On October 28, 2016 the Department of Environmental Resources issued a Request for Proposals (Solicitation # 01-2017) for the purpose of securing the services of a professional to assist the Animal Shelter with its 2017 Canine Assessment and Evaluation Program. A legal notice was posted in Newsday on October 28, 2016 announcing the availability of the detailed specifications and proposal sheets from the office of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Resources.

By the response date of November 10, 2016, we had only received one proposal. This proposal is from Canine Commander, LLC.

Canine Commander, LLC is known to this department as they have provided such services to us since 2010 and have proven themselves to be dependable and effective.

The Office of the Town Attorney has reviewed the circumstances regarding the solicitation and the receipt of this proposal and has determined that we made an adequate attempt to obtain the required number of proposals and are in compliance with Guideline 7 of the Town's procurement policy.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Town Board authorize the Town to enter into an agreement nunc pro tunc as negotiated and approved by Office of the Town Attorney and further authorize the Supervisor and/or his designee to execute said agreement with Canine Commander, LLC for a one year term commencing on January 1, 2017 and running through and including December 31, 2017 at a rate not to exceed \$25,000.00 per year. Funds are available in account DER A 3510 44900 000 0000 (Other Contract). Under its terms, this agreement may be extended at the same rate, upon mutual agreement, for up to four (4) additional one (1) year periods.

The TOWN OF OYSTER BAY, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having its principal office at TOWN Hall, Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, New York 11771, ("TOWN"), acting for and on behalf of the ANIMAL SHELTER DIVISION OF THE TOWN'S DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES ("ANIMAL SHELTER");

CANINE COMMANDER, LLC, a New York corporation, having its principal place of business at 62 Farmers Avenue, Bethpage, New York 11714 ("TRAINER")

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the general intent and purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the behavioral evaluation and training of the TOWN's canine population; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2016, the TOWN issued a Request for Proposals, Solicitation No. 01-2017 (hereinafter referred to as the "RFP"), which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2016, TRAINER submitted a response to this RFP ("Response"), which response has been deemed by the TOWN'S review committee as qualified, and which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2016, the TOWN's Department of Environmental Resources reviewed TRAINER's response to the RFP, which was the only one received; and determined that the response by TRAINER met the requirements of the RFP and contained reasonable overall prices and recommended that the TOWN Board award the contract to TRAINER; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board deems it in the best interest of the TOWN to enter into an agreement with the TRAINER,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as

follows:

1. TERM:

a. This agreement shall commence on January 1, 2017 and shall run through December 31, 2017, unless otherwise extended or terminated pursuant to the terms of this agreement. This agreement shall be subject to four (4) one (1) year extension options. This Agreement may be cancelled at any time by either party giving to the other not less than forty-five (45) days' written notice.

b. The TOWN may elect to terminate this agreement with cause upon 10 days prior written notice to TRAINER.

2. CONTRACT RATES:

This Agreement is a requirements contract subject to the rate schedule provided by TRAINER in his response to the RFP dated October 28, 2016. Said rate is \$55.00 per hour and shall not exceed Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars per calendar year.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The Scope of Services shall be in accordance with those set forth in the RFP dated October 28, 2016.

4. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

TRAINER agrees that it is, and shall at all times be deemed to be, an independent contractor and it shall not, in any manner whatsoever, by its actions or deeds, commit TOWN to any obligation irrespective of the nature thereof, and it shall not, at any time or for any purpose, be deemed an employee of the TOWN. It is further understood and agreed that no agent, servant or employee of TRAINER shall, at any time, or under any circumstances, be deemed to be an

agent, servant or employee of TOWN.

5. FORMAT FOR PAYMENTS AND CLAIMS:

The TOWN shall pay TRAINER the fees specified under Contract Rates above upon submission of monthly claim forms provided by the TOWN Comptroller.

6. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

TRAINER shall provide an embassion page indicating the Town as an additional insured.

- e. TRAINER agrees to provide the required Certificate of Insurance prior to commencement of SERVICES.
- f. Disability Benefits Liability Insurance with coverage of at least the statutory minimum.

7. DEFAULT:

If either party hereto shall default in its performance of any term, covenant or condition of this Agreement for twenty days after notice, or where such default cannot reasonably be cured within said twenty days, if the defaulting party does not promptly after receiving note of the default commence to cure such default and thereafter proceed with diligence uch default; then the other party may terminate this Agreement within thirty (30) da notice the other.

8. INDEMNIFICATION:

Each Party shall indemnify and hold the other harmless against any claim of liability or loss from personal injury or property damage resulting from or arising out of the negligence or willful misconduct of the indemnifying Party, its employees, contractors or agents, except to the extent such claims or damages may be due to or caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the other Party, or its employees, contractors or agents.

9. NOTICES:

Any notices, demands and other communications required or desired to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed properly given if sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the party to which same is to be given at its address first above written.

10. MODIFICATION:

This Agreement may not be orally canceled, changed, modified or amended, and no cancellation, change, modification or amendment shall be effective or binding, unless in writing and signed by both of the parties to this Agreement.

11. WAIVER:

No waiver of any of the provisions hereof shall be effective unless in writing and signed by the party to be charged with such waiver. No waiver shall be deemed a continuing waiver or waiver in respect of any subsequent breach or default, whether of similar or different nature, unless expressly so stated in writing.

12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This Agreement, including all other documents referred to herein which form a part hereof, cont in the understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter contained herein and therein. This agreement supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between or among the parties with respect to such subject matter.

13. ASSIGNABILITY:

The provisions of this Agreement shall extend to, bind and inure to the benefit of each of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and permitted assigns, if any. In no event shall this Agreement be assignable by the Employee.

14. APPLICABLE LAW:

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. The captions in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not to be considered in construing this Agreement. If any provisions of this Agreement are invalid or unenforceable in any respect, the validity and enforceability of the remainder of this Agreement shall not in any way be affected.

15. MISCELLANEOUS:

All oral or written statements, representations, promises, understandings and agreements of the parties hereto are superseded by and merged into this Agreement, which alone fully and completely expresses their agreement. This Agreement contains all of the terms agreed upon between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.




