
Special Use Pennit Extension Request - Resolution No. 269-2019 (May 7, 2019)

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose as a result of an incident that occurred on August 14, 2020, in front of the premises located at 158 Radcliff Drive, East Norwich. The insured's vehicle was a 2020 Honda Pilot, Black Edition (New York State License Plate: 5PD6129). The Honda Pilot was parked legally on the street in front of the insured's house, and was unoccupied at the time of the incident. A Town of Oyster Bay dump truck was passing between the Honda Pilot and a Town of Oyster Bay bucket truck that was parked on the opposite side of the street. As the dump truck passed between the two vehicles, its back gate clipped the bucket truck. The contact between the two vehicles caused the chain which held shut the swinging doors of the dump truck to fall off and onto the ground. The left door of the dump truck swung free, and as it did so, it hit the back and rear driver's side quarter panel of the Honda Pilot. The door caused extensive damage to the vehicle, including the destruction of the rear and side windows which had to be replaced. The amount of damage done to the Honda Pilot totaled \$12,496.96, including body work, part replacement, repainting, refinishing, parts, labor and towing fees. The statement given by the driver of the Town dump truck confirms the events described herein.

This matter cannot be settled for an amount lower than the total claim of \$12,496.96. It is this Office's opinion that this settlement is just, reasonable, and in the best interests of the Town, because liability on the part of the Town is clear. Moreover, the Kelley Blue Book value of the vehicle is listed as being between \$36,638.00 and \$39,127.00. Thus, it is more cost effective to settle the matter for the amount indicated. In light of the foregoing, the Office of the Town Attorney requests that the Town Board approve the proposed settlement.

We have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$12,496.96, together with a copy of the General Release executed by Claimant, GEICO General Insurance Company a/s/o Kristen Cruz. Additionally, we have attached a copy of the body shop estimate, and the claim payment detail sheets. The funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43020 602 0000 000.

Dear Mr. Kunzig:

PWGC is requesting additional funding to complete the above referenced project. This request is attributed to unforeseen efforts that were imposed by the Nassau County Department of Health and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. The following items describe the additional work that was required.

- The Nassau County Department of Health required the existing and proposed backwash treatment systems to the ground waters of the State be permitted with the NYSDEC. PWGC was required to obtain and Industrial SPDES permit from the NYSDEC. This required the preparation of an engineering report, plans, applications and numerous correspondences with the NYSDEC. The permit has is still ongoing and has not been resolved.
- 2. After the approval of the design plans and specification, the Nassau County Department of Health has required additional modifications to the system. PWGC had to prepare additional drawings, figures and attend site meetings with the contractor and negotiate change orders with the contractor.
- 3. Upon the final inspection of the treatment system, the Nassau County Department of Health has requested additional electrical modifications to the existing chemical treatment room. PWGC has had numerous discussions with the NCDHS to address these issues and negotiate change orders with the contractor so the work could be performed.

- 4. The Nassau County Department of Health imposed an onerous sampling regimen that required PWGC to be on-site for several days while the sampling was being completed.
- 5. The Nassau County Department of Health required PWGC to put valve tags on every valve in the iron removal treatment facility and to prepare operational and maintenance manuals with valve schedules.

PWGC is requesting an addition \$16,400 in funding to cover the additional project cost. This amount will enable PWGC to bring this project to final completion.

Town Board Resolution No. 805-2018 authorized this office to enter into the first, one-year extension and Town Board Resolution No. 781-2019 authorized the second, one-year extension.

Since any further extension of this contract would extend beyond three years from the date of the original contract, Guideline 6E of the Town's Procurement Policy requires this Department to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) before any further extension option is exercised. Therefore, this office issued pursuant to the Town's Procurement Policy, Requests for Proposals (RFPs) from fifty-five (55) firms interested in providing On-Call Technology Consulting Services to the Town for the period of April 1, 2021 through and including December 31, 2021. In addition, the RFP was posted on the Town's website.

Forty-five (45) responses were received by the February 23, 2021 response date. Three (3) firms replied after the due date and were deemed invalid. The evaluation and selection process was performed in compliance with the requirements of the Town's Procurement Policy. With the length of this contract and the feasibility of staffing during a global pandemic in mind, each response was carefully reviewed and evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Municipal Experience
- Qualifications
- Location
- Staffing
- Rates

A thorough review of each proposal revealed the following results:

- Local firms that could provide the staffing by the April 1, 2021 start date did not possess the necessary municipal experience or did not fall in the cost range deemed acceptable.
- Firms outside the tri-state area cannot provide adequate local staffing by the contract start date.
- Entities that submitted costs that were well below the current rates offered staffing that did not meet with the experience needed to complete the job duties as they are currently being performed.

Further, an opinion was sought from the Office of the Town Attorney pursuant to Guideline 6E of the Town's Procurement Policy, which confirms this office has satisfied the guidelines of the Town's procurement policy and further that this office may proceed to request Town Board authorization to extend the current contract under the same terms and conditions.

The Office of The Inspector General has reviewed the Contract and proposed vendor's disclosure questionnaire and is satisfied that the procurement Policy has been fulfilled.

We concur with the recommendation of L.K. McLean Associates, P.C. and request that Contract No. H19-196 be awarded to United Paving Corp, in the total bid amount of \$2,103,333.00 and that \$105,166.65 be applied to the low bid amount for a total bid encumbrance of \$2,208,499.65.

As the Town's Structural Engineering Consultant under the above-referenced contract, D&B Engineers and Architects (D&B) is pleased to submit this Task Order Proposal to provide assistance to the Town with professional engineering services related to the design and construction of bulkhead improvements at the TOBAY Beach Marina Facility to mitigate soil loss on the landward side of the bulkhead structure related to deterioration of the timber wales and timber sheeting.

As you are aware, an Engineering Report was developed by others in 2018 and revised in 2019 to document a 2018 investigation performed on the existing timber bulkhead structure and make recommendations relative to repair or replacement options.

The existing timber bulkhead was constructed in approximately 1990 and consists of 12-inch face piles, timber upper and lower wales, and 4-inch tongue/grove vertically oriented timber sheeting with lengths from 16 to 22-feet. The existing bulkhead is approximately 980-feet in length and includes 10-foot return sections on either end, oriented perpendicular to the bulkhead. The area of the existing bulkhead is categorized as a tidal wetland area by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).

The observations and recommendations of the Engineering Report generally indicate that the face piles and upper wale are in serviceable condition, however the lower wale and sheeting show significant deterioration and are contributing to soil migration through the bulkhead. The top cap and related strapping are damaged or missing in various locations. The structure as a whole appears straight and plumb, which suggests the bulkhead's tie-back system is intact and was designed correctly.

Based upon the existing condition of the timber bulkhead structure and our preliminary discussions regarding efficient repair/replacement alternatives, it is anticipated that this project will include rehabilitation of the existing bulkhead through sheeting reinforcement and replacement of existing deteriorated components with new. Maintenance dredging will be performed consistent with the terms of the NYSDEC's General Permit for Bulkhead Removal and Replacement, which allows for maintenance dredging of the area within 5-feet seaward of the bulkhead with seasonal restrictions.

As the project area is classified as a tidal wetland, the project will require preparation and submission of a Joint Application for Permit for review by the NYSDEC, the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the New York Department of State (NYDOS) for the proposed bulkhead work.

Additionally, as requested we will prepare a design memorandum to present and evaluate the two primary alternatives, including a full in-place replacement of the existing bulkhead with new materials and the repair and re-facing of the existing bulkhead. The memorandum will detail aspects of each alternative, including scope elements, permitting aspects, construction costs, timeframes and service life. These two alternatives have been selected for consideration as they represent the most favorable approaches to addressing the failures observed in the existing structure and will not require permitting efforts and risks related to the seaward replacement of the existing bulkhead and associated landfilling between the new and existing systems, which represents a 'presumptively incompatible use' in the NYSDEC's Tidal Wetlands regulations.

With the exception to the overall length of the existing bulkhead, the in-place replacement or the refacing options conform to the requirements of the NYSDEC's General Permit for Bulkhead Removal and Replacement, which suggests that these alternatives are consistent with standard permitting criteria and practices and are therefore less likely to be met with objection and an extended regulatory review period. It is our experience that the permitting for the bulkhead re-facing including maintenance dredging can likely be obtained within 9-12 months from the date of filing.

Our proposed scope includes effort related to an underwater investigation of the bulkhead with a certified dive team as we perform our inspection of the exposed portion of the bulkhead. This preventative measure will serve to protect against potential cost overruns in the construction phase related to underwater deterioration that may have been missed or has progressed since the previous inspection.

In order to support the Town with this project, we propose the following detailed scope of work, which is based upon the assumed alternative to repair and reface the existing structure:

A. SCOPE OF WORK

Technical Design Memorandum

- Prepare a brief technical letter report to describe the relevant aspects of the in-kind replacement and re-facing options, including preparation of conceptual cost estimates for these two alternatives and discussion of material options and relative costs and benefits including service life expectancies and permitting timeframes. The report will include a description of construction activities and approximate timelines associated with permitting and construction of each alternative.
- Meet with Town representatives to discuss the technical report and options, including
 relative costs and benefits of using composite structural sheeting and facing materials in
 lieu of treated timber to accomplish the bulkhead improvements.

Detailed Design

- Perform a site visit to inspect and confirm existing conditions represented in the existing
 Engineering Report and asses any additional damage visually observable from grade.
 Discuss and record any recent damage that may not be represented in the Engineering
 Report with Town representatives.
- Perform an underwater investigation of the concealed portions of the existing bulkhead structure to document current conditions and necessary replacements. Two days of dive team investigation are included in our scope.
- Review available drawings and other data relative to the existing bulkhead system and surrounding areas.
- Perform a topographic field survey to document the details and arrangement of the
 existing bulkhead system and related marina features, including the paved access road,
 dock ramps, bulkhead-mounted utility pedestals and adjacent areas for the purpose of
 development of an existing bulkhead and site plan, including actual face pile locations.
 Install a benchmark on site and develop related project stationing for use in design and
 construction efforts.
- Perform a bathymetric survey of the area within a 10-foot seaward distance from the
 existing bulkhead to document the existing submerged topography in the area of the
 bulkhead to determine maintenance dredging requirements that will accompany the
 bulkhead rehabilitation work to restore lost depth in the area of the existing bulkhead.
- Prepare plans and details to define the construction requirements related to refacing the
 existing timber sheeting and wale replacement. Develop relief drainage details to mitigate

erosion during storm surges which may top the bulkhead structure. Identify areas and appropriate requirements for the repair of settlement behind the existing bulkhead.

- Develop recommended sequencing of construction activities and related construction requirements to avoid impacts to seasonal marina operation.
- Develop construction requirements related to dewatering and reuse of dredged soils, coordinate with the Town to designate suitable soils disposal locations on site, as available and consistent with NYSDEC criteria.
- Prepare construction specifications to define specific requirements related to construction of the work to accompany the drawings.
- Coordinate the detailed design documents with requirements resulting from the Joint Application Permit to the NYSDEC, USACE and NYDOS. Incorporate the conditions of the permit into the project construction documents.
- Provide the draft detailed design drawings to the Town for review and comment. Meet with the Town to discuss questions and comments. Integrate the Town's comments into the final certified bidding documents.
- Prepare a construction cost estimate for bidding of the project, based upon the final drawings.
- Prepare bid sheets and integrate the Town's front end documents into the construction documents. Solicit the Town's endorsement of the documents for public bidding.

Wetland Permit Application

- Determine applicability of state and/or federal wetland jurisdiction based on the final project description, design, and footprint.

- Prepare the draft Joint Application for Permit package including application forms, project location/site maps, aerials, photographs, design drawings, and project narrative, for review by the Town.
- Revise the Joint Application for Permit package based on Town comments.
- Prepare the final Joint Application for Permit package and submit on the Town's behalf to the appropriate regulatory agencies for review and approval.

- Review and evaluate permit conditions and incorporate regulatory aspects of the work into the construction documents and provide guidance to the Town on complying with any special permit conditions and work notification requirements.



As the Town's approved consultant for the above referenced contract, D&B Engineers and Architects (D&B) is pleased to present this proposal to the Town of Oyster Bay (the Town) to conduct Post-Termination groundwater monitoring at the Old Bethpage Landfill. D&B previously completed several years of quarterly groundwater monitoring in accordance with the Town's Consent Decree with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), and assisted the Town in obtaining approval from the NYSDEC in 2016 to enter into three years of semi-annual Post-Termination groundwater monitoring for which sampling and reporting has now been completed. Our work will include supporting the Town with negotiations with NYSDEC on an as-needed basis on groundwater sampling and contamination issues.

As requested by the Town, D&B proposes the following Post-Termination groundwater monitoring tasks for the 2021 reporting year, unless otherwise modified by NYSDEC correspondence and negotiation.

- 1. Post-Termination Groundwater Monitoring:

 - b. The following 13 wells will be sampled during each sampling round: LF-1, LF-2, MW-5B, MW-6A, MW-6B, MW-6C, MW-6E, MW-6F, MW-8A, MW-8B, MW-9B, MW-9C and OBS-1. Note that Well MW-6A has been observed to be dry during several sampling events and will only be sampled if sufficient groundwater is present in the well.


- c. Two semi-annual sampling rounds are anticipated to be completed in 2021.
- 2. Groundwater Monitoring Reports:
 - a. Draft Semi-annual Groundwater Monitoring Reports for each of the two (2) sampling events will be submitted to the Town for review.
 - b. Each semi-annual report will be a stand-alone report and will include the data obtained from all the previous Post-Termination Monitoring and Reporting events.
 - c. D&B will prepare trend graphs for key contaminants and analyze Post-Termination Monitoring concentration trends.
 - d. After Town review, D&B will revise each semi-annual report, as required, and submit the final report to NYSDEC, no more than 60 days from each sampling event.
 - e. A maximum of five (5) copies of each final report will be submitted.
- 3. Laboratory analyses for all samples will be conducted under a separate contract, as follows:

- 2. Attend meetings and represent the Town's interests with regard to merit and justification of future sampling and monitoring at the landfill, as may be necessary.

The proposed fees to complete the above tasks will be based upon time and expenses actually incurred in relation to the above scope in accordance with our On-Call Agreement with the Town and will not exceed a value of \$45,000 for the 2021 scope defined above.





Pursuant to Town Board Resolutions 817-2019 and 156-2020, Cashin Associates, P.C. (CA) has been providing on-call engineering services in 2020 for the operation and development of the Old Bethpage Solid Waste Disposal Complex (OBSWDC). CA enters 2021 having performed the following solid waste management tasks for the Town of Oyster Bay in 2020:

- Annual reports to the NYSDEC detailing tonnages of waste handled at the OBSWDC in 2019.
- Site report for the Seville Central Mix Corp., detailing environmental issues and suggested boundaries, in support of lease negotiations.
- Finalization of the Town's Local Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP).
- Negotiations in support of granting Winters Bros. Recycling (WBR) a third term under Contract DPW 09-999 for disposing of the Town's MSW.
- WBR baler proposal analysis.
- Recommendations for upgrading the yard waste program, especially with respect to collecting leaves and grass clippings.
- Final (conditional) approval of the Alliance Landfill and initiation of the approval process for the Modern and Conestoga landfills, all in Pennsylvania.
- Preparation of a comprehensive 120-w RFP, including vendor conferences and establishment of evaluation criteria, for disposing of the Solid Waste Disposal District's (SWDD) MSW and recyclables.
- Letter report to DEC updating that agency on the status of all solid waste contracts, the baler installation at the transfer station, and the new 120-w RFP for solid waste management.

For CY 2021, CA anticipates being called upon to assist the Town with the following solid waste task groups (per our technical proposal of November 14, 2019):

Task Group A. Preparation of Waste and Recycling Contracts/Planning and Design of New Solid Waste Facilities

- Evaluation of responses to the 120-w RFP issued in October 2020 for disposal of the Town's solid wastes will be of paramount importance in the first half of 2020. CA will continue to chair the Solid Waste Task Force assigned the responsibility of evaluating proposals for disposing of the Town's residential solid waste. Unlike the previous RFP, this one:
 - 1) Emphasizes all components of the waste stream, especially MSW and recyclables.
 - 2) Allows vendors to utilize parcels at the OBSWDC previously occupied by tenants.
 - 3) Allows vendors to accept out-of-town recyclables.
 - 4) Invites innovative technologies for waste reduction, processing and/or disposal, including construction of new facilities.
- CA will assist DPW in evaluating vendor proposals for replacing or renovating the Transfer Station, scale house, tarping station, etc., or for new facilities such as baler building, off-site transloading station, relocated Transfer Station, or even a new recycling facility (e.g. MRF). CA has considerable recent experience in providing these services for both the public and private sector. We would expect to work closely with key Town personnel and prominent solid waste handling vendors to ensure that a balance is struck among the Town's needs, the requirements of the regulatory agencies, and the practical costs and benefits of addressing those needs. This task will include preparing for and conducting vendor interviews and summarizing the results.

Task Group B. Private Vendor Liaison/Evaluation of Proposed Waste Disposal Facilities

• Liaison will pertain to long-term vendors (e.g., the firms operating the solid waste transfer station and the single stream, glass and yard waste disposal contractors), as well as short-term vendors that may be called in during the course of the year to undertake smaller or temporary tasks, such as transfer and disposal of street sweepings. CA's responsibilities will typically entail monitoring the work progress and the quality of services provided by the private vendors, reporting to the Town any deficiencies in the vendors' work, meeting with the Town to discuss problems with the vendors' work, and conveying the Town's requirements for correcting deficiencies back to the vendor.

As directed by the Town, CA will document in writing all problems involving the activities of the on-site private vendors in order to create a suitable "paper trail" for facilitating actions by the Town to address or correct unsatisfactory vendor performance. CA will also review contract documents which cover services provided by each private vendor to ensure that the vendor's work product complies with contract specifications and NYSDEC regulations.

CA will attend regular meetings with the Town and the solid waste and recyclables hauling
contractors. These meetings will be held at intervals to be determined by the Town, as required
to ensure smooth continuous operations or to address any significant problems. Such meetings
typically include the following agenda items: conditions of transfer station and haul roads,

changes in key personnel, and status of vendor subcontracts. CA's main responsibilities under this task will be to provide the Town with technical consultation, and to record meeting notes and issue written minutes, and to ensure that the vendors' operations are in conformance with their contracts with the Town and with the requirements of the appropriate regulatory agencies.

• CA will provide engineering, environmental and technical evaluation of in-state or out-of-state disposal facilities in use and/or proposed by private on-site vendors. CA can provide whatever back-up technical evaluation is required by the Town including: condition surveys, environmental compliance assessments, code compliance inspections, review of designs for facility modifications, pre-demobilization surveys, and operational efficiency reviews. Potential waste disposal facilities include sanitary landfills, recycling facilities and waste to energy plants, as well as intermediate waste transfer stations. Currently, CA is following an established protocol to evaluate alternative MSW disposal sites proposed by Winters Bros. Recycling. In 2021, we expect to issue a final approval of the Alliance Landfill in PA, and conditional approvals of the Modern and Conestoga landfills, also in PA.

Task Group C. Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) Implementation

- As part of this task, CA will ensure that the Town remains mindful of the policies and practices
 outlined in the SWMP, especially as they pertain to implementing the solid waste management
 objectives contained therein (Chapter 7), as well as the revised Part 360 regulations, including
 and especially recently revised reporting requirements. Some of the important implementation
 objectives scheduled for 2020 included collection of data on commercially generated waste,
 C&D debris, and waste flows associated with other solid waste facilities in the SWDD.
- These investigations will be continued in 2021. In addition, per the SWMP, CA will 1) explore ways to reduce municipally generated waste, and to improve the yard waste collection program, and 2) evaluate current composting programs in the region.

Task Group D. Design Review and Oversight of Construction Activities

- This task pertains to modifications of existing facilities or construction of non-major, new
 facilities. (CY 2021 may be impacted by the results of the new 120-w RFP solicitation
 currently being prepared.) Under this task, CA will perform design work and land surveys,
 prepare bid documents, and provide on-site inspection services during the course of any
 contract work.
- If this task involves repairs, CA will oversee all repairs and replacement of structures and equipment, to ensure that such work is performed in accordance with system requirements (including manufacturer specifications) and is consistent with acceptable general work practices.
- Such services may be called upon for transfer/tarping station modifications, circulation pattern improvements, further development of the so-called yard waste deck, the areas previously occupied by lessees or the C & D storage area.

Task Group E. Revision of the Town's Part 360 Permit/Consultation

- CA will assist in identifying, completing, processing and following-up on revisions, modifications and renewals of Town permits and registrations relating to its solid waste management facilities. CA can prepare the applications and associated documentation on behalf of the Town, as well as discuss permit requirements with regulatory agencies. For many years, CA has successfully obtained a series of NYSDEC Part 360 operation permits for the OBSWDC. The most recent five-year permit was issued in June 2018. In 2019, an update to the Engineering Report was triggered by the revision to the Town's single stream recycling (SSR) program.
- In addition, CA will be available in an on-call capacity to provide technical assistance to the Town with regard to any unexpected issues that may arise relative to the Town's solid waste management program. These may include, at the Town's direction, review of permit requirements for new and modified facilities, technical assistance in preparing permit applications, responding to notices of violation, interaction with NYSDEC to ensure that permit applications are complete, technical assistance in responding to NYSDEC regarding other permitting issues, and similar activities. Most importantly, in the event major, new facilities are proposed at the OBSWDC under the 120-w RFP currently on the street, CA will serve as liaison among the vendor(s), Town and any other participating municipal agencies to ensure that any new facilities are properly permitted, licensed or registered.
- CA will assist the Town in completing and filing with NYSDEC the 2020 Transfer Station Facility Annual Report. This effort will take place during the first quarter of 2021.

Task Group F. Meetings and Correspondence with Regulatory Agencies

- At the Town's request, CA will attend meetings with representatives of regulatory agencies (e.g., U.S. EPA, NYS Department of Law, NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, Nassau County Department of Health, Nassau County Department of Public Works, etc.). In the past few years, CA has been heavily involved in such inter-agency coordination as a result of the Town's renewal of its Part 360 permit as well as post-Sandy debris stockpiling, disposal and reporting. CA will prepare minutes of each such meeting in order to provide a written record of the participating personnel, issues discussed, and the understandings reached.
- This task will entail drafting letters for transmitting documents or otherwise simply updating regulatory agencies on the status of the Town's solid waste programs. It is also recommended that notices be provided to these agencies advising them of any milestones achieved by the Town in its efforts to comply with regulations. All such correspondence will be submitted in draft form for the Town's review prior to agency submission.

Task Group G. Miscellaneous Services

If called upon, CA will provide analysis and recommendations on policy issues related to waste
regulations, regional trends in solid waste management, union work rules, state-of-the-art in
collection and processing equipment, the interstate regulation of waste flows, and new
developments in rail haul regulations.

- As requested by the Town, CA will conduct supplemental engineering inspections of the
 facilities at the OBSWDC. These inspections will typically entail the supervision of major
 repairs, punch list inspections for contract close-outs, or trouble-shooting tenant related issues.
 CA will be continuously available on an on-call basis, including during off-hours (i.e., nights,
 weekends, and holidays) to attend to emergency situations.
- CA proposes to continue technical assistance going forward as required for the remaining tenant at the OBSWDC. CA will regularly continue to monitor that tenant's activities to ensure that they pose no threats to the environment, create unsafe conditions, or interfere with landfill operations. For the three vacated parcels, if asked, we will continue the program of environmental testing to ensure that all properties are remediated to the appropriate standards.

CA proposes to perform the scope of services described herein under Contract No. PWC-31-20 as authorized by Town Board Resolution 817-2019. In addition, CA hereby proposes to utilize the services of Germano & Cahill, P.C. as a subconsultant. G & C's knowledge and experience with legislative solid waste issues on Long Island, including existing and proposed statutes and waste flow control findings, will provide a valuable perspective to the Solid Waste Task Force as it evaluates vendor proposals for MSW/recyclables disposal. Germano & Cahill's proposal is attached.

We respectfully request that the Town authorize a sum of \$262,500. for continuation of our services in 2021. A breakdown of this total by task grouping is provided in the attached table.

As always, we appreciate this opportunity to continue our solid waste consulting services to the Town of Oyster Bay. Please let me know if you have any questions or desire additional information.



North Shore Vendor Day Letter of Request:

On Long Island, nitrogen pollution from outdated septic systems has been named the number one cause of harmful algal blooms, fish kills, and the overall decline of the shellfish industry. Innovative Advanced (IA) nitrogen-reducing wastewater treatment systems can now significantly improve water quality conditions on Long Island. However, IA technology is relatively new and an overall unfamiliarity of the technology has caused a slowdown in installations. The objective of North Shore Vendor Day is to provide technical professionals with the opportunity to gain expertise in IA technology. 

The design for this project has been completed and approved by your Department. The bids for this project were received on February 17, 2021. Eleven (11) bids were received and lowest bidder was Metro Paving LLC. We are submitting a proposal for engineering services relative to the Phase I Construction of this project. We propose to provide the following services during the construction of this project.


CONSTRUCTION SERVICES

- Print additional copies of plans and specifications as required for the Town, the Contractor, and Utilities during construction.
- Attend pre-construction meeting and bi-weekly meetings with the Contractor, and Town Representatives. Weekly meeting minutes will be prepared and submitted to all attendees.
- Coordinate and schedule all other construction phase engineering activities with the Contractor, Town, and Engineering staff.
- LiRo has contacted all utility companies regarding the proposed scope of work and no proposed utility work is anticipated for this construction phase.
- Review the Contractor's submissions of his proposed material suppliers, sub-contractors, concrete mix design and asphalt mix design; recommend approval as necessary.
- Review Contractor's proposals for modifications or substitutions.
- Maintain files of construction correspondence and related documents.
- Provide full time inspections during construction to verify that the new curb, curb and gutter, drainage facilities, valley gutters, and other new construction conforms to the design grades.
- Observe proof-rolling of the subgrade and determine undercut required from observations of subgrade deflection under specified wheel load. Mark out areas where subgrade reinforcement is required.
- Review Compressive Strength of Concrete reports prepared by others for compliance with specified strength, slump, air content, etc. Review PC Concrete and Asphalt Concrete batch plant reports prepared by others, for the compliance with mix design criteria, aggregate gradations, temperatures, etc. Prepare reports as required for the information of the Town and the Project Engineer.



Be it enacted by the TOWN BOARD of THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY as follows:

Section 1. Amend Chapter 103 - Dogs and Other Animals, Article IV, of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay, to read as follows:

Article IV Fowl

- § 103-19 **Definitions.** § 103-20 **Prohibition.**
- § 103-21 Penalties for offenses. § 103-22 Applicability.

§ 103-19 **Definitions.**

For the purpose of this article, unless otherwise expressly stated or unless the context or subject matter requires otherwise:

FEED

Shall mean to give, place, expose, deposit, distribute, or scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting, or enticing fowl.

FOWL

Shall include:

PIGEONS

Those domestic varieties belonging to the order Columbiformes.

WATERFOWL

Those species belonging to the order Anseriformes, including but not limited to mute swans, Canada geese, ducks, and mallards and any other waterfowl falling under the jurisdiction of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.



PERSON

Any individual, company, partnership, corporation, limited partnership, joint venture, or other legal entity.

TOWN PROPERTY

Any land which is owned, maintained, leased, or managed by the Town of Oyster Bay for any purpose whatsoever, including, but not limited to parks, preserves, beaches and drains.

§ 103-20 **Prohibition.**

No person shall feed or provide food for any fowl on Town property or privately owned property located within the Town at any time of the year.

§ 103-21 Penalties for offenses.

A violation of this article shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$500. Any subsequent violation occurring within five years of the date of such first violation shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250, nor more than \$750.


§ 103-22 Applicability.

- A. The provisions of this article shall not apply to property owned by or under the jurisdiction of other municipal authorities, the State of New York, and any agency thereof or the government of the United States of America.
- B. The above prohibition shall not apply to the feeding of domesticated or confined fowl, including those confined in zoos, animal shelters, or animal care facilities.
- C. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit keeping, filling or maintaining a non-commercial bird feeder, unless said activity constitutes an attractant and its cessation is ordered by a Town enforcement officer in furtherance of the intent of this Article.
- Section 2. SEQRA Determination. It is hereby determined pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. Section 101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., that the adoption of this local law will not have a significant impact on the environment and that the adoption of this local law constitutes a Negative Declaration in accordance with the New York State Environmental Conservation Law and its applicable regulations thereon.
- Section 3. Severability. If any section, subdivision or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, subdivision or provision of or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law, or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances.



In September, 2020, Labor Law § 27-c was enacted, which required public employers to "prepare a plan for the continuation of operations in the event that the Governor declares a state disaster emergency involving a communicable disease." Under the statute, the plan was to be developed by the employer in the first instance, then shared with the employees' union by February 4, 2021, and must be adopted by April 1, 2021.

Attached is the Town's draft Health Emergency Plan. As required by the statute, the draft was shared with the Union, which offered its assent thereto. Consequently, it is recommended and requested that the Town Board adopt the draft as the Town's Health Emergency Plan, and authorize the Supervisor, or his designee, to execute same, which shall take effect on April 1, 2021.

Kindly suspend the rules and add this matter to the March 23, 2021 Town Board Action Calendar.



Purpose, Scope, Situation Overview, and Assumptions

Purpose

This plan has been developed in accordance with the amended New York State Labor Law Section 27-c and New York State Education Law Section 2801-a(k), (I), as amended. These laws were amended on September 7, 2020, by legislation that requires public employers to adopt a plan for operations in the event of a declared public health emergency involving a communicable disease. The plan includes the identification of essential positions, facilitation of remote work for non-essential positions, provision of personal protective equipment, and protocols for supporting contact tracing.

Scope

This plan was developed exclusively for and is applicable to the TOWN OF OYSTER BAY (the "Town"). This plan is pertinent to a declared public health emergency in the State of New York which may impact Town operations; and it is in the interest of the safety of Town employees and contractors, and the continuity of Town operations that we have promulgated this plan.

Situation Overview

On March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared a pandemic for the novel coronavirus which causes the COVID-19 severe acute respiratory syndrome. The Town developed this plan in accordance with amended laws to support continued resilience for a continuation of the spread of this disease or for other infectious diseases which may emerge and cause a declaration of a public health emergency.

The health and safety of Town employees and contractors is crucial to maintaining our mission essential operations. The Town encourages all employees and contractors to use the most recent <u>CDC Guidance for Keeping Workplaces</u>, <u>Schools</u>, <u>Homes</u>, <u>and Commercial Establishments Safe</u>. The fundamentals of reducing the spread of infection include:

- Using hand sanitizer and washing hands with soap and water frequently, including:
 - o After using the restroom
 - o After returning from a public outing
 - After touching/disposing of garbage
 - o After using public computers, touching public tables, and countertops, etc.
- Practicing social distancing when possible
- Not entering the work place if you feel ill.
- · Notifying your supervisor immediately and going home if you are feeling ill or have a fever
- If you start to experience coughing or sneezing, step away from people and food, cough or sneeze into the crook of your arm or a tissue, the latter of which should be disposed of immediately
- · Cleaning and disinfecting workstations at the beginning, middle, and end of each shift
- Following other guidance which may be published by the CDC, the State Department of Health, or County health officials.

Planning Assumptions

This plan was developed based on information, best practices, and guidance available as of the date of publication. Although this plan was developed to largely reflect the circumstances of the current Coronavirus pandemic, it is also generally applicable to other infectious disease outbreaks.

The following assumptions have been made in the development of this plan:

- The health and safety of Town employees and contractors, and their families, is of utmost importance
- The circumstances of a public health emergency may directly impact Town operations.
- The impacts a public health emergency will upon the Town's ability to respond to the health emergency, with appropriate safety measures put into place and adjustments made to operations to maximize safety.
- The public and Town residents expect the Town to maintain a level of mission essential operations
- Resource support from other jurisdictions may be limited based upon the level of impact the public health emergency has upon them
- Supply chains, particularly those for personal protective equipment (PPE) and cleaning supplies, may be heavily impacted, resulting in considerable delays in procurement
- The operations of other entities, including the private sector (vendors, contractors, etc.), non-profit
 organizations, and other governmental agencies and services may also be impacted due to the public
 health emergency, causing delays or other disruptions in their services
- Emergency measures and operational changes may need to be adjusted based upon the specific circumstances and impacts of the public health emergency, as well as guidance and direction from public health officials and the governor
- Per S8617B/A10832, 'essential employee' is defined as a public employee or contractor that is required to be physically present at a work site to perform their job
- Per S8617B/A10832, 'non-essential employee' is defined as a public employee or contractor that is not required to be physically present at a work site to perform their job

Concept of Operations

The Town Supervisor, or his designee, hold the authority to execute and direct the implementation of this plan. Implementation, monitoring of operations, and adjustments to plan implementation may be supported by additional personnel, at the discretion and direction of the Town Supervisor or his designee.

Upon the determination of implementing this plan, all Town employees and contractors shall be notified by email or written memorandum, with details provided as possible and necessary, with additional information and updates provided on a regular basis. Other interested parties, such as vendors, will be notified by phone and/or email as necessary. The Town's Public Information Office will maintain communications with the public and constituents as needed throughout the implementation of this plan.

The Town Supervisor, or his designee, will maintain awareness of information, direction, and guidance from public health officials and the Governor's office, directing the implementation of changes as necessary.

Upon conclusion of the public health emergency, the Town Supervisor, or his designee, will direct the resumption of normal operations or operations with modifications as necessary.

Mission Essential Functions

When confronting events that disrupt normal operations, the Town of Oyster Bay is committed to ensuring that essential functions will be continued even under the most challenging circumstances.

Essential functions are those functions that enable an organization to:

- 1. Maintain the safety of employees, contractors, and Town residents
- 2. Provide vital services
- 3. Provide services required by law
- 4. Sustain quality operations
- 5. Uphold the core values of the Town of Oyster Bay

The Town of Oyster Bay has identified as critical only those essential functions that are required or are necessary to provide vital services. During activation of this plan, all other activities may be suspended to enable the organization to concentrate on providing the critical functions and building the internal capabilities necessary to increase and eventually restore operations. Appropriate communications with employees, contractors, our constituents, and other stakeholders will be an ongoing priority.

The mission essential functions for the Town of Oyster Bay have been identified as:

Essential Positions

Each essential function identified above requires certain positions on-site to effectively operate. The table below identifies the positions or titles that are essential to be staffed on-site for the continued operation of each essential function. Note that while some functions and associated personnel may be essential, some of these can be conducted remotely and do not need to be identified in this section.

Reducing Risk Through Remote Work and Staggered Shifts

Through assigning certain staff to work remotely and by staggering weekly work shifts, 2 to 3 work shifts depending on shift size as defined by the department head, crowding and density at work sites may be decreased.

Remote Work Protocols

Non-essential employees and contractors able to accomplish their functions remotely will be enabled to do so at the greatest extent possible. Working remotely requires:

- 1. Identification of staff who will work remotely
- 2. Approval and assignment of remote work
- 3. Equipping staff for remote work, which may include:
 - a. Internet capable laptop
 - b. Necessary peripherals
 - c. Access to VPN and/or secure network drives
 - d. Access to software and databases necessary to perform their duties
 - e. A solution for telephone communications
 - i. Note that phone lines may need to be forwarded to off-site staff

As possible, 'essential' staff may be assigned to work remotely for part of their work week to reduce exposures. Further, business hours and locations of Town government may be altered to best accommodate public health protective actions for employees and the public. Alterations to building access and the means by which the public interacts with Town employees may also take place to support these protections. Protective actions may include, but are not limited to occupancy restrictions, protective barriers, and increased conduct of business by

internet, phone, or other means. Protective actions will be taken in accordance with County and State Health Department, and CDC guidelines and requirements.

Staggered Shifts

Implementing staggered shifts may be possible for personnel performing duties which are necessary to be performed on-site but perhaps less sensitive to being accomplished only within core business hours. As possible, management will identify opportunities for staff to work outside core business hours as a strategy of limiting exposure. Regardless of changes in start and end times of shifts, the Town of Oyster Bay will ensure that employees are provided with their typical or contracted minimum work hours per week. Staggering shifts requires:

- 1. Identification of positions for which work hours will be staggered
- 2. Approval and assignment of changed work hours

Personal Protective Equipment

The Department of General Services shall be responsible for coordinating the procurement and distribution of personal protective equipment (PPE) to employees.

The use of PPE to reduce the spread of infectious disease is important to supporting the health and safety of our employees and contractors. Potentially necessary PPE may include:

- Masks
- Face shields
- Gloves
- Disposable gowns and aprons
- Piexiglas
- Hand sanitizer

Note that while cleaning supplies are not PPE, there is a related need for cleaning supplies used to sanitize surfaces, as well as hand soap and hand sanitizer. The Coronavirus pandemic demonstrated that supply chains were not able to keep up with increased demand for these products early in the pandemic. As such, we are including these supplies in this section as they are pertinent to protecting the health and safety of our employees and contractors.

Protocols for providing PPE include the following:

- 1. Identification of need for PPE based upon job duties and work location
- 2. Procurement of PPE
 - a. As specified in the amended law, public employers must be able to provide at least two pieces of each required type of PPE to each essential employee and contractor during any given work shift for at least six months
 - b. Public employers must be able to mitigate supply chain disruptions to meet this requirement
- 3. Storage of, access to, and monitoring of PPE stock
 - a. PPE must be stored in a manner which will prevent degradation
 - b. Employees and contractors must have immediate access to PPE in the event of an emergency
 - c. The supply of PPE must be monitored to ensure integrity and to track usage rates
 - d. To the extent possible, PPE should be stockpiled in order to have adequate stock, particularly during the early stages of any pandemic or outbreak.

Staff Exposures, Cleaning, and Disinfection

Staff Exposures

Staff exposures are organized under several categories based upon the type of exposure and presence of symptoms. The Department of General Services shall be responsible to collect all necessary and relevant information in order to implement a testing, quarantine, and contact tracing program.

Following CDC guidelines, the Town have established the following protocols:

- A. If employees or contractors are exposed to a known case of communicable disease that is the subject of the public health emergency (defined as a 'close contact' with someone who is confirmed infected, which is a prolonged presence within six feet with that person):
 - Potentially exposed employees or contractors who do not have symptoms should remain at home or in a comparable setting and practice social distancing for the lesser of 14 days or other current CDC/public health guidance for the communicable disease in question.
 - a. As possible, these employees will be permitted to work remotely during this period of time
 if they are not ill.
 - b. The employee's respective Commissioner or Department Head must be notified and is responsible for ensuring these protocols are followed
 - c. See the section titled Documentation of Work Hours and Locations for additional information on contact tracing
 - CDC guidelines for COVID-19 provide that critical essential employees may be permitted to continue work following potential exposure, provided they remain symptom-free and additional precautions are taken to protect them, other employees and contractors, and our constituency/public.
 - a. Additional precautions will include the requirement of the subject employee or contractor, as well as others working in their proximity, to wear appropriate PPE at all times to limit the potential of transmission.
 - In-person interactions with the subject employee or contractor will be limited as much as
 possible.
 - c. Work areas in which the subject employee or contractor are present will be disinfected according to current CDC/public health protocol at least every hour, as practical. See the section on Cleaning and Disinfection for additional information on that subject.
 - d. If at any time they exhibit symptoms, refer to item B below.
 - e. The employee's respective Commissioner or Department Head is the decision-maker in these circumstances and is responsible for ensuring these protocols are followed
- B. If an employee or contractor exhibits symptoms of the communicable disease that is the subject of the public health emergency:
 - Employees and contractors who exhibit symptoms in the workplace should be immediately separated from other employees and visitors. They should immediately be sent home with a recommendation to contact their physician.
 - Employees and contractors who exhibit symptoms outside of work should notify their supervisor and stay home, with a recommendation to contact their physician.
 - 3. Employees should not return to work until they have met the criteria to discontinue home isolation per CDC/public health guidance and have consulted with a healthcare provider.

- 4. The Town of Oyster Bay will not require sick employees to provide a negative test result for the disease in question or healthcare provider's note to validate their illness, qualify for sick leave, or return to work; unless there is a recommendation from the CDC/public health officials to do so.
- CDC criteria for COVID-19 provides that persons exhibiting symptoms may return to work if at least 24 hours have passed since the last instance of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications. If the disease in question is other than COVID-19, CDC and other public guidance shall be referenced.
- The employee's respective Commissioner or Department Head must be informed in these circumstances and is responsible for ensuring these protocols are followed
- C. If an employee or contractor has tested positive for the communicable disease that is the subject of the public health emergency:
 - 1. Apply the steps identified in item B, above, as applicable.
 - Areas occupied for prolonged periods of time by the subject employee or contractor will be closed off.
 - a. CDC guidance for COVID-19 indicates that a period of 24 hours is ideally given before cleaning, disinfecting, and reoccupation of those spaces will take place. If this time period is not possible, a period of as long as possible will be given. CDC/public health guidance for the disease in question will be followed.
 - Any common areas entered, surfaces touched, or equipment used shall be cleaned and disinfected immediately.
 - c. See the section on Cleaning and Disinfection for additional information on that subject.
 - 3. Identification of potential employee and contractor exposures will be conducted
 - a. If an employee or contractor is confirmed to have the disease in question, contact tracing and quarantine shall occur pursuant to established Town practice. Confidentiality shall be maintained as required by law.
 - Apply the steps identified in item A, above, as applicable, for all potentially exposed personnel.
 - The employee's respective Commissioner or Department Head must be notified in these circumstances and is responsible for ensuring these protocols are followed

The Town recognizes there may be nuances or complexities associated with potential exposures, close contacts, symptomatic persons, and those testing positive. The Town will follow CDC/public health recommendations and requirements and coordinate with our local public health office for additional guidance and support as needed.

Cleaning and Disinfecting

CDC/public health guidelines will be followed for cleaning and disinfection of surfaces/areas. Present guidance for routine cleaning during a public health emergency includes:

- 1. As possible, employees and contractors will clean their own workspaces in the beginning, middle, and end of their shifts, at a minimum.
 - a. High traffic/high touch areas and areas which are accessible to the public/constituents will be disinfected at least hourly.
 - b. The Department of General Services is responsible for cleaning common areas, and the frequency of such cleaning.

- 2. Staff tasked with cleaning and disinfecting areas will be issued and required to wear PPE appropriate to the task.
- 3. Soiled surfaces will be cleaned with soap and water before being disinfected.
- 4. Surfaces will be disinfected with products that meet EPA criteria for use against the virus in question and which are appropriate for that surface.
- 5. Staff will follow instructions of cleaning products to ensure safe and effective use of the products.

Documentation of Work Hours and Locations

in a public health emergency, it may be necessary to document work hours and locations of each employee and contractor to support contact tracing efforts. Identification of locations shall include on-site work, off-site visits. This information may be used by the Town of Oyster Bay to support contact tracing within the organization and may be shared with local public health officials in accordance with all HIPPA compliance.

The Town of Oyster Bay tracks hours and locations by means of a paper-based sign-in sheet at each facility and by requiring employees to complete an electronic survey prior to entering a Town facility, which survey is monitored by and used by the Department of General Services, who is responsible for handling and managing the information contained therein.

Housing for Essential Employees

There are circumstances within a public health emergency when it may be prudent to have essential employees lodged in such a manner which will help prevent the spread of the subject communicable disease to protect these employees from potential exposures, thus helping to ensure their health and safety and the continuity of the Town of Oyster Bay's essential operations.

If such a need arises, hotel rooms are expected to be the most viable option. If hotel rooms are for some reason deemed not practical or ideal, or if there are no hotel rooms available, the Town of Oyster Bay will coordinate with the Nassau County Office of Emergency Management to help identify and arrange for these housing needs. The Department of Public Safety will be responsible for coordinating such housing arrangements.

The Highway Department has reviewed the work performed by Looks Great Services, Inc. with respect to Requirements contract for Tree Removal and Trimming throughout the Town of Oyster Bay under Contract Number HTR17-163 which was extended by Town Board Resolution No. 207-2020 on March 31, 2020. This will be the third extension of a four year extension option.

In accordance with the Town of Oyster Bay procurement policy, this office requests that said contract be extended for 90 calendar day nunc-pro-tunc to March 13, 2021 through June 10, 2021 to allow appropriate time to review the policy in accordance with Guideline 6 (a through e).

Therefore, it is hereby requested that the Town Board suspend the rules and authorize, as a walk on resolution to Town Board Meeting of March 23, 2021 the extension of Contract No. HTR17-163, Requirements contract for Tree Removal and Trimming throughout the Town of Oyster Bay for 90 calendar days, nunc-pro-tunc to March 13, 2021 through June 10, 2021. "A LOCAL LAW TO ADD SECTION 246-5,5.34 – RESTRICTIONS ON SALE OF VAPING AND MARIJUANA PRODUCTS, VAPE SHOPS, HOOKAH LOUNGES, MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES AND MARIJUANA SHOPS, TO CHAPTER 246 – ZONING, OF THE CODE OF TOWN OF OYSTER BAY."

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay as follows:

Section 1. Add Section 246-5.5.34, Restrictions on Sale of Vaping and Marijuana Products, Vape Shops, Hookah Lounges, Marijuana Dispensaries and Marijuana Shops, to Chapter 246, Zoning, of the Town Code as follows:

§ 246-5.5.34 Restrictions on Sale of Vaping and Marijuana Products, Vape Shops, Hookah Lounges, Marijuana Dispensaries and Marijuana Shops.

§ 246-5.5.34.1 Legislative Intent.

The Town Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Town of Oyster Bay and its residents to restrict the sale of vaping products and marijuana products and the location of vape shops, hookah lounges, marijuana dispensaries, and marijuana shops to particular areas. In addition, all establishments that sell vape products, e-cigarettes, hookahs and accessories, and marijuana and marijuana products will be required to display signage that explains the potential dangers in using such products.



§ 246.-5.5.34.2 **Definitions.** As used in this local law, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

CBD

Cannabidiol, a naturally occurring compound found in the resinous flower of cannabis.

ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES

Also known as e-cigarettes, e-vaporizers, or electronic nicotine delivery systems, are battery-operated devices that people use to inhale an aerosol, which typically contains nicotine, flavorings, and other chemicals.

HOOKAH LOUNGES AND VAPE LOUNGES

Any facility or location whose business operation includes the on-site indoor smoking of electronic cigarettes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, or marijuana derivatives, including only CBD, as defined herein, or other substances, but not including THC, as defined herein. Smoking is the inhalation of the smoke/e-liquid nicotine/vapors water pipe tobacco and other substances encased in electronic cigarettes, vape pens, and pipes commonly known as "hookah," "waterpipe," "shisha" and "narghile" or any similar device.

HOOKAH PIPE

A single or multi-stemmed instrument used by one or more persons to smoke tobacco or other substance, which hookah pipe is also commonly referred to as a hookah, waterpipe, shisha or narghile

MARIJUANA

Same definition ascribed to "marihuana" in NY Public Health Law § 3302: all parts of the plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin. It does not include the mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the mature stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil, or cake, or the sterilized seed of the plant, which seed is incapable of germination.

MARIJUANA DISPENSARY

A dispensary is a location (whether business or non-profit) where patients or consumers can access prescribed Marijuana (cannabis) in a legal and safe manner. Users get assistance from experts (bud tenders) who find an optimal dosage and recommend the delivery method to achieve optimal results when using medical cannabis.

MARIJUANA SHOP

Any establishment which offers for sale or consideration, for on premises or off premises consumption, if allowed by law, cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquid, or any other product containing marijuana or a marijuana derivative, which products contain THC. This shall include recreational marijuana products, but shall exclude any non-prescription marijuana product or derivative that only contains CBD but not THC.

SMOKE SHOP AND VAPE SHOP

Any establishment which offers for sale or consideration, cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquid, marijuana derivatives, including CBD but not THC or other substances, as a substantial or significant portion of its business, merchandise and/or stock-intrade.

SUBSTANTIAL OR SIGNIFICANT PORTION

- (1) "Substantial or significant portion" shall be determined using the following considerations:
 - a) Amount of floor area and basement space accessible to customers and allotted to the sale or consideration of cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type, generally, or as compared to the total floor area and basement space accessible to customers; and/or
 - b) Amount of cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, eliquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances stock-in-trade of any type accessible to customers, generally, or as compared to total stock accessible to customers; and/or
 - c) Revenues derived from cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type, general, or compared to total revenues; and/or
 - d) Advertising devoted to cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type, general, or compared to total advertising; and/or
 - e) Use of the establishment for cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type, general, or compared to total use thereof; and/or
- (2) Notwithstanding the above considerations, the following shall be conclusive in determining substantial or significant portion:
 - a) Forty percent or more of floor area and basement space accessible to customers allotted to cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type; and/or

b) Forty percent or more of its stock-in-trade in cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type; and/or

c) Forty percent or more of its gross income derived from eigarettes, electronic eigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other

marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type; and/or

d) Forty percent or more of its advertising devoted to cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, pipes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, other marijuana derivatives or like substances of any type.

THC

Tetrahydrocannabinol, is the main psychoactive compound in cannabis that produces the high sensation.

§ 246.-5.5.34.3 Restrictions on location of hookah lounges, vape lounges, smoke shops, vape shops, marijuana dispensaries and marijuana shops.

(A) Hookah lounges, vape lounges, smoke shop, vape shop, marijuana dispensary or marijuana shop uses shall be allowable only in a Light Industry (LI) zoning district subject to issuance of a Special Use Permit by the Town of Oyster Bay Zoning Board of Appeals, and subject to the regulations set forth in this section.

(B) The lot line of any property whereupon exists a hookah lounge, vape lounge, smoke shop, vape shop, marijuana dispensary or marijuana shop shall not be located within a thousand (1,000) foot radius of the lot line of any lot zoned for residential use, any school, park, playground, library or church or other place of worship.

§246-5.5.34.4 Posting of Signs.

- (A) No person shall sell or continue to sell or distribute or continue to distribute electronic cigarettes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids. hookah pipes, marijuana or marijuana products in the Town of Oyster Bay unless a sign is posted at the point of sale in a conspicuous place, that warns of the dangers of e-cigarettes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, hookah pipes, marijuana or marijuana products including, at a minimum, the following statement: WARNING: electronic cigarettes, vape pens, vapors, e-liquids, and marijuana contain nicotine. Nicotine is an addictive chemical.
- (B) Such sign shall be printed with letters at least one half inch in height. Signs shall be protected from tampering, damage, removal or concealment.

Section 2. SEQRA Determination.

It is hereby determined pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. Section 101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., that the adoption of this local law is a "Type II" Action within the meaning of Section 617.5 (c)(26) of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., pertaining to "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment" and,



accordingly, is of a class of actions which do not have a significant effect on the environment and no further review is required.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, subdivision or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, subdivision or provision of or application directly involved
