The season shall begin on Monday, Apr 16, 2018 and end on Sunday, Nov 11, 2018.

- 1. All boat and boating equipment docked, berthed, located or left at Town Facilities are left at the sole risk of the owner of said boats and equipment and permission to so dock, berth, locate or leave such property is conditioned upon the owner's acceptance of said risk. All boat and boat equipment owners are reminded to obtain adequate insurance before making use of Town facilities.
- 2. The licensee expressly assumes all risk of loss due to damages, theft, vandalism, or accident to his/her property while berthed in the marina and expressly releases the Town of Oyster Bay, its agents, officers, and employees from any and all claims whatsoever for loss, damage, fire, theft, or accident to his/her property.
- 3. The security that is provided at the marinas is for the protection of Town property. The Town does not assume responsibility for damage done to vessels docked at Town marinas.
- 4. Upon assignment of boat slip, which is for the exclusive use of the licensee, said boat slip SHALL NOT be transferable to another person or to another vessel.
- 5. Once a vessel is assigned a slip in a category, only that vessel may occupy said slip. The only change in slip assignment permitted will be those that involve slips in the applicant's authorized category size. The change in slip assignment will only be made through the Beach Division
- 6. A tenant who wishes to place a different vessel in his/her assigned slip will be permitted to do so only under the following conditions:
 - a. The vessel's overall length must fall within the original category size (for example in the 26-31 foot category, the different vessel cannot be less than 26 feet or more than 31 feet in overall length).
 - b. The tenant has ownership of the new vessel and he/she remains the primary owner.
- 7. A tenant may not:
 - a. Own or be co-owner of more than one vessel which occupies a slip in either north shore marina.b. Trade up or down in vessel size that takes him/her out of his/her category size

 - Transfer ownership to other persons (full or part) and maintain current slip space
- 8. All deadlines for receipt of various documents, required deposits, and final payment must be met. No extensions will be granted.



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

1) "That the use of the premises is restricted to retail and office use." 

Moran v. Town of Oyster Bay, et al.

In October, 2017, James Moran, a pro se plaintiff, served a Summons with Notice upon the Town and several current and former Town officials and employees. Thereafter, Plaintiff served a Verified Complaint upon the same parties, which alleged two causes of action for (i) breach of contract and (ii) malicious prosecution.

By way of background, Plaintiff was charged and convicted - following trial - of violations of several Town ordinances relating to, among other things, the maintenance and repair of his home. Plaintiff took an appeal from that conviction, which appeal remains undecided. Notwithstanding his conviction, Plaintiff commenced the subject civil action. This Office interposed an answer to the Verified Complaint, but following joinder of issue, certain conflicts of interest arose that now prevent this Office from defending the case.

Consequently, this Office released a Request for Proposals ("RFP") on July 11, 2018, which sought proposals from qualified law firms to serve as litigation counsel to (i) the Town and (ii) the individually named defendants. The RFP was sent by direct mail to five (5) firms that this Office reasonably believed to have the requisite experience necessary to defend against the action and the RFP was additionally posted to the Town of Oyster Bay website. In response, four (4) proposals were received prior to the deadline for submissions.

A careful review of each of the four proposals was conducted by members of this Office, with a view towards the criteria set forth in the Town of Oyster Bay Procurement Policy and in the RFP. Following such review, which was conducted in compliance with Guideline 9 of the Procurement Policy, this Office recommends that the following firms be retained to provide litigation counsel to the parties:

Baumgarten v. Town of Brookhaven

This action stemmed from the execution of a search warrant for the plaintiff's home and the alleged application for an arrest warrant for the plaintiff. Plaintiff, pro se, filed suit against both the Town and the County, as well as a former Assistant Town Attorney. Plaintiff claimed that the Assistant Town Attorney filed a false request for a warrant and another false document, which led to plaintiff's arrest by the Suffolk County Police.

We made a motion to dismiss, which was granted in its entirety. Plaintiff filed a Notice of Appeal; the appeal was denied by the Second Circuit.

Ferreira v. Town of East Hampton et al

This federal action stemmed from plaintiff's disagreement with code enforcement activities which occurred at his Montauk property. Plaintiff was issued numerous violations by the Town, which went substantially unaddressed; as such, two separate Board authorized clean up initiatives were performed, with the costs of such efforts being added to plaintiff's tax bill. Plaintiff made various claims against the Town and its employees and Board members, including violation of his Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Fourteenth Amendment rights.

We represented all but one of the individual defendants, who consisted of board members, code enforcement officials, Town attorneys and a police officer. At the conclusion of discovery, we moved for summary judgment on the basis of absolute and/or qualified immunity; the motion was granted, and our clients were dismissed from the case before trial.

Raus v. Town of Southampton et al

We successfully defended the Town and a number of Town officials in connection with this federal complaint filed by Karen Raus, a homeowner in the Town who claimed her constitutional rights were violated by the Town and the various individually-named Town officials in connection with code enforcement activities. Plaintiff claimed that all of the code enforcement activities and the subsequent violations she received were fabricated and were intended to drive people of limited means out of the community.

The complaint contained claims under the 1st amendment (free speech/association) and 14th amendment (equal protection and due process), as well as claims for malicious/unlawful abuse of process, conspiracy, infliction of emotional distress, harassment and pain and suffering. We were successful in having the case dismissed by motion. Plaintiff appealed, appearing *pro se* for purposes of the appeal; the Second Circuit upheld the findings of the District Court.



Arroyo v. Central Islip Union Free School District

Plaintiff filed this action against the District alleging breach of contract in connection with the denial of long term disability benefits to plaintiff, an employee of the District. We filed a pre answer motion to dismiss, which was granted in its entirety.

Hartman v. Central Islip Union Free School District

Plaintiff sued the District and a number of other entities claiming breach of contract in connection with payment of union dues. We succeeded in obtaining dismissal of all by one claim via a pre-answer motion to dismiss; the remaining claim against the District was subsequently voluntarily dismissed.

Cooper v. Town of Southampton Cooks v. Town of Southampton Opoku v. Town of Southampton Proctor v. Town of Southampton

We successfully defended the Town of Southampton and various officers associated with the Town of Southampton in these separate actions alleging false arrest, malicious prosecution and other civil rights violation stemming from plaintiffs' arrests by the Town of Southampton Street Crimes Unit. Plaintiffs were among a group of criminal defendants who had their convictions overturned when issues came to light about one of the officers in the Street Crimes/Narcotics Unit having a prescription drug dependency. This office successfully prevented disclosure of documents regarding after the fact investigations of the SCU and was successful in having the cases dismissed by pre-trial motions (Cooper, Opoku and Procotr) and a directed verdict in the case of Cooks.

Leykam v. Southold Park District

The firm was successful in dismissing Plaintiff's Complaint against the Southold Park District on a pre-discovery motion for summary judgment on the issue of ownership, maintenance and control. Plaintiff had fallen on a set of stairs leading down to a beach on the Long Island Sound and sustained a torn quadriceps muscle which required surgery.

Perricone-Bernovich v. Village of Head of the Harbor

We successfully defended the Village of Head of the Harbor before the State Division of Human Rights, the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the Department of Justice in connection with a claim that the Village's denial of a variance constituted disability discrimination. None of the three agencies found any evidence of discrimination by the Village.

Rosado v. Town of Southold

We successfully intervened in an action by the state in suing the federal government over the EPA's permanent designation of a new dumping site in the Long Island Sound close to Fishers Island for contaminated dredge, mostly from river bottoms in Connecticut.

Lake v. Town of Southold

We successfully defended the Town in a C.P.L.R. Article 78 proceeding challenging the dismissal of a probationary police officer by the Southold Police Department.

Egan v. Village of Sag Harbor

We successfully defended the Village against a C.P.L.R. Article 78 zoning challenge.

Zabar v. Village of Saltaire

We successfully defended the Village before the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the Department of Justice against the allegation of discriminatory zoning practices. The Village ZBA had denied petitioner's request to expand her home to permit her to put into a downstairs bedroom and bathroom, which she alleged was necessary because of her disability; there was no finding of any discriminatory animus by the Village.

Morreale v. Town of Smithtown

We obtained summary judgment for the Town based on lack of prior written notice where plaintiff slipped and fell on ice in a Town park. The decision was affirmed on appeal by the Second Department.

Ranco Sand and Stone v. Vecchio et al

Property owner brought C.P.L.R. Article 78 proceeding against town board, seeking review of board's resolution issuing a positive declaration under State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) that required owner to prepare a draft environmental impact statement (DEIS) in connection with its application to rezone its property from residential to heavy industrial. We successfully moved to dismiss the petition on the grounds that the board's decision was not ripe for judicial review. The decision was affirmed by the Court of Appeals of the State of New York. Ranco Sand & Stone Corp. v. Vecchio, 27 N.Y.3d 92, 49 N.E.3d 1165 (2016).

Williams v. Town of Smithtown et al

The Town established its prima facie entitlement to judgment as a matter of law by demonstrating that it did not have prior written notice of the defect, and that it did not create the alleged defect through an affirmative act of negligence.

Town of Hempstead v. Hempstead Zoning Board of Appeals

We successfully defended the Hempstead Zoning Board of Appeals, which, after a hearing, granted Scotty's Marina, Inc., a special permit to use a deck above a waterway for the outdoor consumption of food. The Town appealed from a judgment of the Supreme Court, Nassau County, which denied the petition and dismissed the proceeding. The decision was affirmed on appeal; the Second Department noted that a determination of a zoning board should be sustained if it is not illegal, has a rational basis, and is not arbitrary and capricious, and here, the Board's determination was not illegal, had a rational basis, and was not arbitrary and capricious. Furthermore, the Board's finding that the proposed use of the deck would not have any meaningfully negative consequences on the surrounding properties and the adjacent

neighborhood was supported by the record; as such, the Board's determination constituted a permissible exercise of its jurisdictional authority.

Paul v. Town of Southampton

We secured summary judgment in favor of the Town on plaintiff's Labor Law §§ 240(1) and 241(6) claims; a property owner who does not contract for the work being performed at the time of the plaintiff's accident cannot be held liable under the Labor Law absent some nexus between the owner and the worker or the work being performed.

Semprini v. Village of Southampton

We successfully defended the Village in connection with plaintiff's attempt to amend her notice of claim to assert a new theory of liability. The Supreme Court denied plaintiff's motion, which was upheld on appeal. General Municipal Law § 50–e(6) allows good-faith, nonprejudicial technical changes, but not substantive changes in the theory of liability.

Flynn v. Town of Southampton

We obtained summary judgment on behalf of the Town in this wrongful death action arising from plaintiff's claim that the Town negligently operated its 911 emergency call system and was negligent in failing to come to the decedent's aid after he placed largely incoherent 911 calls. The Court agreed with our contention that a special relationship did not exist between the Town and the decedent.

Trials:

This firm has also obtained defense verdicts on behalf of municipalities in both state and federal court in numerous cases. Some of our recent successes include Glowcenzki v. Village of Southampton et al, a federal action involving a death wherein which the firm successfully obtained a defendant's verdict on six of seven causes of action on behalf of three Village Police Officers and the Village. The plaintiff's surviving family members alleged that the Police Officers used excessive force, failed to intervene to protect the plaintiff and assaulted and battered the decedent. The plaintiff also alleged that the Village failed to properly train the Officers in the proper techniques for interacting with emotionally disturbed people. After a two week trial, the jury returned a verdict in favor of the Police Officers and Village on six of the seven causes of action. Despite their finding of liability on the one cause of action, the jury did not award any monetary, compensatory or punitive damages.

In Bucalo v. Town of Southampton, the female plaintiff alleged that a Town Police Officer used excessive force, assaulted and battered her during a routine traffic stop. At the conclusion of discovery, we filed a motion for partial summary judgment which resulted in the dismissal or discontinuance of all claims for false arrest and imprisonment, for Monell liability against the Town and the SHTPD, and for common law negligence. The lone remaining claim for excessive force was tried before a jury; after a week-long trial, we successfully obtained a defendant's verdict in Federal Court on behalf of the Town and the individual police officer.

In Maidstone v. the Town of East Hampton, this office obtained a directed verdict at the time of trial on behalf of the Town of East Hampton and several Town officials. The plaining contended that their Procedural Due Process rights were violated by the Town by virtue of the

Town's Code inspections of their property within the Town. As a result of the inspections, numerous Town Code violations were observed by inspectors. Plaintiffs were given the opportunity to remedy the violations and were required to appear in Court to answer the charges. The court proceedings resulted in a guilty plea and the payment of a fine by the plaintiffs. The Court found that plaintiffs were not deprived of any process; they were afforded both notice of the charges brought against them and an opportunity to challenge those charges, and moreover, they pled guilty to those charges.

Ongoing Litigation:

Mazzone v. Town of Southampton

This is a federal action premised upon allegations of violations of the Equal Protection and Due Process Clauses, and the 1st, 4th and 5th Amendments; plaintiff alleges that the Town and its employees/officials charged plaintiff with numerous violations and misdemeanors in the Town and other Justice Courts. John Shields of our office served as special prosecutor for the Town in Justice Court with respect to the code violations, and plaintiff was convicted of nine separate charges.

We received the complaint and responded by filing a pre-answer motion to dismiss. Magistrate Lindsay issued a report and recommendation that our motion to dismiss be granted, which was upheld by the District Judge. Plaintiff was given leave to re-plead, and an amended complaint was served. We filed a motion to dismiss the amended complaint, which was fully briefed and orally argued. We are cautiously optimistic that the amended complaint will be dismissed as well.

Affordable Housing/Beacon Wireless v. Town of Brookhaven et al

In this case, we are representing the Town of Brookhaven in a contract dispute involving construction of cell phone towers. The Town initially entered into a contract with the plaintiff, to have plaintiff assess various Town-owned properties as potential sites for placement of cell phone towers; once they found sites, they were free to submit applications for construction at those sites. Once towers were constructed, the contract provided for rental income (paid by wireless providers) to be divided between the developer and the Town on a specified basis.

Plaintiffs identified certain sites and built towers; however, the litigation arose when the Town also began contracting with another developer (co-defendant Mid Atlantic). The litigation involves interpretation of the terms of the contract and most notably, whether the contract provided plaintiffs with an exclusive right to construct towers in the Town. We filed a motion for summary judgment, which was successful in dismissing some, but not all, of plaintiff's claims. The summary judgment decision was upheld on appeal. A trial is scheduled to commence in November 2018.

Norton v. Town of Brookhaven

Plaintiff Jerome Norton brought this complaint against the Town of Brookhaven and its employees claiming violation of his First Amendment right to intimate association, his First Amendment right to petition the government, his right to substantive due process, his rights to

equal protection, his procedural due process rights, his Fourth Amendment right to be free from unconstitutional search and seizure and Monell claims, in addition to a state law malicious prosecution claim. He also sought a declaratory judgment and injunctive relief under 28 U.S.C. §2201. Norton and his brothers own residential property in the Town, which they rented without a valid permit. They were cited for this and other code violations; notices of violation were issued, but went unaddressed. Plaintiff was advised that a compliance inspection would be held and if violations still existed, appearance ticket(s) would issue. He responded by letter, objecting to the inspector's authority and objecting to the Town Rental Code as being invalid and unconstitutional. Eventually, plaintiff was issued fourteen appearance tickets to appear in District Court; he likewise failed to appear in Court, even when threatened with arrest. He was given notice both to correct the code deficiencies and to appear in court. Norton's counsel communicated with the court about legal insufficiencies, yet never entered a formal appearance or a plea. Notwithstanding this blatant disregard of instructions, Norton never appeared a day in court, was never arrested, and all of the accusatory instruments were dismissed.

This federal lawsuit ensued. A pre-answer motion to dismiss the complaint, was granted in part and denied in part. A non-monetary partial settlement was negotiated between the Town defendants and Norton. Thereafter, plaintiff filed a third Amended Complaint. We are vigorously representing the Town and the various Town officials named in the case.

III. RFP Requirements for Legal Services





Dear Mr. Crispi:

Confirming our several telephone conferences regarding the above-referenced matter, this letter, when countersigned by you shall serve as the agreement between the Town and the Seritage entities for the use of designated areas behind (east) the former Sears Auto Center, as well as the area north and south of the Center totaling approximately 1,200 spaces to the Town for temporary commuter parking for Town residents with valid parking permits. This use will be through December 31, 2018 and may be extended for additional periods of time upon your approval. The approved parking areas will be delineated by barricades in the early morning on Mondays through Fridays only, from 5 a.m to 9 p.m. The Town will make every effort to ensure that commuters park only in the designated areas.

Pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law §6-n, effective January 1, 1987, the Town of Oyster Bay is partially self-insured with respect to its comprehensive general liability. The Town will provide Commercial General Liability insurance in an amount up to One Million (\$1,000,000) Dollars combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence. Once the Town's self-insured retention is reached, the Town's two excess policies provide Commercial General Liability insurance in (1) an amount up to One Million

(\$1,000,000) Dollars combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence; and (2) an amount up to Nine Million (\$9,000,000) Dollars combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence.

The Town of Oyster Bay shall indemnify and save Seritage Growth Properties, Seritage SRC Finance, LLC, Sears, and Sears Auto Center, and their respective members, owners, directors, officers and employees ("The Indemnitees") harmless from and against (a) except to the extent the same are due to the negligence or willful misconduct of an Indemnitee, all claims of whatever nature against the Indemnitees arising from any act, omission or negligence of the Town of Oyster bay, its contractors, licensees, agents, servants, employees, invitees or visitors, (b) except to the extent the same are due to the negligence or willful misconduct of any Indemnitee, all claims against the Indemnitees arising from any accident, injury or damage whatsoever caused to any person or to the property of any person and occurring during the temporary closing of the Hicksville Parking Garage, due to structural issues, in or about the area as previously agreed to and described in a document provided to the Town, through December 31, 2018. This indemnity and hold harmless agreement shall include indemnity from and against any and all liability, fines, suits, demands, costs and expenses of any kind or nature (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees and disbursements) incurred in or in connection with any such claim or proceeding brought thereon, and the defense thereof.



The Town's commuter parking structure located on Duffy Avenue in Hicksville will be undergoing repairs for approximately 90 days, during which time commuters will not be able to use the facility. In order to alleviate the effect of the closure of the parking facility, Seritage Growth Properties, 500 Fifth Avenue, Suite 1530, New York, NY 10110 ("Seritage Growth") has offered the use of a portion of the parking lot at 195 North Broadway, Hicksville, NY 11801, for temporary commuter parking.

Seritage Growth will make space available behind the former Sears Auto Center as well as the area north and south of the former Sears Auto Center (the "Licensed Area"). These areas will allow for 1,200 parking spaces for temporary commuter parking for Town residents with valid parking permits. Seritage Growth will make the Licensed Area available for an initial period through December 31, 2018, with the ability to extend the license if necessary. While the Town will not pay Seritage Growth for the use of the parking lot, the Town will be responsible for maintaining, cleaning, and lighting the Licensed Area Mondays through Fridays between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 p.m. In addition, the Town's Department of Public Safety will also monitor the Licensed Area during those hours. It is expected that starting on August 24, 2018, buses will be used to shuttle commuters to and from the Hicksville train station between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 a.m., and again from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.

After reviewing the committee's preliminary recommendation and based on compliance with Guideline 6 and 9 of the Town's Procurement Policy, it is recommended that the following firm be selected, Jan Hird Pokorny Associates, Inc. (JHPA).

Services of the Consultant are to be provided as needed in a total amount not to exceed \$20,000.00. Funds are available to satisfy these planning services in Account No. PAD B 8020 44800 000 0000.

Further, the office of, Jan Hird Pokorny Associates, Inc. (JHPA) requests to use as a sub-consultant, Old Structures Engineering, PC (OSE). For the purpose of this project Old Structures Engineering, PC (OSE) will provide services related to the structural assessment of buildings.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Town Board authorize by Resolution, Jan Hird Pokorny Associates, Inc. AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES by and between JAN HIRD POKORNY ASSOCIATES, INC.

and

THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY, NASSAU COUNTY, NEW YORK

This is an Agreement for Jan Hird Pokorny Associates, Inc. (JHPA) with sub-consultant Old Structures Engineering, PC (OSE), to provide Planning Consultant Services on behalf of the Town of Oyster Bay, Nassau County, New York.

The Term of this Agreement shall begin on August 15, 2018 and continue through December 31, 2018 with two (2) one (1) year extensions upon the mutual consent of the Town of Oyster Bay and JHPA.

Scope of Services:

Planning Consultant Services related to providing the Landmarks Preservation Commission with technical assistance in regards to performing structural assessments of historical and landmark buildings within the Town of Oyster Bay shall be provided by JHPA. Specifically, JHPA will provide services described in the Proposal for Professional Services dated May 29, 2018. Specific tasks for this assignment include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provide technical assistance directly to the Commissioner and/or Deputy Commissioner of the Department on behalf of the Landmarks Preservation Commission, and undertake all technical support tasks for this assignment, including those outlined below, at the specific direction of the Commissioner and/or Deputy Commissioner or his/her designee.
- 2. Perform visual and detailed inspections, with representatives of this Department, of historical and landmark buildings within the Town of Oyster Bay and provide comprehensive comments and reports as it pertains to the structural integrity and historic value/significance of the subject buildings.
- 3. Have the ability to research Nassau County property records and review building, property, and landmark records maintained by this Department and integrate this information with the above mentioned reports.
- 4. Interact with other Town Departments and other municipal agencies involved in historical and landmark buildings within the Town of Oyster Bay. Other municipal agencies include, but are not limited to: the Town Attorney's Office; the Town's Historian, the local and community Historical Societies, etc.
- 5. Provide expert testimony on behalf of this Department and the Landmarks Preservation Commission at hearings, court proceedings and other public meetings, as needed, regarding specific reports drafted and submitted on behalf of the Town of Oyster Bay pertaining to structural adequacy and historical values/significance of historical and landmark buildings within the Town of Oyster Bay.

Qualifications:

JHPA and OSE represent that they have a deep rooted knowledge of historic construction methods, building typologies as well as an understanding of building preservation, maintenance issues, and material performance. This knowledge and understanding will ensure the team can adequately provide any assistance to the Landmark's Commission technical staff that will be required. We have outlined below our approach to tasks we anticipate providing as part of the contract services.

Prior to the commencement of any work, the team participants will meet with key personnel within the Town of Oyster Bay to review the existing Landmark inventory, Town protocol and procedures, Town code and zoning requirements, and develop a program for communication between agencies and outside preservation groups. This familiarization phase will allow all the team members to develop an understanding of the operational procedures and requirements while establishing critical relationships with the representatives from Oyster Bay.

The team will also establish meeting/communications standards to be used for the duration of the contract to ensure good communication practices and free transfer of information between Oyster Bay and the JHPA team.

Independent of general coordination with Oyster Bay, the team will also provide critical assistance to the Landmarks Commission related to the inventory of historic and Landmarked structures. These tasks include Building Assessments (with support tasks of Research/Documentation, Inspections, and Reporting), Agency Coordination, and Expert Testimony.

Building Assessments:

Research/Documentation:

We envision the key role to our services as performing conditions assessments of historic resources. This type of assessments are commonplace for our team, as we have completed over sixty in the past five years alone.

Inspection:

The inspection process will commence with a review of historical documents to confirm significance and original detailing. Team members will research local repositories, the state archives, contact local historical societies, and any other appropriate venues for relevant historical data.

Report of Findings:

Research and documentation will be followed with a detailed visual (with select removals if required) inspection of the structure to review historic integrity and building evolution as well as assessing the current salient conditions of the building structure and finishes.

The team will compile the materials gathered during the initial documentation phase with the findings of the visual assessment and any relevant field sketches into an annotated report for the Commission's use.

Agency Coordination:

Another critical component of the proposed services is inter-agency coordination. The team has long-standing experience working on projects where multiple tiers of municipal agencies were involved, or where municipal work required coordination with local historical and preservation groups.

We are prepared to collaborate where necessary with the Town Planning Board, Town Attorney's Office, Building Department, Zoning Office, and Purchasing agent(s) to provide assistance to the Commission. We are also prepared to collaborate with the NYS OPRHP as well as the Nassau County offices. Working with historic resources collaborative efforts are also essential with local historical societies, Preservation Long Island (former SPLIA) and the Town Historian.

Expert Testimony:

Key team members have extensive experience providing peer review, expert testimony for court cases, lawsuits, or on behalf of preservation efforts. The combined experience of the participants ensures we can provide thoughtful and appropriate testimony on behalf of the commission.

Team members will participate individually or combined (JHPA and OSE) to provide expert testimony related to historic significance, historic integrity, building/structural integrity, and building condition. The testimony will be provided for any exiting historical or landmarked structure in addition to any structures landmarked during the term of the contract.

Compensation:

The consulting fees charged by JHPA will be based upon time expended in completing services with a maximum billing rate of \$300 and with a total contract amount of \$20,000.







It was a pleasure meeting with you and the others to discuss the above referenced project at the Tobay Beach Marina. As discussed during our meeting and subsequent site inspection, the intent of the Town is to receive a report outlining the existing conditions of the marina, reconstruction alternatives, and associated cost estimates.

We have prepared the following scope of work and fee schedule for your consideration:

SCOPE OF WORK

- Prepare schematic base maps of the bulkhead and marina area.
- Utilizing a Certified Professional Diver, we will evaluate the underwater conditions of the bulkhead.
- Utilizing a N.Y.S. Licensed Surveyor we will provide a full bathometric survey employing state of the art survey drone in the area encompassing the bulkhead facility (approximately 250' x 1,000'). 




