NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the requests as hereinabove set forth are hereby authorized and approved, and that St. Boniface Martyr Church may use Harry Tappen Beach from Sunday, May 12, 2019 through Monday, May 20, 2019 for its annual Feast by the Shore; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Town Board hereby waives Section 168-5B of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay so as to allow raffles and other games of chance to be sold at and during the aforementioned Feast by the Shore; and Section 168-22 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay so as to allow the sale of beer during the Feast by the Shore, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Parks, is hereby authorized to provide the abovementioned property and equipment to St. Boniface Martyr Church, for its Feast by the Shore to be held from Thursday, May 16, 2019 through Sunday, May 19, 2019, said property and equipment to be delivered as abovementioned, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. St. Boniface Martyr Church shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits for its Feast by the Shore, and will furnish copies of same to the Department of Parks prior to the start of the Feast;
- 2. Fees for the use of the showmobile and portable lights shall be paid to Town in accordance with Resolution No. 174-2017;
- 3. St. Boniface Martyr Church shall be responsible for 24 hour security at Harry Tappen Beach from Sunday, May 12, 2019 through Monday, May 20, 2019;
- 4. The use of all Town property shall be in conformance with the direction of the Commissioner of the Department of Parks, or his duly authorized designee;
- 5. The said organization shall comply with all ordinances of the Town of Oyster Bay, both in its use of Town property, and in conduct of the aforementioned activities, except for Sections 168-5B and 168-22, as indicated above; and
- 6. The said organization shall file a Certificate of Insurance with the Office of the Town Clerk, indicating said organization maintains commercial general liability insurance, in the amounts of \$1,000,000 with a general aggregate of \$2,000,000 and naming the Town as an additional insured, in connection with the aforementioned activities.

168-22. No person shall bring beer, ale or any other alcoholic beverage into any park or beach.

Other items that require Town Board authorization are:

The use of a showmobile and portable lights from Thursday, May 16 through Sunday, May 19, 2019. Fees are in conjunction with Resolution 174-2017, pertaining to permits for showmobile and portable lights.

The use of 20 trash receptacles and 20 picnic tables will be provided by the Parks Department.

Page 2, St. Boniface

It is understood that St. Boniface must obtain insurance and all necessary permits from various regulating agencies in relation to the operation of this Feast by the Shore and supply the Department of Parks with copies of same. These copies must be in our possession prior to the start of the Feast by the Shore.

It is understood that St. Boniface will provide adequate 24-hour security at Tappen Beach from Sunday, May 12 through Monday, May 20. Security will include night coverage and patrol of the beachfront.

Town Board authorization is requested for the use of Tappen Beach and Town Equipment from Sunday, May 12, 2019 to Monday, May 20, 2019 by St. Boniface Martyr Church for its annual Feast by the Shore.

2018 OPERATION & MAINTENANCE FUNDING

The Town of Oyster Bay has been approved to receive 2018 Clean Vessel Assistance Program Operation and Maintenance (CVAP O&M) funding provided through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation. This grant funding may provide up to \$5,000.00 in reimbursement for the operation and maintenance costs in running a pump out boat/pump out station at each marina that the Town provides this service. The Town offers pump out services at Tobay Beach & Marina, Theodore Roosevelt Beach and Marina, and Tappen Beach and Marina thereby making the maximum 2018 CVAP O&M grant award equal to \$15,000.00. Receipt of this grant funding is contingent upon the execution of a Clean Vessel Assistance Operation and Maintenance Agreement between the Town of Oyster Bay and the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Town Board authorize the Town to enter into a Clean Vessel Assistance Operation and Maintenance Agreement with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation to be approved by the Town Attorney and further authorize the Supervisor and/or his designee to execute said agreement.



This Annual Operation and Maintenance Grant Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), by and between the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, a New York State public benefit corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation"), with offices located at 625 Broadway, Albany, New York, 12207-2997, and the Recipient identified on the cover page hereof, with offices located at Town Offices, 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, NY 11771.

WHEREAS, the Corporation is the agency of the State of New York which is the recipient of federal grant funds provided under the Clean Vessel Act Grant Program (hereinafter referred to as the "CVA"), such program being authorized pursuant to the Clean Vessel Act of 1992 and the regulations promulgated thereunder for the purpose of providing federal grant funds to states for the construction, renovation, operation and maintenance of pumpout and dump stations to improve water quality; surveying existing pumpout and dump stations; and implementing education programs to increase public awareness of the use and availability of pumpout and dump stations to receive sewage waste from marine recreational vessels; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation ("DEC") is an executive department of the State of New York with jurisdiction over the environmental policy, law and regulations of this State, pursuant to, among other things, Environmental Conservation Law ("ECL") Section 3-0301; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1285(5) of the Public Authorities Law, the Corporation is empowered to provide certain assistance to municipalities, persons and state agencies, including, among other things, advice on matters relating to the identification, collection, handling, separation and disposal of waste, and on matters relating to the prevention and control of air emissions and water discharges subject to regulation pursuant to the ECL; and

WHEREAS, the Recipient has submitted a Clean Vessel Assistance Program ("Program" or "CVAP") Letter of Intent (the "LOI") to the Corporation seeking financial assistance for reimbursement of costs incurred by Recipient for the operation and maintenance ("O&M") of the project(s) listed in the LOI;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and assurances in this Agreement, the Corporation and the Recipient agree as follows:

- 1. The Recipient previously submitted the LOI to the Corporation for grant assistance under the Program, for costs associated with the O&M of the project(s) as described in the LOI.
- 2. The representations set forth in the LOI are true and correct as of the date hereof, and Recipient has complied with, performed and will continue to comply with and perform all of the covenants and promises therein.

If the project(s) is conveyed or transferred to a third party, the Agreement shall be incorporated in the sales contract, and the Recipient and purchaser, with the consent of the Corporation, shall execute an assignment and assumption agreement of the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement.
- 17. Recipient acknowledges that continuation of the Program is dependent upon the availability of CVA funding from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, and to the extent



This Department is in receipt of correspondence, from Anthony Guardino, Esq., Farrell Fritz Attorneys, P.C., dated February 13, 2019, requesting to rescind Restrictive Covenants for the above mentioned property.

On September 25, 1956, the Town Board approved a Town Board Resolution which granted permission to erect and maintain a gasoline service station on the subject premises

According to the Declaration of Restrictive Covenants enacted pursuant to Town Board meeting of September 25, 1956, Number 6, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties that the covenants and restrictions herein contained may be altered, modified or rescinded at any time by the then owner or owners of the premises with the consent of the Town.

On April 18, 1958, the Town Board approved a Town Board Resolution which granted permission to erect and maintain a public garage on the subject premises.

According to the Declaration of Restrictive Covenants enacted pursuant to Town Board meeting of April 18, 1958, Number 5, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that the covenants and restrictions herein contained may be altered, modified or rescinded at any time by the then owner of the premises with the consent of the Town.

The present property owner has agreed to voluntarily surrender the special use permit for the public garage and the gasoline service station and has submitted a Site Plan application for the construction of a 14,698 one story retail building with drive-thru and associated site improvements. The proposed retail building with drive-thru is an as-of-right use however the hours of operation will require a variance from the Zoning Board of Appeals.

As you know, this firm represents CVS Pharmacy and First Hartford Realty Corp., in connection with their application for site plan approval to construct a new CVS Pharmacy at 140 Stewart Avenue in Bethpage (the "Property"). For purposes of the request made in this letter, I also represent the property owners, Caskrow I Realty, LLC (Lot 22) & Caskrow Realty III, LLC (Lot 21).

As you know, my clients' engineer, VHB Engineering, received a comment letter from the Planning Division, dated July 9, 2018, indicating that the Property is encumbered by a Town Board resolution of April 18, 1958 (copy attached), and associated Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions,¹ which must be extinguished prior to the issuance of building permits. This Declaration relates to a special permit that was issued in connection with an application to erect and operate a "Public Automobile Garage and Showroom" on the Property. There was also an Agreement between the then-Applicant and the Town of Oyster Bay indicating that the covenants and restrictions contained therein were conditions of the granting of the special

permit by the Town Board for a Public Automobile Garage and Showroom.

By e-mail received on February 11, 2019, Scott Byrne, the Superintendent of Planning, brought to my attention a yet another Town Board resolution, dated September 25, 1956, and an Agreement, dated September 7, 1956 (copies attached) that must also be extinguished prior to the issuance of building permits. We have reviewed the revised plans referenced above and offer the following comments that were not addressed as requested in the previous letter dated July 9, 2018.

#### **ZONING:**

- 1. The applicant should anticipate seeking a variance from the Zoning Board of Appeals for the following:
  - Section §246-5.5.3.3 24 hour commercial use abutting a residential district.
- 2. The overall signage square footage for free standing signage should be measured from the outside of the structure surrounding the signage (main sign body). The applicant must provide the overall square footage of the free standing signage on the sign plans to demonstrate compliance with the Zoning Code. The overall square footage of the signage must correspond on the signage plans and the Site Plan. Adjust accordingly.

#### REFUSE AND RECYCLABLES STORAGE:

- The compactor enclosure elevations and details do not clearly portray if the fencing is completely enclosed. According to Section §246-7.2 in the Town Code, the enclosure must be designed to prevent access by rodents and the blowing away of refuse. Adjust accordingly.
- 2. The compactor enclosure plan has some illegible dimensions and words on it. Please adjust accordingly.

#### OTHER:

- In order for the Planning Division to send your application for a Planning Advisory Board hearing the applicant must obtain the approval from the Nassau County Public Works Department for 239F, New York State Department of Transportation and the Town's Department of Environmental Resources.
- For record keeping purposes the signage plan must have a title, page number and date.
- 3. The subject premises are encumbered by Town Board Resolution meeting of April 18, 1958 associated Declaration of Restrictive Covenants. These must be extinguished prior to issuance of any Building Permits. The property owner's attorney should submit a letter on

the owner's behalf requesting that the Town Board rescind the restrictive covenants. The letter should state that the owner is willing to surrender the special use permit granted in the Resolution and the owner is proposing an "as of right use" for the properties Zoning District.

Satisfactory resolution of the issues outlined above is essential to the completeness of the record and is necessary to allow the Planning Division to make a fully informed recommendation to the Department of Planning and Development. Accordingly, the applicant should revise the appropriate plans and augment existing documentation, by way of follow up correspondence, which provides suitable responses to these comments. The applicant should submit four full sets of revised plans.







WHEREAS, the rate sheet for the Game Day Program lists the cost of a full page in the Program as \$29,500.00, and the Mets have offered to give the Town a full page in the Program for the 2019 baseball season in exchange for fifty (50) single rounds of golf at the Town golf course, which rounds the Mets will use as promotional items for their fans; and

WHEREAS, according to Commissioner Pinto: i) the fifty rounds of golf have a value between \$4,000.00 and \$4,750.00, based on the Town's usual fee of \$80.00 per round for residents and \$95.00 for non-residents; ii) the Mets' use of the bartered rounds would be subject to availability in the discretion of the Commissioner and would be honored by the Town only on dates and times that would least affect the residents of the Town; and iii) the content of the page in the Program would be to promote the Town's parks and facilities and the programs conducted by the Department of Parks, and Commissioner Pinto requested Town Board authorization to proceed with the proposed barter transaction; and

WHEREAS, Steven C. Ballas, Comptroller, by memorandum dated March 11, 2019, advised that he has reviewed the proposed barter transaction between the Town and the New York Mets, and as a non-cash transaction it does not require any entries to the Town's fund level financial statements,

Joseph G. Pinto, Commissioner, and Gregory Skupinsky, Deputy Commissioner, Department of Parks, by memoranda dated March 7, 2019 and March 8, 2019, advised the Office of the Town Attorney that the New York Mets ("Mets") offered the Town an opportunity to advertise in the Mets' Game Day Program, which opportunity, in the opinion of the Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner, would be advantageous to the Town.

The Game Day Program is published by the Mets for the baseball season and is distributed at all 81 home games, with average attendance of approximately 40,000 spectators per game. The rate sheet for the publication lists the cost of a full page in the Program as \$29,500. The Mets have offered to give the Town a full page in the Program for the 2019 baseball season in exchange for fifty (50) single rounds of golf at the Town golf course, which rounds the Mets will use as promotional items for their fans. According to Commissioner Pinto, the 50 rounds of golf have a value between \$4,000 and \$4,750, based on the Town's usual fee of \$80 per round for residents and \$95 for non-residents. According to Commissioner Pinto, use of the bartered rounds would be subject to availability in the discretion of the Commissioner and would be honored by the Town only on dates and times that would least affect the residents of the Town

The content of the page in the Program would be to promote the Town's parks and facilities and the programs conducted by the Department of Parks.

Commissioner Pinto and Deputy Commissioner Skupinsky requested Town Board authorization to enter into a barter agreement with the Mets, to exchange fifty (50) rounds of golf at the Town Golf Course in exchange for granting the Town a full page in the Mets' Game Day Program for the 2019 season.

Since the Program must be prepared in time for Opening Day of the baseball season (April 4, 2019), it is requested that the rules be suspended and that this matter be placed on the March 12, 2019 Town Board calendar for action.
