During the course of the construction of this project, actual measured quantities differed from those in the original contract. To reflect those changes, we have prepared Notification No. 1 Quantity Increase and Decrease indicating a <u>net decrease</u> of \$43,239.50, for your consideration and Town Board Resolution.

Actual field conditions encountered required additional work and the deletion of work not anticipated during the design of this contract. The decrease reflects the removal of a portion of the site work and unused allowances. There was additional work required by the Nassau County Fire Marshal for the fire alarm enclosure and antenna. These items have been addressed and are being submitted for your review as Change Order No. 1 for a decrease of \$43,239.50 and Town Board Resolution. We, therefore, recommend the following changes for your approval.

John A. Grillo Architect, PC has performed a final inspection of the Storage Building including all ancillary items required under the contract and all additional work as required by TOB or required as per existing field conditions.

The contract included 60 calendar days to complete the work. The construction was scheduled on March 4, 2020. The final completion date of this contract was set as May 2, 2020. The revised completion date is July 7, 2021 after multiple discontinue/continue letters issued to the contractor for material delays. A walk-through took place with substantial completion of work occurring July 7, 2021. The building was opened to the Golf Course staff that day.

The original bid amount for this contract was \$488,000.00. The final contract value, including Change Order 1 and Notification 1 recommended for approval is \$444,760.50. Therefore, this office recommends that the Town of Oyster Bay accept this job as final.
