsibilities. To that end, CA recently developed alternative plans for a waste disposal complex for that parcel and will be available to assist DPW in evaluating vendor proposals for replacing or renovating the Transfer Station, scale house, tarping station, etc., or for new facilities such as baler building, off-site transloading

station, relocated Transfer Station, or even a new recycling facility (e.g. MRF), if the Town chooses to revisit that option. CA has considerable recent experience in providing these services for both the public and private sector. A key issue will be how new or expanded facilities would be constructed and financed, i.e. whether by 1) a vendor who assumes all costs, 2) a vendor whose costs are reimbursed by the Town through progress payments or built into tipping fees, or 3) the Town through normal contracting procedures.

• In addition, it may be expected that with any large and complex operating facility such as the OBSWDC, the need continually arises for rehabilitation and modifications of existing facilities and the procurement of vendor contracts. CA's staff includes solid waste management experts, civil engineers, electrical/mechanical engineers, environmental scientists and geologists, architects and landscape architects, and construction managers/field inspectors. Under this task CA will perform design work and land surveys, and prepare bid documents for new contracts to be issued by the Town, or review bid documents prepared by others, at the Town's option. CA will also provide on-site inspection services during the course of any contract work undertaken at the OBSWDC. If this task involves repairs, CA will oversee all repairs and replacement of structures and equipment, to ensure that such work is performed in accordance with system requirements.

CA proposes to perform the services described herein under Contract No. PWC31-24 as authorized by Town Board Resolution 921-2023. In addition, CA hereby proposes to utilize the services of German & Cahill, P.C. as a subconsultant (see the attached proposal from Germano & Cahill to CA). Germano & Cahill's knowledge and experience with legislative and contractual solid waste issues on Long Island are without equal and will provide a valuable perspective to CA and the Town in the development of future solid waste management programs. In 2022, Germano & Cahill drafted the contract between the Town and GNC entitled "Recyclables Delivery and Marketing Agreement".

CA respectfully requests that the Town authorize a sum of \$317,250 for continuation of our services in 2024. A breakdown of this total by task grouping is provided in the attached table.

As always, we appreciate this opportunity to provide our solid waste consulting services to the Town of Oyster Bay. Please let me know if you have any questions or desire additional information.



- 3. That the hours of operation for the subject facility shall be Monday through Thursday from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m., Friday from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m., Saturday from 6:300 a.m. until 7:30 p.m., and Sunday from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.
- 4. That any building on the premises shall have double insulation and soundproofing so that the use of air hammers, banging or other noises will not penetrate the wall area and result in noise which may be heard by the residential homes to the south of the subject premises.

- 5. That there shall be no parking of commercial vehicles on the subject property except when such vehicles are being fueled or making deliveries, and except those commercial vehicles related to the use of the subject property as set forth in paragraph 2 hereinabove.
- 6. That auto body work and repairs shall also be prohibited at all times, but this restriction shall not prohibit installation or servicing of accessories, or minor work.
  - 7. That there shall be no backing of delivery trucks onto adjacent streets.

- 12. That any and all signs that are to be erected and maintained are to comply with all applicable provisions of present or future laws or ordinances of the Town of Oyster Bay, unless such signage is granted variance relief by the Town of Oyster Bay Board of Zoning Appeals.
- 13. That all exterior lights shall be located, positioned and directed so as not to interfere with or cause annoyance or inconvenience to vehicular traffic or the surrounding areas, and shall be of shielded design to minimize impacts.
- 14. That all underground storage facilities (i.e., tanks, piping and related equipment) shall be in compliance with all local, county, state and federal requirements and regulations. Said storage facilities shall be maintained to meet all the requirements set by the Fire Marshal of the County of Nassau.

Claim No.:

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose as a result of an accident that occurred on October 14, 2018. Plaintiff Rossiello was attending the Oyster Festival when she was struck by a golf cart rented by the Festival's organizer, the Oyster Bay Charitable Fund, ("Charitable Fund") but operated by a Town employee. The Town-employee was dispatched by walkie-talkie and was responding to a new pickup call when she reached down to put the cart into reverse, and then accelerated forward into the back of the then 78-year-old plaintiff's legs, knocking her to the ground. The employee, who is now retired, was assigned to and being supervised by the co-defendant Charitable Fund and was engaged in transporting vendors and those guests who required assistance. She was paid by the Town.

As a result of the accident, Ms. Rossiello suffered a non-displaced fractured fifth metatarsal, a small non-displaced tear of the right superior labrum, trauma to her right ankle, and an exacerbation of a prior laminectomy. Her treatment thereafter included the use of a bone simulator to assist the healing of the foot, along with steroid injections to her shoulder. Five years post-accident, she claimed that she still had pain and restricted motion in her shoulder, and pain interspersed with areas of numbness in her foot. She now claims to need a cane to assist her in walking.

After extensive settlement negotiations, numerous conferences before the Court, three mediations, and the drafting of a Declaratory Judgment Summons and Complaint, a jury was selected and trial was set to begin. At that point, plaintiff and codefendant changed their negotiations postures and, with the assistance of the trial judge, a settlement in the total amount of \$120,000.00 was reached. The Town's portion of the settlement is \$45,000.00. The remaining \$75,000.00 to be paid by the codefendant Charitable Fund.



Accordingly, we have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$45,000.00, together with copies of a Stipulation of Discontinuance and a General Release executed by the claimant. The funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43010 602 0000 000.



Claim No.: 2023-9184

A Town Board Resolution is required to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). Consequently, the Office of the Town Attorney seeks Town Board authorization to settle the above-referenced claim for the sum of \$24,011.65. The settlement is to compensate claimant for the destruction of a rare 1998 BMW z3 Roadster Convertible, fitted with substantial upgrades made by the claimant, Alexander Tapia.

On August 9, 2023, Mr. Tapia's car was parked outside his home at 243 Central Park Drive, Plainview. At approximately 8:39 a.m., a Town of Oyster Bay Sanitation truck attempted to make a u-turn in front of Mr. Tapia's home. While completing the turn, the metal step on the back of the truck became caught under the left rear wheel well of the BMW. As the truck moved forward, the step dug into the body of the car, severely bending the car's frame. The force of the impact was so great, that it pushed the car forward onto the utility strip of claimant's property.

The entire accident was captured clearly on claimant's home front door camera, with perfect picture and sound. The resulting damage effectively destroyed Mr. Tapia's car. Currently, the wrecked car is being stored in a secured pen at the Town of Oyster Bay Highway Facility, located at 150 Miller Place, Syosset. Liability is completely upon the Town for the accident.

On January 9, 2024, the Office of the Town Attorney proposed a settlement in this matter for the sum of \$27,230.01 (Resolution No. 53-2024). The proposed settlement included funds to compensate Mr. Tapia for the value of a replacement vehicle (minus depreciation), upgrades (minus depreciation) storage charges caused by the delay in reaching a settlement, forty-five (45) day rental, and towing fees. The Town Board voted to table the Resolution at that time because it raised the following questions concerning the proposed settlement: 1) Could the Town Attorney's Office negotiate down the storage fees with the garage owner? 2) Was the rental allowance of forty-five days at \$3,100.00 in keeping with insurance industry standards? 3) Could a salvage value be assigned to



the wrecked car, and could the Town acquire the vehicle as part of the settlement to the claim? This office has resolved these issues.

As a result of direct negotiations with the repair shop where the vehicle was previously stored (All-Out Automotive, Inc.), the owner of same has agreed to reduce his bill from \$6,804.62 to \$5,000.00. Additionally, with the aid of an independent appraiser/adjuster associated with Salerno Brokerage Corporation, an examination of the vehicle was performed. Based upon this examination, it was determined that the vehicle, if sold at auction would have a potential salvage value of \$2,500.00. Moreover, subsequent research conducted by this office indicated that the breakup value of the vehicle's various component materials, at auction, could result in the Town realizing a potential maximum return of approximately \$3,515.00 or greater. Finally, the rental allowance originally provided at \$3,100.00 for 45 days, would be reduced to \$1,200.00 for 30 days.

Accordingly, the settlement has been reduced to \$24,011.65, with title of the vehicle being transferred to the Town, which settlement offer the claimant has accepted.

We have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$24,011.65. Kindly be advised that the funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43020 602 0000 000.
