Dear Commissioner Betz:

H2M architects + engineers (H2M) has been providing support to the Town of Oyster Bay (Town) regarding historic environmental impacts in and around Bethpage Community Park (Park). We continue to work with the Town Attorney's office and outside counsel regarding support services in dealing with claims made by the Department of Defense (Navy) and Northrop Grumman Systems Corporation (Grumman). In addition, it is periodically requested that we review and comment on New York Site Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) and Grumman reports and correspondence. We have also provided engineering support regarding remedial investigation of the Bethpage Community Park Ice Rink Area under the NYSDEC Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP).

The Town's participation in the BCP requires investigation of the extent of Freon impacts to the environment and, if necessary, developing and implementing mitigating measures.

A Remedial Investigation Report (RIR) was submitted in 2015 and comments were received from the NYSDEC. A revised RIR was submitted in January 2016 in response to regulatory agency comments. The NYSDEC approved the RIR in May 2016, made a "significant threat determination for the sites in the Brownfields Cleanup Program (BCP)" and requested an alternatives analysis report to identify, evaluate and select a remedy or alternative remedies to address the Freon impacts. An Alternatives Analysis Report (AAR) was submitted to the NYSDEC in October 2016 and comments were received from the NYSDEC in November 2016. On November 23, 2016, H2M submitted to the NYSDEC (on behalf of the Town) notification of election to revise the AAR and an initial response to the NYSDEC comment letter for the AAR. The AAR revisions were discussed with the NYSDEC on December 8, 2016.

The BCP requirements will continue through 2017. For 2017 it is anticipated that the following additional activities will be required for compliance with the Brownfields Cleanup agreement executed between the Town and the NYSDEC:

Finalization of AAR based on NYSDEC responses and selection of a proposed remedial strategy. Based on the AAR submitted to the NYSDEC in October 2016, the proposed remedial alternative includes establishment of institutional controls in the form of an environmental easement that will:



- o Control future intrusive work at a depth where groundwater is present to minimize exposure potential;
- Restrict use of the groundwater as a source of potable or process water and implement a site management plan and health and safety plan (for subsurface activity conducted at a depth where groundwater is present);
- o Provide periodic certification of institutional controls to the NYSDEC; and
- o Provide Site access and appropriate notification to the NYSDEC.
- Prepare a Remedial Work Plan (RWP) and fact sheet for NYSDEC approval.
- Place fact sheet, RIR, AAR, and RWP in a document repository for public comment.
- · Submit the fact sheet to the Brownfield Site Contact List.
- Based on NYSDEC approval, implement the remedial alternative. Implementation of the remedial alternative may include preparing a Site Management Plan (SMP) and Final Engineering Report (FER), conducting a survey, and creating an environmental easement.

The above is contingent upon NYSDEC approval of the proposed remedial alternative. Once the above tasks are completed, additional steps in the Brownfields process may include maintenance of the environmental easement.

Considering the above, H2M is requesting budgetary authorization in the amount of \$104,000 for 2017, as follows:







Legal Counsel for Ongoing Negligence Matters

In or about August, 2016, Burns, Russo, Tamigi, and Reardon, LLP, one of the Town's outside counsel for negligence matters, began the process of winding down and dissolving its law practice. That firm was handling a number of matters for the Office of the Town Attorney, many of which were at advanced stages of the litigation. Consequently, although this Office took back many of the files that the Burns, Russo firm was handling, it was not feasible for all of the matters to come in house given that this Office is short-staffed and it would require a significant amount of time to become familiar with all of the files, especially those that were approaching trial readiness.

The partners who were handling the matters at Burns, Russo moved on to practice at Milber, Makris, Plousadis & Seiden, LLP, 1000 Woodbury Road, Suite 402, Woodbury, New York, and The Law Office of Alan J. Reardon 19 Park Avenue, Williston Park, New York 11596 taking with them approximately twenty four cases that this Office could not bring back in house, given that those matters required immediate attention for which adequate staffing was not available. As such, this Office consented to the partners' continued handling of those matters.

From the period beginning with the Burns, Russo dissolution through the end of calendar year 2016, Milber, Makris billed \$44,134.99 while The Law Office of Alan J. Reardon billed \$20,000.00 in legal fees and disbursements. Billing was computed at the rates previously utilized by the Burns, Russo firm. Of note, when this Office procured outside counsel for calendar year 2017, Milber, Makris and The Law Office of Alan J. Reardon both responded to the RFP and were appointed to assist this Office with negligence matters at the same billable rates previously applied.

It is therefore requested that the Town Board ratify the actions of the Office of the Town Attorney in utilizing the services of Milber, Makris, Plousadis & Seiden, LLP and The Law Office of Alan J. Reardon in the three month period following the Burns, Russo dissolution. Authorization is further requested for the Comptroller to satisfy the aforementioned legal fees, nunc pro tunc to October 1, 2016, in an amount not to exceed \$44,134.99 with respect to Milber, Makris and an amount not to exceed \$20,000.00 with respect to the Law Office of Alan J. Reardon. Funds are to be drawn from Account Nos. TWN AMS 1910 43010 601 0000 000 and TWN AMS 1910 43020 602 0000 000.

- 5. Any player can make a reservation up to five (5) days in advance of the requested date of play. The fee for this reservation is \$5.00 at all times.
- 6. The player who reserves the tee time must play in the group.
- 7. Five (5) day tee-time bookings start five (5) days prior to the date requested at 12:00AM for a \$5.00 per player fee.
- 8. Thirty day tee-time bookings start 30 days prior to the date requested at 12:00AM for a \$5.00 per player fee.
- 9. No reservation can be made less than 24 hours in advance of the requested date of play. Members of the Town of Oyster Bay Golf Course can make two (2), thirty (30) day in advance reservations in addition to the five (5) days in advance privileges. No player can hold more than two (2), thirty (30) day reservation at one time. The fee for these reservations is \$5.00. Reservations can be made online or on the telephone reservation system
- 10. If a tee-time is cancelled less than 24-hours in advance, the player reservation fee will not be waived.
- 11. Failure to cancel a tee-time will result in a loss of reservation rights until full payment of all applicable reservation and green fees are paid. All photo I.D.'s must be presented to the cashier before tickets are purchased and shown to the starter 15 minutes prior to tee time.
- 12. All greens fees must be paid one hour prior to tee-off or tee time will be forfeited with applicable greens fees will be charged.
- 13. If a member has paid for his group's tee-time and one (1) member is a "no show" in his group, a rain check will be issued to the member; if the "no show" spot can be filled with another player.

GENERAL

- 1. Any golfer, who arrives to play and does not have the proper identification, will be charged non-resident rates.
- 2. Each player must have their own bag and at least 5 clubs.
- 3. Daily receipt is required to play golf and must be presented to golf staff upon request.
- 4. USGA rules shall govern all play, except for any local rules shown on scorecards or posted at the starters shack.
- 5. Daily receipt will entitle holder to one round of golf.

GENERAL - continued

- 6. There will be absolutely no refunds or adjustments made from the cash register. A formal request for a refund must be submitted in writing to the Commissioner of Parks.
- 7. All golfers will begin on the 1st tee, unless otherwise directed by the starter.
- 8. Golf and cart tickets must be carried during play and presented to authorized personnel upon request.
- 9. When an open hole lies ahead, slower moving players shall permit faster moving players to play through.
- 10. The Town of Oyster Bay will not be responsible for any accident incurred on the course. All players shall play at their own risk.
- 11. The Town of Oyster Bay will not be responsible for the loss or damage of personal property. Lost and found articles will be kept for one week and if not claimed, they will then be turned over to the Nassau County Police Department in conformance with article 7B of the Personal Property Law.
- 12. Minimum age to play the golf course is fifteen (15) years, without an adult, ten (10) years, accompanied by an adult.
- 13. The course will be closed Mondays, except holidays, when the course will be closed on Tuesdays, except when scheduled otherwise by the Commissioner of Parks or his designee
- 14. Holiday rates will be in effect on National Holidays falling between May 1st and October 31st.
- 15. Green fees will be halved when the majority of play is on temporary greens and tees.
- 16. All non-playing guests (limit one (1) per foursome) must purchase appropriate greens fee.
- 17. A resident may bring only one guest per day at the posted guest rate on weekdays only.
- 18. Golfers will be allowed to tee-off at the 10th hole and play the back nine for A discounted price. The days of play will be established by the Commissioner of Parks or his designee.
- 19. The first tee-time will commence with sunrise or as close to sunrise, as conditions permit.
- 20. The tee-time schedule may be adjusted subject to the Commissioner of Parks or his designee.
- 21. Scheduling for private golf outings, tee-time hours and discounted price play can be adjusted during the season subject to the prior approval of the Commissioner of Parks or his designee. All adjustments are subject to availability of playing time and current course conditions.
- 22. The minimum requirement of 100 players for Not-For-Profit Outings can be adjusted subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Parks or his designee.

GREEN FEES/CART POLICY

- 1. Player must have a driver's license to rent a gas cart and sign the appropriate rental agreement.
- 2. No one will be permitted on the golf course without a green fees ticket/receipt.
- 3. Green fees ticket/receipts will be sold only to a player personally presenting his/her golf membership.
- 4. Each player must personally register and sign in with the starter and present proper ID upon request.
- 5. Green fees and golf cart receipts must be shown to rangers, golf managers and others who have the authority to enforce the rules.
- 6. A golf cart/ticket receipt must be purchased to obtain a cart.
- 7. Golf cart drivers must have a driver's license.
- 8. Cart driver and passenger are responsible for adherence to the rules.

9. Users of golf carts shall use same at their own risk.

GREEN FEES/ CART POLICY - continued

- 10. Renters of golf carts shall be responsible for any damages to the cart or damage caused by the cart.
- 11. All carts must remain a minimum of thirty feet from all greens.

DRESS CODE

- 1. All players must be appropriately dressed.
- 2. Spike less golf shoes are mandatory footwear for all players at the Oyster Bay Golf Course. Footwear, with any form of metal or ceramic golf spikes is prohibited. Violation of this regulation can result in removal of golf course privileges.

RAIN CHECK

- 1. Rain checks will only be issued and approved by a manager, and only after the completion of all the necessary forms.
- 2. Applicability
 - a. Rain check(s) may be issued in the event of rain, prior to tee-off when the player(s) voluntarily chooses not to tee-off for applicable cart fees and greens fees.
 - b. Rain check(s) may be issued when it rains after play has begun for applicable cart fees, greens fees and tee time fees when the Greens Keeper closes the course.
 - c. Rain check(s) may be issued for applicable cart fees and greens fees when the Greens Keeper closes the course.
- 3. All rain checks must be used within one year of issuance. Those not used become void with no refunds offered or available unless otherwise authorized by the Commissioner of Parks.

ETIQUETTE

- 1. In the event that a ball is hit in the direction of other players a warning shout of "FORE" is mandatory.
- 2. Ball marks made on the green must be properly repaired.
- 3. Divots taken in the fairway and rough must be properly repaired.
- 4. Bunkers must be raked and smoothed, eliminating any trace of divot or foot print.
- 5. In the interest of all players, players should play without delay and keep pace with the group ahead.
- 6. Entry into environmentally protected areas is prohibited.
- 7. Maximum lost ball search time is five minutes.
- 8. Place golf bags or carts at side of green nearest to next tee.

RULES VIOLATIONS

- 1. All players in a group may be equally responsible for any infraction of the rules committed by one member of the group.
- 2. Failure to follow ranger or other officials; warning or direction may result in your being cited for infraction of rules with possible suspension of playing privileges or loss of membership. Rule violators are subject to penalties deemed appropriate by the Director of Golf.
- 3. Intentional or careless damage to property or violations of rules may result in revocation of all playing privileges, including memberships.

This office sent out Requests for Proposals to over 40 accredited Financial Advisor service firms based in New York State. Six proposals were received by the March 17 due date. A committee consisting of Commissioner Joe Pinto, Deputy Comptroller Christine Wiss and I independently evaluated and rated the firms and then held a meeting to discuss our findings.

The unanimous choice of the committee was Fiscal Advisors and Marketing, Inc., followed by Capital Market Advisors and Munistat. With that being stated, all of the proposals projected costs higher than what the Town would spend if we were to exercise our option to renew the current contract for the 21 months from April 1, 2017 through December 31, 2018.

Therefore, the recommendation the committee is making to the Town Board is to reject all of the proposals received and renew our existing contract with Fiscal Advisors & Marketing, Inc. This renewal option was authorized by resolution 854-2014, dated December 16, 2014.

The value of Financial Advisor services would be contingent upon the type and amount of debt issued. Funds for this purpose are available in various capital funds object .29999 or other appropriate accounts.

COUNTY OF NASSAU AGREEMENT:

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM

The County of Nassau (County) has proposed an Agreement to the Town of Oyster Bay in which the the Town would serve as a vendor to the County in the administration of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Famillies (TANF) and Safety Net Assistance programs in return for up to \$164,919.00 for a period of May 1, 2017 - December 31, 2017.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families is the Federal program established under the Personal Responsibility and Work Responsibility Reconciliation Act of 1996 that provides income support to eligible families, within the broader context of a comprehensive service delivery system that moves families from dependency to economic self-sufficiency. Safety Net refers to former TANF recipients who have reached the 60-month TANF eligibility limit. Recipients of TANF and Safety Net Assistance benefits are required to adopt an Individual Employment Plan and maintain adherence to this Plan in order to remain eligible for said benefits.

The Fown's role as a vendor to the County through this Agreement would be to accept a caseload of approximately 200 TANF and Safety Net Assistance recipients and work with them in the development of and adherence to their Individual Employment Plans. More specifically, the Town's Department of Intergovernmental Affairs, Division of Employment and Training (DET) would conduct individual assessments with TANF and Safety Net Assistance recipients. develop Indvidual Employment Plans, provide job search assistance, make referral to supportive services and arrange for the recipients participation in activities required to maintain TANF and Safety Net Assistance eligibility. The DET would also be responsible for tracking activities participated in by recipients and reporting results to the County in order for the County to determine continued eligibility of these recipients TANF and Safety Net benefits.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Town Board authorize the Town to enter into an Agreement to be negotiated and approved by the Town Attorney and further authorize the Supervisor to execute said Agreement. The authorizing Resolution must contain the following language:

RESOLVED: That Joseph S. Saladino, Town Supervisor of the Town of Oyster Bay, is hereby authorized to execute a contract agreement on behalf of this corporation for purposes of entering into a contract with the Nassau County Department of Social Services for the period of May 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017

It is further requested that the Office of the Comptroller be authorized to create a revenue and an expense account for the purpose of administering the services as detailed through the Agreement.


