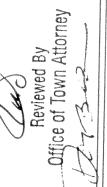

A resolution of the Town Board is required in order for the Town to settle claims, where the amount of the proposed settlement exceeds Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

The above referenced claim arose as a result of an incident following the adoption of a dog at the Town of Oyster Bay Animal Shelter on November 13, 2013. The Connors adopted a Cane Corso, a dog of over 100 pounds. Shortly after adoption, the dog attacked Tonilynn Connor, then 14 years of age. The dog left scars on Miss Connor's face. The scarring has formed a hardened area on Miss Connor's check, clearly visible. Claimant further had corrective surgery involving excision of the scar of left eyebrow and removal of scar tissue of the lower lip involving closure of the flap of the lip, resulting in significant scarring. The dog was euthanized on November 19, 2013.

The trial of this matter commenced in May 2017, resulting in the selection of a jury. At a conference prior to opening statements, this case settled for \$20,000.00. This settlement takes into consideration the significant damages value of this matter and the liability defenses of the Town. The funds for said payment are to be drawn from Account No. TWN AMS 1910 43010 602 0000 000. This Office received settlement documents, including a Release and Stipulation of Discontinuance on June 2, 2017.

Accordingly, we have attached a resolution authorizing payment of \$20,000.00, together with copies of the closing documents including the Stipulation of Discontinuance and General Release executed by the claimant on May 24, 2017.

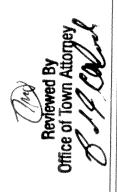

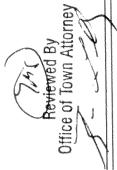

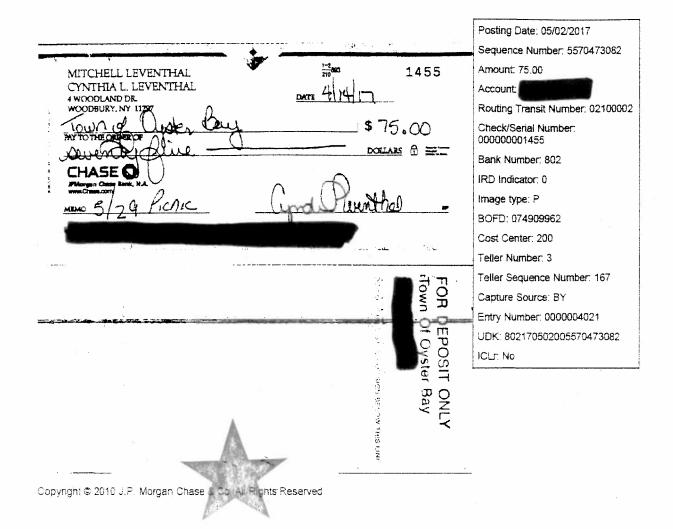

As we discussed, my client, the Oyster Bay Fire Department is preparing to enter a Lease Purchase Agreement for the purposes of purchasing a replacement tower ladder truck. The truck will replace obsolete equipment. As in the past the Department is seeking tax exempt financing in connection with the purchase. Under the IRS Code, the Department is permitted to make application to the United States Internal Revenue Service as a qualified tax exempt borrower. The Town has no financial obligation concerning the purchase, however the Statute requires that Special Not for Profit Fire Corporations must obtain approval to enter into such tax exempt financing from the municipality where the Corporation does business. Re: Memorandum - Eligibility for Private Activity Financing Under the Internal Revenue Service Code §103. Purchase and Financing of Firefighting Equipment/Apparatus

In connection with the Fire Department's proposed Private Activity Financing application the following Memorandum has been prepared for the Corporation's Accountants, will be kept on file with the Secretary of the Corporation, and provided to the holder of the financing obligation, Community First National Bank and serve as evidence that the Corporation is an eligible entity under §103 of the United States Internal Revenue Service Code.

The Oyster Bay Fire Department is a New York Special Not-for-Profit Fire Protection Corporation organized in 1888. The Department has been providing fire protection to the greater Oyster Bay community since it was organized over one hundred twenty five (125) years ago. New York Special Not-for-Profit Fire Protection Corporations are not taxing authorities, and contract with municipalities they serve. The

Department contracts with each of the municipalities lying within the Oyster Bay Fire Protection Area (hereinafter the "Protection Area"). The Protection Area contains the unincorporated areas of the Town of Oyster Bay, and the Incorporated Villages of Mill Neck, Cove Neck, Oyster Bay Cove, and Laurel Hollow, and covers approximately 28 square miles of territory.

As a Special Not-for-Profit Fire Protection Corporation, New York Statute requires that the Department be under the supervision of the municipality where the Department's Headquarters are physically located. The Department is located at 188 South Street in the unincorporated hamlet of Oyster Bay, therefore, the Town of Oyster Bay, pursuant to the New York State Municipal Law, has regulatory authority regarding aspects of the operation of the Department, including authorizing the Department to participate in IRS§103 Tax Exempt Financing.

The proposed financing is only an obligation of the Fire Corporation, and the Town is not, under any circumstances, a participant, guarantor, assignee, or otherwise obligated for the underlying debt. The Corporation can proceed as a matter of law, in purchasing the apparatus and entering into the necessary financing without utilizing the provisions of the IRS Code. However, in an effort to reduce its cost of operations, it is seeking municipal authorization for §103 Tax Exempt Financing. The interest rate reduction associated with Tax Exempt Financing is one (1%) percentage point less than conventional interest rates, thereby allowing the Department to finance the apparatus, as of this writing at $2.92\%^1$.

Proposed Use of Private Activity Funding

To adequately protect the lives and property within the Protection Area the Corporation requires a tower ladder truck that is capable of supporting the particular attributes of the Communities it serves. The current tower ladder apparatus is a 1996 model and it has been less reliable and more costly to maintain as it ages. The Corporation's Board of Directors has determined that the expense and time associated with retrofitting the apparatus to bring it within regulatory compliance, as well as the expense of current and anticipated future maintenance in not a cost effective strategy. The Corporation, in order to conform with OSHA, other Federal/State regulations, and insurance standards mandates, has thoroughly investigated such expenses and has determined that such efforts are not in the best interest of the Corporation, or the Communities it serves.

Analysis of Department Resources

Financial Resources

¹ As of April 13, 2017 the Corporation has determined that the best available §103 Tax Exempt Interest Financing is 2.92%. The rate is subject to change based on the anticipated delivery date of the apparatus. The estimated delivery date of the apparatus is August 1, 2017.

The Corporation is financial stable and solvent. The Corporation's Board of Directors has determined that the proposed financing for the apparatus is in the best fiscal interest of the Corporation. Further, that the current apparatus has exceeded its projected service life, and the cost of retrofitting, as well as allocating increased annual funding, to carry out necessary repairs, is no longer cost effective. The Corporation has adequate funding to meet this proposed obligation, as well as the Corporation's other short and long term fiscal obligations.

In connection with this opinion, I have reviewed the subject Equipment Lease Purchase Agreement, (the "Lease"), with a maximum amount of indebtedness in the principal amount of One Million Three Hundred Four Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Six (\$1,304,556.00) Dollars; the Agreement to provide services by and between my Client and the Town of Oyster Bay for firefighting services, to an area known as the Oyster Bay Fire Protection Area; the Escrow Agreement dated as of May 15, 2017, among the Borrower, Community Leasing Partners and Community First National Bank, as escrow agent; all Resolutions and proceedings of the Borrower and the Town of Oyster Bay Board relating to the issuance of the obligation, and all related documents, all dated of even date herewith (collectively, the Lease Purchase Documents).

I have also reviewed the constitution and laws of the State of New York and such applicable court decisions as I have deemed necessary or relevant for purposes of rendering the opinions set forth below, the organization and existence of the Borrower and the proceedings of the Borrower in relation to the Lease Purchase Documents and such other matters as I have deemed necessary or relevant as a basis for this opinion and made such further inquiries and investigations as I have deemed necessary or appropriate for purposes of rendering such opinion.

Based upon the foregoing, it is my opinion that.

- 1. The Borrower, the Oyster Bay Fire Department, Inc. is the true and correct name of the Organization, and is duly organized as a not-for-profit corporation, and is in good standing under the laws of the State of New York and a "qualified volunteer fire department" as defined under Section 150(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and has the power, authority and legal right to own its properties and to transact the business in which it is engaged.
- 2. The signatures and representations of the Borrower's Officers have been examined by Counsel, and are the true and accurate signatures of such Officers, and each have the power, authority and full and legal right to execute, deliver and carry out the terms and provisions of the Lease Purchase Documents and has taken all necessary action to obtain all necessary consents and approvals and to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of the Lease Purchase Documents.
- 3. The authorization, approval and execution of the Lease Purchase Documents and all other proceedings of the Borrower relating to the transactions contemplated thereby have been performed in accordance with all open meeting laws, public bidding laws, and all other applicable state and federal laws.

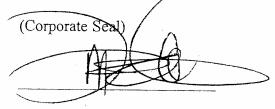

TAX-EXEMPT FINANCING COMPLIANCE PROCEDURE

ARTICLE I

DEFINITIONS

- **Section 1.1. Definitions**. Capitalized words and terms used in this Compliance Procedure have the following meanings:
- "Annual Compliance Checklist" means a questionnaire and/or checklist described in Section 6.1 hereof that is completed each year for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- "Annual Report" means the Issuer's audited financial statements (or unaudited financial statements as permitted by the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking for the Tax-Exempt Bonds) and certain other financial information and operating data required to be filed annually with the MSRB for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- "Bond Compliance Officer" means the Issuer's Treasurer or, if the position of Treasurer is vacant, the person filling the responsibilities of the Treasurer for the Issuer.
- "Bond Counsel" means a law firm selected by the Issuer to provide a legal opinion regarding the tax status of interest on the Tax-Exempt Bonds as of the issue date or the law firm selected to advise the Issuer on matters referenced in this Compliance Procedure.
- "Bond Restricted Funds" means the funds, accounts, and investments that are subject to arbitrage rebate and/or yield restriction rules that have been identified in the Tax Compliance Agreement for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- "Bond Transcript" means the "transcript of proceedings" or other similarly titled set of transaction documents assembled by Bond Counsel following the issuance of the Tax-Exempt Bonds.
 - "Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
 - "Compliance Procedure" means this Tax-Exempt Financing Compliance Procedure.
- "Continuing Disclosure Undertaking" means the Continuing Disclosure Agreement(s), Continuing Disclosure Undertaking(s), Continuing Disclosure Instructions or other written certification(s) and agreements of the Issuer setting out covenants for satisfying the Issuer's requirements for providing information to the MSRB pursuant to SEC Rule 15 2-12 on an ongoing basis for one or more Tax-Exempt Bond issues.

"Cost" or "Costs" means all costs and expenses paid for the acquisition, design, construction, equipping or improvement of a Project Facility or costs of issuing Tax-Exempt Bonds for a Project Facility.

"EMMA" means the Electronic Municipal Market Access system for municipal securities disclosures established and maintained by the MSRB, which can be accessed at www.emma.msrb.org.

"Final Written Allocation" means the Final Written Allocation of Tax-Exempt Bond proceeds prepared pursuant to Section 5.4 of this Compliance Procedure.

"Financed Assets" means that part of a Project Facility treated as financed with Tax-Exempt Bond proceeds as reflected in a Final Written Allocation or, if no Final Written Allocation was prepared, the accounting records of the Issuer and the Tax Compliance Agreement for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

"Governing Body" means the Board of Directors of the Issuer.

"Intent Resolution" means a resolution of the Issuer stating (1) the intent of the Issuer to finance all or a portion of the Project Facility; (2) the expected maximum size of the financing and (3) the intent of the Issuer to reimburse Costs of the Project Facility paid by the Issuer from proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

"IRS" means the Internal Revenue Service.

"Issuer" means the Oyster Bay Fire Department Inc.

"MSRB" means the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, or any successor repository designated as such by the Securities and Exchange Commission in accordance with Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"Placed In Service" means that date (as determined by the Bond Compliance Officer) when the Project Facility is substantially complete and in operation at substantially its design level.

"Project Facility" means all tangible or intangible property financed in whole or in part with Tax-Exempt Bonds that are (1) functionally related or integrated in use, (2) located on the same physical site or proximate sites, and (3) expected to be Placed In Service within a one-year period of each other.

"Rebate Analyst" means the rebate analyst for the Tax-Exempt Bonds selected pursuant to the Tax Compliance Agreement.

"Regulations" means all regulations issued by the U.S. Treasury Department to implement the provisions of Code §§ 103 and 141 through 150 and applicable to tax-exempt obligations.

"Tax Compliance Agreement" means the Federal Tax Certificate, Tax Compliance Agreement, Arbitrage Agreement, or other written certification or agreement of the Issuer setting out representations and covenants for satisfying the post-issuance tax compliance requirements for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

"Tax-Exempt Bonds" means any bond, note, installment sale agreement, lease or certificate intended to be a debt obligation of the Issuer or another political subdivision or government instrumentality, the proceeds of which are to be loaned or otherwise made available to the Issuer, and the interest on which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. A list of all Tax-Exempt Bonds outstanding and subject to this Compliance Procedure as of April 13, 2017, is attached as Exhibit A.

"Tax-Exempt Bond File" means documents and records which may consist of paper and electronic medium, maintained for the Tax-Exempt Bonds. Each Tax-Exempt Bond File will include the following information if applicable:

(a) Intent Resolution.

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(b) Bond Transcript.

- (c) Final Written Allocation and/or all available accounting records related to the Project Facility showing expenditures allocated to the proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds and expenditures (if any) allocated to other sources of funds.
- (d) All rebate and yield reduction payment calculations performed by the Rebate Analyst and all investment records provided to the Rebate Analyst for purposes of preparing the calculations.

(e) Forms 8038-T together with proof of filing and payment of rebate.

(f) Investment agreement bid documents (unless included in the Bond Transcript) including:

(1) bid solicitation, bid responses, certificate of broker;

(2) written summary of reasons for deviations from the terms of the solicitation that are incorporated into the investment agreement; and

(3) copies of the investment agreement and any amendments.

Any item required to be maintained by the terms of the Tax Compliance Agreement involving the use of the Project Facility or expenditures related to tax compliance for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

(h) Any opinion of Bond Counsel regarding the Tax-Exempt Bonds not included in the Bond Transcript.

(i) Amendments, modifications or substitute agreements to any agreement contained in the Bond Transcript.

(j) Any correspondence with the IRS relating to the Tax-Exempt Bonds including all correspondence relating to an audit by the IRS of the Tax-

- Exempt Bonds or any proceedings under the Tax-Exempt Bonds Voluntary Closing Agreement Program (VCAP).
- (k) Any available questionnaires or correspondence substantiating the use of the Project Facility in accordance with the terms of the Tax Compliance Agreement for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- (l) For refunding bond issues, the Tax-Exempt Bond File for the refunded Tax-Exempt Bonds.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

Section 2.1. Purpose of Compliance Procedure.

- (a) <u>Issuer's Use of Tax-Exempt Bonds</u>. The Issuer uses Tax-Exempt Bonds to fund Costs of a Project Facility Project. The Issuer understands that in exchange for the right to issue Tax-Exempt Bonds at favorable interest rates and terms, the Code and Regulations impose ongoing requirements related to the proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds and the Project Facility financed by the Tax-Exempt Bonds. These requirements focus on the investment, use and expenditure of proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds and related funds as well as restrictions on the use of the Project Facility.
- (b) <u>IRS Recommends Separate Written Procedures</u>. The Issuer recognizes that the IRS has stated that all issuers of Tax-Exempt Bonds should have separate written procedures regarding ongoing compliance with the federal tax requirements for Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- (c) <u>Continuing Disclosure Undertaking: Issuer Commitment</u>. The Issuer is required under the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking to provide disclosures of certain financial information and operating data and to file notices of certain material events to the marketplace to facilitate informed secondary market trading in Tax-Exempt Bonds issued by the Issuer. The Issuer is committed to full compliance with the federal tax and securities law requirements for all of its outstanding and future tax-exempt financings. This Compliance Procedure is adopted by the Governing Body to comply with the IRS and Securities and Exchange Commission directives and to improve tax and securities law compliance and documentation.
- Section 2.2. Scope of Compliance Procedure; Conflicts. This Compliance Procedure applies to all Tax-Exempt Bonds currently outstanding and all Tax-Exempt Bonds issued in the future. If the provisions of this Compliance Procedure conflict with a Tax Compliance Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking or any other specific written instructions of Bond Counsel, the terms of the Tax Compliance Agreement, Continuing Disclosure Undertaking or specific written instructions of Bond Counsel will supersede and govern in lieu of this Compliance Procedure. Any exception to this Compliance Procedure required by Bond Counsel as part of a future issue of Tax-Exempt Bonds will be incorporated in the Tax Compliance Agreement for the future issue. Any requirements imposed on the Issuer in the Tax Compliance Agreement, will be noted by the Bond Compliance Officer and incorporated into the Annual

Compliance Checklist. The Issuer acknowledges that the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking may also apply to one or more issues of taxable securities issued by the Issuer.

Section 2.3. Amendments and Publication of Compliance Procedure. This Compliance Procedure may be amended from time-to-time by the Governing Body. Copies of this Compliance Procedure and any amendments will be included in the permanent records of the Issuer.

ARTICLE III

BOND COMPLIANCE OFFICER; TRAINING

Section 3.1. Bond Compliance Officer Duties. The Bond Compliance Officer is responsible for implementing this Compliance Procedure. The Bond Compliance Officer will work with other employees that use the Project Facility to assist in implementing this Compliance Procedure. The Bond Compliance Officer will consult with Bond Counsel, legal counsel to the Issuer, accountants, tax return preparers and other outside experts to the extent necessary to carry out the purposes of this Compliance Procedure. The Bond Compliance Officer will report to the Governing Body as necessary, and at least annually, regarding implementation of this Compliance Procedure and any recommended changes or amendments to this Compliance Procedure.

Section 3.2. Training.

- (a) <u>Training Programs</u>. When appropriate, the Bond Compliance Officer and/or other employees of the Issuer under the direction of the Bond Compliance Officer will attend training programs offered by the IRS or other industry professionals regarding Tax-Exempt Bonds that are relevant to the Issuer.
- (b) <u>Change in Bond Compliance Officer</u>. Any time an individual acting as the Bond Compliance Officer passes the responsibilities for carrying out the provisions of this Compliance Procedure to another individual, the Issuer will ensure the incoming individual acting as Bond Compliance Officer is trained on how to implement the policies and procedures included in this Compliance Procedure to ensure the Issuer's continued compliance with the provisions of this Compliance Procedure and all Tax Compliance Agreements for any outstanding Tax-Exempt Bonds.

ARTICLE IV

TAX-EXEMPT BONDS CURRENTLY OUTSTANDING

Section 4.1. Tax-Exempt Bonds Covered by Article IV Procedures. This Article IV applies to all Tax-Exempt Bonds issued prior to the date of this Compliance Procedure that are currently outstanding. These Tax-Exempt Bonds are listed on Exhibit A.

- Section 4.2. Tax-Exempt Bond File. As soon as practical, the Bond Compliance Officer will attempt to assemble as much of the Tax-Exempt Bond File as is available for the Tax-Exempt Bonds listed on Exhibit A.
- Section 4.3. Annual Compliance Checklists. As soon as practical following the adoption of this Compliance Procedure, the Bond Compliance Officer will work with Bond Counsel and/or legal counsel to the Issuer and cause Annual Compliance Checklists to be completed for all outstanding Tax-Exempt Bonds and will follow the procedures specified in Article VI to complete the Annual Compliance Checklists and thereafter include each completed Annual Compliance Checklist in the Tax-Exempt Bond File.
- Section 4.4. Correcting Prior Deficiencies in Compliance. In the event the Bond Compliance Officer determines any deficiency in compliance with a Tax Compliance Agreement for an outstanding Tax-Exempt Bond listed on Exhibit A, the Bond Compliance Officer will consult with Bond Counsel and, as necessary, follow the procedures described in the Regulations or the Tax-Exempt Bonds Voluntary Closing Agreement Program (VCAP) to remediate the noncompliance. If remediation of the noncompliance requires the Issuer to submit a request under VCAP, the Bond Compliance Officer will undertake this step only after reporting the violation to the Governing Body and obtaining its approval.

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ARTICLE V

COMPLIANCE PROCEDURE FOR NEW TAX-EXEMPT BOND ISSUES

Section 5.1. Application. This Article V applies to Tax-Exempt Bonds issued on or after the date of this Compliance Procedure.

Section 5.2. Prior to Issuance of Tax-Exempt Bonds.

- (a) <u>Intent Resolution</u>. The Governing Body will authorize and approve the issuance of Tax-Exempt Bonds. Prior to or as a part of the authorizing resolution or ordinance, the Governing Body may adopt an Intent Resolution.
- (b) <u>Directions to Bond Counsel</u>. The Bond Compliance Officer will provide a copy of this Compliance Procedure to Bond Counsel with directions for Bond Counsel to structure the documentation and procedural steps taken prior to issuing the Tax-Exempt Bonds so that they conform to the requirements of this Compliance Procedure, except to the extent Bond Counsel determines that different procedures are required. The Bond Compliance Officer will consult with Bond Counsel so that appropriate provisions are made to fund or reimburse the Issuer's costs and expenses incurred to implement this Compliance Procedure.
- (c) <u>Tax Compliance Agreement</u>. For each issuance of Tax Exempt Bonds, a Tax Compliance Agreement will be signed by the Bond Compliance Officer. The Tax Compliance Agreement will (1) describe the Project Facility and the anticipated Financed Asses, (2) identify

all Bond Restricted Funds and provide for arbitrage and rebate compliance, (3) for new money financings, require a Final Written Allocation, and (4) contain a form of the Annual Compliance Checklist for the Tax-Exempt Bonds. The Bond Compliance Officer will confer with Bond Counsel and the Issuer's counsel regarding the meaning and scope of each representation and covenant contained in the Tax Compliance Agreement.

- (d) <u>Preliminary Cost Allocations</u>. For each issuance of Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer in consultation with Bond Counsel, will prepare a preliminary cost allocation plan for the Project Facility. The preliminary cost allocation plan will identify the assets and expected costs for the Project Facility, and when necessary, will break-out the portions of Costs that are expected to be financed with proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds (the "Financed Assets") and the portions, if any, expected to be financed from other sources.
- (e) Tax Review with Bond Counsel. Prior to the sale of Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer and Bond Counsel will review this Compliance Procedure together with the draft Tax Compliance Agreement to ensure that any tax compliance issues in the new financing are adequately addressed by this Compliance Procedure and/or the Tax Compliance Agreement. If Bond Counsel determines that this Compliance Procedure conflicts with the Tax Compliance Agreement, or must be supplemented to account for special issues or requirements for the Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer will ask Bond Counsel to include the written modifications or additions in the final Tax Compliance Agreement. The Bond Compliance Officer will request Bond Counsel to prepare a form of Annual Compliance Checklist for use in monitoring the ongoing compliance requirements for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

Section 5.3. Accounting and Recordkeeping.

- (a) Accounting for New Money Projects. The Bond Compliance Officer will be responsible for accounting for the investment and allocation of proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds. The Bond Compliance Officer will establish separate accounts or subaccounts to record expenditures for Costs of the Project Facility. Where appropriate, the Bond Compliance Officer may use accounts established as part of the Issuer's financial records for this purpose. In recording Costs for the Project Facility, the Bond Compliance Officer will ensure that the accounting system will include the following information: (1) identity of person or business paid, along with any other available narrative description of the purpose for the payment, (2) date of payment, (3) amount paid, and (4) invoice number or other identifying reference.
- (b) Accounting for Refunded Bonds and Related Refunded Bond Accounts. For Tax-Exempt Bonds that are issued to refund prior Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Tax Compliance Agreement will set out special accounting and allocation procedures for the proceeds of the financing, and if necessary proceeds of the refinanced Tax-Exempt Bonds.
- (c) <u>Tax-Exempt Bond File</u>. The Bond Compliance Officer will be responsible for assembling and maintaining the Tax-Exempt Bond File. The Annual Reports, other reports and notices of certain material events filed by the Issuer with the MSRB will be publicly available on EMMA and need not be separately maintained in the Tax-Exempt Bond File.

Section 5.4. Final Allocation of Bond Proceeds.

- (a) Preparation of Final Written Allocation; Timing. The Bond Compliance Officer is responsible for making a written allocation of proceeds of Tax-Exempt Bonds to expenditures and identifying the Financed Assets. This process will be memorialized in the Final Written Allocation. For a new money financing, the Bond Compliance Officer will commence this process as of the earliest of (1) the requisition of all Tax-Exempt Bond proceeds from any segregated Tax-Exempt Bond funded account, (2) the date the Project Facility has been substantially completed or (3) four and one/half years following the issue date of the Tax-Exempt Bonds. For Tax-Exempt Bonds issued only to refund a prior issue of Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer will work with Bond Counsel to prepare and/or document the Final Written Allocation for the Project Facility financed by the refunded Tax-Exempt Bonds and include it in the Tax Compliance Agreement.
- Compliance Agreement and, if necessary, contact Bond Counsel to seek advice regarding any special allocation of Tax-Exempt Bond proceeds and other money of the Issuer to the Costs of the Project Facility. If no special allocation is required or recommended, the Bond Compliance Officer will allocate Costs of the Project Facility to the proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds in accordance with the Issuer's accounting records. Each Final Written Allocation will contain the following: (1) a reconciliation of the actual sources and uses to Costs of the Project Facility, (2) the percentage of the cost of the Project Facility financed with proceeds of the Tax-Exempt Bonds (sale proceeds plus any investment earnings on those sale proceeds), (3) the Project Facility's Placed in Service date, (4) the estimated economic useful life of the Project Facility, and (5) any special procedures to be followed in completing the Annual Compliance Checklist (e.g., limiting the Annual Compliance Checklist to specific areas of the Project Facility that the Final Written Allocation or the Tax Compliance Agreement treats as having been financed by Tax-Exempt Bonds).
- (c) <u>Finalize Annual Compliance Checklist</u>. As part of the preparation of the Final Written Allocation, the Bond Compliance Officer will update the draft Annual Compliance Checklist contained in the relevant Tax Compliance Agreement. The Bond Compliance Officer will include reminders for all subsequent arbitrage rebate computations required for the Tax-Exempt Bonds in the Annual Compliance Checklist.
- (d) Review of Final Written Allocation and Annual Compliance Checklist. Each Final Written Allocation and Annual Compliance Checklist will be reviewed by legal counsel to the Issuer or Bond Counsel for sufficiency and compliance with the Tax Compliance Agreement and this Compliance Procedure. Following the completion of the review, the Bond Compliance Officer will execute the Final Written Allocation.

ARTICLE VI

ONGOING MONITORING PROCEDURES

Section 6.1. Annual Compliance Checklist. An Annual Compliance Checklist will be completed by the Bond Compliance Officer each year following completion of the Final Written Allocation. Each Annual Compliance Checklist will be designed and completed for the purpose of identifying potential noncompliance with the terms of the Tax Compliance Agreement or this Compliance Procedure and obtaining documents (such as investment records, arbitrage calculations, or other documentation for the Project Facility) that are required to be incorporated in the Tax-Exempt Bond File. The Bond Compliance Officer will refer any responses indicating a violation of the terms of the Tax Compliance Agreement to legal counsel to the Issuer or Bond Counsel and, if recommended by counsel, will follow the procedure set out in Section 4.4 hereof to remediate the non-compliance.

Section 6.2. Arbitrage and Rebate Compliance. The Bond Compliance Officer will monitor the investment of Bond Restricted Funds and provide investment records to the Rebate Analyst on a timely basis. The Bond Compliance Officer will follow the directions of the Rebate Analyst with respect to the preparation of and the timing of rebate or yield reduction computations.

ARTICLE VII

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE

Section 7.1. Annual Disclosure Filings. For each issuance of Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer will review the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking to determine the financial information and operating data required to be included in the Annual Report to be filed by the Issuer with the MSRB on EMMA. The Bond Compliance Officer will cause the Annual Report to be filed with the MSRB on EMMA within the time limits provided in the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking for the Tax-Exempt Bonds.

Section 7.2. Material Event Disclosure Filings. For each outstanding issue of Tax-Exempt Bonds, the Bond Compliance Officer will review the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking to determine the "material events" that require prompt notice to be filed with the MSRB. Generally, the occurrence of any of the following events with respect to the Tax-Exempt Bonds represents a "material event:"

- (1) principal and interest payment delinquencies;
- (2) non-payment related defaults, if material;
- (3) unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
- (4) unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
- (5) substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;

- (6) adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the IRS of proposed or final determinations of taxability, Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the Tax-Exempt Bonds, or other material events affecting the tax status of the Tax-Exempt Bonds;
- (7) modifications to rights of bondholders, if material;
- (8) bond calls, if material, and tender offers;
- (9) defeasances;
- release, substitution or sale of property securing repayment of the Tax-Exempt Bonds, if material;
- (11) rating changes;
- bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar event of the obligated person;
- the consummation of a merger, consolidation, or acquisition involving the obligated person or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the obligated person, other than in the ordinary course of business, the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material; and
- appointment of a successor or additional trustee or the change of name of the trustee, if material.

After obtaining actual knowledge of the occurrence of any event that the Bond Compliance Officer believes may constitute an event requiring disclosure, the Bond Compliance Officer will contact Bond Counsel to determine if notice of the event is required to be given to the MSRB under the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking. If it is determined that notice should be provided to the MSRB or is required to be provided to the MSRB by the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, the Bond Compliance Officer will cause the appropriate notice to be filed with the MSRB on EMMA within 10 business days after the occurrence of the event or as otherwise directed by Bond Counsel.

In furtherance to Item No. 13 of the docket of June 27, 2017, the Department of Public Works authorized Hirani Engineering & Land Surveying, P.C. ("Hirani") under Contract PWC07-16 to perform a structural investigation of the Hicksville Parking Facility ("Garage") in order to determine the current condition of the Garage and as to the need for repairs.

On March 17, 2017, Hirani issued a recommendation to the Town, based upon their initial investigation, to immediately install reinforcement at certain locations in the lower decks of the Garage in order to be protective of the public. The Department of Public Works submitted a request to the Office of the Town Attorney, dated March 17, 2017, for a waiver of the procurement policy in order to immediately secure a contractor to perform the services recommended by Hirani. By memo dated March 20, 2017, the Office of the Town Attorney concurred with the Department of Public Works that the repairs are of an emergency nature and that the Town's Procurement Policy may be waived to allow the office to secure a contractor to make the necessary repairs.

On the night of March 17, 2017, the Department of Public Works and Hirani received two cost proposals for the scope of work developed by Hirani, which included the installation of a shoring system at designated locations. Arsenal Scaffold of West Babylon, New York provided a cost of \$90,000.00 and Structural Preservation Systems, LLC ("Structural") of Hawthorne, New York provided a cost of \$66,675.00. The Department of Public Works authorized Structural, on the night of March 17, 2017, to begin work immediately.

During the course of work additional manpower and services were requested of Structural, for which a Change Order in the amount of \$15,000.00 was submitted to the Town. Hirani reviewed this Change Order and found that this submitted additional cost to be fair and reasonable.

Attached is a letter dated June 28, 2017, from Hirani Engineering & land Surveying, P.C., recommending acceptance of the initial quote of the contractor in the amount of \$66,675.00 and Change Order in the amount of \$15,000.00.

Total cost for the initial installation amounts to \$81,675.00. A separate fee for a discounted monthly rental for the shoring system was also negotiated in the amount of \$6,630.00. It is recommended that sufficient funding be authorized to allow for this system to remain in place for an eight month period, in

an amount not to exceed \$53,040.00. Funds are available for this purpose in the total amount of \$134,715.00 from Account No. HWY H 5997 20000 000 0811 016.

Therefore, we request the Town Board authorize, by resolution, the above-mentioned Waiver of the Procurement Policy to authorize Structural Preservation Systems, LLC for the installation of an emergency shoring system at the Hicksville Parking Facility in the total amount of \$134,715.00 and that payment be issued by the Office of the Comptroller upon submission of a proper claim.

The Department of Public Works, utilizing the services of Hirani Engineering & Land Surveying, P.C. ("Hirani") under Contract No. PWC07-16 has been conducting a structural evaluation of the Hicksville Parking Facility due to significant cracking issues. Based upon the initial analysis of Hirani, as documented in their attached correspondence dated March 17, 2017, the Hicksville Parking Facility has significant structural issues that must be remedied immediately to be protective of the public.

It is the intention of the Department of Public Works to retain the services of a contractor who can perform the necessary temporary repairs, under the direction of Hirani, until such time that a permanent solution can be determined.

As this work must happen immediately due to a dangerous condition, it is requested that your office provide a determination that a waiver of the Town of Oyster Bay Procurement Policy is warranted. With your determination, a qualified contractor will selected and a formal request will be submitted to the Town Board.

Based on our visual inspection and study of available design drawings of the Hicksville Parking Garage structure, we report the following:

- 1. There are two major through cracks in the filigree and topping slab decks perpendicular to the slab span propagating the entire length on the lower three levels between bays 7 & 8 and 12 & 13.
- 2. The slabs with through cracks are displaced vertically at a few locations. Concrete is spalling and debris falling at some locations.
- 3. The slab reinforcement where visually observed is corroded and rebars are missing.
- 4. Vibration effects during vehicular movements in and around the cracked slabs was observed.

Based on our preliminary analysis and findings, we conclude that the lower three level decks with the continuous through cracks (bays 7 & 8 and 12 & 13) are structurally compromised and therefore should be shored immediately for public safety as it is dangerous.

We recommend that the Town get contractors to shore the bays with crack immediately for safety.

Section 1. Legislative Findings. By Local Law 1-2016, adopted on June 7, 2016, the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay created a Permit Amnesty Program, which applied to owners of one and two family homes and properties in condominium unit developments situated in the Town of Oyster Bay, and allowed such owners to file building permit applications and other permit applications for existing improvements and waived the maintain fee. In order to take advantage of the Amnesty Program, applications had to be filed no later than December 31, 2016. By Local Law 2-2017, adopted January 10, 2017, the Amnesty Program was extended through June 30, 2017. Based upon the success of the Amnesty Program, the Town Board has determined that extending the Permit Amnesty Program through December 31, 2017, will be advantageous to the Town and its residents.

<u>Section 2.</u> Amnesty Period. Section 3 of Local Law 1-2016, as previously amended by Local Law 2-2017, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Amnesty Period. The Permit Amnesty Program shall continue through December 31, 2017. This shall be known as the Amnesty Period.

a. The Town of Oyster Bay Department of Planning and Development will begin taking building permit applications and other permit applications under this Permit Amnesty Program effective immediately for all past work and work in progress at the time of the enactment of this local law without benefit of permit and will stop accepting permit applications under this local law on December 31, 2017; and

b. During the Amnesty Period, the Town of Oyster Bay will waive the maintain fee for building permits and other required permits (e.g., electrical and plumbing) to maintain construction activities that took place or are taking place without the required permit(s) and for which such work the necessary permit(s) has been applied for during the Amnesty Period. All other fees and costs associated with the issuance of building or other permits shall remain in effect during the Amnesty Period.

Section 3. Except as modified by this Local Law all of the terms, conditions and provisions of Local Law 1-2016 as previously amended by Local Law 2-2017, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. SEQRA Determination. It is hereby determined pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. Section 101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., that the adoption of this local law is a "Type II" Action within the meaning of Section 617.5 (c)(20) of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., pertaining to "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment" and, accordingly, is of a class of actions which do not have a significant effect on the environment and no further review is required.

Severability. Accordingly, Local Law 1-2015, as amended by Local Law 2-2016 and Local Law 1-2017, is hereby further amended as follows:

SECTION 4 IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any eligible employee who:

- a. has been continuously in the active service of the Town from no later than July 1, 2014 to the date immediately prior to retirement;
- b. is eligible for a service retirement (with or without penalty) as of the effective date of this local law as more fully set forth in Section 5A hereof) or first becomes eligible between August 1, 2017 and on or before December 31, 2017 (as more fully set forth in Section 5B hereof); and
- c. files an application for service retirement that is effective during the applicable period, as set forth in Section 5 hereof,

shall be entitled to the retirement incentive provided in Section 4A of this local law.

AMEND SECTION 4A AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 4A</u>. There shall be an open period during which eligible employees who have complied with the requirements of Section 4 of this local law may retire and receive the additional retirement benefit.

It shall commence on the effective date of this Local Law and shall run through the close of business on December 31, 2017. In order to qualify for the retirement benefit, the eligible employee's retirement must be not later than January 31, 2018, with his or her retirement being effective commencing no later than February 1, 2018.

SECTION 5 IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 5. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an eligible employee who is a member of the retirement system and who is entitled to a retirement incentive pursuant to Section 4 of this local law, as amended, and who was eligible to retire as of the effective date of this Local Law shall receive a retirement incentive of:
 - a. The sum of \$500.00 for each completed year of retirement service credit in the retirement system;
 - b. An amount equal to 2% of the employee's base 2016 salary, pro-rated from January 1, 2017 to the last day of employment; and
 - c. The Town shall provide the retiree with individual health, optical and dental insurance for life, and shall provide health, optical and dental insurance coverage to those individuals covered under the retiree's family coverage, if applicable, during retiree's life.
- B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an eligible employee who is a member of the retirement system and who is entitled to a retirement incentive pursuant to Section 4 of this local law, as amended, and who first becomes eligible to retire between August 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017 shall receive a retirement incentive of:
 - a. The sum of \$1,000.00 for each completed year of retirement service credit in the retirement system;
 - b. An amount equal to 2% of the employee's base 2016 salary, pro-rated from January 1, 2017 to the last day of employment; and
 - c. The Town shall provide the retiree with individual health, optical and dental insurance for life, and shall provide health, optical and dental insurance coverage to those individuals covered under the retiree's family coverage, if applicable, during retiree's life.

SECTION 8 IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 8. The amounts due under Section 5 and Section 7 to any eligible employee who has complied with Section 4 of this local law and who retires pursuant to this local law shall be paid, at the employee's option, to be exercised prior to the effective date of his or her retirement, either:

- a. In one lump sum within seventy-five (75) days after the effective date of retirement; or
- b. In three equal payments, the first payment to be made within seventy-five (75) days after the effective date of the employee's retirement, the second payment to be made on the first anniversary of the effective date of the retirement, and the third payment

to be made on the second anniversary of the effective date of the retirement, all without interest.

SEQRA Determination. It is hereby determined pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 8 N.Y.E.C.L. Section 101 et seq. and its implementing regulations, Part 617 of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., that the adoption of this local law is a "Type II" Action within the meaning of Section 617.5 (c)(20) of 6 N.Y.C.R.R., pertaining to "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment" and, accordingly, is of a class of actions which do not have a significant effect on the environment and no further review is required.

Severability. If any section, subdivision or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, subdivision or provision of or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law, or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances.

§231-1 Legislative Intent.

- (A) The Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay has determined that there has been a proliferation of the use of unmanned aircraft systems (commonly known as "drones" and "model aircraft") (UAS) in and around the Town of Oyster Bay. The Town Board also finds that the flying of these drones presents a noisy and potentially dangerous condition to the public and wildlife that may be present at Town facilities and that drone use at Town facilities is inconsistent with the establishment and maintaining of a safe and pleasing public environment. The Town Board further finds that it is in the public interest to limit the private use of such UAS in the vicinity of Town of Oyster Bay facilities.
- (B) The Town Board recognizes that the Federal Aviation Administration has authority to regulate the use of UAS by public entities as well as UAS used for commercial purposes and that no person shall operate a UAS for commercial purposes without the express permission of the FAA.

§231-2 Scope; applicability.

- (A) Scope: No UAS may be operated on, near, or above any Town Facility, as defined herein, by any private, commercial, or business person or entity without approval of such use from the Town of Oyster Bay, as evidenced by a permit issued by the Town Clerk.
- (B) Applicability:
- (i) The provisions of this chapter do not, and are not intended to, limit, replace, or circumvent any state or federal law, code, or regulation but, rather, are intended to supplement such legislation.
- (ii) Should any provision of this chapter be in conflict with any applicable state or local law, ordinance, code, or regulation, the more restrictive provision or requirement shall prevail.

§231-3 Presumption.

For purposes of this chapter, the following rebuttable presumption shall apply: The possession by any person of a UAS while on or in the vicinity of any Town of Oyster Bay facility creates the presumption that such UAS has been used in violation of this chapter subjecting the possessor of such UAS to all penalties provided for herein.

§231-4 Definitions.

As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

TOWN FACILITY

Any park, beach, cemetery, property, building or repair facility, under the ownership or control of the Town of Oyster Bay, or any of the Town departments.

UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM

Any mechanical device which is airborne or may be caused to be airborne, including model airplanes and drones as well as any other similar mechanical device that is controlled by radio transmitter.

§231-5 Enforcement.

All employees of the Department of Planning & Development, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Highways, and the Department of Public Safety who are now or hereafter charged with the responsibility to perform inspection and/or enforcement duties with regard to the laws, codes, ordinances, rules and regulations within the general jurisdiction of their respective departments as well as police officers having jurisdiction are hereby further empowered to enforce the provisions of this chapter and to issue appearance tickets returnable in the District Court of Nassau County for violations thereof.

§231-6 Penalties for offenses.

- (A) First offense: fine of \$500 plus the cost of permit.
- (B) Second offense within one year of first offense: fine of \$1,000 plus the cost of permit.

(C) Third offense within 18 months of first offense: fine of \$1,500 plus the cost of permit.

§231-7 Permits.

- (A) Anyone seeking issuance of a special exception permit to operate a UAS, not otherwise permitted by another governmental authority, shall file an application with the Town Clerk on forms provided by the Town Clerk and pay the proscribed fee.
- (B) Filing period: An application for a permit shall be filed with the Town Clerk not less than 15 days or more than 30 days prior to the date upon which the applicant proposes to conduct the activity.
- (C) Form: The application for a permit shall set forth the following information:
- (i) The name, address and telephone number of the person seeking to conduct such activity.
- (ii) If the activity is proposed to be conducted for, on behalf of or by an organization, the name, principal address and telephone number of the organization.
- (iii) The name, address and telephone number of the person or officers of the organization authorized to be responsible for the activity.
- (iv) The date when the activity is to be conducted.
- (v) The area over which the activity is proposed to be conducted as well as the starting point and the termination point.
- (vi) The number of persons who will be involved conducting the activity.
- (vii) The times when the activity is proposed to commence and terminate.
- (viii) The altitude of the proposed UAS flight.
- (ix) Description of any photographic, video and/or audio recording capabilities of the UAS as well as any attachments to the UAS.
- (D) Waiver of time limitation: The Town Clerk, where good cause is shown therefor, shall have the authority to consider any application hereunder which is filed less than 15 days prior to the proposed activity date.
- (E) The fee for such permit shall be \$75.00 and may be adjusted from time to time by order of the then-seated Town Board.

§231-8 Insurance requirement.

- (A) As part of the application for a permit to operate a UAS under the terms of this chapter, the applicant must provide proof of liability insurance, naming the Town of Oyster Bay as an additional insured, in the following minimum limits:
- (i) General liability: \$1,000,000.
- (ii) Bodily injury: \$500,000 individual.

(iii) Bodily injury: \$1,000,000 single accident.

(iv) Property damage: \$500,000.

§231-9 Standards for issuance:

The Town Clerk shall issue a permit as provided for hereunder when, from a consideration of the application and from such other information as may otherwise be obtained, he or she finds that:

- (A) The proposed activity will be orderly in character and not tend to disturb the public peace.
- (B) The conduct of the activity will not interrupt the providing of normal emergency services in the area.
- (C) The conduct of the activity will not interrupt the safe and orderly movement of traffic.

§231-10 Alternative permit.

The Town Clerk, in denying an application for a special exception permit, shall be empowered to authorize the conduct of the activity on a date, at a time different from that designated by the applicant. An applicant desiring to accept an alternate permit shall, within three days after notice of the action by the Town Clerk, file a written notice of acceptance with the Town Clerk. An alternate permit shall conform to the requirements of a permit under this chapter.

§231-11 Notice to Town and other officials.

- (A) Immediately upon the issuance of a permit, the Town Clerk shall send a copy thereof to the following:
- (i) The Supervisor.
- (ii) The Councilmembers.
- (iii) The Commissioner of Parks.
- (iv) The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety.
- (v) The Commissioner of Planning & Development.
- (vi) The Commissioner of Public Works.
- (vii) The Commissioner of General Services

§231-12 Form of permit.

- (A) Each permit shall contain the following information:
- (i) The name and address of the person granted the permit.
- (ii) The name of the manufacturer, model number, and serial number of the UAS to be flown.

- (iii) Description of any photographic, video and/or audio recording capabilities of the UAS as well as any attachments to the UAS.
- (iv) The date the activity is to be conducted.
- (v) The assembly area, the starting point and the termination point of the activity.
- (vi) The starting time and the approximate time the activity is to terminate.
- (vii) The area in and over which the UAS will be operated.

§231-13 Duties of permittee.

- (A) A permittee hereunder shall comply with all permit terms and conditions and with all applicable laws and ordinances.
- (B) The person granted the permit shall have the permit in his/her immediate possession at all times during the conduct of the activity and shall display the same upon demand of any person authorized to enforce this chapter.

§231-14 Conduct of permittee.

Permittee shall operate the authorized UAS in a manner consistent with the permit issued by the Town of Oyster Bay.

§231-15 Exceptions.

The above prohibition shall not apply to the use of drones for active law enforcement purposes, or where the same is authorized by license or permit under the laws and regulations of the United States of America, the State of New York, or under the regulations of the Town of Oyster Bay, or as a function of the Town's Department of Public Safety, or for which permission has been previously granted by the appropriate governing body, board, agency or commission having authority to grant such permissions.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 279-15, adopted on May 12, 2015, the Town Board granted a Change of Zone and Site Plan Approval for the construction and development of a mixed-use development located in "RSC-25" (Multi-Family Senior Citizen Residence), "RMF-16" (Multi-Family Residence) and "GB" (General Business) Districts, at premises located at Old Country Road, Plainview, Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, State of New York, and described as Section 47, Block E, Lots 752A and 752B on the Land and Tax Map of Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 279-15 required that a Declaration of Restrictive Covenants be executed and recorded, which Declaration contained covenants and restrictions, specifically Covenant No. 25 which provides for Town Board approval of any major Site Plan Modification; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 692-16, adopted on December 13, 2016, the Town Board approved the site layout plan for the subject premises; and

WHEREAS, Beechwood CBW, LLC, fee owner, (hereinafter referred to as Applicant) has petitioned the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay for modification of a Declaration of Restrictive Covenants, recorded in the Nassau County Clerk's Office on May 9, 2016, at Libor 13358, Page 481, affecting the construction and development at premises located at Old Country Road, Plainview, Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, State of New York, and described as Section 47, Block E, Lots 752A and 752B on the Land and Tax Map of Nassau County; and

WHEREAS, Applicants have specifically requested modification of paragraphs 1, 10 and 25 of said Declaration of Restrictive Covenants; and

WHEREAS, a duly advertised public hearing on said application was held by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay on June 20, 2017, at which hearing all parties interested in the subject matter and desiring to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Oyster Bay Department of Environmental Resources, Town Environmental Quality Review Division, by memorandum dated June 20, 2017, recommended Town Board determination that the subject legislation is deemed to fall under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, 6 NYCRR, Part 617, Section 617.5(c), Type II Actions List, as Item No. 20, relative to "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment", and as such does not require completion of an Environmental Assessment Form, Environmental Impact Statement or other environmental consideration; and

WHEREAS, Elizabeth L. Maccarone, Commissioner, Department of Planning and Development, by memorandum dated June 27, 2017, has advised that the Department of Planning and Development does not object to the modifications requested; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Planning Commission, by Resolution No. 10178-17, adopted on June 29, 2017, has recommended local determination of said application,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the petition of Beechwood CBW, LLC, fee owner, requesting that the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay modify the existing Declaration of Restrictive Covenants, recorded in the Nassau County Clerk's Office on May 9, 2016 at Libor 13358, Page 481, affecting the development and construction of a mixed-use development of the premises located at the southernmost corner of Old Country Road, in

Plainview, Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, State of New York, said premises being described at Section 47, Block E, Lots 752A and 752B is hereby granted, to the following extent:

- 1) Paragraph 1 of the Declaration shall be modified to confirm that the term "retail stores" shall include restaurants and offices and other commercial uses permitted by the Town Code of the Town of Oyster Bay in a General Business district;
- 2) Paragraph 10 of the Declaration shall be amended to reflect that the hours of operation of the loading docks of any commercial establishment shall be 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sundays and holidays, and that all loading docks shall be buffered and screened to mitigate potential noise and visual impacts, and be located more than 400 feet from the nearest residences along Round Swamp Road; and
- 3) Paragraph 25 of the Declaration shall be amended to reflect that the Applicant has submitted to the Town a performance bond in the amount of \$1,000,000 to guarantee the development of athletic fields and irrigation system in accordance with the plans to be designed and approved by the Town, and accordingly certificate of occupancy may be issued by the Town provided that all other requirements have been satisfied.
