

We have received a request from Anthony Durso III to "construct an irregular shaped 4 foot wide by 7 foot long platform leading to a 3 foot wide by 16 foot long ramp leading to a 5 foot wide by 30 foot long float and a 5 foot wide by 20 foot long float, and a 5 foot wide by 12 foot long jet ski float. Install eight anchor piles and a 12 foot wide by 14 foot long boat lift with two 16 inch wide by 20 foot long catwalks. Structures will extend approximately 45 feet into Carmen's River from the plane of Mean Low Water". All work is to be done according to the attached plans stamped "NYSDEC Approved" Permit No. 1-2824-03191/00004 dated February 19, 2019 and the Department of the Army, New York District, Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit No. NAN-2019-00144-EKN dated September 16, 2019. Chapter 241 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay entitled "Waterways" requires Town Board approval for structures projecting into the waterways.

Copies of the following documents are attached: Town of Oyster Bay Mooring, Dock, Pier, Float and Bulkhead Permit Application No.19120259; New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) Permit No. 1-2824-03191/00004 dated February 19, 2019; Department of the Army, New York District Corps of Engineers Permit No. NAN-2019-00144-EKN dated September 16, 2019, and a letter of General Concurrence with the Federal Consistency Assessment Form from the New York State Department of State dated June 25, 2019. Also attached is a memo from George Baptista Jr., Deputy Commissioner Department of Environmental Resources dated December 26, 2019, classifying the project as a TYPE II ACTION under SEQRA. Please note that plans for the proposed work can be found attached to the DEC permit.

The relevant documents are attached for your review. Please note the proposed plans can be located in the NYSDEC and the Department of the Army Corps of Engineers Permit approvals.

The proposed work at the subject premises would, in our opinion, be compatible with the surrounding area.

Pursuant to Section §241-9(E)(3) in the Town Code, all persons, local governments, other agencies or corporations having any property or operating any facilities on the two properties on both sides of the premises for which the permit is sought (four properties in total), and any properties which have any frontage on a waterway and are directly opposite from the subject premises shall be notified at least 14 days in advance, in writing, of the appearance of such matter for Town Board action. It is the responsibility of the applicant to issue said notices and the applicant shall bear the cost of same. Therefore, I respectfully request that this application be put on the agenda for the May 19, 2020 Town Board calendar to provide the applicant ample time to comply with this requirement.

Pursuant to the provisions of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, SEQRA, as promulgated in the regulations contained in 6 NYCRR Part 617) and the Town of Oyster Bay Environmental Quality Review (TEQR) Law (Chapter 110 of the Oyster Bay Town Code), the Department of Environmental Resources has reviewed the above-captioned application.

Based on our review, the Department has classified the subject proposal as a TYPE II ACTION, under the SEQRA Type II Actions List, at §617.5(c)(12), relative to "construction, expansion or placement of minor accessory/appurtenant residential structures, including garages, carports, patios, decks, swimming pools, tennis courts, satellite dishes, fences, barns, storage sheds or other buildings not changing land use or density;" and under Appendix B, §B(2), of the TEQR Law, relative to "The installation of minor accessory facilities such as lawn sprinkler systems, swimming pool heaters and fire sprinkler systems, provided that such systems comply with all applicable codes and ordinances."



We have received a request from Kathleen Austin to "replace approximately 40 linear feet of existing bulkhead in place with two new 6-foot long return 18-inches higher than existing. The regulated activities also include the replacement and relocation of an existing six-foot wide by 24-foot long float parallel to the existing bulkhead, the installation of a new three-foot wide by 12-foot long ramp leading to a new four foot wide by six-foot long float and the installation of a 12-foot wide by 12.5-foot long boat lift". All work is to be done according to the attached plans stamped "NYSDEC Approved" Permit No. 1-2824-03353/00001 dated October 17, 2019 and the Department of the Army, New York District, Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit No. NAN-2019-01129-EKL dated October 17, 2019. Chapter 241 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay entitled "Waterways" requires Town Board approval for structures projecting into the waterways.

Please note that plans for the proposed work can be found attached to the DEC permit.

The relevant documents are attached for your review. Please note the proposed plans can be located in the NYSDEC and the Department of the Army Corps of Engineers Permit approvals.

The proposed work at the subject premises would, in our opinion, be compatible with the surrounding area.

Pursuant to Section §241-9(E)(3) in the Town Code, all persons, local governments, other agencies or corporations having any property or operating any facilities on the two properties on both sides of the premises for which the permit is sought (four properties in total), and any properties which have any frontage on a waterway and are directly opposite from the subject premises shall be notified at least 14 days in advance, in writing, of the appearance of such matter for Town Board action. It is the responsibility of the applicant to issue said notices and the applicant shall bear the cost of same. Therefore, I respectfully request that this application be put on the agenda for the May 19, 2020 Town Board calendar to provide the applicant ample time to comply with this requirement.



Notice of Commencement At least 48 hours prior to commencement of the project, the permittee and contractor shall sign and return the top portion of the enclosed notification form certifying that they are fully aware of and understand all terms and conditions of this permit. Within 30 days of completion of project, the bottom portion of the form must also be signed and returned, along with photographs of the completed work.
- 2. Post Permit Sign The permit sign enclosed with this permit shall be posted in a conspicuous location on the worksite and adequately protected from the weather.

- 3. Conformance With Plans All activities authorized by this permit must be in strict conformance with the approved plans submitted by the applicant or applicant's agent as part of the permit application. Such approved plans were prepared by Rising Tide Waterfront Solutions, last revised 8/13/2019.
- 4. No Construction Debris in Wetland or Adjacent Area Any debris or excess material from construction of this project shall be completely removed from the adjacent area (upland) and removed to an approved upland area for disposal. No debris is permitted in wetlands and/or protected buffer areas.
- 5. No Disturbance to Vegetated Tidal Wetlands There shall be no disturbance to vegetated tidal wetlands or protected buffer areas as a result of the permitted activities.
- 6. Materials Disposed at Upland Site Any demolition debris, excess construction materials, and/or excess excavated materials shall be immediately and completely disposed of in an authorized solid waste management facility. These materials shall be suitably stabilized as not to re-enter any water body, wetland or wetland adjacent area.
- 7. Storage of Equipment, Materials The storage of construction equipment and materials shall be confined to the upland area landward of the bulkhead or on a barge.
- 8. Clean Fill Only All fill shall consist of clean sand, gravel, or soil (not asphalt, slag, flyash, broken concrete or demolition debris).
- 9. Backfilling All peripheral berms, cofferdams, rock revetments, seawalls, gabions, bulkheads or other approved shoreline stabilization structures shall be completed prior to placement of any fill material behind such structures.
- 10. No Seaward Extension of Bulkhead The new bulkhead shall be constructed in place of the existing bulkhead with no seaward extension of the outermost bulkhead face.
- 11. Replacement Bulkhead Maximum Height The top elevation of the replacement bulkhead shall be no more than 18 inches higher than the existing bulkhead.
- 12. No Structures on Bulkhead No permanent structures shall be installed on the authorized bulkhead without first obtaining written department approval (permit, modification, amendment).
- 13. Excavation for Bulkhead/Structure Prior to any construction or removal of bulkheads and other shoreline stabilization structures all backfill shall be excavated landward of the structure and retained so as not to enter the waterway, tidal wetland or protected buffer area.
- 14. No Runoff Over or Through Bulkhead or into Wetland There shall be no discharge of runoff or other effluent over or through any bulkhead or shoreline stabilization structure or into any tidal wetland or protected buffer area.
- 15. Bulkhead Decking No portion of the decking or boardwalk shall extend seaward of the bulkhead sheathing.

- 16. Use of Treated Wood The use of wood treated with Pentachlorophenol or other wood treatment not specifically approved by the Department for use in wetlands and/or marine waters, is strictly prohibited in the construction of structures that will be in contact with tidal waters.
- 17. Dock Reconstruction or Replacement Dock reconstruction or replacement or seasonal installation shall not involve expansion or substantial modification of existing structures or facilities.
- 18. No Floats, Ramps in Vegetated Tidal Wetlands Floats and ramps may not rest on or be stored in any vegetated tidal wetland.
- 19. Float Installation The float shall be installed only at the approved location with a minimum water depth of 2½ feet, measured at apparent low tide.
- 20. No Prop Dredging Prop dredging, or the act of utilizing and/or directing the propeller or propulsion system of a motorized vessel and/or the water-borne forces created by said propeller or propulsion system, to excavate or displace existing bottom sediment and benthic habitat for the direct or indirect purpose of establishing or increasing water depth, is a regulated activity and is not authorized by this permit. Prop dredging is strictly prohibited without further written authorization (permit, modification or amendment) from the department.
- 21. Repairs to Structures All repairs to existing structures shall be confined to replacement of existing elements with no change in design, dimension or materials, unless specifically authorized by this permit.
- 22. No Dredging or Excavation No dredging, excavating or other alteration of shoreline or underwater areas is authorized by this permit, nor shall issuance of this permit be construed to suggest that the Department will issue a permit for such activities in the future.
- 23. No Permanent Structures on Dock No permanent structures shall be installed on dock/catwalk/float without first obtaining written Department approval (permit, modification, or amendment).
- 24. Docks at Property Lines Docks/catwalks/floats must not:
 - a. extend laterally beyond property lines,
 - b. interfere with navigation, or
 - c. interfere with other landowners riparian rights.
- 25. Pilings at Property Lines Pilings shall not:
 - a. extend laterally beyond property lines,
 - b. interfere with navigation, or
 - c. interfere with other landowners riparian rights.

- 26. Boat Lifts at Property Lines Boat lift/davit shall not:
 - a. extend laterally beyond property lines,
 - b. interfere with navigation, or
 - c. interfere with other landowners riparian rights.
- 27. No Structures on Pilings No structures, other than structures specifically authorized by this permit, shall be constructed on pilings without further authorization from the department (permit, modification or amendment).
- 28. Contain Exposed, Stockpiled Soils All disturbed areas where soil will be temporarily exposed or stockpiled for longer than 48 hours shall be contained by a continuous line of staked haybales / silt curtains (or other NYSDEC approved devices) placed on the seaward side between the fill and the wetland or protected buffer area. Tarps are authorized to supplement these approved methods.
- 29. Maintain Erosion Controls All erosion control devices shall be maintained in good and functional condition until the project has been completed and the area has been stabilized.
- 30. No Interference With Navigation There shall be no unreasonable interference with navigation by the work herein authorized.
- 31. Precautions Against Contamination of Waters All necessary precautions shall be taken to preclude contamination of any wetland or waterway by suspended solids, sediments, fuels, solvents, lubricants, epoxy coatings, paints, concrete, leachate or any other environmentally deleterious materials associated with the project.
- 32. State Not Liable for Damage The State of New York shall in no case be liable for any damage or injury to the structure or work herein authorized which may be caused by or result from future operations undertaken by the State for the conservation or improvement of navigation, or for other purposes, and no claim or right to compensation shall accrue from any such damage.
- 33. State May Order Removal or Alteration of Work If future operations by the State of New York require an alteration in the position of the structure or work herein authorized, or if, in the opinion of the Department of Environmental Conservation it shall cause unreasonable obstruction to the free navigation of said waters or flood flows or endanger the health, safety or welfare of the people of the State, or cause loss or destruction of the natural resources of the State, the owner may be ordered by the Department to remove or alter the structural work, obstructions, or hazards caused thereby without expense to the State, and if, upon the expiration or revocation of this permit, the structure, fill, excavation, or other modification of the watercourse hereby authorized shall not be completed, the owners, shall, without expense to the State, and to such extent and in such time and manner as the Department of Environmental Conservation may require, remove all or any portion of the uncompleted structure or fill and restore to its former condition the navigable and flood capacity of the watercourse. No claim shall be made against the State of New York on account of any such removal or alteration.

34. State May Require Site Restoration If upon the expiration or revocation of this permit, the project hereby authorized has not been completed, the applicant shall, without expense to the State, and to such extent and in such time and manner as the Department of Environmental Conservation may lawfully require, remove all or any portion of the uncompleted structure or fill and restore the site to its former condition. No claim shall be made against the State of New York on account of any such removal or alteration.

WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

1. Water Quality Certification The authorized project, as conditioned pursuant to the Certificate, complies with Section 301, 302, 303, 306, and 307 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended and as implemented by the limitations, standards, and criteria of state statutory and regulatory requirements set forth in 6 NYCRR Section 608.9(a). The authorized project, as conditioned, will also comply with applicable New York State water quality standards, including but not limited to effluent limitations, best usages and thermal discharge criteria, as applicable, as set forth in 6 NYCRR Parts 701, 702, 703, and 704.

GENERAL CONDITIONS - Apply to ALL Authorized Permits:

1. Facility Inspection by The Department The permitted site or facility, including relevant records, is subject to inspection at reasonable hours and intervals by an authorized representative of the Department of Environmental Conservation (the Department) to determine whether the permittee is complying with this permit and the ECL. Such representative may order the work suspended pursuant to ECL 71-0301 and SAPA 401(3).

The permittee shall provide a person to accompany the Department's representative during an inspection to the permit area when requested by the Department.

A copy of this permit, including all referenced maps, drawings and special conditions, must be available for inspection by the Department at all times at the project site or facility. Failure to produce a copy of the permit upon request by a Department representative is a violation of this permit.

2. Relationship of this Permit to Other Department Orders and Determinations Unless expressly provided for by the Department, issuance of this permit does not modify, supersede or rescind any order or determination previously issued by the Department or any of the terms, conditions or requirements contained in such order or determination.

3. Applications For Permit Renewals, Modifications or Transfers The permittee must submit a separate written application to the Department for permit renewal, modification or transfer of this permit. - 4. Submission of Renewal Application The permittee must submit a renewal application at least 30 days before permit expiration for the following permit authorizations: Excavation & Fill in Navigable Waters, Tidal Wetlands, Water Quality Certification.
- 5. Permit Modifications, Suspensions and Revocations by the Department The Department reserves the right to exercise all available authority to modify, suspend or revoke this permit. The grounds for modification, suspension or revocation include:
 - a. materially false or inaccurate statements in the permit application or supporting papers;
 - b. failure by the permittee to comply with any terms or conditions of the permit;
 - c. exceeding the scope of the project as described in the permit application;
 - d. newly discovered material information or a material change in environmental conditions, relevant technology or applicable law or regulations since the issuance of the existing permit;
 - e. noncompliance with previously issued permit conditions, orders of the commissioner, any provisions of the Environmental Conservation Law or regulations of the Department related to the permitted activity.
- 6. Permit Transfer Permits are transferrable unless specifically prohibited by statute, regulation or another permit condition. Applications for permit transfer should be submitted prior to actual transfer of ownership.

NOTIFICATION OF OTHER PERMITTEE OBLIGATIONS

Item A: Permittee Accepts Legal Responsibility and Agrees to Indemnification

The permittee, excepting state or federal agencies, expressly agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York, its representatives, employees, and agents ("DEC") for all claims, suits, actions, and damages, to the extent attributable to the permittee's acts or omissions in connection with the permittee's undertaking of activities in connection with, or operation and maintenance of, the facility or facilities authorized by the permit whether in compliance or not in compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit. This indemnification does not extend to any claims, suits, actions, or damages to the extent attributable to DEC's own negligent or intentional acts or omissions, or to any claims, suits, or actions naming the DEC and arising under Article 78 of the New York Civil Practice Laws and Rules or any citizen suit or civil rights provision under federal or state laws.

Item B: Permittee's Contractors to Comply with Permit



We have received a request from Martin Kelly to "remove and replace approximately 25 linear feet of an existing L shaped bulkhead up to 18 inches higher than existing, and one 6 foot return. The proposed bulkhead will tie into existing perpendicular 30 linear foot bulkhead. Existing 6 foot wide by 30 foot long mooring float will be removed and replaced with a 30 inch wide by 9 foot long ramp leading to a 6 foot wide by 11 foot long mooring float, and a two foot wide by 16 foot long finger float in an L shaped configuration. Additionally one 12 inch diameter timber pile will be installed to support the finger pier. The proposed work also includes one-time maintenance dredging of approximately 25 cubic yard of material within 10 linear feet seaward of the length of the 55 linear foot section of bulkhead over an area of 450 square feet to a depth of four feet below the plane of Mean Low Water. "All work is to be done according to the attached plans stamped "NYSDEC Approved" Permit No. 1-2824-02327/00004 dated October 8, 2019 and the Department of the Army, New York District, Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit No. NAN-2019-00783-EVI dated September 24, 2019. Chapter 241 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay entitled "Waterways" requires Town Board approval for structures projecting into the waterways.

Copies of the following documents are attached: Town of Oyster Bay Mooring, Dock, Pier, Float and Bulkhead Permit Application No.19110246; New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) Permit No. 1-2824-02327/00004 dated October 8, 2019; Department of the Army, New York District Corps of Engineers Permit No. NAN-2019-00783-EVI dated September 24, 2019, and a letter of General Concurrence with the Federal Consistency Assessment Form from the New York State Department of State dated July 29, 2019. Also attached is a memo from George Baptista Jr., Deputy Commissioner Department of Environmental Resources dated December 19, 2019, classifying the project as a TYPE II ACTION under SEQRA. Please note that plans for the proposed work can be found attached to the DEC permit.

The relevant documents are attached for your review. Please note the proposed plans can be located in the NYSDEC and the Department of the Army Corps of Engineers Permit approvals.

The proposed work at the subject premises would, in our opinion, be compatible with the surrounding area.

Pursuant to Section §241-9(E)(3) in the Town Code, all persons, local governments, other agencies or corporations having any property or operating any facilities on the two properties on both sides of the premises for which the permit is sought (four properties in total), and any properties which have any frontage on a waterway and are directly opposite from the subject premises shall be notified at least 14 days in advance, in writing, of the appearance of such matter for Town Board action. It is the responsibility of the applicant to issue said notices and the applicant shall bear the cost of same. Therefore, I respectfully request that this application be put on the agenda for the May 19, 2020 Town Board calendar to provide the applicant ample time to comply with this requirement.

Within 30 days of completion of project, the bottom portion of the form must also be signed and returned, along with photographs of the completed work.
- 5. No Construction Debris in Wetland or Adjacent Area Any debris or excess material from construction of this project shall be completely removed from the adjacent area (upland) and removed to an approved upland area for disposal. No debris is permitted in wetlands and/or protected buffer areas.
- 6. No Disturbance to Vegetated Tidal Wetlands There shall be no disturbance to vegetated tidal wetlands or protected buffer areas as a result of the permitted activities.

- 30. Leave a Uniform Bottom Elevation All dredging shall be conducted so as to leave a uniform bottom elevation free of mounds or holes.
- 31. No Overflow from Barges There shall be no overflow of material from the holding barges during dredging or during transport of dredged material.
- 32. Contain Exposed, Stockpiled Soils All disturbed areas where soil will be temporarily exposed or stockpiled for longer than 48 hours shall be contained by a continuous line of staked haybales / silt curtains (or other NYSDEC approved devices) placed on the seaward side between the fill and the wetland or protected buffer area. Tarps are authorized to supplement these approved methods.
- 33. Maintain Erosion Controls All erosion control devices shall be maintained in good and functional condition until the project has been completed and the area has been stabilized.



- 2. On July 5, 2019, the New York District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers received a request for Department of the Army authorization for the removal and replacement, in place, of approximately 25 linear feet of an existing L shaped bulkhead up to 18-inches higher than existing, and (1) one 6-foot return. The proposed bulkhead will tie into existing perpendicular 30-linear foot bulkhead. Existing six-foot-wide by 30-foot-long mooring float will be removed and replaced with a 30-inch-wide by 9-foot-long ramp leading to a six-foot-wide by 11-foot-long mooring float, and a two-foot-wide by 16-footlong finger float in an L shaped configuration. Additionally (1) one 12-inch-diameter timber pile will be installed to support the finger pier. The proposed work also includes one-time maintenance dredging of approximately 25 cubic yards of material within 10 linear feet seaward of the length of the 55 linear foot section of bulkhead over an area of 450 square feet to a depth of four feet below the plane of Mean Low Water. The recovered dredged material would be placed upland behind the bulkhead as back fill with no return flow to the waterway. The project is located in Tern Canal, at 68 South Bay Ave, Massapequa, Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York.

Dear Mr. Tassone:

In accordance with your request, D&B Engineers and Architects, P.C. (D&B) is pleased to submit this proposal for consultation services with regard to suspected mold issues at the Town of Oyster Bay's Town Hall South facility. Specifically, as part of this scope of work, D&B will assess the presence of suspected mold in the areas around the Town Clerk's office, adjacent bathroom and other areas of interest. We understand that the possibility of mold may be related to moisture emanating from the roof and may include historically trapped moisture since the installation of a new roof system. Our proposed services include investigation, assessment, sampling and reporting. Sampling activities shall be performed by a New York State Licensed Mold Assessor.

In order to complete this assignment, D&B proposes the following detailed scope of work.

A. SCOPE

Investigation

D&B will assess the Clerk's Office and bathroom for the presence of mold, conducting a thorough visual inspection of the affected areas, including but not limited to the bathroom, roof and adjacent rooms.

During the inspection, D&B will look for:

- Visible mold or moisture on walls or ceilings or air vents;
- Visible mold on furniture, cabinets or personal property;
- Indications of roof leaks or siding and trim leaks (past or present);

- Plumbing leaks (past or present);
- Heating system, humidifiers, air conditioners leaks or problems (past or present);
- Dampness;
- Prior flooding; and
- Musty or unknown odors.

The inspection will be conducted in accordance with select sections of ASTM E2418-06 - Standard Guide for Readily Observable Mold and Conditions Conducive to Mold in Buildings: Baseline Survey Process. Moisture readings will be observed using a moisture meter (Surveymaster Protimeter) to measure the moisture content of the walls to determine if there is a potential for mold growth in these areas. Digital photographs will be collected to highlight areas of interest. If the Town decides to perform coring/destructive testing of the roofing system, D&B will perform a similar investigation, including field moisture screening on the roofing materials. Roofing removals and restoration will be performed by others, as directed by the Town outside of the scope of this proposal.

Sampling

- At the time of the visual inspection, the Mold Assessor will collect air samples from the suspected affected areas. D&B will be prepared to take up to thirty (30) air samples including ambient/outdoor samples and blanks at locations throughout the building, as requested by the Town. We will coordinate with Town staff to temporarily interrupt building HVAC systems as may be necessary to facilitate sample collection.
- D&B will collect up to five (5) swab or tape lift samples of visibly impacted areas and materials. These can be performed on interior areas and/or removed roofing materials, as determined at the time of the work. Our sampling effort includes up to (2) visits to the site for assessment and collection of samples.
- Samples will be analyzed for the presence of mold by a laboratory certified by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH). Sample results will be interpreted in accordance with guidelines established by the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists (ACGIH) by a Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH).

Report Preparation and Analysis of Results

D&B will prepare a report that summarizes the results of the visual investigation and sampling. Within this report, D&B will evaluate the sample results against the appropriate standards and provide recommendations to the Town of Oyster Bay with regard to the need for further testing and/or remedial activities to address locations which may exhibit elevated mold concentrations. We note that as mold is pervasive in

our environment, including within conditioned building spaces, our analysis will address sampling results with regard to typical ambient mold conditions.

B. FEES

The proposed fees to complete the above tasks will be based upon time and expenses actually incurred in relation to the above scope in accordance with the terms of our on-call agreement with the Town and will not exceed \$8,500. Direct expenses, including sampling analysis, mileage and document reproduction are included in the above fees.

To minimize disruption of office activities, D&B is prepared to conduct the assessment and sampling activities in the evening when the office is vacant, as necessary.

To accomplish our work, D&B proposes to utilize as a subcontractor EMSL Analytical, Inc. for laboratory analytical services and is hereby requesting the Town's approval of this qualified and experienced testing laboratory.

Records will be maintained as required by the Department of Transportation (DOT) and National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) regarding employee participation in the SAP process as well as comply with 42, part 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Copies of SAP records will be made available to the employee if requested. Compliance will be monitored and reported in writing to the Town of Oyster Bay Designated Employer Representative (DER).
- 3. Ongoing communication will occur between the SAP and the DER regarding employee treatment plan progress (including testing schedule). Signed consents for release of information will be obtained as required by state and federal mandate. A copy of the employee treatment plan will be included in the initial progress report and forwarded to the DER.
- 4. Communication with the Medical Review Officer (MRO) will occur as needed regarding an employee's laboratory test (test results, quantitative levels and other employee test information).
- 5. Face-to-Face evaluation will occur with employees who are being considered for return to safety sensitive work and a written report (of compliance or non-compliance) will be forwarded to the DER. The report will determine the follow-up and or alcohol and drug testing frequency that the employee will have over the next 12 to 60 months following the date of return to safety sensitive duty. These efforts will support the DER who will proceed with performing the "fit for duty" evaluation.

Obligations

In the event that the Town of Oyster Bay or Norwich Behavioral Health Services terminates the agreement, a phase out period of ninety (90) days will be provided to assure that employee treatment is not undermined.

<u>Personnel</u>

Employees of Norwich Behavioral Health Services will provide all services under the agreement.

Statutes, Laws and Codes

Norwich Behavioral Health Services will comply with and ensure that all personnel comply with all Town of Oyster Bay operational requirements in association with the implementation of the Employee Assistance Program.

Licenses/Permits/Insurance

All employees of Norwich Behavioral Health Services possess and will for the term of the agreement possess all necessary qualifications, permits, licenses required to perform the services described in this agreement, including malpractice and liability insurance.

Nondisclosure of Information

Norwich Behavioral Health Services will not, without the prior written permission of the Town of Oyster Bay, (1) disclose or publish any findings made by them in the performance of services for the Town of Oyster Bay, or (2) remove any Town of Oyster Bay premises any Town of Oyster bay property or disclose same unauthorized persons.

This Agreement, effective January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021, is entered into between the Town of Oyster Bay and Norwich LCSW Behavioral Health Services PLLC.

Norwich LCSW Behavioral Health Services PLLC, 1005 Glen Cove Avenue, Glen Head, NY 11545, agrees to provide services as set forth as the Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) for the Town of Oyster Bay whose principal place of business is 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, New York 11771. The Town of Oyster Bay agrees to accept the services and pay for them in the amount set forth.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Town of Oyster Bay is desirous of receiving Substance Abuse Professional services for its employees as hereinafter set forth, and NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE AND RENEWAL

Unless terminated earlier by the Town of Oyster Bay as described in Article XIV, this Agreement shall remain in effect from the effective date through and including December 31, 2021.

ARTICLE II ASSISTANCE TO BE PERFORMED BY NORWICH LCSW BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES PLLC

The services provided will be carried out under the direction of the Town of Oyster Bay's Division of Labor Management Relations, Department of Human Resources and shall include:

As defined by the Department of Transportation (DOT) Office of Drug and Alcohol Policy and Compliance (ODAPC) and the non-DOT Substance Abuse Policy should such policy be adopted by the Town of Oyster Bay, the following SAP responsibilities will be provided to the Town of Oyster Bay and their employees and will be carried out in coordination with Town of Oyster Bay's Employee Assistance Program provider. These services will include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Screening, assessment and referral of employees who test positive for drug or alcohol use. This will include the development of a treatment plan indicating referral to appropriate modality of treatment. Clinical assessments will be face-to-face with employees and include full psychosocial history. Assessment will also include in-depth drug and alcohol use history and the use of a standardized tool such as the MAST, SASI, and AUDIT. The referral process will also include the facilitation of the employee into the appropriate treatment or education program.
- 2. Maintenance of records as required by the Department of Transportation (DOT) and National Transit Safety Board (NTSB) regarding employee's participation in the SAP process. Copies of SAP records will be made available to the employees if requested. Compliance will be monitored and reported in writing to the Designated Employer Representative (DER).
- 3. Communication as needed with the employer or Designated Employee Representative (DER). Releases will be obtained from employees as required by state and federal mandate. A copy of the employee treatment plan (testing plan) outlining recommendations will also be made available to the DER.
- 4. Communication as needed with the Medical Review officer (MRO) who has reviewed the findings of an employee's laboratory tests regarding test results, quantification levels, and any other pertinent information.
- 5. Face-to-face evaluation with employees who are being considered for return to safety sensitive work and a written report (of compliance or non compliance) to the DER. The report will determine the follow-up and/or alcohol testing that the employee will have over the next 12 to 60 months following the date of return to safety sensitive work. This will support the DER who will proceed with performing the "fit for duty" evaluation.

ARTICLE III OBLIGATIONS OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY

The Town of Oyster Bay will pay Norwich LCSW Behavioral Health Services PLLC for its services as follows: Norwich LCSW Behavioral Health Services PLLC will receive a total of \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 and \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) for the period January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021. The Town of Oyster Bay will be billed monthly in the amount of \$833.33 dollars for services rendered.

Upon speaking with the client, the counselor assesses the situation, acquires demographic and contact information, works with the individual to determine a solution to the presenting problem and develops a treatment plan for the client.

The EAP counselor speaks with the caller for the amount of time that is needed by the client and schedules daily or weekly follow-ups depending on the client's preferences and needs. Our EAP also offers employees and their families:

- Multi-lingual counseling phone line including immediate access to English, Spanish and French speaking therapists
- Staff made up solely of certified social workers and licensed psychologists
- A provider network of over 100,000 licensed therapists nationwide
- Full integration into the client's already existing healthcare plan to ensure continuity of care following EAP utilization

Upon request, Charles Nechtem Associates, Inc. will provide the caller with a personalized, face-to-face counseling referral within 10 miles of their desired location — usually work or home. Every effort is made to accommodate the personal preferences of the employee in terms of gender, location, financial situation, religion and/or age, without compromising the quality of care. The EAP counselor contacts the service provider by telephone giving the provider his/her diagnostic impressions and recommendations for treatment and ensures a "fit" with regard to the client's needs.

- 1. The goal of the assessment interview is to address and identify the severity and life impact of an employee's problem(s) (the frequency, intensity, duration of unwanted feelings, thoughts, and behaviors). We also assess previous unsuccessful attempts to resolve the problem(s) as well as the personal strengths of the employee (what the employee does well). These are pertinent in differentiating the needs and abilities of an employee before problem resolution can take place.
- 2. CNA expects that in every assessment interview the following areas will be addressed with the employee. (Clinicians are alert not only to the content of the interview but to process issues which may point to underlying conflicts, denied, or not in the employee's awareness. If the employee is not open to exploration of any of these areas, the clinician remains sensitive to the refusal but may interpret this to the employee as limiting the clinician's ability to understand the needs of the employee.)
  - a. Basic identifying demographic information
  - b. Health, medical, and life-style status
  - c. Alcohol and drug history/current practice
  - d. Mental status
  - e. Problem history, including any attempt solutions
  - f. Presenting vs. assessed problem
  - g. Marital, family, and social support system
  - h. Strengths, personal resources of the employee health benefit coverage
  - i. Recommendations and disposition plan

 Additional information: During the assessment, interview the clinician may decide that additional information from sources other than the employee is necessary to complete an assessment. The following areas often require inclusion of additional information or persons prior to disposition of the case:

- a. A marital problem;
- b. A family or child related problem;
- c. An alcohol or drug problem;
- d. A job performance problem;
- e. A problem with possible medical complications;
- f. A problem with neurological implications;
- g. A legal problem;
- h. A financial problem.

### Supervisory Referrals Screening

Management consultation is available to all supervisors and managers on an unlimited basis. The counselors of Charles Nechtern Associates, Inc. generally work with managers who are dealing with employee issues that have not been responsive to normal management interventions. We believe that one key to the success of an employee assistance program is its support for human resource professionals and supervisory staff in intervening with employees when personal problems are affecting their job performance.

- Must provide a DSM IV diagnosis and formal treatment plan for everyone seeking mental health or substance abuse treatment.
- Social Workers and Psychologists must be members of the National Register for Clinical Practice.
- Psychiatrists must be board certified.

The following documentation is collected when a professional is recruited to be a member of our EAP provider network and is maintained with up-to-date information on current providers:

- Copy of diploma from degree granting institution
- · Copy of certificates for specialization training.
- Copy of current state certification or license. [verified with state licensing boards at recruitment and on an annual basis]
- Copy of board certification/diplomat status.
- Copy of current malpractice insurance.
- Copy of DEA number where applicable.
- Verification that the provider's practice is established [5+ years] and is respected by other professionals in the area.

Verification that office space is appropriate for corporate clientele—in a safe area, a quality building, appropriately furnished, confidential access.

Hospital privileges for Psychiatrists.

Verification of training/experience in substance abuse/alcoholism.

Verification of continuing education in short-term intervention, crisis management, or substance abuse. All affiliate clinical work is reviewed concurrently while in process through follow-up calls to the employee. A peer review system is in place, which assures that every clinical case report is reviewed prior to paying the claim. The computer system has a proprietary system of protocols that allow the reviewer to assess the work of a particular clinician working with a specific employee with a specific DSM IV diagnosis with a specified severity with the aggregate work of all other clinicians in our network working with employees matching the diagnosis and severity. This information allows us to define appropriate levels of intervention and referral. By defining "best practice" skills for specific problem areas, we assure consistency in our EAP interventions across a broad network of providers. We use the information to educate affiliates whose work is

not in alignment with "best practice". Of course, extenuating circumstances are frequently the cause of practicing outside the protocols.

Statistical Data and Monitoring Reports

Cases are closed for reporting purposes upon receipt of the case record form from the face-to-face counselor, a review by a case manager and the form entered into the computer by scanning or keying in the information. Both demographic and clinical information is collected in the case record. Clinical information includes: session history in narrative form, DSM IV diagnosis for primary and secondary issues, case status [closed without referral, closed with referral, closed/employee discontinued, type of

referral, name of referral, date of referral, and treatment plan for referral. Demographic information includes name, address, and tenure with company, age, sex, marital status, source of referral to program, insurance information, significant medical problems, chronic medication, and mandatory referral information.

A standard quarterly report is provided for most of our companies and organizations, but can be modified to include any and all of the above information as requested by the purchaser as long as the confidentiality of individual users is protected. Standard reports provide aggregate numbers for age, sex, marital status, employee or family member, assessed problems, disposition of cases including those completed with EAP counseling as well as the types of referrals for ongoing therapy, self-help, medical, legal, or financial services. On-site training or critical incident services are reported as well as management consultations and referrals.

Cases are counted using the following formula: One person, one case, one program year, irrespective of how many times that person might contact the EAP during that program year. We provide unlimited access to the EAP.

### Committee Meetings and Training Sessions

Management Training Meetings

At the start of the program, Management Training sessions will be made available during all shifts sufficient in number so that all supervisors can attend. Sessions are generally scheduled within the first 30 to 45 days of the contract date as an integral part of the implementation. We recommend no more than 20 supervisors participate in a session. Sessions are generally 90 minutes in length and focus on the following:

- How to recognize a troubled employee.
- How to document workplace incidents, job reliability, and job performance.
- How to do a mandatory referral.
- How to use the EAP as a supervisory tool for handling employee personal problems and work problems.
- How and when to make suggested referrals to the EAP.

### Employee Orientation Meetings

Employee orientation sessions are generally scheduled in all sites, during all shifts, sufficient in number so that all employees can participate. Orientation sessions generally last 30 minutes. Sessions can be attended by as many as 100 employees. The purpose of the orientation sessions is to introduce the new employee benefit, describe how easy it is to access the program, explain the basic premise of counseling, and discuss the breadth of questions and issues for which we can provide assistance.

There is no additional charge for either supervisory training sessions or employee orientations. We attempt to schedule them with the appropriate City Human Resources personnel during the first 30 to 45 days of the contract. In larger organizations the process can take up to 60 days.

Employee wellness and life-style modification workshops are scheduled quarterly and at the convenience of our client companies. They are frequently scheduled over the lunch hours in a place where employees can eat lunch and learn. ### Account Management and Steering Committee Meetings

Charles Nechtem Associates provides EAP services to its client companies using an account manager. Our account manager is responsible for the coordination of our services with the client company including consultation services for HR and supervisory staff, scheduling of employee orientations, supervisory trainings, and wellness workshops, the delivery of quarterly reports of EAP activities, attends steering committee meetings with client, and acts as an ombudsman for the client company in resolving any issues with EAP services. Account Managers will:

- Meet on a regular basis with City Human Resource Management to review the EAP services and respond to any questions or concerns about the program.
- Maintain telephone contact with designated City management at all sites. Respond to any
  requests for critical incident debriefings or requests for EAP staff to come on site.
- Plan with designated City management any special promotional events or materials, health fair participation, or other specialized services requested by The Town of Oyster Bay.

The counselors provide immediate 24/7 access and emergency telephone counseling services for employees and family members seeking assistance from their EAP. They refer all callers to an affiliate EAP counselor who provides face-to-face counseling services for employees and family members. We feel this model provides greater access for employees seeking assistance from their EAP, the opportunity for family members to be seen close to their homes, and opportunities for our call center counselors to target referrals to affiliate counselors with specializations in the area of employee concern. With our call center counselors continuing follow-up and monitoring of cases, no employee or family member gets lost in their attempt to receive assistance.

### • Coordination with Insurance Providers and Benefit Plans

In the event of a referral beyond the EAP sessions, every employee or family member is referred to a known resource capable of providing either the extended or specialized care necessary for the amelioration of the assessed primary and secondary [if any] problem(s). Every effort will be made to accommodate the personal preferences of the employee in terms of gender, location, financial limitation, or age without compromising the quality of care. If the employee accepts the recommendation, the EAP counselor contacts the service provider by telephone giving the provider his/her diagnostic impressions and recommendations for treatment. In some cases the EAP counselor may contact the proposed service provider prior to making the recommendation to the employee to check on accessibility and "fit". The cost of the recommended care and applicable benefit coverage is discussed with the employee prior to making any recommendation. Every effort is made to make referrals that do not create financial hardship or that are ineligible for benefit reimbursement. Charles Nechtem Associates maintains up-to-



date insurance or HMO descriptions for every Client Company or organization and disperses those descriptions to all EAP counselors providing services to employees.

#### On-site Services

CNA will provide a counselor who will provide On-Site face to face services 3 hours per week and the location where on-site services will be determined.

### Distribution of Brochures, Newsletters, Wallet Cards

Posters, brochures, a welcome letter, and wallet cards will be made available at the start of the program. Since our wallet cards and brochures are customized for each client company, it generally takes 30 days to get them designed and printed. Brochures, wallet cards, and sufficient posters for each site are UPS delivered to the appropriate sites at the start of the program. We recommend that the brochures be mailed to the homes of the employee families within the first 30 days of the program. Posters can be put up immediately. We provide additional [different] posters 6 months into the program to keep a fresh reminder of the program in front of the employees. Posters and brochures are available in English, French, and Spanish.

A wellness newsletter is provided four times each year in sufficient quantity so that each employee family can have one. The newsletter provides current information about health issues and serves as a reminder that the EAP service is also about wellness and prevention.

We regularly participate in Health Fairs, provide quarterly lunchtime seminars on a variety of topics, and work with HR executives in assuring adequate promotion for the program.

#### • DOT Training for Supervisors and Employees

Charles Nechtem Associates employs Call Center Counselors who are certified Substance Abuse Professionals [SAP]. Those counselors are current with DOT regulations and will provide the required instruction for supervisors and employees.

#### Critical Incident Services

Our Counselors are immediately available on the 800# for consultation with city officials in the event of an incident. The Call Center Counselor will arrange for a trained professional from Charles Nechtem Associates, Inc. to come on-site to assist employees and supervisors. Our response time is 24 hours or less. Critical incident debriefings and group counseling will be scheduled with management and made available to all traumatized employees and supervisors. If the work-site incident has an impact on family members, we recommend scheduling group sessions in the workplace for family members as well. Critical Incident Stress Management is a multi-faceted approach to crisis intervention, designed to offer emotional first aid after a critical incident. Use of such strategies may help prevent the development of posttraumatic stress disorder. Critical Incident Stress Management is delivered in modules, which include:

## Confidentiality of Services and Records

Charles Nechtem Associates, Inc. has developed safeguards to assure that all EAP counseling services are conducted in a manner designed to protect the privacy of employees and their family members. We comply with all Federal and State Laws [HIPAA] protecting the privacy of conversations and other contacts between our EAP counselors and employees. All staff members with access to clinical records are trained in protecting confidential materials.

- A. Protection of Clinical Charts:
- All charts are to be kept in locked, fireproof filing cabinets.
- Clinicians are not to take charts home to work on them.

When it is necessary for clinical purposes to transport charts, care must be taken to assure they are not misplaced or lost. Whenever possible, charts should not be moved.

- B. Protection of Computer Files:
- The computer files are not accessible by outside modem.
- Password access only provides additional internal security.
- Access to a computer file is restricted to a "need-to-know" basis.
- C. <u>Chart Access</u>: Only those professional and administrative employees with a need to handle charts will be granted access to them.
- D. <u>Release of Information</u>: No information may be released about a covered enrollee, including one who is assessed, is in treatment, or is a participant in the Employee Assistance Program without his/her written consent.






A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 246 – ZONING, SECTION 246-5.5.5, APARTMENTS OVER STORES OR OFFICES, AND SECTION 246-5.2 SCHEDULE OF USE REGULATIONS – NONRESIDENCE DISTRICTS, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY

Be it enacted by the TOWN BOARD of THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY as follows:

Section 1. Amend Chapter 246 - ZONING, Section 256-5.5, to read as follows:

Section 246-5.5.5 – (RESERVED)

<u>Section 2.</u> Delete Chapter 246 – ZONING, Section 246-5.5.5.1 through Section 246-5.5.5.2, inclusive.

Section 3. Amend Chapter 246 – ZONING, Section 246-5.2, Schedule of Use Regulation – Nonresidence Districts, to remove "Apartments over stores or offices (Sec. 246-5.5.5)" as a Permitted Principal Use in the Neighborhood Business (NB), Central Business (CB), and General Business (GB) Districts.

Section 4. SEQRA Determination. It is hereby determined pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. Section 101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., that the adoption of this local law is a "Type II" Action within the meaning of Section 617.5 (c)(26) of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., pertaining to "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment" and, accordingly, is of a class of actions which do not have a significant effect on the environment and no further review is required.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, subdivision or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, subdivision or provision of or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law, or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances.

<u>Section 6.</u> Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.
