So it is with on that basis that I would ask the town board to please consider that.

Supervisor, this pertains to Town taxes only. And as long as we have a 100% disabled veteran where the disability ties directly to his or her military service, we are able to give 100% disabled veterans the tax exemption that the state legislature has recently passed.

The way that this program is supposed to work is that the United States Office of Veterans Affairs would be the arbiter here to determine whether or not that veteran is 100% disabled and that the disability ties directly to his or her service. And this would be a way for us, again, to show our veterans here in the Town of Oyster Bay just how grateful we are.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And I know we all concur based on discussions that I've had with our colleagues. So with that, all the criteria we're following are set in law by New York State and not criteria we create, but that we are following. Of
