

Volunteer Firefighters provide such a tremendous service to the Town, it is requested that ice time that falls on or after 11pm be made available to the Town of Oyster Bay Volunteer Firefighters Hockey Teams at a discounted rate of \$250.00 per hour. A signed Letter of Request will be made by the Chief of the Department on Department letterhead for approval by the Commissioner of Parks. This ice time will only be rented if the time is available and not scheduled to other teams.

All fees at Marjorie R. Post and Syosset-Woodbury Community Parks will be in effect and continue in effect until amended or revised by the Town Board. All fees for the Bethpage Indoor Ice Skating Center will be in effect on a year-round basis.



As you are aware, in late April and early May 2018, H2M conducted radiological surveys at the former Syosset Landfill located on Miller Place in Syosset, NY. The original approved project budget was \$5,000. As part of this originally approved budget and scope of work, H2M conducted site walkthroughs on April 24, 2018 and April 26, 2018, and subsequently prepared a Radiological Survey letter report dated May 1, 2018. The radiological survey findings summarized in this May 1, 2018 report identified three locations where the radiological measurements were generally higher than the other areas of the site. However, H2M noted at the time that no radiation readings were detected at the former Syosset landfill site that were above the typical background levels of radiation.

Based on the May 1, 2018 report findings, H2M was requested by the Commissioner to conduct a confirmatory survey to verify the findings. Consequently, H2M incurred additional effort and conducted an additional site survey at the former Syosset Landfill. During this survey, H2M documented the survey path using a Trimble Geo7X GPS unit and collected additional radiological measurements also focusing on the locations previously identified with slightly higher radiation levels. A second Radiological Survey letter report, dated May 10, 2018, was prepared and submitted to the Town. H2M again concluded that no radiation readings were detected at the former Syosset landfill site that were above the typical background levels of radiation.

In consideration of the follow up confirmatory radiological survey and preparation of the second Radiological Survey letter report, H2M incurred additional labor and expense totaling \$3,200.74. The total project budget was therefore \$8,200.74. Attached please find a copy of H2M's invoice 152377, dated August 16, 2018. This invoice totaled \$8,200.74. To date, \$5,000.00 has been paid leaving a balance of \$3,200.74 for the additional services.

H2M requests a budget increase of \$3,200.74 and subsequent payment for the additional services rendered.

Dear Dr. Bruni,

When signed by you and the Town of Oyster Bay below this letter will constitute our agreement with respect to the matters set forth below. We agree as follows:

As you know, the Town of Oyster Bay in connection with its proposed Public Access Defibrillation ("PAD") Program is required by law to have a "collaborative agreement" with an "Emergency Health Care Provider" (which we will refer to as "Medical Director"), as those terms are used in Section 3000-b of the Public Health Law.

The Town of Oyster Bay believes that its proposed PAD Program is an extremely important service to provide to its employees, residents and visitors. The Town of Oyster Bay is pleased that you have expressed an interest in serving as the Medical Director for the PAD Program.

Annexed hereto, and incorporated into this agreement by reference, are written practice, protocols, policies, and procedures that will govern the Town of Oyster Bay proposed PAD Program.

You have represented to the Town of Oyster Bay that you have knowledge and experience in the delivery of emergency cardiac care and that you will participate in the regional quality improvement program pursuant to Subdivision 1 of Section 3004-a of the Public Health Law.

The Town of Oyster Bay herby retains you, and you agree to be retained by the Town of Oyster Bay, as the Medical Director for the PAD Program for the term, January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020 for the fee of \$3,600.00. Either party may terminate

this agreement at any time, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. Provided however, that the Town of Oyster Bay may terminate the agreement immediately in the event that you cease to qualify for any reason as the Medical Director under applicable laws, rules and regulations.

WRITTEN PRACTICE PROTOCOLS, POLICIES, AND PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATION ("AED PROGRAM") of the Town of Oyster Bay.

In order to enhance safety measures for the residents, employees, and visitors of the Town of Oyster Bay facilities and property, an Automated External Defibrillation program (AED Program) has been instituted. This document sets forth the practice protocols, policies, and procedures of the AED Program (the Program Policy), and is deemed incorporated into each collaborative agreement to which the Town of Oyster Bay is or becomes a party.

The policy is designed to assure that the Town of Oyster Bay personnel who operate the AEDs are properly trained, all AED equipment is maintained in good operating condition, and all New York State laws, rules and regulations applicable to the program are strictly adhered to by the Town of Oyster Bay staff.

A. Training

- 1. Only those who are trained to use AEDs in accordance with the laws of the State of New York shall be authorized to use the AEDs.
- 2. All authorized personnel must successfully complete a training course in the operation of AEDs approved by a nationally recognized organization approved by the New York State Department of Health for the purpose of training people in the use of AEDs.
- 3. All authorized personnel must maintain on file with the Town of Oyster Bay, a written certification card or other written evidence satisfactory to the Medical Director Dr. Joseph Bruni, establishing such authorized personnel's successful completion of an approved AED training course.

- 4. All such certificates must be current and still effective under the standards of the organization that has approved the course to which such certification relates, and only authorized personnel with certifications effective at the time of use of any AED may use the AED.
- 5. The Town of Oyster Bay will provide ongoing training in the use of AEDs for its authorized personnel to the extent recommended by the organization that has approved the training course attended by authorized personnel.
- 6. All authorized personnel shall be familiar with and trained to use the specific model of AED owned by the Town of Oyster Bay.

B. Location of AED Units.

- 19 Public Safety Vehicles & Boats
- 2 Town Hall North
- 2 Town Hall South
- 1 Landfill
- 7 DPW Facilities
- 7 Community Centers
- 22 Various Town Parks, Beaches, Pools.

If the Town elects to obtain additional AEDs, this policy shall be amended to reflect such additions, and the location at which same shall be employed.

C. Maintenance and Inspection of the AED Units.

- 1. The AED will be kept protected in the case, as supplied by the manufacturer, and shall be kept clean, warm, and dry at all times when not in use.
- 2. The AED is designed to perform routine self-diagnostic tests to verify its operating and battery status. The AED Unit will have both visual and audible status indicators and a special service indicator light. To supplement and verify the self-diagnostic checks built into each unit, The Department of Public Safety and Parks Department shall conduct the following inspections:
 - a. Weekly inspections; a visual inspection of the AED to determine if any of the self-diagnostic tests and the special service lights indicate that attention is required.
 - b. Monthly inspection: On the first business day of each month, the Department of Public Safety and Parks will prepare a monthly inspection report. Each inspection will include observation of all self-diagnostic indicators on the equipment as well as verification that the AED Unit is complete, clean and in good operating condition.

- 3. If a problem is detected in any such inspection, or if some attention otherwise seems warranted, then the AED should be serviced or attended to immediately. In the event service is needed contact the Department of Public Safety.
- 4. In the event that such service or attention so warrants, arrangements must be made immediately to have a replaced AED Unit until the AED Unit is serviced or repaired and is again fully functional.

D. In the event of emergency.

- 1. In the event of any medical emergency, immediately notify the Nassau County Police or local Fire Department by calling 911 for medical assistance, if the situation requires it.
- 2. If more then one employee is present in the course of an emergency situation, then one shall contact EMS while the other employee assists and stays with the victim.
- 3. Check the victims Circulation, Airway and Breathing, confirm that victim is unconscious, not breathing and has no pulse or obvious signs of life. If necessary, start CPR until the AED is applied.
- 4. Position victim away from water and metal. Place unit by victim's shoulder and turn it on.
- 5. Expose victim's chest, and dry or shave the area if necessary.
- 6. Apply pads to victim's chest. If needed, plug cables into unit.
- 7. Stand clear during rhythm analysis.
- 8. Follow prompts from AED unit to (a) press shock button or (b) do not shock but immediately give CPR with the pads remaining in place, starting with chest compressions.
- 9. Follow the AED's prompts to analyze the rhythm again after 5 cycles of CPR (about 2 minutes).
- 10. Continue steps 8 & 9 until the victim recovers (moves) or professional rescuers arrive and take over.

- 11. If the victim recovers (moves), check for breathing and put a breathing unresponsive victim in the recovery position (with pads remaining in place) and continue the breathing.
- 12. After emergency medical service assistance has reached the location of the emergency, trained personnel will remain at the scene to assist EMS personnel.
- 13. If the victim must be transported from the facility, with the AED Unit employees will determine which hospital the victim is being transported to. Inquiry should be made of the ambulance or emergency vehicle operator. If that information is not available, then the employee should contact the Emergency Medical Provider's office to determine where the ambulance took the victim. Employees should not follow the ambulance.
- 14. The Town of Oyster Bay and the Emergency Health Care Provider (hereinafter "Medical Director") with which the Town has entered into a collaborative agreement related to this program must file reports with respect to each incident involving use of an AED. Such reports cannot be completed without information contained in computer chips installed within each AED unit. Therefore, it is imperative that the staff retrieve any AED unit that leaves the facility. To that end the AED is equipped with a special quick connect adapter, which allows the electrodes, which are attached to the victim when the AED is in use, to be connected to different brand units of AED's. Therefore, the EMS personnel attending to an incident involving the use of the AED will have the option of disconnecting the electrodes from the AED and connecting the same to AED's that the EMS personnel may have brought to the scene.
- 15. In any situation in which the AED remains at the scene after it is used, it should be secured by AED trained employees.

E. Documentation requirements.

- 1. In the event that an AED is used, the following steps are required:
 - A. The authorized personnel using the AED will prepare an incident report.
 - B. The Medical Director must be contacted promptly, and be provided with all relevant data.
 - C. The data on the computer chip installed in the AED Unit must be downloaded.
 - D. The Town of Oyster Bay must report and submit data to the Nassau County Regional Emergency Medical Services Council:

F. Emergency Health Care Provider.

1. The Town of Oyster Bay has entered into a collaborative agreement with the following Medical Director:

Dr. Dash is closing out the open Town of Oyster Bay permits on his property. The town noticed the existing marine structures on the new survey did not match his permits in the town file. Mr. Dash applied for permits in 1990 to authorize the installation of two 6' x 20' floats on three float anchor piles, a 5' x 6' platform, 3' x 14' ramp. A boat lift, an access platform and a davit were installed without the benefit of permits. We are requesting a new permit to be issued from your department for the existing marine structures that exist on the property. The float was shortened the without a permit after Sandy and the boat lift was replaced. The floats were cut down in size due to storm damage. The town asked that we have the existing structures approved by the NYSDEC and Army Corps of Engineers. This has been done. The marine structures we need town permit for that were not in the original permit are:

- 1- The 12' wide x 14' long elevator boat lift installed on two piles
- 2- The 4' 3" x 6' access platform from the bulkhead to the elevator lift
- 3- The 6' davit on one 10" diameter piling seaward of the platform for the ramp.
- 4- The two 6' wide x 20' long floats that were in the issued town permit were reconstructed into one 6' wide by 27.5' long float.

The NYSDEC issued a warning letter for the addition of the boat lift and access platform, davit and reconfigured float. This is the amended NYSDEC Permit. The NYDEC Permit # 1-2824-00454/00001 was issued 7/27/1990 for a 5' x 6' platform, 3' x 14' ramp, two 6' x 20' floats on three anchor piles.

The Army Corps of Engineers issued a no further review required for the additional structures via email. They stated the structures were authorized under Nationwide #2 for structures in a man-made canal of the boat lift and access platform, davit and reconfigured float. USACE Permit #15851 issued 9/5/1990 for the 5' x 6' platform, 3' x 14' ramp, two 6' x 20' floats on three float anchor piles.

This property is located in a NYSDOS identified canal. The NYSDOS issued a permit for the existing marine structures.

Dear Sir/Madam;

During a recent inspection, Department staff noted a potential violation at 60 Gloucester Road, Massapequa (Nassau County). Specifically,

- 1) Reconstruction of an elevator boat lift without a NYS DEC permit.
- 2) Installation of an access platform from the BH to the boat lift without a NYS DEC permit.
- 3) Installation of 6' davit on one 10" diameter piling without a NYS DEC permit.
- 4) Two 6'x20' floats reconstructed into one 6'x27.5' float without a NYS DEC permit.

These are regulated activities within the Department's Tidal Wetland jurisdiction and therefore, require a permit from the Department.

Conducting regulated activities without the required NYSDEC permits is a violation of Article 25 of the State's Environmental Conservation Law. Such violations may be subject to a maximum penalty of \$10,000 per day per violation.

At this time, the Department is issuing this warning letter in lieu of further enforcement action against you. We now consider this violation resolved. You are reminded, however, that any future regulated activity will require the appropriate permits.


PROPOSED

Hello Mr DeMartino,

I mentioned this situation in conversation with you previously.

In this email I am supplying the documents from 1990 we have obtained from the town, the recent survey and a complete application.

We are requesting approval from your department for the unauthorized structures that exist on the property. Mr. Dash is trying to close out the Town of Oyster Bay permits on his property. The town noticed the existing marine structures on the new survey did not match his permits in the town file. The town asked that we have these structures approved by the NYSDEC, NYSDOS and Army Corps of Engineers. The marine structures in question are the:

- The 12' wide x 14' long elevator boat lift installed on two piles
- The 4' 3" x 6' access platform from the bulkhead to the elevator lift 2-
- 3-The 6' davit on one 10" diameter piling seaward of the platform for the ramp and float.
- The two 6' wide x 20' long floats were reconstructed into one 6' wide by 27.5' long float.

I do not believe these structures have permits and we need to obtain approval for these existing unauthorized structures. This property is located in a NYSDOS identified canal. The floats were cut down in size due to storm damage.

The float was reconstructed into one 6' wide by 27.5' long float.

Mr. Dash applied for permits in 1990 to authorize the installation of two 6' x 20' floats on three float anchor piles, a 5' x 6' platform, 3' x 14' ramp off of the platform. The permit numbers are listed below.





I sent the email below to the NYSDEC. They issued a warning letter for the unauthorized structures.



Dear Sir/Madam;

During a recent inspection, Department staff noted a potential violation at 1 S Bay Avenue, Massapequa (Nassau County). Specifically, 1) Constructed the boat basin larger then the permit authorized and thus the construction of a wider float to reach the intended location in the canal. These are regulated activities within the Department's Tidal Wetland jurisdiction and therefore, require a permit from the Department.

Conducting regulated activities without the required NYSDEC permits is a violation of Article 25 of the State's Environmental Conservation Law. Such violations may be subject to a maximum penalty of \$10,000 per day per violation.

At this time, the Department is issuing this warning letter in lieu of further enforcement action against you. We now consider this violation resolved. You are reminded, however, that any future regulated activity will require the appropriate permits.

WHEREAS, New York State General Municipal Law ("NYS GML"), Section 104-b, requires every town to adopt internal policies and procedures governing all procurement of goods and services not subject to the bidding requirements of General Municipal Law, Section 103, or any other law, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Oyster Bay, both by Ordinance and by departmental policies and procedures, has a long established framework for the procurement of goods and services; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to have said policies and procedures embodied in one document; and

WHEREAS, comments have been solicited from those officers of the Town involved with procurement; and

WHEREAS, the Procurement Policies and Procedures of the Town of Oyster Bay were most recently adopted by the Town Board on March 27, 2018, by Resolution No. 209-2018; and

WHEREAS, it is the practice of the Town Board to review the procurement policies and procedures from time to time as the Town Board deems appropriate or necessary, and NYS GML Section 104b(4), requires every municipality to annually review its procurement policies and procedures,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town of Oyster Bay does hereby adopt the following procurement policies and procedures:

Guideline 1. Every prospective purchase of supplies or equipment, every public work and service contract, and every equipment lease shall be evaluated to determine the applicability of NYS GML Sections 103 and 104(b), and the herein procurement policy. The Department of General Services, Division of Purchasing (hereinafter referred to as "Purchaser") shall estimate the cumulative amount of the items of supply or equipment needed in a given fiscal year. That estimate shall include the canvass of other town departments and past history to determine the likely yearly value of the commodity to be acquired. The information gathered and conclusions reached shall be documented and kept with the file or other documentation supporting the purchase activity.

Guideline 2. All purchases of supplies or equipment which will exceed \$20,000.00 in the fiscal year, and public work and service contracts over \$35,000.00, shall be formally bid pursuant to NYS GML Section 103, inclusive of all future statutory amendments, deemed to be incorporated by reference, as if cited in its entirety herein.

Guideline 3(a). All estimated purchases of supplies or equipment:

in writing. At its discretion, the Department may elect to interview each firm, make visits to each firm, or inspect prior work done by each firm.

The Department shall then initiate negotiations with the highest qualified firm. If a satisfactory agreement cannot be negotiated with the firm considered the most qualified, at a fee determined to be fair and reasonable, then negotiations with said firm shall be terminated and negotiations then undertaken with the second most qualified firm. Failing accord with the second most qualified firm, negotiations shall terminate with it and then be undertaken with the third most qualified firm.

If acceptable terms cannot be reached with the three highest ranked firms, the selection process shall be terminated and the project shall be re-evaluated by the Town.

If acceptable terms are reached with one of the three highest ranked firms, the Department shall, in writing, notify the Town Board thereof, and make an appropriate recommendation in connection therewith, including justification for the cost of the services to be rendered.

Guideline 6(d). A Department may issue an RFP seeking to secure a number of professional service providers in any given field for a period of years, and after selecting those providers the Department shall, in writing, notify the Town Board accordingly and make a recommendation in connection therewith that the Department, during that period, may select any of the selected providers to perform said services.

<u>Guideline 6(e).</u> All agreements for professional services shall clearly state the agreement term, and the number and length of extensions, if any. The Department shall advise the Town Board of this information prior to the approval of any agreement.

When exercising any extension option, the Department shall obtain approval from the Town Board of the agreement terms exercised to date, the provision currently being exercised, and whether there are any remaining extensions. If a Department seeks to extend an agreement for a period beyond three (3) years from the original commencement date of the agreement, it shall issue a new RFP to determine if exercising the option is in the best interests of the Town.

No Department may recommend authorization of any task under a professional services agreement unless it is reasonably believed that said task will be completed prior to the expiration of the agreement.

All responses to an RFP shall be kept confidential until such time as the contract for work or goods is awarded and thereafter all documents responsive to the RFP shall be subject to disclosure pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Public Officers Law.

Guideline 7. A good faith effort, documented in writing, shall be made to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations. If the Purchaser is unable to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations, the Purchaser shall forward to the Town Attorney documentation regarding the attempt to obtain proposals or quotations, including the number of service providers in the field, the number of Requests for Proposals sent out and the number of responses received. If, in the opinion of the Town Attorney, the Purchaser has made an adequate attempt to obtain proposals or quotations, and was not able to obtain the requisite number of same, then the Town Attorney shall issue a written determination that the Purchaser has complied with the provisions of this Procurement Policy. In the event that the Town Attorney determines that the Purchaser has not made an adequate attempt to obtain proposals or quotations, the Purchaser shall be directed to make a further attempt to obtain same. In no event shall the inability to obtain the proposals or quotations be a bar to the procurement.

Guideline 8. The Commissioner or Department Head, or designee thereof, of each department responsible for procurement of services, supplies, equipment, or construction obtained with Federal, State or Local funds, shall review all proposed procurement actions to avoid the purchase of unnecessary or duplicative items. Such reviews shall consider

to be rendered;

- Experience of the firm in assignments of similar size, scope, and complexity;
- 3. Special knowledge relevant to project;
- 4. Special equipment or facilities relevant to project;
- Size, staffing, resources, and financial capability of the firm vs. the size of the assignment;
- Knowledge and experience with Town facility(ies) and programs involved in the assignment;
- 7. Past performance with the department;
- 8. Time constraints and deliverability of service;
- 9. Firm's current workload with the Town; and
- 10. Cost.

It is expressly acknowledged that the quality of the services to be rendered is of paramount importance. However, it is further expressly acknowledged that the cost of the services to be rendered is a substantial concern. Therefore, the Department shall, in every instance, justify to the Town Board, as hereinafter set forth, the cost of the services to be rendered.

Guideline 6(b). Architectural, Engineering, Environmental and Surveying firms will be invited to file a Federal Form SF 330 with the Town, which form will remain on file for a period of one year. Said firm will be required to provide updates on an annual basis. When such services are required, the Department seeking said services shall send an RFP to at least three (3) firms which have a current Federal Form SF330 on file with the Town. The RFP shall contain the project description, the criteria for evaluation, the date by which the firm must respond, and the name of a contact person in the Department. The Department shall obtain at least three (3) qualified proposals.

Gnideline 6(c). For all other professional services, the Department seeking said services shall make every reasonable effort to compile and maintain a current list of persons or entities interested in performing professional services for the Town; and, utilizing such list, the Department shall send the RFP by mail or email to those interested person or entities in an effort to obtain at least three (3) qualified proposals for any and all such services to be rendered, unless it is reasonably determined by the respective Commissioner or Department Head that the value of the services to be provided will not exceed \$5,000.00 per year, in which event only one (1) qualified proposal need be obtained. In every instance, the Department shall endeavor to make a fiscally prudent selection.

The Department shall also post the RFP on the Town's website and request the Town Clerk to post the RFP on the Town's builtein boards, and, at its option, may advertise the RFP in a newspaper of general circulation, consistent with the procedures for advertising a public bid under NYS GML Section 103. Such publication shall satisfy the foregoing provisions of this Procurement Policy relating to the number of proposals required, regardless of how many proposals are actually received by the Department.

The Department will review all submitted material and rank the firms in order of qualifications for this project. The basis on which the firms were ranked shall be documented

- c. Goods procured from or services provided by agencies for the blind or severely handicapped;
- d. Goods procured from correctional facilities;
- e. Goods, including surplus, procured from another governmental agency;
- f. Media advertising and public notices;

Goods and services procured through existing Federal, State or County contracts or contracts let by any political subdivision or district therein, which contracts have been made available for use by other governmental entities and which have been let to the lowest responsible bidder or on the basis of best value in a manner consistent with New York State Municipal Law Section 103: and
- h. Goods purchased at auction.

Quideline 6(a). From time to time, Town Departments retain individuals or companies to provide various professional services and certain other services requiring a special or technical skill, training or expertise. The service provider must be chosen based on accountability, reliability, responsibility, skill, education and training, professional judgment and integrity. The qualifications of the service provider is of prime importance to the successful and expedient completion of any project and are not necessarily found in the individual or company that offers the lowest price. For that reason, the following professional services and certain other services are not covered by the competitive bidding requirements of NYS GML Section 103, and are exempt from coverage under NYS GML Section 104-b:

Despite the foregoing, this Town Board recognizes that the establishment of formal policies and procedures would assist in ensuring that the most prudent and economical use is made of public monies, thus facilitating the acquisition of services of the best possible quality at the most beneficial cost. Seeking competition also guards against favoritism, extravagance, fraud and corruption, while allowing interested vendors a fair and equal opportunity to compete.

For the foregoing reasons, the following Qualification Based Selection (QBS) procedures shall be utilized:

The Department seeking to obtain a service shall prepare a written Request for Proposals ("RFP"), including a description of the proposed project, information regarding the approximate budget of the project, and any other relevant information.

The Department shall prepare a list of criteria to be used m evaluating submissions of qualifications. The criteria shall include, but not be limited to:

1. Magnitude, scope, and complexity of the services

of \$10,000.00 or more, up to and including \$20,000.00, shall require a written Request for a Quote ("RFQ") and written, fax, or electronic quotations from at least three (3) vendors.

of \$5,000.00 or more, but less than \$10,000.00, require an oral or written request and written, fax or electronic quotations from at least two (2) vendors.

of less than \$5,000.00 require an oral, written, fax or electronic quotation from at least one (1) yendor.

Guideline 3(b). All estimated public work and service contracts:

- of \$15,000.00 or more, up to and including \$35,000.00, require a written RFQ, and written, fax or electronic quotations from at least three (3) contractors.
- of \$7,500.00 or more, but less than \$15,000.00, require a written RFQ and written, fax or electronic quotations from at least two (2) contractors.
- ofless than \$7,500.00 require a written, fax or electronic quotation from at least one (1) contractor.

Guideline 3(c). Individual equipment leases, the annual costs of which are estimated to be:

- in excess of \$35,000.00, require a formal bid, which bid shall be conducted consistent with the provisions of NYSGML Section 103.
- $$\cdot$15,000.00$ or more, up to and including \$35,000.00, require quotations from at least three (3) vendors.
- \$7,500.00 or more, but less than \$15,000.00, require quotations from at least two (2) vendors.
 - less than \$7,500.00, require a quotation from at least one (1) vendor.

Leases of multiple pieces of equipment, intended for use in one project, shall, for the purpose of this Guideline, be considered an individual lease.

Real property leases, due to their unique nature, are specifically excluded from this Guideline.

Guideline 3(d). Any written RFQ shall describe the desired goods, quantity and the particulars of delivery including mode of delivery and time parameters for delivery. The Purchaser shall compile a list of all vendors from whom written/fax/or electronic quotations have been requested, and the written/fax/oral/electronic quotations offered.

All responses to an RFQ or bid proposal shall be kept confidential until such time as the contract for work or goods is awarded and thereafter all documents responsive to the RFQ/bid proposal shall be subject to disclosure pursuant to the applicable provisions of the New York State Public Officers Law. All public works contracts must be in the form approved by the Town Attorney.

All information gathered in complying with the procedures of this Procurement Policy shall be preserved and filed with the documentation supporting the subsequent purchasee or public work and service contracts.

Guideline 4. For all purchases and/or services sought to be procured under Guidelines 2 and 3 hereof, the lowest responsible vendor or contractor meeting specifications shall be awarded the purchase, public work or service contract. If a vendor or contractor is not deemed responsible or does not meet specifications, facts supporting that judgment shall also be documented and filed with the record supporting the procurement. As provided in NYS GML Section 103, the Town may reject all bids or offers and re-advertise for new bids or offers in accordance with this Procurement Policy.

<u>Guideline 5.</u> Except when directed by the Town Board, no solicitation or written proposals or quotations shall be required under the following circumstances:

- a. Emergencies;
- b. Sole source vendors or providers of services, including, but not limited to, the procurement of those with a unique skill set, including

consolidation or breaking out to obtain a more economical purchase. When determined appropriate by the respective Commissioner, Department Head, or their designee, an analysis should be made of lease versus purchase alternatives and any other analysis to determine the most economical approach.

Guideline 9. No employee, officer or agent of the Town of Oyster Bay shall participate directly or indirectly in the selection or in the award or administration of any contract if a conflict, real or apparent, would be involved. Such conflict would arise when a financial or other interest in a firm selected for award is held by:

- 1. An employee, officer or agent involved in making the award;
- His/her relative including father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, niece, husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, stepfather, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepsister, stepbrother, half-brother, or half-sister;
- 3. His/her partner; or
- An organization which employs, is negotiating to employ, or has an arrangement concerning prospective employment of any of the above.

Guideline 10. Any actual or prospective contractor may protest the solicitation or award of a contract for serious violations of the principles of this Policy. Any protest against solicitations must be received before the due date for receipt of bids or proposals, and any protest against the award of a contract must be received within ten calendar days after contract award, or the protest will not be considered. All bid protests shall be in writing, submitted to Purchasing Agent or the Commissioner of the Department of General Services. The Purchasing Agent or the Commissioner of the Department of General Services may, at his/her discretion, suspend the procurement pending resolution of the protest, if warranted by the facts presented.

Guideline 11. These policies and procedures shall be reviewed from time to time as the Town Board deems appropriate or necessary, and shall be reviewed at least annually by the Town Board. In addition, from time to time, upon request of the Town Board, each Department shall provide, in writing, a summary accounting of the essential activity arising out of these policies and procedures.

Guideline 12. In accordance with the requirements of NYS GML 104-b(2)(f), the following individual is responsible for the purchase of goods and services:

Eric Tuman - Commissioner, Department of General Services, or his successor

Guideline 13. The Town Board shall adopt a separate Resolution setting forth the procedures, rules and regulations to be followed for the disposal of the Town's surplus personal property.

Insofar as these policies and procedures are inconsistent with any existing Town policy or procedure, the provisions of this Resolution shall be controlling.

AGREEMENT RENEWAL / BUDGET AMENDMENT

At the Town Board Meeting of April 4, 2017, the Town Board adopted Resolution Number 178-2017 (enclosed) which authorized the Town to enter into an Agreement with The County of Nassau (County). Through this Agreement the Town served as a vendor to the County in the administration of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Safety Net Assistance programs, in exchange for \$164,919.00 for the period of May 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017. This Agreement allows for up to four (4) one (1) year renewals.

At the Town Board Meeting of November 28, 2017, the Town Board adopted Resolution Number 800-2017 (enclosed) which authorized the Town to execute the first one-year renewal and budget amendment to the Agreement with the County. Through this renewal and budget amendment the Town served as a vendor to the County in the administration of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Safety Net Assistance programs, in exchange for \$286,763.00 for the period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018.

At the Town Board Meeting of December 11, 2018, the Town Board adopted Resolution Number 782-2018 (enclosed) which authorized the Town to execute the second one-year renewal and budget amendment to the Agreement with the County. Through this renewal and budget amendment the Town served as a vendor to the County in the administration of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Safety Net Assistance programs, in exchange for up to \$342,498.00 for a period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019.

The Town and County now wish to execute the third one-year renewal and a budget amendment to the Agreement. Through this renewal and budget amendment the Town would serve as a vendor to the County in the administration of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Safety Net Assistance programs for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 in exchange for up to \$349,348.00.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families is the Federal program established under the Personal Responsibility and Work Responsibility Reconciliation Act of 1996 that provides income support to eligible families, within the broader context of a comprehensive service delivery system that moves families from public dependency to economic self-sufficiency. Safety Net refers to former TANF recipients who have reached the 60-month TANF eligibility limit. Recipients of TANF and Safety Net Assistance benefits are required to adopt an Individual Employment Plan and maintain adherence to this Plan in order to remain eligible for said benefits.

The Town's role as a vendor to the County through the third one-year renewal of the Agreement would be to accept a caseload of approximately 350 TANF and Safety Net Assistance recipients and work with them in the development of and adherence to their Individual Employment Plans. More specifically, the Town's Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, Division of Employment and Training (DET) would conduct individual assessments with TANF and Safety Net Assistance recipients, develop Individual Employment Plans, provide job search assistance, make referral to supportive services and arrange for the recipients participation in activities required to maintain TANF and Safety Net Assistance eligibility. The DET would also be responsible for tracking activities participated in by recipients and reporting results to the County in order for the County to determine continued eligibility of these recipients TANF and Safety Net benefits.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Town Board adopt a Resolution authorizing the Supervisor or his authorized designee to execute a third one-year renewal and budget Amendment to the above referenced Agreement between The County of Nassau and the Town of Oyster Bay; nunc pro tunc as of January 1, 2020.

AMENDMENT NO. III

This AMENDMENT, dated as of January 1, 2020, (together with the exhibits, schedules, appendices and attachments, hereto, if any, this "Amendment"), between (i) Nassau County, a municipal corporation having its principal office at 1550 Franklin Avenue, Mineola, New York 11501 (the "County"), acting for and on behalf of the County Department of Social Services, having its principal office at 60 Charles Lindbergh Blvd., Uniondale, New York 11553 (the "Department"), and (ii) the Town of Oyster Bay, a municipal corporation, having its principal office at 977 Hicksville Road, Massapequa, New York, 11758 (the "Contractor").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to County contract number CQSS17000033 between the County and the Contractor, executed on behalf of the County on June 7, 2017, as amended by the amendment executed on behalf of the County on February 26, 2018 as amended by the amendment executed on behalf of the County on March18, 2019 (the "Original Agreement"), the Contractor provides employment services for recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families ("TANF"), which services are more fully described in the Original Agreement (the services contemplated by the Original Agreement, the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, the term of the Original Agreement is from May 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019 with an option to renew under the same terms and conditions for two (2) additional one-year period(s) remaining (the "Original Term"); and

WHEREAS, the Maximum Amount that the County agreed to reimburse the Contractor for Services under the Original Agreement, as full compensation for the Services, was Seven Hundred Ninety-Four Thousand One Hundred Eighty and 00/100 (\$794,180.00) Dollars (the "Maximum Amount"); and

WHEREAS, the County and the Contractor desire to amend and renew the Original Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Amendment, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Renewal of Term. The Original Agreement shall be renewed and thereby extended for one (1) year so that the termination date of the Original Agreement, as amended by this Amendment (the "Amended Agreement"), shall be December 31, 2020.
- 2. <u>Maximum Amount.</u> The Maximum Amount in the Original Agreement shall be increased by Three Hundred Forty- Nine Thousand Three Hundred Forty- Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$349,348.00), so that the maximum amount that the County shall pay to the Contractor as full consideration for all Services provided under the Amended Agreement shall be One Million One Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty- Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,143,528.00) (the "Amended Maximum Amount").
- 3. <u>Budget</u>. The line-item budget referred to in Section 4 (f) of the Original Agreement, is amended to appear in its in its entirety as set forth in Exhibit "A", attached hereto (such amended budget, the "<u>Amended Budget</u>"), which may be amended or modified from time to time upon request of the Contractor, subject, however, to prior approval of the Department.
- 4. <u>Payment</u>. Section 4. <u>Payment</u>. Subsection (A)(1) through (3) of the Original Agreement is hereby amended to read in its entirety as set forth below:
 - 4(A)(1) Provided the Contractor performs all the terms and condition of this Agreement, the County agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to accept a maximum sum not to exceed Three Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand Three Hundred Forty-Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$349,348.00) in accordance with the line-item budget attached hereto as Amended "Exhibit A" (the "Amended Budget").
 - 4(A)(2) For all the Contractor's actual costs for Educational activities, Job Skills Training, Job Readiness Training and OJT services, the County agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to accept a maximum sum not to exceed Zero (\$0.00) DOLLARS.
 - 4(A)(3) A combination of cost-based not to exceed Two Hundred Twenty-Seven Thousand Seventy- Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$227,076.00) and performance-based reimbursement not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Two and 00/100 Dollars (\$122,272.00) will be used to pay the Contractor.
 - (a) Cost-Based Reimbursement. The cost-based reimbursement will be paid in arrears on a monthly basis in accordance with Exhibit A.
 - (b) Performance-Based Reimbursement. The performance component of the Contractor's services shall be billed separately from the cost-based reimbursement. Performance-based reimbursement will be paid on a monthly basis over the term of this Agreement.
 - (i) Performance Payment Schedules:

Payments for each milestone are as follows:

(aa) Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) for each client with fully countable activities

- (bb) Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each assessment completed within Fifteen
- (15) Days for clients who are Non-Exempt from employment activities;
- (cc) One Hundred Dollars (\$100) for each assessment completed with a client that is exempt from employment activities;

(ii) Performance Claiming Procedures:

Each month the Contractor shall submit to the Department a summary, using the Monthly Employment Vendor Report that will be constructed for this purpose, which will include the number of clients meeting the criteria for each milestone. The Contractor will provide the supporting documentation as specified in the payment policy section of each milestone with the summary.

- (c) The Contractor shall generate and submit the NYS COGNOS report entitled Federal All Families Detail Listing- Countable Cases through the NYS COGNOS System and Welfare-To-Work Caseload Management System reports (or other report as may be designated by OTDA) as well as, or other documentation required to substantiate or verify claims for performance based reimbursement as determined by the Department These reports and documents are to be submitted with the Contractor's claim for performance based reimbursement.
- 5. <u>Compliance with Law.</u> Section 19. <u>Compliance with Law</u> of the <u>Original Agreement</u> is hereby amended to add sections 19. (g) which shall read as follows:
- 19.(g) <u>Vendor Code of Ethics</u>. By executing this Agreement, the Contractor hereby certifies and covenants that:
 - (i) The Contractor has been provided a copy of the Nassau County Vendor Code of Ethics issued on June 5, 2019, as may be amended from time to time (the "Vendor Code of Ethics"), and will comply with all of its provisions;
 - (ii) All of the Contractor's Participating Employees, as such term is defined in the Vendor Code of Ethics (the "Participating Employees"), have been provided a copy of the Vendor Code of Ethics prior to their participation in the underlying procurement;
 - (iii) All Participating Employees have completed the acknowledgment required by the Vendor Code of Ethics;
 - (iv) The Contractor will retain all of the signed Participating Employee acknowledgements for the period it is required to retain other records pertinent to performance under this Agreement;
 - (v) The Contractor will continue to distribute the Vendor Code of Ethics, obtain signed Participating Employee acknowledgments as new Participating Employees are added or changed during the term of this Agreement, and retain such signed acknowledgments for the period the Contractor is required to retain other records pertinent to performance under this Agreement; and
 - (vi) The Contractor has obtained the certifications required by the Vendor Code of Ethics from any subcontractors or other lower tier participants who have participated in procurements for work performed under this Agreement.

6. <u>Full Force and Effect</u>. All the terms and conditions of the Original Agreement not expressly amended by this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect and govern the relationship of the parties for the term of the Amended Agreement.
