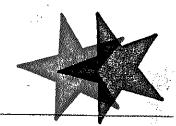

Pinto, Commissioner, Department of Parks, by memorandum dated January 12, 2022, requested Town Board approval to conduct two Town of Oyster Bay Car Show Long Island events, to be held at TOBAY Beach, on Saturday, April 30, 2022, from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, with a rain date set for Sunday, May 1, 2022; and on Sunday, October 2, 2022, from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, with a rain date set for Sunday, October 9, 2022, or as otherwise determined by the Department of Parks, as well as Town Board approval to accept Vehicle Registration Fees for said event, along with Sponsor Fees, Vendor Fees, Exhibitor Fees, Mobile Food Concession Fees and commemorative merchandise revenue; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested that spectators attending each event be admitted to each event free of charge, and that food and beverage be available to the public for purchase, to be provided by the then-current Town Concessionaire at TOBAY Beach or by an alternate food and beverage provider(s), as determined by the Commissioner of the Department of Parks, or his designee, and pursuant to the Town's procurement policy; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested authorization to incorporate the use of mobile food concessions to provide food and beverage, in lieu of the then-current Town Food and Beverage Concessionaire, and requested a waiver of the provisions of Chapter 173, Sections 173-10 to 173-18, of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay Peddlers, provided that all mobile food concessions shall be in compliance with the provisions of the New York State Sanitary Code and shall possess any and all necessary, valid and current, insurance, permissions and permits required by the Nassau County Department of Health, and also requested authorization to charge each such participating mobile food concessions a fee not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars per event, all fees collected for each event to be deposited in the Town of Oyster Bay General Fund Account No. TWN A 0001 02770 590 0000; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested approval for event entertainment to be provided through the Department of Parks, by the thencurrent Town Concessionaire at TOBAY Beach and/or a participating sponsor(s) of that event, with the talent selection to be approved by the Commissioner of the Department of Parks or his designee, with the entertainment fees to be satisfied solely by or in conjunction with the Department of Parks, the then-current Town Concessionaire at TOBAY Beach and/or a participating sponsor(s) of that event, and shall not exceed a total amount of \$4,500.00 for each such event, with any partial or whole fees billed to the Town by the entertainment group to be drawn from the Town of Oyster Bay Car Shows Program Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000 in accordance with Guideline 5, Section b of the Town Procurement Policy; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested approval to set a Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollar Registration Fee for all vehicles pre-registered prior to the day of each event, and a Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollar Registration Fee for all vehicles registering on the day of each event; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested approval to offer the following sponsorship levels with varying valuation amounts and promotional opportunities: Presenting Sponsor with a monetary valuation set by the Department, which value shall not exceed Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, Event Sponsor with a monetary valuation set by the Department, which value shall not exceed Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars, Sponsor with a monetary valuation set by the Department, which value shall not exceed One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, In-Kind Sponsor based on their commitment of service and/or promotional value provided to the event, to be determined by the Commissioner of the Department of Parks or his designee; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested approval to offer Vendors the opportunity to sell products directly to the public and to offer Exhibitors the opportunity to display product and distribute product-related literature, each such Vendor or Exhibitor to be allotted a specific 10 foot x 15 foot area at the event as designated by the Department of Parks, and up to two 8 foot tables, one 6 foot table and one 10 foot x 10 foot tent, said tables and tents to be provided by each Vendor and Exhibitor, with a monetary valuation set by the Department, which value shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further confirmed that each such Sponsor, Vendor, and Exhibitor shall be a legal, accredited business in good standing with the State of New York and will be required to provide such documentation upon request, including, but not limited to a then-current certificate of insurance naming the Town of Oyster Bay as an additional insured; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further confirmed that all media-based organizations partnering with the Town of Oyster bay for Car Show Long Island events, shall be permitted the right to sell new sponsorships, brought in jointly with the Town, and equally share any revenues (50%/50%) upon reconciliation of said event; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further confirmed that the Town of Oyster Bay and the Department of Parks reserves the right to refuse any Sponsor, Vendor or Exhibitor, for any reason that it deems does not properly serve said event and/or the public in attendance; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pinto, by said memorandum, further requested Town Board approval to employ the services of a dedicated judging staff to adjudicate the aforesaid Town of Oyster Bay Car Show Long Island events, said judges to be recognized and selected by the Commissioner of the Department of Parks or his designee based on their expertise and knowledge of classic, antique and show cars, which is in accordance with Guideline 5, Section 6, of the Town's Procurement Policy, whereby the procurement of judges is exempt from the solicitation, written proposal and response requirements of the policy, with the number of judges not to exceed twenty (20) per event, and each individual judge's fee not to exceed One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars per event, with payment of such fees to be drawn from the Oyster Bay Car Show Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000; and

The Department of Parks requests Town Board approval to conduct two Town of Oyster Bay Car Show Long Island events, to be held at Tobay Beach. The first show being Saturday, April 30, 2022, from 11:00am to 4:00pm with a rain date set for Sunday, May 1, 2022. The second show will be Sunday, October 2, 2022, from 11:00am to 4:00pm with a rain date set for Sunday, October 9, 2022. Dates and/or times may change as determined by this department.

There shall be a registration fee for all cars showing at the event. Fees will be set as follows:

\$15.00 for all cars pre-registered to the date of the event \$25.00 for all cars registering the day of the event

Show car owners shall be required to fill out a registration form to register their vehicle online or at a designated location within the Town of Oyster Bay prior to or on the date of the event.

All spectators attending the event shall be admitted free of charge.

Food and beverage shall be available to the public for purchase. The Department of Parks reserves the right to utilize the current Town concessionaire(s) at Tobay (as of the date of the each event) and/or reserves the right to select alternate food and beverage provider(s), as determined by the Commissioner of Parks or his designee and pursuant to the Town's procurement policy.

The Commissioner of Parks or his designee may incorporate the use of mobile food concession(s), in lieu of the current Town Food and Beverage concessionaire(s), at specific events. The Department of Parks requests that the Town Board waive the provisions of Chapter 173 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay - Peddlers, provided that all mobile food concession merchants

shall be in compliance with the provisions of the New York State Sanitary Code and shall possess any and all necessary insurance, permissions and permits required by the Nassau County Department of Health, said insurance, permissions and permits to be valid and current. Each mobile food concession shall be charged a fee (per event) not to exceed \$250.00. All fees collected for each event shall be deposited in the Town of Oyster Bay General Fund Account No. TWN A 0001 02770 590 0000.

Event entertainment shall be provided by the Department of Parks, the Town concessionaire(s) at Tobay (as of the date of each event) and/or participating sponsor(s). Talent selection shall be approved by Commissioner of Parks or his designee. Entertainment fees shall be satisfied solely by or in conjunction with the Town of Oyster Bay Department of Parks, the Town concessionaire(s) at Tobay (as of the date of each event) and/or a participating sponsor(s) and shall not exceed the total amount of \$4,500.00 for said event. The use of DJ and/or audio services may be incorporated into the event by utilizing the services of EKO Productions Inc. per Town Board Resolution No. 691-2021 (attached). The total cost for DJ and /or audio services shall not exceed \$2,000.00 Any partial or whole fees billed to the Town by the entertainment group and/or EKO Productions Inc. shall be drawn from the Town of Oyster Bay Car Shows Program Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000 in accordance with Guideline 5, section b of the Town Procurement Policy.

The Department of Parks is seeking Town Board approval to accept the addition of sponsors, vendors and exhibitors to said event, at a fee, to be collected by this department. Sponsors/vendor/exhibitor fees are as follows:

PRESENTING SPONSOR

Presenting sponsorship shall include the logo and/or wordmark in the title of the event and appear as such on all promotional impressions, including but not limited to printings, posters, banners, press releases, media promotion and/or advertising, mailings and commemorative merchandise. Presenting sponsors shall be entitled to a dedicated area at the event, designated by this department for any promotional displays, advertising and giveaways. Valuation of Presenting Sponsors shall be set by this department at an amount not to exceed \$5,000.

EVENT SPONSOR

Event sponsors shall be included on all promotional impressions by logo and/or wordmark, including but not limited to printings, posters, banners, press releases, mailings and commemorative merchandise. Event sponsors shall be entitled to a dedicated area at the event, designated by this department, for any

promotional displays, advertising and giveaways. Valuation of Event Sponsors shall be set by this department at an amount not to exceed \$2,500.

SPONSOR

Sponsors shall be included in all mailings by logo and/or wordmark and shall be entitled to a dedicated area at the event, designated by this department, for any promotional displays, advertising and giveaways. Valuation of Sponsor shall be set by this department at an amount not to exceed \$1,000.

IN-KIND SPONSOR

In-kind sponsors shall be included in promotional material and may be entitled to a dedicated area at the event, designated by this department, based on their commitment of service, product and/or promotional value provided to the event, to be determined by the Commissioner of Parks or his designee.

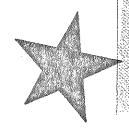
VENDOR

A vendor shall be allotted a 10' X 15' area at the event, designated by this department, and up to two 8ft tables, one 6ft table and one 10' X 10' tent to sell product directly to the spectators attending the event. Tables and tent shall be the responsibility of the vendor. Valuation of a Vendor shall be set by this department at an amount not to exceed \$150.

EXHIBITOR

An exhibitor shall be allotted a 10' X 15' area at the event, designated by this department, and up to two 8ft tables, one 6ft table and one 10' X 10' tent to display product and hand out product related literature directly to the spectators attending the event. Tables and tent shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor. Valuation of an Exhibitor shall be set by this department at an amount not to exceed \$150.

All sponsors/vendors/exhibitors must be legal, accredited businesses in good standing within the State of New York and will be required to provide such documentation upon request including but not limited to current certificate of insurance naming the Town of Oyster Bay as an additional insured.



All media-based organizations partnering with the Town of Oyster Bay for Car Show Long Island events, shall be permitted the right to sell new sponsorships, brought in jointly with the Town, and equally share any revenues (50/50) upon reconciliation of said event.

The Town of Oyster Bay and the Department of Parks reserves the right to refuse any sponsor/vendor/exhibitor, for any reason, that it deems does not properly serve said event and/or the public in attendance.

The Department of Parks requests Town Board authorization to employ the services of a dedicated judging staff to adjudicate for the 2022 Car Show Long Island event at Tobay Beach on Saturday, April 30, 2022 with a rain date set for Sunday, May 1, 2022. The second show will be Sunday, October 2, 2022 with a rain date set for Sunday, October 9, 2022. Judges shall be recognized and chosen based on their expertise and knowledge of classic, antique and show cars and shall be selected at the discretion of the Commissioner of Parks or his designee with an individual fee not to exceed \$150, with the number of judges not to exceed 20 per event.

All judging service fees shall be funded by event registrant fees and shall be drawn from the Oyster Bay Car Show Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000.

In accordance with Guideline 5, section b of the Town Procurement Policy, the judges are exempt from the solicitation, written proposal or requirements of the policy.

The Department of Parks is seeking Town Board approval to produce commemorative merchandise, highlighting the event, to be sold at the event by this department. Merchandise shall be ordered through the Town procurement policy. Merchandise will be available for public purchase at the event and will be set at a cost not to exceed \$20 per piece. Cost will be determined by this department.

The Department of Parks may hire an outside organization to arrange for insurance and transportation for specialty vehicles and/or show cars to appear in the show to help promote and/or benefit the show. The cost of this service shall not to exceed \$500 per vehicle. Fees shall be drawn from the Oyster Bay Car Show Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000.

All monies collected from said event which shall include but are not limited to car registration fee, event sponsor fee, vendor fee, exhibitor fee and commemorative merchandise revenue shall be deposited in the Town of Oyster Bay General Fund Account No. TWN A 0001 02770 590 0000. Upon event reconciliation, 65% of the total monies shall remain in the Town of Oyster Bay General Fund Account No. TWN A 0001 02770 590 0000 and 35% of total monies received from event shall be transferred to the Town of Oyster Bay Car Shows Program Trust Account No. TWN TA 0000 00085 438 0000 to be used to develop and execute future events for the

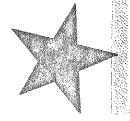

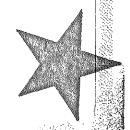

By Resolution 674-207, adopted October 17, 2017, the Town Board authorized the Town Supervisor to enter into a Multi-Jurisdictional Chief Elected Officers Agreement with the Town of North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove, establishing the role of the Town of Oyster Bay Supervisor as "Chief Elected Official" under the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act ("WIOA"), which is the authorizing legislation for federally funded workforce programs.

The Town of Oyster Bay Supervisor, Joseph Saladino, is the Chief Elected Official for the purposes of administering WIOA and for entering into and implementing agreements in accordance with that Act (WIOA). The Town of North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove join the Town of Oyster Bay in the Local Workforce Development area called the "Oyster Bay-North Hempstead- Glen Cove Workforce Development Area" in the Muli-Jurisdictional Official Agreement, adopted on October 17, 2017, sharing efforts and resources, as outlined in said WIOA agreement.

Newly elected officials in the Town of North Hempstead (Supervisor) and the City of Glen Cove (Mayor), requires that the WIOA agreement in the "Oyster Bay- North Hempstead- Glen Cove Workforce Development Area" be updated with the attached agreement.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that a new agreement be authorized by Town Board to allow Supervisor Saladino to sign and execute this agreement to reflect the change of the administration in the Town of North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove.

Multi-Jurisdictional Chief Elected Officials Agreement

Request for Designation of

Local Workforce Development Area:

Ovster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove

The Supervisor of The Town of Oyster Bay, the Supervisor of the Town of North Hempstead, and the Mayor of the City of Glen Cove, acting on their authority as the Chief Elected Officials, enter into this agreement in accordance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (herein referred to as WIOA) §107 [c] [1] [B]. The Supervisor of The Town of Oyster Bay, the Supervisor of the Town of North Hempstead, and the Mayor of the City of Glen Cove are Chief Elected Officials, as defined in WIOA § 3 [9], and enter into this agreement to organize and implement activities pursuant to WIOA and as proposed by the Governor of the State of New York for the purpose of administering WIOA in the Town of Oyster Bay, the Town of North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove.

Part 1- Designation of the Chief Elected Official

The Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay shall be designated as the Chief Elected Official for purposes of administering WIOA and for entering into and implementing agreements in accordance with that Act.

Part 2 - Designation of Grant Recipient and Local Governmental Grant Sub recipient / Incorporated Fiscal Agent

- 1. The Chief Elected Officials recognize they are jointly responsible for WIOA Funds and agree to the appointment of the Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay as the Grant Recipient who bears the fiduciary responsibility for these funds with the New York State Department of Labor.
- 2. The Grant Recipient designates the Department of Intergovernmental Affairs' Division of Employment and Training to be the local grant sub recipient/fiscal agent to assist the Grant Recipient with the administration of the grant funds.
- 3. The local grant sub recipient/fiscal agent shall disburse such funds for grant activities at the direction of the Local Workforce Development Board (LWDB.)
- 4. The Chief Elected Officials agree that the designated local governmental grant sub recipient/fiscal agent has reliable internal controls for financial management and disbursement of funds.
- 5. The name of the area is the "Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Development Area."



Part 3- Composition of and Designation of Workforce Development Board

- 1. The Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay will establish and appoint a Workforce Development Board (LWDB) to assist and carry out provisions of WIOA §§107 (a] &(b]. Subject to the requirements of Section 2 of Part 3 below, the Supervisor of the
 - Town of Oyster Bay, prior to making appointments to the LWDB, shall solicit recommendations for appointments from the Chief Elected Officials of the LWDA. The Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay shall appoint those members as have been recommended by the Chief Elected Officials.
- 2. Every effort will be made to balance the selection geographically throughout the OysterBay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Development Area as well as balance the selection of large and small business, and other related factors to as accurately as possible reflect the landscape of the Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Investment Area.
- 3. Modification of membership may be completed at any time by the LWDB once established subject to the confirmation and concurrence of the Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay, as set forth in Part 1 above.
- 4. With the exception of the annual regional meeting of the three Long Island LWDBs, the location of meetings of the LWDB shall be rotated among the Town of Oyster Bay, the Town of North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove.

Part 4 - Designation of One Stop Services and other responsibilities

- 1. As required by Section 121 (a) of WIOA, the Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay, in cooperation with the Workforce Development Board, shall develop, administer, and approve the appropriate Memoranda of Understanding in establishing no less than one facility known as Comprehensive One Stop Center in the Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Investment Area.
- 2. The Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay shall also:
 - Review and approve the 4-year local plan developed by LWDB, as required by WIOA S 108(a);
 - Review and approve actions taken by the board to designate One Stop Operatorsas required by WIOA § 121 (d) (1);
 - Review and approve monitoring activities by the LWDB as required by WIOA §121
 - Review and approve the budget of the LWDB, as required by WIOA § 107(d)(12)(A); and
 - Negotiate and reach agreement on local performance accountability measures with the LWDB and the Governor as required under WIOA § 107(d)(9).

Part 5 - Duration Modification Settlement and Rescission of Agreement

1. This Agreement becomes effective upon the concurrent acceptance by the municipalities with the authorized signature of the Chief Elected Officials of each municipality.

- 2. This Agreement may only be modified or amended in writing with the mutual consent ofall the municipalities as evidenced by the authorized signatures of the Chief Elected Officials.
- 3. Non-concurrence between the municipalities shall be resolved as expeditiously as possible. Representatives of the municipalities shall meet and confer with one another to resolve issues of non-concurrence. If concurrence cannot be reached within a reasonable amount of time, steps shall be taken towards resolution through the State.
- 4. This Agreement (including any subsequent amendments) shall stay in effect until such time as: I) federal or State authority ceases for the Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Development Area to serve as the local implementation means for job training programs or 2) any party acts to rescind this Agreement. Formal action seeking arescission must be taken at least six months prior to the conclusion of the program year. The effective date of the rescission would then be the close of that program year.

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose from an incident occurring on July 27, 2014, at the Town pool at Syosset-Woodbury Community Park. The decedent, Jonathan Sobel was swimming in the Town pool when he had a heart attack, resulting in drowning. The stated cause of death was a heart attack, with drowning listed as the secondary cause. The Estate, by Laurie Sobel, brought a wrongful death action against the Town, alleging a delay in lifesaving techniques. The decedent was a patent attorney at the time of the incident.

After extensive settlement negotiations, this matter was settled for \$2,000,000.00. Of this amount, the Town is to pay \$806,757.00 and the Town's liability excess carrier, Starr Insurance Company is to pay \$1,193,243.00. It is this Office's opinion that such settlement is just, reasonable, and in the best interests of the Town given the uncertainties associated with litigation.

The Surrogates Court has approved the proposed settlement. Of the total settlement, Laurie Sobel is to receive \$866,012.93; the decedent's son, Matthew Sobel, and daughter, Julia Sobel are to receive \$162,296.28 and \$270,061.00 respectively; and \$701,629.79 is to be paid out of the settlement as legal fees and disbursements, all monies to be distributed by plaintiff's counsel.

Accordingly, we have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$806,757.00, together with copies of the Stipulation of Discontinuance; a General Release in favor of the Town and the Court decree from the Surrogates Court. The funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43010 602 0000 000.

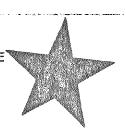

It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds herein authorized will exceed five years.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. The faith and credit of said Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. Such cost shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land within said District in the manner provided by law in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same become due.

Section 6. Such bonds shall be in fully registered form and shall be signed in the name of the Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, by the manual or facsimile signature of the Supervisor and a facsimile of its corporate seal shall be imprinted or impressed thereon and may be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Town Clerk.

Section 7. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of the Town; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, he shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State

Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds, including determining whether to issue such bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service and all matters related thereto, prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the Town by the facsimile signature of its Supervisor, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the Town), the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Supervisor. It is hereby determined that it is to the financial advantage of the Town not to impose and collect from registered owners of such bonds any charges for mailing, shipping and insuring bonds transferred or exchanged by the fiscal agent, and, accordingly, pursuant to paragraph c of Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, no such charges shall be so collected by the fiscal agent. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 9. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said

 Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$470,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY, NASSAU COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY COSTS OF THE INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE FACILITIES OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY PUBLIC LIGHTING DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY, NASSAU COUNTY, NEW YORK.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions heretofore duly had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Section 202-b of the Town Law, and more particularly an order dated February 8, 2022, said Town Board has determined it to be in the public interest to increase and improve of the facilities of the Town of Oyster Bay Public Lighting District in the Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, at an estimated maximum cost of \$470,000; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide funding for such capital project; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. For the class of objects or purposes of paying costs of the increase and improvement of the facilities of the Town of Oyster Bay Public Lighting District in said Town, consisting of the refurbishing and improvement of facilities in such Public Lighting District, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, there are hereby authorized to be issued \$470,000 bonds of said Town pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the estimated maximum cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is \$470,000 and that the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of the \$470,000 bonds of said Town authorized to be issued pursuant to this bond resolution.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is thirty years, pursuant to subdivision five of paragraph a of

Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds herein authorized will exceed five years.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. The faith and credit of said Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. Such cost shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land within such Public Lighting District in the manner provided by law and levied and collected in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same become due.

Section 6. Such bonds shall be in fully registered form and shall be signed in the name of the Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York, by the manual or facsimile signature of the Supervisor and a facsimile of its corporate seal shall be imprinted or impressed thereon and may be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Town Clerk.

Section 7. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of the Town; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, he shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the Supervisor shall be a full

acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 8. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds. including determining whether to issue such bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service and all matters related thereto, prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the Town by the facsimile signature of its Supervisor, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the Town), the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Supervisor. It is hereby determined that it is to the financial advantage of the Town not to impose and collect from registered owners of such bonds any charges for mailing, shipping and insuring bonds transferred or exchanged by the fiscal agent, and, accordingly, pursuant to paragraph c of Section 70.00 of the Local Finance Law, no such charges shall be so collected by the fiscal agent. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Supervisor shall determine.

Section 9. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 10. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150 - 2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 11. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary in Newsday, a newspaper having general circulation in said Town, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

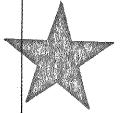

On November 30, 2021, the Town issued a Request for Proposals ("RFP") seeking quotes for the Town's Public Officials & Employees Liability Insurance policy, in accordance with the requirements of the Town's procurement policy. Requests were sent to eleven (11) insurance brokers, to obtain quotes/proposals from insurance carriers and the RFP was posted on the Town's website.

Multiple brokers requested additional information. The sole broker to submit quotes, Salerno Brokerage Corp. ("Salerno"), advised the Office of the Town Attorney that it had forwarded the Town's Request for Proposals to multiple insurance carriers and received responses from ten (10) insurance carriers, AIG, Berkley, Greenwich (AXA XL), HCC, Hudson Insurance, Kinsale Insurance, Munich Re, RSUI, Trident and Chubb. Chubb, through its subsidiary, Ace American Insurance Company, the Town's current insurer, provided two renewal options, with a common coverage limit but differing self-insured retention levels, while Greenwich (AXA, XL) provided an option with the same coverage limit, but a lower retention and a lower premium. Both Ace American Insurance Company and Greenwich (AXA, XL) Insurance Company ("Greenwich") are A-rated by AM Best Ratings Services, Inc., which signifies that each carrier has demonstrated an excellent ability to meet ongoing consumer obligations.

This Office's memorandum to the docket dated January 21, 2022, recommended that Chubb's Ace American Insurance policy through Salerno Brokerage Corp. be selected at a renewal premium of \$224,238.00 for the period January 28, 2022 to January 28, 2023. Subsequent to this recommendation, Chubb's Ace American Insurance Company, Greenwich revised its response criteria and offered a lower premium for the same services to be provided by Chubb's Ace American. Accordingly, following a review and evaluation, the Office of the Town Attorney has determined that based upon the terms and coverage afforded, the claim history of the Town, and the cost of the defense of such claims, Greenwich's policy proposal, with a premium of \$194,628.00, for the period January 28, 2022 to January 28, 2023, will provide substantial savings to the Town. In the past, Greenwich has declined to bid on this policy but Salerno advised us that the improvement in the Town's rising credit rating apparently drew the carrier's interest and expanded the market of carriers available to the Town. Salerno advised this Office that, in their experience, Greenwich has provided strong customer service.

Salerno further advised that the existing policy with Chubb's Ace American Insurance Company contains a sixty (60) day "tail", an extension period in which previously unknown claims can be reported to Chubb's Ace American Insurance Company. This Office was assured this Office that there will be no break in coverage.

Therefore, based on compliance with Guideline 7 of the Town's procurement policy, it is recommended that the Greenwich policy, through Salerno Brokerage Corp., be selected, at the renewal premium of \$194,628.00, for the period January 28, 2022 to January 28, 2023, with funds to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43010 603 0000 000.

The Inspector General has reviewed the RFP and the proposed vendor's disclosure questionnaire and is satisfied that the Procurement Policy has been fulfilled.

Accordingly, kindly table MD#50 (1-18-22), suspend the rules and walk this item on the January 25, 2022 Town Board action calendar.

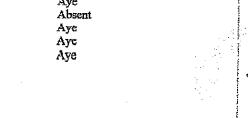

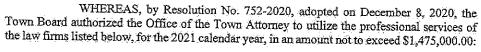

WHEREAS, the Jericho Water District (District"), is a municipal provider of water, with a district of approximately 37 square miles, including in excess of 19,000 water services and serving over 58,000 people, most of whom are Town residents; with an existing underground pump station in the grass shoulder of Juneau Boulevard adjacent to the above-referenced Town property; and

WHEREAS, Jericho Water District's Consultant, William D. The Town of Oyster Bay ("Town") owns property on the south side of Jericho Turnpike, east of Juneau Boulevard and north of Nome Drive, in Woodbury, New York, which is designated on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 13, Block 79, Lot 40. The Jericho Water District (District"), is a municipal provider of water since 1923, with a district of approximately 37 square miles, including in excess of 19,000 water services and serving over 58,000 people, most of whom are Town residents. The District currently maintains an underground pump station in the grass shoulder of Juneau Boulevard adjacent to the above-referenced Town property.

By letter dated August 24, 2021, Jericho Water District's Consultant, William D. Merklin, P.E., President, D&B Engineers and Architects, informed the Office of the Town Attorney that the District's existing equipment is approaching the end of its useful life, and that the District plans to replace and upgrade the equipment, including a new backup generator, to prevent the possibility of water pressures below the allowable minimum during a power outage. Mr. Merklin, on behalf of the District, requested permission to install and maintain the new backup generator and related equipment in the most secure location, which is an area within the Town's protective fencing approximately fifty feet by twenty feet in size, on the adjacent Town property at the northeast corner of Juneau Boulevard and Nome Drive, Woodbury, New York.

The Department of Public Works reviewed the request and proposed site plan and has no objection. In addition, the Department of Public Works requested that the Office of the Town Attorney prepare a License Agreement with the Jericho Water District for this purpose, for the period, March 1, 2022 through February 29, 2032, with two (2) ten (10) year extension options.

THE JERICHO WATER DISTRICT, a Town Law Article 13 Commissioner Elected Special District having its principal business address at 125 Convent Road, Syosset, N.Y. 11791, hereinafter called the "LICENSEE" or the "DISTRICT".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the TOWN is the owner of certain premises located on the south side of Jericho Turnpike, east of Juneau Boulevard and north of Nome Drive, in Woodbury, New York, which is designated on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 13, Block 79, Lot 40, hereinafter referred to as the "PREMISES", as identified on the attached "Proposed Site Plan"; and

WHEREAS, the LICENSEE is a municipal provider of water since 1923, with a district of approximately 37 square miles, including in excess of 19,000 water services and serving over 58,000 people, most of whom are TOWN residents; and

WHEREAS, the LICENSEE currently maintains a pump station below grade concrete vault in the grass shoulder of Juneau Boulevard, with the exception of an

electric meter and disconnect located in an above-grade enclosure adjacent to the underground vault ("Juneau Blvd pump station"); and

WHEREAS, the existing electrical equipment and controls at the LICENSEE's Juneau Blvd pump station are approaching the end of their useful life, and the LICENSEE desires to replace and upgrade the equipment, including a new backup generator, to prevent the possibility of water pressures below the allowable minimum during a power outage; and

WHEREAS, the LICENSEE desires to improve the operation and security of the Juneau Blvd pump station by locating the generator past the limits of the existing chain link fence bordering the PREMISES, so as to prevent accessibility to the generator by and visibility to the public; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. -2022, adopted on , 2022, the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay accepted and approved the LICENSEE's request and authorized and directed the Town Supervisor or his designee to execute a license agreement with the LICENSEE; and



WHEREAS, by Resolution No. -2022, adopted on , 2022, the Board of the Jericho Water District authorized and directed the _____ or his designee to execute a license agreement with the TOWN,

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the services, mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, agree as follows:

1. The TOWN hereby grants permission to the LICENSEE to use a portion of the PREMISES, within the TOWN's protective fencing, approximately fifty feet by twenty feet in size, at the northeast corner of Juneau Boulevard and Nome Drive, Woodbury, New York, (which area is to be designated and approved by the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works), during the Term (as hereinafter defined), subject, at all times to the TOWN's right to terminate this License Agreement, as hereinafter set forth. The attached 'Proposed Site Plan' provides an approximation of the size and location anticipated. The LICENSEE shall utilize the Licensed Premises only and solely for the installation and maintenance of an above-ground generator and related equipment incidental to the operation of the LICENSEE's underground water pump station. No member of the public shall be allowed access to the Licensed Premises, or any other area of the PREMISES, in connection with this Agreement. LICENSEE



acknowledges that TOWN shall have no obligation to provide security and LICENSEE assumes all risk and liabilities associated from the level of security LICENSEE elects to maintain at the Premises.

- 2. The term of the license (the "Term") shall be for the ten year period from March 1, 2022 through and including February 29, 2032, with two (2) separate ten (10) year extension options as mutually agreed and approved by the respective Boards of the TOWN and the LICENSEE.
- 3. (a) LICENSEE shall pay to the TOWN a license fee of \$1.00 per year, for each year of the Term, payable in advance, the first payment to be made at the time of execution of this Agreement. Payment should be directed via mail or in person to: Town of Oyster Bay, Office of the Town Attorney, 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, N.Y. 11771.
- (b) LICENSEE shall, at all times, keep the Licensed Premises free and clear of any encumbrances, liens, mechanics' liens, public improvement liens, and any other matters that may affect the quality and marketability of title to the Licensed Premises.



- 4. (a) Any preparation, grading, fencing or alteration of the land or appurtenances thereon that may be necessary or required for the intended use, shall be the sole responsibility of the LICENSEE and shall be made at its own cost and expense, for the LICENSEE's purposes, provided, however, that the plans for such preparation, grading or alteration of the land or appurtenances thereof, shall first be submitted to the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works of the TOWN, or his duly appointed representative, and his written approval obtained therefor.
- (b) LICENSEE shall maintain the installation, and its necessary operations and maintenance of its equipment is a manner that is least disruptive to the surrounding community. In addition, LICENSEE shall coordinate and respond to all inquiries, public and private, with respect to its use of the Licensed Premises.
- 5. Within thirty (30) days after the expiration of the period of use set forth herein or earlier termination pursuant to the terms of this License Agreement, the LICENSEE shall, at its own cost and expense, level, top dress and rehabilitate said land, and restore the appurtenances thereon, all to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works of the TOWN, or his duly appointed representative, and his opinion and directives shall be binding upon the respective parties hereto.



The LICENSEE shall obtain, and furnish evidence of, insurance for the 6. benefit of the TOWN with respect to such coverages, such amounts and such limits as the TOWN shall require from time to time. Without limitations, the LICENSEE shall initially obtain coverage and provide Certificates of Insurance and additional Insured Endorsements with respect to comprehensive general liability in amounts per occurrence of not less than \$1,000,000.00,\$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate, and \$500,000.00 for property damage and shall name the "Town of Oyster Bay, all elected and appointed Town officials, employees, architects, engineers, consultants and volunteers" as additional named insureds on those policies. The LICENSEE shall further insure its vehicles with policies providing coverage limits of not less than a \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit and shall further insure its property and equiptment which may at any time be upon the PREMISES, and list the "Town of Oyster Bay, all elected and appointed Town officials, employees, architects, engineers, consultants and volunteers" as additional named insureds on those policies. LICENSEE shall provide evidence to the TOWN of Workers' Compensation Insurance Coverage. All such certificates shall provide that the TOWN be given 30 days' prior written notice of termination of coverage or default under the contract of insurance or non-payment of premium. To the extent permissible under the



insurance contract and pursuant to the certificate, the TOWN shall have thirty (30) days after the receipt of said notice to cure such default so that the applicable insurance may continue, but the TOWN shall have no obligation to take any such action. Failure to maintain, and supply evidence of insurance, to the TOWN shall be a material default under this License Agreement.

- 7. It is understood and agreed that the license herein granted for the temporary use and occupancy of said land, does not and shall not in any way be construed to evidence a transfer of any interest in real property between the parties hereto, or create a Landlord-Tenant relationship.
- 8. The LICENSEE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the TOWN, its officers and employees, from any and all claims, suits, losses, damages, or injury to person or property of whatsoever kind and nature, whether direct or indirect, arising out of the use of the land hereunder, or the carelessness, negligence or improper conduct or alleged carelessness, negligence or improper conduct of the LICENSEE and/or its subcontractors, agents, or employees, which responsibility shall not be limited to the insurance coverage herein provided for.



- 9. The LICENSEE shall promptly comply with all statutes, ordinances, rules, orders, regulations and requirements of the federal, state or municipal government, and of any and all their departments and bureaus, applicable to the use of said land, for and the correction, prevention and abatement of nuisances or other grievances in, upon or connected with said premises during said term.
 - 10. Intentionally deleted.
- 11. The permission of the TOWN granting the use of said land hereunder, is made only to the LICENSEE, and may not, without the express consent of the Town Board of the TOWN, be transferred or assigned to any other firm or person.
- 12. This License Agreement is terminable at will by either party hereto, at any time hereafter, and for any reason whatsoever, upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other party, and if this Agreement be so terminated, the Term shall expire and the obligations of the parties hereunder for the further performance of the terms, covenants and conditions herein shall cease, except as to the requirement of restoration and rehabilitation under paragraph "5", and the LICENSEE shall forthwith remove itself, vacate said lands and restore the Licensed Premises to its original condition.



All notices, demands and requests given or required to be given by, pursuant to, or relating to, this License Agreement, shall be in writing, if to the TOWN, to the Town Attorney, 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, N.Y. 11771; if to the LICENSEE, to the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, 125 Convent Road, Syosset, N.Y. 11791. All notices shall be deemed to have been properly given if hand delivered or if mailed by United States registered or certified mail, with return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or by United States Express Mail, or FedEx or other comparable overnight courier service to the parties at the address first above written, or such other addresses as shall be given in writing by any party to the other. A notice shall be deemed to have been given: in the case of hand delivery, at the time of delivery; in the case of registered or certified mail, when delivered or two business days after mailing; or in the case of overnight courier service, on the business day after the same was sent. A party receiving a notice that does not comply with the technical requirements for the notice under this section may elect to waive any deficiencies and treat the notice as having been properly given. LICENSEE shall not be entitled to any notices of any nature whatsoever from the TOWN except with respect to matters for which this agreement specifically and expressly provides for the giving of notice.

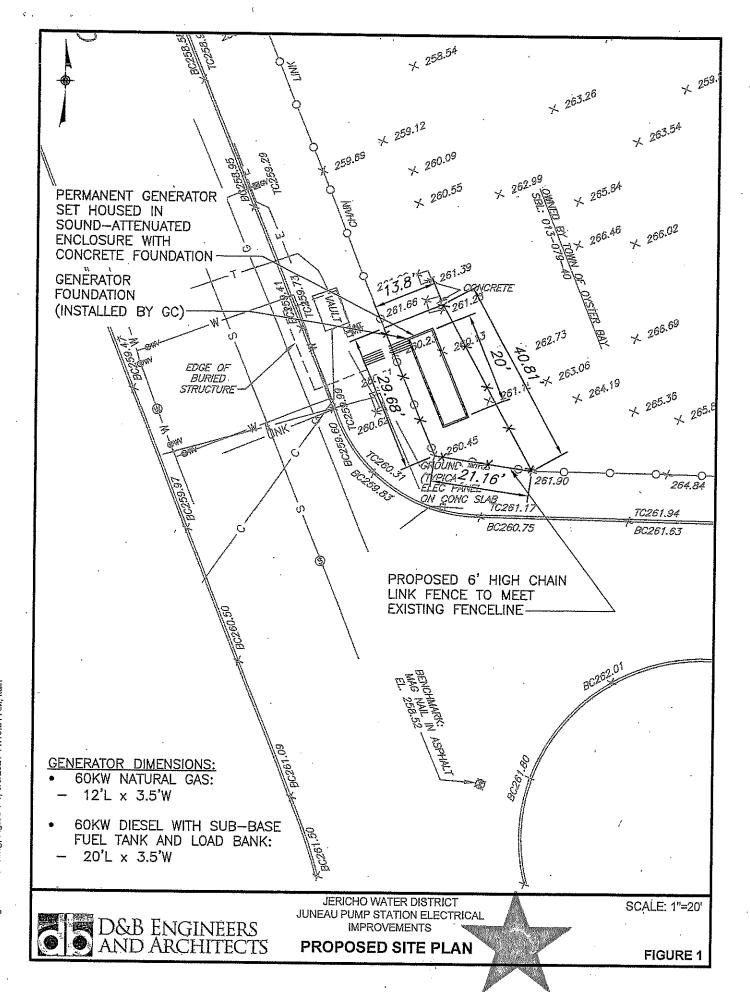

D&B Engineers and Architects, D.P.C. has been retained by the Jericho Water District (JWD) to prepare the plans and specifications for electrical improvements to their pump station on Juneau Boulevard, Woodbury, NY in the Town of Oyster Bay (the Town).

The existing Juneau Pump Station provides water pressure to a small area of relatively high elevation within the Woodbury Tank portion of the District's service area. The pump station is located in a below grade concrete vault in the grass shoulder of Juneau Boulevard, with the exception of the electric meter and disconnect which is located in an above grade enclosure adjacent to the vault.

The existing electrical equipment and controls are approaching the end of their useful life and need to be replaced. In addition, the existing facility does not include an emergency generator. Therefore, customers within the service area of the pump station could experience pressures below the allowable minimum during a power outage.

It is our intention to replace the existing electrical equipment and install a standby generator to improve the operation and security of this pump station. Due to the limited space on the shoulder of the street, and to further protect the generator, we would like to locate the generator past the limits of the existing chain link fence bordering the Town's property at the corner of Juneau Boulevard and Nome Drive. This would allow the generator to not be accessible to the public and would help to conceal the unit behind the landscaping in the area.

On behalf of the Jericho Water District, we would like to request the Town to review the existing land use agreement between the Town of Oyster Bay and the Jericho Water District. Please review the documents provided and let us know if it is feasible for the existing agreement to be modified or for a new agreement to be developed to allow for the construction of a standby generator, replacement electrical equipment, and replacement fencing as shown on the attached Figure 1 draft proposed site plan.

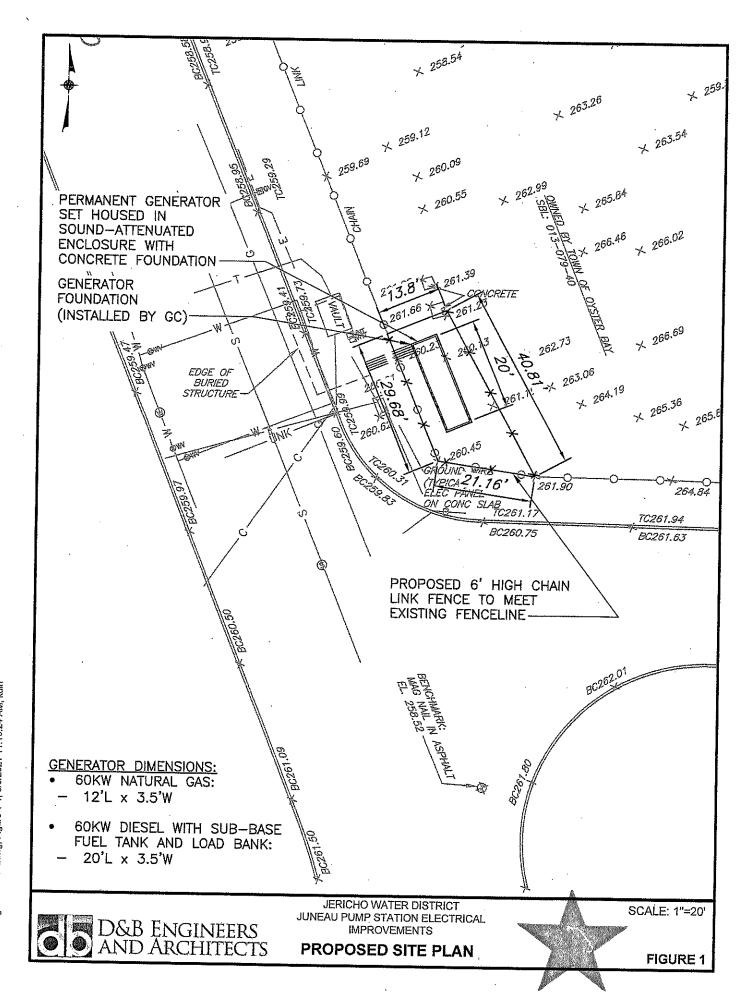

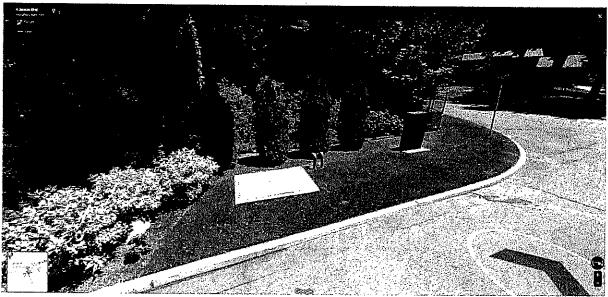
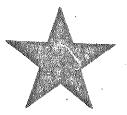


Figure 2: View of Juneau Pump Station from the Street

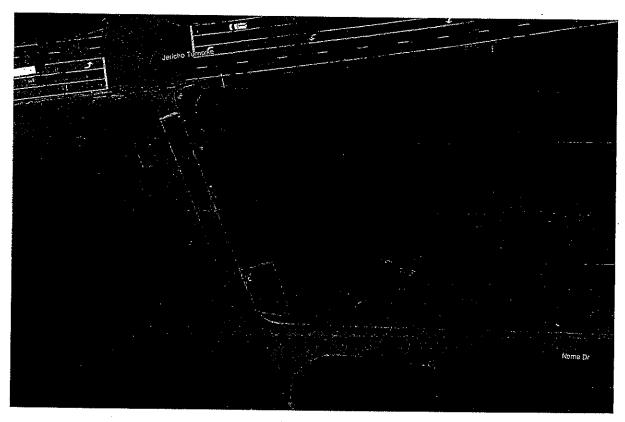


Figure 3: Aerial View of Juneau Pump Station and Approximate Limits of Work
