Dear Commissioner Bergin:

Cashin Associates, P.C. (CA) is submitting this proposal to provide technical assistance to the Department of Environmental Resources relative to the Town's shellfish management program for 2018. As part of our services during 2017 and prior years, CA assisted the Town with shellfish management and related waterways issues. This work included sediment and benthic community investigation/mapping, shellfish surveys, water quality investigations and development of resource management recommendations for Oyster Bay Harbor/Cold Spring Harbor and South Oyster Bay. This authorization will provide for a continuation of services relating to shellfish management provided to the Town of Oyster Bay, and specifically the continuation of the shellfish stock assessments, sediment condition mapping and shellfish resources assessments initiated in prior years.

Background Information

Oyster Bay Harbor/Cold Spring Harbor — Oyster Bay Harbor/Cold Spring Harbor contains important hard clam and oyster resources that support a substantial fishery on public and leased grounds. The Town is committed to protecting and enhancing the long-term viability of the resource and, to that end, has developed and implemented bay management programs to preserve water quality and ecological resources in the harbor complex. The shellfish resources of the Harbor are not only important to commercial and recreational shellfishing, but they also play an important ecological role in the health of the harbor by providing filtering capacity, food for waterfowl and other species, and other ecological benefits.

The services provided by CA in 2016/2017 were directed at providing the technical data and recommendations required by the Town to manage and protect the harbor and its shellfish resources, as well as other technical support as needed during the course of the year.

Shellfish population surveys of the harbor have been performed by CA in 1999, 2007, 2011 and 2013. The surveys provided data on the distribution and abundance of hard clams and other shellfish, and were utilized to assess the health of the shellfish populations. In 2014, CA completed a detailed study of the Town's Bay Management Area, and in 2015 performed an investigation of sediment type/condition in the inner harbor areas. The prior surveys have provided data to monitor long-term trends in shellfish abundance, and to estimate sustainable yields for the resource. Analysis of shellfish population health and estimated sustainable yield has enabled the Town to assess the effect of harvesting pressure on the resource, and determine the number of commercial shellfish permits that should be issued. The shellfish data also provided information useful to the harbor seeding programs and other habitat enhancement projects. Periodic shellfish surveys are important to ensure that the data are available to the Town for monitoring the status of the resource and the harvesting pressure that can be sustained.

The data collected in 2015 - 2017 enabled the identification of which underwater lands are optimal for shellfish growth and survival, and provided a scientific basis for selecting areas for shellfish seeding programs and sanctuary placement. Establishment of sanctuary areas can not only help sustain shellfish resources in the bay, but also have benefits for water quality by providing filtering and removal of containments.

Scope of Services for 2018

Based on the above considerations and discussion with the Town, services to be provided during 2018 will include the following:

- 1. Continuation of the sediment study initiated in prior years, to complete the data collection and analysis for all public underwater lands in Oyster Bay/ Cold Spring Harbor. This task includes field investigation and sample analysis sufficient to create sediment and benthic maps of key areas of Oyster Bay Harbor, to be used to identify potential sanctuary and seeding areas based on scientific analysis.
- 2. Completion of shellfish surveys to obtain information on the current status of the stock and estimates of sustainable yield.

- 3. Technical assistance with the proper placement of seed clams and oysters to ensure that they are placed on lands favorable to growth and survival, based on the data collected under item 1 above.
- 4. Technical advice as to the best location for possible shellfish sanctuaries and bay management areas, including possible establishment of areas providing shellfish filtering to improve water quality.
- 5. Any follow-up technical consulting relating to pending, past or future legal actions involving shellfisheries, including the actions contesting the legality of the shellfish leases.
- 6. Utilization of the sediment data collected under tasks 1 and 2 above, to identify possible areas to locate shellfish reserves that can improve water quality in deteriorated areas of the harbor.
- 7. Attendance at shellfish management meetings, other hearings or public meetings as deemed appropriate by the department.

CA recommends that a budget of \$55,000 be established for this work. This includes an amount for sediment testing and related direct expenses needed for the shellfish habitat investigation and mapping. CA understands that the Town will identify assignments to be undertaken by CA during the year.



Dear Commissioner Bergin:

Cashin Associates, P.C. (CA) is submitting this proposal at the request of the Department of Environmental Resources to provide on-call services relating to the Town's harbor management program, and waterways survey and mapping. Services covered by this proposal will help to address issues relating to the western waterfront mooring field, water quality improvements, navigation, shoreline improvements, and similar harbor use concerns. The waterfront and harbor areas are utilized by a number of different user groups, and potential conflicts may arise among the groups with regard to navigational needs, shoreline access, water uses in the area, and safety/regulatory requirements. The implementation of harbor management protocols will help to resolve conflicts and safely accommodate multiple activities in the Town's coastal areas, as well as help to protect water quality and marine resources. CA can also assist the Town with field survey and mapping of the harbor as needed.

The services will be provided in follow-up to previous technical assistance provided to the Town in 2017 and earlier years.

The specific tasks to be performed as part of this proposal are as follows:

- Assistance in identification of pollution sources to waterfront areas, and development of recommendations to mitigate such pollution.
- Follow-up assistance for implementation of the western waterfront area mooring and navigation plan submitted in 2016, and assistance to the Town in implementing that plan.
- Follow-up to the report on seed clam prices and boat use costs for the Town.
- Research on possible grant opportunities relating to harbor management for the Town.

- Research on nitrogen-removal technologies available for use by the Town.
- Research into bay management programs in other regions for possible applications to Oyster Bay coastal areas.
- Review of Oyster Bay Harbor mapping for information relating to harbor management meetings.
- Meeting with the Town representatives to obtain input on the Town's objectives for the waterfront areas.
- Collection of physical data needed for preparation of harbor management maps, including a bathymetric map utilizing sonar and GPS equipment.
- Identification of regulatory permits that will be required including any state and federal
 approvals, and completion of permit applications as appropriate.
- Assistance with harbor management for South Oyster Bay and Hempstead Harbor as requested by the Town.
- Meetings on Bay Management as requested by the Town.

CA is requesting a budget of \$30,000 for the services described above. CA understands that the Town will identify specific assignments for CA to address as they arise during the year. A breakdown of this fee by professional labor categories is given in Table 1, attached.

We appreciate the opportunity to submit our proposal, and we would welcome the opportunity to continue to assist your department with effective management and protection of the Town's coastal water resources.

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose as a result of an accident that occurred on March 1, 2015. Plaintiff, Wendy Servellon was driving a motor vehicle in the right lane on Shore Road, near Tappan Beach. Kevin Kumar, a Town Bay Constable was driving a Town SUV with two other Town employees as passengers. The Town vehicle is alleged to have veered into the right lane into plaintiff's vehicle. Kevin Kumar testified that it was the Town employee's intention to enter Tappan Beach, which entrance was on the right side of Shore Road. Plaintiff's car went into a tree just past the entrance to the Beach. Plaintiff alleges various injuries including disc herniation of L2/3 and bulging of the L3/4 and L4/5 lumbar disks. Plaintiff further alleges herniation of the C4/5 and C5/6 cervical disks.

After extensive settlement negotiations, this matter was settled for \$25,000.00 It is this Office's opinion that such settlement is just, reasonable, and in the best interests of the Town given the uncertainties associated with litigation.

Standard Work Day Reporting and Resolution for Elected & Appointed Positions

Pursuant to the Section 315.4 of the New York Codes Rules and Regulations of the New York State and Local Retirement System, concerning the calculation and reporting of days worked for elected or appointed officials, the governing board of the elected or appointed officials shall establish, by resolution, a standard work day for each elected or appointed position.

The aforementioned resolution shall include the number of hours prescribed as a standard work day for each position (no fewer than six hours, and no more than eight hours); the expiration of the term of each position; that the employer maintains an actual daily record of time worked for the official or the official holding office has recorded and submitted to the clerk his or her work activities for a period of three consecutive months; and the total number of days per month to be reported by the official, based upon such record of work activities. This resolution shall be adopted no later than the first regular meeting held 180 days following the commencement of the term of office.

Furthermore, the Standard Workday Resolution shall be posted on the Town website for a minimum of thirty days. The new regulations also include filing and posting requirements whereby a certified copy of the Standard Work Day Resolution and an affidavit of posting shall be filed by the Town Clerk with the Office of the State Comptroller within 45 days of the adoption the resolution.

Pursuant to the foregoing, this office recommends Town Board adoption of a Standard Workday Resolution for the following: the recertification of the three-month reporting records for Town Supervisor Joseph S. Saladino, Town Clerk James Altadonna Jr., and Town Board Members Michele M. Johnson, Louis B. Imbroto, Thomas P. Hand. Said Resolution shall be adopted at the next Town Board Meeting, in the format set forth by the aforementioned regulations.

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose as a result of an incident that occurred on March 28, 2016. Claimant, Amy Hochler alleges to have sustained personal injuries when she tripped and fell a defective sidewalk on Sullivan Drive in Jericho, New York. In Summer 2014, the homeowner adjacent to the subject sidewalk, shortly following receipt of a Town hazard letter, requested that the Town repair the subject sidewalk. In August 2014, a Town inspector noted that the sidewalk was not completed. On the date of incident in March 2016, the sidewalk was not repaired. Plaintiff tripped and fell, fracturing her patella of the left knee. After the accident, plaintiff was required to use various devices, including an immobilizer cast for 7 weeks and use a cane for approximately 2-3 months.

After extensive settlement negotiations, this matter was settled for a total of \$45,000.00, with the Town to pay \$30,000.00 and the homeowner to pay \$15,000.00. It is this Office's opinion that such settlement is just, reasonable, and in the best interests of the Town given the uncertainties associated with litigation.

Accordingly, we have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$30,000.00, together with copies of the Stipulation of Discontinuance with prejudice and a General Release executed by Claimant. The funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43010 602 0000 000.







WHEREAS, the Town of Oyster Bay, the New York State Department of Environmental Resources ("NYSDEC"), and the Cornell Cooperative Extension, seek to initiate a program that will improve the water quality in the Great South Bay; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Oyster Bay Town Code §196-18, the Town Board may set aside underground lands as a management area for the conservation, preservation, seeding and rehabilitation of shellfish. That section provides that "(n)o person shall take, interfere with or otherwise disturb shellfish within an area designated as a management area", and authorizes the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources to prohibit and restrict the removal of shellfish from a management area; and

WHEREAS, in order to properly manage the program, the five (5) areas proposed by the NYSDEC for clam and oyster seeding in the Town of Oyster Bay's portion of Great South Bay must be designated as "Conservation Management Areas". As part of the program, the Town will enforce the ban on removal of shellfish in the five areas and will assist in the seeding of the designated areas and with other water quality and shellfish seeding tasks, as needed; and

WHEREAS, Neil O. Bergin, Commissioner, Department of Environmental Resources, by memorandum dated May 25, 2018, requested that the Town Board designate as a Conservation Management Area:

All that area of South Oyster Bay, including tributaries, creeks and canals, lying north of a line extending easterly from the northeasternmost point of land of Great Island (west of Great Island Channel and south of The Run) to the southeasternmost point of land of Goose Island (southwest of Massapequa Creek); thence continuing easterly to a point of intersection located 900 yards southeast of Unqua Point (Nassau Shores), immediately north of old Winnehook Channel (local name); and continuing easterly to a point of intersection located 900 yards southwest of Bergen point (Great South Bay, town of Babylon).



Conservation Management Area Designation

The New York State Department of Environmental Resources in conjunction with Cornell Cooperative and the Town of Oyster Bay, Department of Environmental Resources (DER), seeks to initiate a program that will help improve the water quality in the Town of Oyster Bay portion of the Great South Bay. In order to properly manage the program, pursuant to Chapter 196 "Shellfish" Section 196-18 "Conservation Management Areas," the five areas proposed for clam and oyster seeding in the town portion of the Great South Bay must be designated by the Town Board as management areas. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation has determined that these areas are uncertified and as such meet the criteria for a management area pursuant to the aforementioned code section. The area requested for designation as a "Management Area" is described by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation as:

All that area of South Oyster Bay, including tributaries, creeks and canals, lying north of a line extending easterly from the northeasternmost point of land of Great Island (west of Great Island Channel and south of The Run) to the southeasternmost point of land of Goose Island (southwest of Massapequa Creek); thence continuing easterly to a point of intersection located 900 yards southeast of Unqua Point (Nassau Shores), immediately north of Old Winnehook Channel (local name); and continuing easterly to a point of intersection located 900 yards southwest of Bergen Point (Great South Bay, Town of Babylon).

Because the areas are closed to shell fishing, the Town has been asked to enforce the ban and prevent illegal harvesting. The Department of Environmental Resources with the assistance of Public Safety has the resources to complete this task. In addition, the project requires the Town of Oyster Bay, Department of Environmental Resources, to assist in the seeding of the designated areas and other water quality and shellfish seeding tasks as may be needed.

Town board designation of the area noted above as a Conservation Management Area is respectfully requested.

§ 196-18 Conservation management areas.

The Town Board may set aside as a management area, Town lands underwater for the conservation, transplantation, preservation, seeding and rehabilitation of shellfish. Any area so set aside shall come under the direct supervision of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources of the Town of Oyster Bay. No person shall take, interfere with or otherwise disturb shellfish within an area designated as a management area.

- A. An uncertified area shall be a management area.
- B. A description of each management area and all prohibitions, restrictions and regulations with regards to the taking of shellfish from a management area shall be posted in the office of the Town Clerk.
- C. Determinations by Commissioner.
 - (1) The Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources is authorized to prohibit and restrict the removal of shellfish from any management area. In making a determination as to the prohibition or restriction of the removal of any shellfish from a management area the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources shall, among other things, give due consideration to the following:
 - (a) Whether or not the shellfish have been sufficiently purified to be suitable as food for human consumption.
 - (b) Whether or not the first spawning period has passed for the shellfish in the management area.
 - (c) Whether a minimum quantity of shellfish is available within the shellfish area for spawning until such time as desired quantities of shellfish are maintained.
 - (2) Whenever the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources has made a determination after giving due consideration to the conditions prescribed in this section, he may open the management area with freedom of access for harvest by holders of shellfish permits and other persons duly authorized to use the management area.
- **D.** The Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources shall mark a management area with appropriate monuments, stakes or boundary markers.
- E. No person shall willfully injure or remove any signs, monuments, stakes or boundary markers of any kind placed for the purpose of delineating or locating a management area. The Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources may authorize the removal of any sign, monument, stake or boundary marker.

Proposed Action:

The Town of Oyster Bay ("Town") has acquired approximately 22.5 acres of land ("Site") located adjacent to the existing Ellsworth W. Allen Park ("Park") which was subject to an extensive soil remediation program which removed all known contaminated soils to a depth of 10 feet below grade beyond the requirements of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation NYCRR Part 375 Restricted Residential Soil Cleanup Objectives and the United States Department of Environmental Protection Agency Record of Decision for the site.



Lead Agency Coordination Request Letter Ellsworth W. Allen Park 4/20/2018

Since the completion of the remedial program, drainage infrastructure was installed to support the planned recreational improvements that had been developed through an extensive community outreach program, including the construction of a recharge basin and installation of leaching pools and connecting pipe. The Town is proposing to implement a project to develop this site for recreational use, utilizing a conceptual plan which meets the needs of the community while minimizing construction costs. The project will be comprised of two phases - Phase I entails installation of utilities and parking for the site and Phase II entails construction of the fields.

This project is anticipated to include the following features:

- One multi-purpose synthetic turf field, sized appropriately for high school soccer
- One Little League/Softball synthetic turf field, with natural grass outfield
- One Baseball synthetic turf field, with natural grass outfield
- One T-Ball/Challenger synthetic turf field
- Bleachers
- Baseball batting/pitching tunnels
- Restroom and Concession facility with roof observation/scorer's area
- Site and sports lighting (the Town may elect to install only the necessary conduit at this time)



Location: Liberty Industrial Finishing operated at 55 Motor Avenue between 1948 and 1977. The Site is located approximately one mile south of Bethpage State Park in Farmingdale, Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York. Site Features: The Site is the former location of an aircraft parts manufacturing and metal-finishing facility that began its operation in the early 1930's. From 1940 to 1944, the federal government and private corporate interests utilized the Site to develop and maintain production of materials needed for World War II. The Site includes a 30-acre property located at 55 Motor Avenue. The property is bordered by the Long Island Railroad to the north, Motor Avenue to the south, Main Street to the east and a small town park, Ellsworth Allen Park, to the west. The surrounding area is primarily residential with several commercial establishments on the major roads. Current Zoning/Uses: The Site can be divided into a western portion (Tax Lot 327 which is generally unpaved and limited activity) and an eastern portion (Tax Lots 331 and 332), each about 15 acres in size. Site operations in the western portion have ceased. The Plume A groundwater treatment system is located on the western portion. Tax Lot 332, 7 1/2-acres in size, of the eastern portion of the Site has been redeveloped and is paved over with a large-scale grocery/retail store and adjacent parking lot which was completed in May 2010. Now that the soils and subsurface features cleanup selected in the 2002 ROD have been completed, the Town will construct recreational facilities and establish the new community park on the western portion. The Town notified EPA that it would acquire the western 7.5-acre portion (Central Sub-Parcel) of the Eastern Parcel (which is adjacent to the Western Parcel), for further expansion of the Elisworth

MCLs (e.g., 5 ug/L for cadmium, 50 ug/L for Chromium, and 5 ug/L for TCE, cis-1,2-DCE, and PCE). USEPA will evaluate any need for expansion of the groundwater treatment network to meet these MCLs.

Site Health Assessment

People are not drinking contaminated groundwater because the area is served by a public water supply that is not affected by this contamination. Since residual contamination is found at depth, it is not expected that people will come into contact with contaminated soils or groundwater. People may come in contact with contaminants present in the Pond 2 sediments while entering or existing the pond during recreational activities. Volatile organic compounds in the groundwater or soil may move into the soil vapor (air spaces within the soil), which in turn may move into overlying buildings and affect indoor air quality. This process, which is similar to the movement of radon gas from the subsurface into the indoor air of buildings, is referred to as soil vapor intrusion. A passive sub-slab depressurization system (system that ventilates/removes the air beneath the building) has been installed in the building on the eastern portion of the site to prevent the indoor air quality from being affected. Because the central and western portion of the site is vacant, the inhalation of site-related contaminants due to soil vapor intrusion does not represent a concern in this portion of the site in its current condition. However, the potential exists for the inhalation of site contaminants due to soil vapor intrusion for any future on-site redevelopment and occupancy. Environmental sampling indicates soil vapor intrusion is not a concern for off-site buildings.



The Town of Oyster Bay Department of Environmental Resources (DER), Town Environmental Quality Review (TEQR) Division has reviewed the above referenced application pursuant to Article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law, State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the implementing regulations thereto at 6 NYCCR, Part 617, and the Town of Oyster Bay Environmental Quality Review Law (Chapter 110 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay). The following report summarizes DER's TEQR findings regarding the subject application.

Applicant: Department of Public Works, Town of Oyster Bay

Title of Project: Ellsworth W. Allen Park Expansion

Description of Proposed Action: The Town of Oyster Bay ("Town") has acquired approximately 22.5 acres of land ("Site") located adjacent to the existing Ellsworth W. Allen Park ("Park"). The site was subject to an extensive soil remediation program which removed all known contaminated soils to a depth of 10 feet below grade beyond the requirements of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation NYCRR Part 375 Restricted Residential Soil Cleanup Objectives and the United States Department of Environmental Protection Agency Record of Decision for the site. Contaminants historically found at the site included Benzo(a)pyrene, Dibenzo(a,h)anthracene, cadmium and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons. The site was then backfilled with clean fill.

The Site currently contains an operating groundwater treatment facility under the supervision of the USEPA. Part of the underground recharge piping runs under proposed elements of this project. A copy of the Excavation Findings in Preparation for Site Development report and Site Management Plan for the remedial work are available for review at the Division of Engineering office. The Town may allow the South Farmingdale Water District to discharge into the existing recharge basin. Potential enlargement of the basin to meet anticipated flowrates will be studied and addressed as necessary, and/or the Town may require that the recharge basin be partitioned to separate the multiple discharges. Any existing remediation infrastructure including recharge piping, pumps, underground electric and underground controls will remain as part of this project, portions of which will be modified to facilitate the work. This facility's effluent drainage system will be coordinated with the proposed development to ensure future operation.

Since the completion of the remedial program, drainage infrastructure was installed to support the planned recreational improvements that had been developed through an extensive community outreach program, including the construction of a recharge basin and installation of leaching pools and connecting pipe. The Town is proposing to implement a project to develop this site for recreational use, utilizing a conceptual plan which meets the needs of the community while minimizing construction costs.

This project will include the following features:

- One multi-purpose synthetic turf field, sized appropriately for high school soccer
- One Little League/Softball synthetic turf field, with natural grass outfield
- One Baseball synthetic turf field, with natural grass outfield
- One T-Ball/Challenger synthetic turf field



- Bleachers
- Baseball batting/pitching tunnels
- Restroom and Concession facility Sports lighting (the Town may elect to install only the necessary conduit at this time)
- Pedestrian walking path
- · Maintenance shed and facilities area
- Open grass field
- Parking area
- Landscaping
- Site Lighting

The project scope also entails the following tasks:

- Analyze the existing soils to determine suitability for drainage and structural support.
- Establish final grades for the site.
- Petition the Nassau County Department of Public Works for the installation of a new traffic signal to service the Site (A traffic signal warrant analysis has been provided to Nassau County and is pending approval and a traffic impact study has been prepared in order to assess potential environmental impacts).
- Coordinate the relocation of existing utilities and the installation of new utility services to support the development of the Site with the South Farmingdale Water District, Nassau County Department of Public Works, National Grid and PSEG-LI.
- Prepare a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for submission and approval by the Town Department of Planning and Development and New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
- Revise the existing Site Management Plan, as necessary, to conform to the final site plan for the project which shall detail the earth moving and excavations necessary and provide a protocol for the proper handling and disposal of contaminated soil if found during the course of work.



The environmental review of this application also included multiple meetings, emails and telephone conferences to obtain the information needed in order to perform a comprehensive and holistic environmental review of the proposed action. The following is a summary of DER's analysis of the relevant environmental parameters with regard to the subject application, based on the information contained in the documents enumerated above.

Zoning and Land Use – Ellsworth W. Allen Park in Farmingdale currently comprises approximately 16 acres at the northeast corner of the intersection of Motor Avenue and Heisser Lane. The Site is located in the Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, New York. The Site is bounded by the Long Island Rail Road tracks to the north, Motor Avenue to the south, Main Street to the east, and Ellsworth Allen Park to the west. The Town of Oyster Bay acquired by condemnation approximately 21.5 acres of the former Liberty Industrial Finishing Site, adjoining Allen Park to the east, for the specific purpose of expanding the park. The remaining approximately 9 acres at the easternmost end of the former Liberty site has been redeveloped with a Stop & Shop supermarket. The Town also performed condemnation proceedings to acquire two additional parcels, totaling approximately one acre, on Heisser Lane to the immediate north of Allen Park for inclusion in the park expansion project.





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The existing park and proposed expanded area is within a Town of Oyster Bay Recreational Zone and the proposed use is consistent with the current zoning. As the proposed use is intended to serve the needs of the community and is compatible with surrounding land uses, it is anticipated that the proposed action will not have a significant adverse impact on land use and zoning.

<u>Traffic</u>, <u>Parking</u>, <u>and Pedestrian Impacts</u> – A Traffic Impact Study and Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis were prepared for the proposed project. Meetings and correspondence with the applicant, traffic and engineering consultants, and Town staff culminated in a comprehensive and through review regarding traffic, parking and pedestrian impact analysis. The below information is a brief summary of the analysis that resulted in the TEQR recommendation as it relates to same.

Traffic data were collected and analyzed for the Traffic Impact Study (TIS) to establish the existing conditions and demands. This included traffic volume counts, spot speed measurements, field inventories and observations. The data collected were reviewed, summarized and tabulated, and were utilized to conduct the traffic signal warrant analysis and to determine any potential significant impacts of the proposed development.

Study Methodology

The following tasks were conducted to accomplish the goals of the TIS:

- 1. Background research was conducted and aerial maps and related documents were reviewed.
- 2. Site visits were conducted to observe the prevailing traffic conditions in the study area.
- 3. The proposed site access driveway at Motor Avenue/Woodward Parkway was analyzed as the key intersection, as it will experience the maximum number of project-generated trips.
- 4. Field inventories were made of traffic control devices and number and direction of travel lanes at and near the key intersection.
- 5. Automatic Traffic Recorder (ATR) machine counts were collected continuously for a period of one week at all approaches of the key intersection.
- 6. Spot speed data were collected in both directions along Motor Avenue, in the vicinity of the key intersection, to determine the prevailing operating speeds.
- 7. Based on the aforementioned data, traffic signal warrant analyses were conducted in accordance with the MUTCD guidelines.
- 8. Manual turning movement counts at the key intersection of Motor Avenue and Woodward Parkway, collected on a weekday during the morning (7:00 9:00 AM) and evening (4:00 6:00 PM) peak periods, were obtained from Nassau County Department of Public Works (NCDPW) and utilized in the study.
- 9. Based on the ATR and manual turning movement counts, existing traffic volumes were established at the key intersection. These volumes were utilized in analyzing the traffic conditions without the proposed development.
- 10. Trip generation and assignment analyses were conducted to estimate the traffic to be generated by the proposed development and its assignments through the key intersection and adjacent roadways during the peak hours analyzed. 11. Project-generated trips assigned through the key intersection were added to the existing volumes to establish and analyze the future traffic conditions with the proposed project.
- 12. Intersection capacity and level of service (LOS) analyses were conducted using Synchro to analyze the traffic operating conditions with and without the proposed project during the weekday AM and PM and Saturday midday peak hours.
- 13. Analysis results for the traffic conditions with and without the proposed project were compared to determine the potential impacts of the proposed development.
- 14. TIS report prepared to summarize and present the study methodology, data, analysis results and conclusions.



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Roadway Network

Ellsworth W. Allen Park is located along the north side of Motor Avenue. Motor Avenue is a two-way east-west arterial, with one travel lane in each direction and an additional two-way left turn lane in the vicinity of Woodward Parkway intersection. Woodward Parkway is a two-way north-south street, which terminates at Motor Avenue from the south, making a "T" intersection. Woodward Parkway generally has one lane in each direction and additional turning lanes at certain intersections. At the northbound approach to the Motor Avenue intersection, Woodward Parkway has two travel lanes including one right turn lane and one left turn bay. The proposed Park access driveway will form the fourth leg of the intersection from the north, with two southbound lanes to facilitate exiting traffic.

Key Intersection

The intersection of Motor Avenue at Woodward Parkway/Proposed Park Driveway was analyzed to determine the potential project-related traffic impacts. This intersection is expected to experience the maximum increase in traffic due to the proposed project.

Traffic Volumes

Automatic Traffic Recorder (ATR) machines were installed at all approaches of the Motor Avenue and Woodward Parkway intersection to monitor and record vehicular counts for a period of one week from Sunday (February 11, 2018) to Saturday (February 17, 2018). The data collected were reviewed and summarized and were utilized in the traffic signal warrant analysis presented below. In addition, manual turning movement counts collected at the intersection of Motor Avenue and Woodward Parkway were obtained from NCDPW. These counts were collected on a weekday morning (7:00 – 9:00 AM) and evening (4:00 – 6:00 PM) peak periods. These counts, along with the aforementioned recent ATR counts, were utilized to establish the weekday AM and PM and Saturday midday peak hour volumes at the key intersection for the capacity and LOS analysis discussed below. Traffic volume data were reviewed, summarized and tabulated, and are available at the offices of DER and DPW.


Spot Speed Data

To monitor and record prevailing vehicular speeds along Motor Avenue, manual spot speed data were collected using a radar gun on Wednesday, February 14, 2018 during off-peak hours (9AM – 1PM). During the survey, eastbound and westbound traffic speeds were recorded separately along Motor Avenue approaching the Woodward Parkway intersection. In each direction, a statistically significant number of readings were recorded. Standard industry guidelines were followed and data were recorded under dry daylight conditions. Spot speed data were reviewed, tabulated and summarized, and using frequency distribution curves, 85th percentile operating speeds were calculated for each direction along Motor Avenue. The spot speed data indicate that the 85th percentile speeds along Motor Avenue are 43 MPH and 46 MPH in the eastbound and westbound directions, respectively. These operating speeds were utilized in the traffic signal warrant analysis, following the MUTCD guidelines.

The plan also proposes a new Park access driveway on Motor Avenue, opposite Woodward Parkway. Under the existing conditions, Motor Avenue and Woodward Parkway make a 3-legged "T" intersection controlled by a stop sign at its minor approach of Woodward Parkway, which terminates at the intersection from the south. The proposed Park access driveway will make the intersection 4-legged. The study was conducted to perform a traffic signal warrant analysis for the intersection of Motor Avenue and Woodward Parkway, as well as to determine any potential significant traffic impacts due to the proposed development of the Park. Traffic data were collected and analyzed and field inventories and observations were made to conduct the traffic study. A traffic signal warrant analysis was conducted based on the guidelines set forth by the Federal Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and its New York State Supplement (MUTCD). According to the guidelines, a traffic signal is warranted under the existing conditions at the intersection.

The proposed Park expansion and the proposed access driveway will increase traffic demands at the intersection. Therefore, installation of a traffic signal is recommended at the intersection. It should be noted that while traffic will increase at this intersection, this is not anticipated to produce a significant adverse impact. Signalized intersection capacity analyses were conducted with and without the additional project-generated traffic to determine any significant impacts due to the prosed development. The TIS indicates that based on the analysis and data, the key intersection will have ample capacity to accommodate the additional traffic to be generated by the proposed development. The intersection will continue to operate at satisfactory levels, and no significant traffic impacts are anticipated due to the proposed project. Parking needs will be sufficiently accommodated based on the proposed recreational uses at the site and have been incorporated into the proposed action. Also, it should also be noted that the proposed project includes a series of pedestrian walkways and crosswalks and will improve access and community connectivity to the park.

<u>Soils and Topography</u> – A SPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Construction Activity will be required for the proposed project and all necessary erosion and sediment control measures will be utilized to ensure that the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan and best management practices provided within that document will be utilized on site. The site is not expected to be susceptible to erosion after the completion of construction. Based on the forgoing, it is not anticipated that there will be significant adverse environmental impact to soils and topography as a result of the proposed project.

Further, as previously mentioned, a Site Management Plan has been prepared for the proposed action and the site has an extensive history of soil remediation as document in the EPA Five Year Review of the Liberty Industrial Finishing Site. Both documents are available for review at the Department of Environmental Resources and were considered in DER's recommendation that there will not be a significant adverse impact to soils and topography as a result of the proposed action.

It should be noted that the main elements of the 2002 ROD include excavation and disposal of contaminated on-Site soils, removal of contaminated materials from underground storage tanks and other subsurface features, excavation and disposal of contaminated sediments within Pond A, implementation of a monitoring program for the remainder of the ponds within Massapequa Preserve, construction and operation of pump-and-treat systems for Plume A, implementation of a groundwater monitoring program, and ICs to prevent access to groundwater and maintain land use. All of these remedial components have been implemented and groundwater and sediment operation, maintenance, and monitoring activities are ongoing.

The full pump and treat construction was completed in 2009/2010 to include off-Site recovery wells; pulse pumping was initiated in 2012. Pulse pumping does not appear to be pulling a higher rate of mass from the aquifer except for two possible exceptions at RW-3A for cadmium and RW-7 for total chromium where increasing trends are shown following the onset of pulse pumping. On-Site/property boundary monitoring wells show that VOCs have nearly reached remedial goals with the exception of one monitoring well in the UGA (MW-7A). Maximum Site-wide VOC concentrations are found downgradient of the property in an area known as the mid-field in the MA (MW-11C and MW-11D). The maximum TCE concentration of 160 µg/l was detected in MW-11D during this review period. While concentrations have varied historically, MW-11C and MW-11D have shown a decreasing trend during this review period. In addition, periodic monitoring of the six sentinel wells has not detected any Site-related Plume A or Plume B contamination, indicating that the on-Site GRS pumping and treatment is operating as intended and the plumes are stable.

Site-wide cadmium and chromium concentrations are lower than historic levels but recent concentration trends have varied depending on the monitoring well. Maximum cadmium and chromium concentrations are found in the mid-field area, but in the UGA rather than the MA where maximum VOCs reside. Mid-

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field monitoring wells showing maximum Site-wide cadmium and chromium concentrations in 2015 were RW-6 (1,030 μ g/l) and MW-17B (269 μ g/l), respectively. Both of these wells are depicted to be within the capture zone of the mid-field UGA recovery wells so the plumes should not migrate outside the current extent of contamination, but will continue to be monitored to ensure this does not occur.


The remedy has eliminated exposure to ecological receptors through the excavation and off-Site disposal of the contaminated sediment in Massapequa Creek. The enhanced monitoring program involving periodic sediment and surface water chemistry and the toxicity testing for the lower ponds was last conducted in November 2014. The review of the April 2015 Post-Remediation Pond Sampling Report indicates that the surface water sampling did not indicate any exceedances of the New York State Ambient Water Quality Standards and sediment sampling and analysis did not show an impact to biota based on sediment toxicity testing. All ICs have been implemented at the Liberty site and the ESD, which was published by EPA in July 2012, notified the public of the change in the permitted use from commercial-industrial to recreational for the Central Parcel.

Flora and Fauna — The proposed action will occur in an area that has been previously disturbed and remediated. Soil disturbance and construction activities would only disturb generalist species indicative of natural succession in suburban environments. The site plan includes significant landscape plantings and site improvements. None of the vegetation would be considered ecologically significant, nor would any of the fauna that may inhabit the subject property where disturbance is proposed. Any displaced birds or small mammals (squirrels, rabbits, meadow voles, etc.) would constitute an insignificant ecological impact; therefore, no significant adverse impacts to ecological resources will result of the proposed project.

Surface Waters – The subject property does not contain any mapped wetlands, and is not located in close proximity to such resources. The proposed development includes the installation of stormwater drainage infrastructure providing on-site storage for runoff. Further, as previously indicated the impervious area will be decreased as a result of the proposed project. The regraded areas will direct stormwater to a series of catch basins; increased landscaping along with existing pervious surfaces will also be utilized to manage stormwater runoff. The site is not located in a floodzone, therefore there is no need to further mitigate potential flooding impacts on site or onto adjacent properties and roadways. In summation, there are no significant adverse environmental impacts associated with potential adverse impacts to natural surface water resources as a result of the proposed project.

Groundwater The Site currently contains an operating groundwater treatment facility under the supervision of the USEPA. Part of the underground recharge piping runs under proposed elements of this project. A copy of the Excavation Findings in Preparation for Site Development report and Site Management Plan for the remedial work are available for review at the Division of Engineering office. The Town may allow the South Farmingdale Water District and EPA-managed groundwater treatment facility to discharge into the existing recharge basin. Potential enlargement of the basin to meet anticipated flowrates will be studied and addressed as necessary, and/or the Town may require that the recharge basin be partitioned to separate the multiple discharges. Any existing remediation infrastructure including recharge piping, pumps, underground electric and underground controls will remain as part of this project. This facility's effluent drainage system will be coordinated with the proposed development to ensure future operation. Since the completion of the remedial program, drainage infrastructure was installed to support the planned recreational improvements that had been developed through an extensive community outreach program, including the construction of a recharge basin and installation of leaching pools and connecting pipe. The proposed facility will discharge sewage to the existing Nassau County sewer line which serves the site, thereby avoiding potential groundwater quality impacts that may be associated with the use of subsurface sewage disposal systems.





According to the Site Management Plan (SMP) prepared for the Site:

Inspections

The 2002 Agreement at Paragraph 20 and the BFPP Statute provide rights of access to the USEPA and others for inspections and other appropriate purposes. The 2002 Agreement can be viewed at the Department of Environmental Resources of Department of Public Works (Appendix C in the SMP). Such access may include sampling, monitoring, and operations and maintenance to the on-site groundwater treatment system and potential remedial efforts should additional impacts be discovered onsite during future site development activities. The Town will provide access in accordance with these requirements.

Notifications

The 2002 Agreement and the BFPP Statute provide for notification of the USEPA in a variety of circumstances. In the 2002 Agreement, at Paragraph 25 the Town agreed to comply with notice requirements under any applicable laws and, in addition, agreed to immediately notify USEPA of releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances at or from the Site which constitute an emergency or may present an immediate threat to the public or the environment. The 2002 Agreement is included as Appendix C. The Town will provide notifications in compliance with these requirements and any other applicable laws. For example, reportable quantities of petroleum product shall be reported to the NYSDEC spills hotline. Paragraphs 2.2 and 2.2.1 provide for notice in emergency circumstances in satisfaction of the additional notice requirement noted above.

Cooperation with the USEPA and the SWDs

The 2002 Agreement Paragraph 25, and the BFPP Statute provide for cooperation between the Town and the USEPA, the SWDs, and others in connection with any future remediation of ROD violations, ongoing groundwater remediation, and in general with the USEPA's ongoing oversight. The 2002 Agreement is included as Appendix C. The Town will comply with these requirements, which include cooperation with any further remediation of ROD exceedances which may be conducted by the SWDs in the future, and other activities which the USEPA may direct in the course of its continuing oversight.

The Town will cooperate with the USEPA and SWDs to insure compliance with land use and restrictions and institutional controls for the Site. As noted previously, while the Town may conduct remediation of residual impacts going forward, the Town does not waive the SWDs obligation to conduct the cleanup and bear its costs if in the Town's discretion it believes the contamination encountered is sufficiently significant. The Commissioner of Parks will manage the Town's compliance with the foregoing and may designate appropriate Town employees or consultants to work with the USEPA to that end.

Further, according to the EPA Second Five Year Review conducted in July, the following information should be noted: Site historical operations on the Western Parcel and Central Parcel have ceased and these parcels are presently vacant except for the groundwater treatment system on the southwestern portion of the Western Parcel. The Eastern Parcel has been redeveloped and is paved over with a large-scale grocery/retail store and adjacent parking lot that was completed in May 2010.

There are no private drinking wells in the vicinity of the Site. People living near the Site obtain their drinking water from local water utilities; the water utilities routinely test their supplies to ensure compliance with State and federal drinking water standards. In 1998, EPA and the Massapequa Water District (MWD) and the South Farmingdale Water District (SFWD) joined in a collaborative effort and installed six "sentinel" monitoring wells between the Site property and downgradient public drinking water wells. These sentinel wells serve as an early warning system to indicate whether any plume of contamination is beginning to migrate towards the water supply well fields. Periodic monitoring of these sentinel wells by the local water districts has not detected any Site-related contamination.

<u>Special Groundwater Protection Area (SGPA)/Critical Environmental Area (CEA)</u> – The subject property is not located in or substantially contiguous to the SGPA or in any other area designated as a CEA by the Town of Oyster Bay.

Air Quality, Odors, Noise, and Lighting — The proposed project does not entail a use that would be associated with significant generation of odors, adverse impacts to air quality or noise and specific considerations and adjustments have been made in order to ensure that outdoor lighting does not adversely impact neighboring residents. Any exterior lighting installed for the proposed project will be required to be of shielded design, so as to minimize illumination impacts to neighboring properties. There are no significant adverse environmental impacts regarding air quality, odors, noise and lighting.

Water Usage and Sewage Generation — There will be a minor increase in water usage and sewage generation rates as a result of the proposed project. The proposed project entails Water Service Connection to South Farmingdale Water District and Nassau County Department of Health backflow prevention approval. Sanitary wastewater typically is generated at approximately the same rate as domestic water consumption, which is not expected to increase to levels that would cause an adverse impact. All such wastewater generated at this location is discharged to the Nassau County sewer connection which serves the site, and conveyed to the County's Cedar Creek facility on the south shore of the Town of Hempstead (hamlet of Wantagh) for treatment and effluent discharge to the Atlantic Ocean.


<u>Solid Waste Generation</u> — There will be an increase in solid waste generation rates at the site as a result of the intensified land use and temporarily as a result of construction activity. Solid wastes generated as a result of the proposed action will be collected for disposal at existing solid waste management facilities, as occurs with the existing current practices. Recycling is required as per Town Code.

Other Community Services — As the proposed project is intended to serve the needs of the community and has been designed based on the culmination of extensive community outreach, the proposed project is not anticipated to impose significant additional demand on other community services (e.g., police, fire, etc.) at the subject location. The proposed action does not entail the generation of school children who would require the services of the School District. Further is should be noted that the Town conducted a series of meetings to ensure that the community's needs were being met and that there would not be an adverse impact as a result of the proposed project. The Town's recent outreach efforts include the following:



<u>Aesthetic Resources</u> — The proposed site does not contain any significant aesthetic value and would benefit from the aesthetic improvements inherent in the proposed project. Additionally, the area of proposed disturbance provides no significant viewshed or aesthetic value. The applicant has conducted numerous meeting with the community in order to develop a plan that incorporates enhanced aesthetics while meeting the park needs as communicated to the Town. Therefore, there are no significant adverse environmental impacts anticipated as a result of the proposed project as it pertains to aesthetic resources.

<u>Historic and Archaeological Resources</u> – The subject property is previously disturbed and contains no historic or archaeologically resources of significance. The SHPO CRIS database was reviewed and there are no historically significant resources or even, "undetermined" properties on or substantially contiguous to the site that could have potentially been impacted by the proposed action. Thus, the proposed action will not adversely impact archaeological and/or historic resources listed in or eligible for the New York State and National Registers of Historic Places.



<u>Open Space and Recreation</u> – The subject property has been designed to provide the needed public open space and recreation areas in the subject area. Far from adversely impacting open space and recreational opportunities, the purpose of the proposed project to to provide additional opportunities for community enjoyment and participation in open space and recreation.

<u>Energy</u> – The subject action entails connection to existing utilities. The proposed facility expansion will involve an incremental increase on energy demand, which will be moderated by the implementation of energy conservation measures required under the New York State Building Code.

Public Health and Safety – The USEPA-directed remedial action for soil and surface features to cleanup standards specified in the Record of Decision (ROD) has been completed. The Western and Central Parcels have both been remediated to the same ROD criteria. As the ROD directed remedial actions are complete and the Site transitions from Superfund remediation of a contaminated site to ordinary park construction and operations at a remediated site, many of the special site requirements developed for the Superfund work are unnecessary and inappropriate and generally no longer apply. At the same time, it is possible that some residual contamination may be encountered during park construction and operations. Accordingly, a Site Management Plan (SMP), dated February 26, 2018 was prepared to establish appropriate procedures for park construction and operation, including timely investigation and response if evidence of contamination is encountered. The SMP is intended to (1) ensure the safety of the park, (2)

protect park workers and the community, (3) comply with the Town's obligations under the 2002 Agreement and the BFPP Statute as noted above, and (4) preserve the Town's protections from liability. The major features of the SMP, as set forth below, may be broadly characterized as follows.

- Park workers will be trained in the history of contamination and remediation at the Site and recognition of evidence of possible Site contamination in compliance with Occupational Health and Safety Organization (OSHA) Hazard Communication (29CFR 1910.1200) and Safety Training (29CFR 1926.21) Standards. If evidence of contamination is discovered, immediate notification will be made to an Environmental Professional as described in the SMP.
- The Town of Oyster Bay Commissioner of Parks (Public Works?) will designate one or more experienced Environmental Professionals who are familiar with the site history and have appropriate training.
- The Environmental Professional will be trained (e.g., Professional Engineer or OSHA 40-hour Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response Training (HAZWOPER)) to evaluate environmental hazards and handle environmental emergencies at the Site.
- The Environmental Professional will evaluate any and all reports of contamination and manage the Town's response in consultation with appropriate Town officials. In the interest of safety and efficiency, incidental contamination will be handled using simplified procedures set forth below. While they are simplified in comparison to the site-specific procedures employed under the ROD for investigation and remediation of a contaminated Superfund site, the procedures under this SMP are appropriate for a public park on a fully remediated site and compliant with applicable laws and requirements.
- In cases involving ROD exceedances, incidental contamination would otherwise have been the
 responsibility of the Settling Work Defendants (SWDs) and handled in accordance with the ROD.
 While the Town will generally assume responsibility for investigations of and response to
 contamination under this SMP, if ROD exceedances are encountered which the Town in its discretion
 deems sufficiently significant, the Town retains its right to refer such ROD violations to the USEPA
 and SWDs for remediation in accordance with the ROD.
- The Town will comply with applicable federal, state, and local requirements for park construction and
 operations and with the specific requirements of the 2002 Agreement and the BFPP Statute, which
 may exceed those requirements in some respects, for example as to institutional controls, notice,
 cooperation or access.
- The Commissioner of Parks (Public Works?), in consultation with appropriate Town officials, will manage the Town's implementation of the Site Management Plan and compliance with its obligations and may designate Town employees or consultants to work with EPA on specific matters as may be appropriate.

The Town intends for compliance with the SMP to constitute reasonable steps with respect to hazardous substances at the Site in satisfaction of applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations and the Town's obligations under both the 2002 Agreement and the BFPP Statute. Based on the forgoing, it is anticipated that the proposed project will not have a significant adverse environmental impact on public health and safety.

<u>Community Growth and Character</u> – The proposed project will not result in population growth and is in character with the existing land use, zoning and overall community character in the project vicinity. The proposed project will be an asset to the community and is consistent with the community character and development of the appropriately zoned parcel.

<u>CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION</u> – If the Town Board concludes that the foregoing information fully addresses the relevant environmental issues, such that it is determined that the proposed action does not pose the potential for significant environmental impacts, the Board should adopt a **Negative Declaration**, either as part of the approval or via a separate document for the proposed action. In either case, the Negative Declaration should cite the present memorandum as the basis for the SEQRA determination.

If it is decided that modifications are necessary in order to provide additional mitigation with respect to anticipated environmental impacts, the Negative Declaration should identify said modifications and the reasons thereto, in addition to citing the present memorandum, as the basis for the SEQRA determination.

The requirements of SEQRA can be fulfilled by the filing of the Negative Declaration in the Environmental Notice Bulletin. Should the Board adopt the Negative Declaration and direct DER to file the necessary paperwork, DER will carry out this task and the SEQR process will have been completed in accordance with Article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law, State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the implementing regulations thereto at 6 NYCCR, Part 617, and the Town of Oyster Bay Environmental Quality Review Law (Chapter 110 of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay).

SUBJECT: Amendment to Resolution No. 563-2006

Resolution No. 810-2005, adopted on November 15, 2005, authorized the Town to enter into negotiations to sell and convey title to certain parcels of real property that abut the northerly side of certain premises located on Joyce Lane, Woodbury, New York (the "Joyce Lane Buffer"). Thereafter, the Town Board, by Resolution No. 563-2006, adopted on June 27, 2006, established prices for the parcels that comprise the Joyce Lane Buffer, and authorized the sale of those parcels to those residents who previously expressed interest in their purchase. A price of \$16,000 was established for all of the 4,000 sq. ft. parcels. On March 30, 2007, fifteen of the parcels were sold.

In August, 2014, the owners of 23 Joyce Lane first expressed interest in purchasing the 4,000 sq. ft. parcel abutting their property. A Contract of Sale was executed, and the transaction closed on January 21, 2015 with a \$16,000 payment being made to the Town, consistent with the terms of Resolution No. 563-2006.

In April, 2018, this Office received an inquiry from counsel for the current owners of 23 Joyce Lane, who sought a correction deed for the parcel that was conveyed on January 21, 2015. The title company has requested that the Town Board, by resolution, authorize the execution of the correction deed. Our research of the Town's files indicates that four parcels were omitted from Resolution 563-2006, as the owners of the abutting property had not expressed an interest in purchase of the Joyce Lane Buffer parcels at the time Resolution No. 563-2006 was adopted, although the price of all of the 4,000 sq. ft. parcels had been established.

Accordingly, this Office recommends and requests that Resolution No. 563-2006 be amended to now include the following four parcels:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay, by Resolution No. 507-1998, adopted on July 7, 1998, did heretofore establish a policy for the maintenance of inventory and the disposal of the Town's surplus personal property; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Nocella, Town Attorney, and Thomas M. Sabellico, Special Counsel, by memorandum dated June 12, 2018, requested and recommended that said policy be replaced; and

WHEREAS, no statute prescribes a procedure for the sale of unneeded Town personal property, and therefore, there is no statutory mandate that such property be sold only after public advertisement for sealed bids or advertisement for public auction; however, in order to fill a fiduciary duty, the method of sale adopted should be one which is designed to bring the best price or maximum benefits and may include sale by either auction, private negotiation, or competitive bidding,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the recommendation and request as hereinabove set forth are hereby accepted and approved and Resolution No. 507-1998 is hereby rescinded; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the care and custody of all personal property of the Town assigned to a particular department of the Town shall be the responsibility of the head of said department, and all personal property of the Town not assigned to a particular department of the Town shall be the responsibility of the Commissioner of the Department of General Services; and be at further

RESOLVED, That the Commissioner of the Department of General Services is hereby designated Property Manager of the Town's personal property and he or she shall be responsible for maintaining an inventory control of all such items; and be it further

RESOLVED, That every department head shall, on a form and in a manner designated by the Commissioner of the Department of General Services and the Town Comptroller, submit in writing to the Commissioner of the Department of General Services an inventory of all such property assigned to his or her department or under his or her care and custody; and be it further

RESOLVED, That in cooperation with the Town Comptroller, the Commissioner of the Department of General Services shall maintain and keep a record of the Town's personal property, based upon the data supplied to the Department of General Services by each department head, as well as from such other sources as may be available, and the Town Comptroller shall furnish to the Commissioner of the Department of General Services a fixed asset record, which shall be updated periodically, all in a manner as prescribed by the Comptroller of the State of New York; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Town of Oyster Bay does hereby adopt the following policies and procedures to be followed, which authorize the Commissioner of the Department of General Services to dispose of those items of Town property deemed surplus:

- 1. When a Town department head deems it necessary to dispose of any Town personal property, he or she shall notify the Commissioner of the Department of General Services, in writing, giving a full description of each item, including its condition, age, original cost, if known, and its estimated current market value;
- 2. The Commissioner of the Department of General Services shall evaluate and determine the feasibility of reassigning any such personal property to another Town department where there is a valid and useful need for same. If the item has a substantial monetary value, arrangements may be made with the respective department heads and, with the approval of the Town Comptroller, said property inventory record will be transferred using a disposition form transferring from the department disposing of said property to the department acquiring said property;
- 3. Where it is determined that there is no valid and useful need for personal property in any Town department, the Commissioner of the Department of General Services shall declare such personal property to be surplus property and shall proceed to determine an estimated fair market value of the item, to the best of his or her ability, utilizing trade manuals, used equipment manuals, and any other available evaluation sources or methods. The estimate obtained, indicating the source, will be documented as part of the disposition record;
- 4. If the estimated value of the item to be disposed of is \$10,000.00 or greater, the item to be disposed of shall be advertised by the Commissioner of the Department of General Services, upon Town Board approval, for competitive bid sale or public auction, including on-line auction. If the estimated value of the item to be disposed of is less than \$10,000.00, the Commissioner of the Department of General Services, upon Town Board approval, may advertise the item for competitive bid sale or public auction, including on-line auction. If an item is being offered for sale by bid or auction, the minimum price shall be the estimated value as determined by the Commissioner of the Department of General Services;
- 5. If the estimated value of the item to be disposed of is less than \$10,000.00, the Commissioner of the Department of General Services may sell such item directly to a party making the highest offer, provided that the Commissioner has prepared a written offer for sale

and has received a written offer to purchase from at least three parties, and the Town Board approves accepting said offer;

- 6. A good faith effort shall be made to obtain three offers to purchase. If the Town is unable to obtain three offers, the attempts made shall be documented and become part of the disposition record. In no event shall the inability to obtain the three offers to purchase be a bar to the disposition;
- 7. Whenever any disposition is awarded to other than the highest dollar offeror, the reasons such an award furthers the purpose of the Town as set forth hereinabove shall be documented by the Commissioner of the Department of General Services and be maintained as part of the disposition record;
- 8. If an item or items to be disposed of are being replaced by an item or items from the same manufacturer, and the manufacturer is willing to accept the item or items being disposed of for a credit towards the purchase of the new item or items ("trade-in") the Commissioner of the Department of General Services may dispose of the item or items by trade-in, without requiring competitive bid, public auction, or three written offers, provided that in the discretion of the Commissioner of the Department of General Services, the credit for the trade-in is a fair and reasonable amount for the estimated value of the item or items being disposed of; and
- 9. Whenever any item is reassigned, sold or disposed of, the Commissioner of the Department of General Services shall notify the Town Comptroller, so that the Towns master inventory records will be kept current.

Dear Commissioner Lenz,

The Town of Oyster Bay has utilized computerized routing for almost thirty years for the creation of sanitation and recycling routes, under the concept of "two crews—two services". With the advent of single stream routing and the use of common shared equipment, the Town has elected to move to "one crewtwo services". In order to accomplish this goal, the current Town routes need to be adjusted.

Phase 1 of the Project, the requirement to build the routing dataset, has been successfully completed. This scope of work entails Phase 2, which is the creation of required routes. Working in conjunction with LiRo, our subconsultant Routesmart Technologies will develop efficient and optimized routes for the Town.

Scope of Work

The project is to generate new residential and recycling routes for the Town of Oyster Bay. The objective is to create 45 trash routes and 15 recycling routes for servicing approximately 115,000 households. The goals include generating new residential trash and recycling routes with single packer vehicles.

Town crews will complete one trash route, empty vehicle and complete one recycling route. Trash routes will use 950 homes per route target, 60 lbs-collected per location and 20,000 lb vehicle capacity. Recycling routes will use 1,300 homes per route target, 25 lbs per location and 10,000 lb vehicle capacity.

Service day changes to the residents are not desired. Routes will be developed to preserve existing sanitation and recycling zones and corresponding service day. The existing GIS based service locations, sanitation districts, SORT zones, and facility locations created in Phase 1 of the project will be used.

LiRo will balance route territories and sequence routes so that each route has the same amount of workload based on time, with the following parameters: 1) Serve both sides of a residential street, 2) Service time per stop will be 30 seconds, and 3) 5 am start time for all vehicles. Route summary reports and driving directions for each route (PDF format for local printing) will be provided.

LiRo will conduct one (1) review of a five (5) route sample prior to the finalization of the routing scenario. We strongly recommend that the Town drive these routes and scrutinize operational constraints based on this sample.

Integrated Construction, Design, and Technology Solutions



Once final routes are delivered, rework will require a separate scope of work and budget based on edits that may be requested. Our proposed fee includes the use of HERE street data to support the project. No end-user licensing of the HERE data is included via this project effort.

Routesmart will perform all routing work remotely. RouteSmart and Town of Oyster Bay will use WebEx video conferencing to review results. LiRo personnel will be local and will be on-site to assist the Town during the route review. Should the Town request Routesmart personnel be on-site, travel & expenses will be billed as incurred. This is not anticipated to occur.

<u>Fees</u>

The fee for the above services is a *lump sum of \$ 70,000*. Work will be invoiced in accordance with the terms and conditions of our On-Call Civil Engineering Contract with the Town.

Phase 3 of the project, which is the long term maintenance of the routes, will include the Town acquiring an up to date license of RouteSmart software and the training of Town staff. For budget purposes, we recommend that the Town allocate \$75,000 for Phase 3 of the project.
