1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay, ladies and  
2 gentlemen, we began this meeting this morning --  
3 obviously, it's Tuesday, October 18, 2022 -- our  
4 7:00 p.m. second half of our Town Board meeting and  
5 Budget Hearing.

6 We began our meeting with the Pledge of  
7 Allegiance and prayer and a moment of silence,  
8 there's no need to do that because this is not a  
9 new meeting, it is a continuation of the same  
10 meeting.

11 With that, may I have a motion to  
12 continue our hearing from this morning?

13 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Supervisor, I'll  
14 make a motion that this hearing be continued.

15 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Second.

16 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All in favor,  
17 please signify by saying, "Aye."

18 ALL: "Aye."

19 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All opposed,  
20 "Nay."

21 (Whereupon, there were no "Nay"  
22 responses from the Board.)

23 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: The "Ayes" have  
24 it.

25 (TIME NOTED: 7:08 P.M.)

1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And with that, I  
2 officially gavel in.

3 Okay. We are going to take a Public  
4 Comment out of order so they don't have to stay for  
5 the whole lengthy hearing that we will be having  
6 this evening, and with that, I call to the podium,  
7 please, Michael O'Connell.

8 (Whereupon, Supervisor Saladino entered  
9 into Public Comment Session beginning at 7:08 p.m.  
10 and the proceedings resuming at 7:11 p.m. as  
11 follows:)

12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: So, folks, this  
13 is a continuation of our Budget Hearing from this  
14 morning.

15 I do want to point out, especially for  
16 those who may be watching online, that this -- even  
17 though our Nation is experiencing the highest  
18 inflation rate in at least 40 years, we, in the  
19 Town of Oyster Bay, have been able to provide the  
20 fifth consecutive budget with no tax increase.

21 This is a no tax increase budget. We  
22 collect the same amount that we have collected  
23 every year, except in 2018 when we cut taxes and  
24 collected \$1.3 million less from our residents.

1                   We continue to sustain that and provide  
2                   all the increasing services for the same amount,  
3                   and that means \$7.8 million are back in the pockets  
4                   of our taxpayers, and that's a big, big deal. We  
5                   get it.

6                   When we started in 2017 and this  
7                   administration took over, it was a \$44 million  
8                   deficit. As of the close of 2021, a \$62.2 million  
9                   surplus, again, while cutting taxes.

10                  In January of 2017, there were five  
11                  funds within our overall budget that were negative.  
12                  Now, all funds are balanced. Every single one of  
13                  them.

14                  The total Town debt back in January of  
15                  2017 was \$763 million. Now, we have it down to  
16                  \$576 million, and we continue to shave off that  
17                  debt -- net -- while still borrowing at a much  
18                  lower rate because our bond rating keeps going up  
19                  to pave the roads and take care of all our  
20                  responsibilities in taking care of the Town.

21                  The annual debt service used to be  
22                  \$92 million in 2017. Now, it's \$78 million. The  
23                  annual new debt issuance used to be over \$100  
24                  million a year. Now, we have it down to \$55  
25                  million or less.

1 Standard & Poor's gave -- we had a junk  
2 bond status in 2017. Now, today, we have an A+  
3 positive outlook with six budget notches up from  
4 there.

5 We have so -- and Moody's also has  
6 recognized the big positive changes we've made in  
7 the Town, and now Moody's gives us A1 stable  
8 outlook with five notches upgrade, and we're only  
9 four notches away from a perfect AAA bond rating,  
10 and this Town Board will get there. You can be  
11 sure of that.

12 In January 2017, the New York State  
13 Comptroller had the Town of Oyster Bay labeled in  
14 significant stress. Now, we're entirely off the  
15 stress monitoring list. Not just lessened our  
16 stress, but no longer are on that list.

17 We collected \$234 million in property  
18 taxes in 2017, and as of today, \$233 million  
19 annually. We cut that down.

20 The Town -- before we got here -- used  
21 to borrow \$32 million annually for cash flow  
22 borrowing. Now, Zero. We stopped that process all  
23 together, and we continue to go through this very,  
24 very good news.

25 So with that, I am going to ask --

1 MR. LaMARCA: Supervisor, may I just  
2 point out, please, that Councilman Imbroto has  
3 joined us for the hearing tonight.

4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And he wasn't  
5 with us --

6 MR. LaMARCA: He wasn't with us this  
7 morning.

8 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: May we, for  
9 procedural purposes, take attendance, once again,  
10 for this night -- second half of our Hearing, and  
11 if the Town Clerk would please take attendance.

12 MR. LaMARCA: Supervisor Saladino?

13 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Present.

14 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Johnson?

15 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Present.

16 MR. LaMARCA: Councilman Imbroto?

17 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Present.

18 Thank you for pointing that out.

19 MR. LaMARCA: Councilman Hand?

20 You're welcome.

21 COUNCILMAN HAND: Present.

22 MR. LaMARCA: Councilman Labriola?

23 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Present.

24 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Maier?

25 COUNCILWOMAN MAIER: Present.

1 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Walsh is not  
2 here yet, but she is on her way.

3 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Wonderful.

4 Thank you very much, Town Clerk.

5 So we've gone down just some of the  
6 tremendous improvements. We went through this all  
7 earlier today.

8 And with that, I'm going to ask our  
9 Director of Finance, Rob Darienzo, to step forward.

10 Mr. Darienzo, we have no residents here  
11 for our meeting -- at least physically here -- in  
12 the Town Board room, so we're going to do this in  
13 an abbreviated fashion, and, obviously, if a  
14 resident does show up and wants to speak, we're  
15 happy to entertain their comments, but I do want to  
16 point out, for the record, there is no resident  
17 here, and that's why we're doing this in  
18 abbreviated fashion.

19 We, actually, do have one resident, and  
20 that's Mike Polanski (phonetic), no disrespect.

21 Mike, are you here to make comments or  
22 just to observe?

23 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Just observe.

24 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just observing.

25 Okay. So pointing that out, rather

1 than go through the whole litany of all that we've  
2 accomplished over these years, we, the Town Board,  
3 would like to thank you, as our Finance Director,  
4 for a multiple of aspects including doing an  
5 incredible job getting the Town out of its darkest  
6 days and putting us in a position as one of the  
7 fiscally strongest municipalities in the State of  
8 New York.

9 Do you concur with all of the factual  
10 information that I just presented?

11 MR. DARIENZO: I certainly concur. I  
12 put it together for you.

13 (Whereupon, there was laughter among  
14 the assemblage.)

15 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: You put together  
16 this budget, and, therefore, you concur that  
17 everything that I mentioned is a fact, and we've  
18 come a very long way.

19 Would you like to summarize where we  
20 are -- not long -- but summarize where we are from  
21 a fiscal standpoint?

22 (Whereupon, Councilwoman Walsh arrived  
23 at the hearing.)

24 MR. DARIENZO: We are -- I've been with  
25 the Town for 25 years, and we're in a better spot



1 financially now than we've ever been in during my  
2 career.

3 We have a higher surplus than we've  
4 ever seen before. It's at a level that's where it  
5 belongs -- it's not too high, it's not too low,  
6 it's just right, right now -- so I'm very happy and  
7 very proud of the work that we've all done here at  
8 the Town of Oyster Bay led by yourself and the rest  
9 of the Town Board.

10 It's your stewardship that has helped  
11 us get to where we are today, and I hate to say  
12 that we're on cruise control now because there's  
13 always work to be done, but, with that being said,  
14 we are beyond the darkest days, and now the sun is  
15 shining brightly and only good times ahead.

16 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Well, our news is  
17 so good that we know that we're very proud to tell  
18 this information to the public, to our taxpayers,  
19 to our residents.

20 It's great news, and we -- even with  
21 all of the wild inflation and -- nationally, it's  
22 10 percent -- I went to the store and eggs are four  
23 times what they -- 400 percent more than what they  
24 cost just a couple of -- and food bills and so  
25 on -- gas is up over some 50 percent of what it

1 was.

2 MR. DARIENZO: The gas in our budget is  
3 up roughly 50 percent in 2023. That's our  
4 projection, yes.

5 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: But with all of  
6 the massive inflation we're dealing with, we still  
7 are charging our taxpayers the same amount now for  
8 the -- going into the sixth year -- sixth  
9 consecutive year.

10 MR. DARIENZO: It's -- I want to say  
11 it's unbelievable, but it really isn't because  
12 we're doing it, so I believe it.

13 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

14 On behalf of the entire Town Board,  
15 Mr. Darienzo, thank you for your hard work.

16 MR. DARIENZO: It's my pleasure.

17 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I'd like to call  
18 up our Town Comptroller.

19 Sir, will you please state your  
20 presence?

21 MR. BALLAS: Hi. My name is Steve  
22 Ballas. I'm the Comptroller for the Town of Oyster  
23 Bay.

24 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: You heard me go  
25 down a synopsis of some of the highlights of this

1 budget including the fact that we are, once again,  
2 freezing taxes -- not raising. We cut, our first  
3 year, \$1.3 for the 2018 budget, and, now, this is  
4 our sixth budget without a tax increase.

5 You heard all of the items about the  
6 highlights of this budget including our bond rating  
7 increases and the long litany of, actually,  
8 wonderful news for our taxpayers.

9 Do you concur that everything I've said  
10 is actually factual?

11 MR. BALLAS: I do. Absolutely.

12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And can you tell  
13 us about outside, independent agencies that look  
14 carefully and audit our budget?

15 MR. BALLAS: Well, as you know, we are  
16 required to have our annual financial report  
17 audited by an outside auditing firm -- Cullen and  
18 Danowski is our auditing company -- and they've  
19 audited our financial statements and have given us  
20 an unqualified opinion that all of our records are  
21 in accordance with generally accepted accounting  
22 principles and government accounting standards.

23 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: How -- you see  
24 the fact that many municipalities are raising taxes  
25 to stay afloat, and we are not doing that.

1           As a professional accountant for  
2 decades, how would you classify where we are in our  
3 Town in terms of our fiscal strength and our  
4 conservative practices?

5           MR. BALLAS: As I said earlier, it is  
6 amazing -- and Rob says unbelievable -- but it is  
7 believable because we are doing it.

8           I'm, actually, proud to be a part of  
9 it, but it's all because of the sound management  
10 and stewardship that you and this Board have  
11 actually guided the Town since you've been here.

12           SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And the outside  
13 rating agencies, such as Moody's, that looks  
14 carefully over everything we do, what have they  
15 said about the financial practices and the  
16 position, the financial position of the Town?

17           MR. BALLAS: They agree.

18           And when I say they agree, they awarded  
19 us upgrades -- I think it's seven up to now --  
20 seven upgrades.

21           SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And it's only the  
22 beginning.

23           MR. BALLAS: Yes. We're shooting for  
24 the top.

25           SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you for

1 your assistance, your professionalism, and your  
2 stewardship in assisting this Town Board.

3 We greatly appreciate you and your  
4 team.

5 MR. BALLAS: Proud to be here.

6 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

7 MR. BALLAS: Thank you.

8 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Well, with that,  
9 this is the time when we turn the floor over to  
10 Town residents that have comments, but I can tell  
11 everyone who is watching this online that we're  
12 looking at a near empty room, but for the purposes  
13 of procedure, I'll ask if anyone would like to  
14 comment or ask any questions as it relates to this  
15 Town Board Budget Hearing.

16 (Whereupon, there was no response from  
17 the assemblage.)

18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Let the record  
19 reflect that no one has indicated that they would  
20 like to be heard on that.

21 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Supervisor, in  
22 light of the fact that our residents are not  
23 present, but they're listening at home, I would  
24 just like to make a comment about everything we've  
25 heard today, and what we've listened to from our

1 financial people, and, particularly, for those that  
2 may be listening at home, in these times where we  
3 open the newspaper and see so many things -- the  
4 difficulties that our citizens are facing between  
5 their worries about if they can afford food, the  
6 price of gasoline, heating, electricity --  
7 everything has gone up. Well, in their budget,  
8 that is true.

9 And it's happened in our budget, too,  
10 and what you've heard today, if you were listening  
11 earlier, was our Finance Director point out that  
12 even in the times of high inflation where our fuel  
13 costs are over 45 percent, for instance, and other  
14 challenges that we meet because the cost of  
15 everything that we do has gone up, and even in  
16 spite of that, we have found ways to bring in more  
17 revenues without taxing more of our residents, and  
18 I think that's quite an accomplishment because the  
19 easy thing to do, and a lot of municipalities do  
20 it, is to place the burden on to the taxpayers and  
21 ask more of them and raise their taxes, and we've  
22 chosen not to do that.

23 We've taken the more difficult task,  
24 which is to make our municipality do more with less  
25 and to maintain those services that they have

1       come -- and that they expect, and I think it's a  
2       real -- this budget is a testament to that. I  
3       think it shows that even in these difficult times  
4       that we can manage with the right managers and the  
5       right stewardship and the right direction and  
6       leadership from yourself and your team.

7                 And I'm proud to be voting in favor of  
8       this budget -- as we will eventually next week --  
9       but the hearing really demonstrated that; that in  
10      spite of all these challenges that we've managed to  
11      make one thing less that our citizens have to worry  
12      about. They will not get an increase in taxes in  
13      spite of everything else that has increased in  
14      their budgets.

15                SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

16                With that, I am so proud to be the Town  
17      of Oyster Bay's Supervisor and a member of this  
18      team. It's an incredible team.

19                I thank you all.

20                And with that, may I ask for a motion?

21                COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Supervisor, I'll  
22      make a motion that this hearing be closed and  
23      decision be reserved.

24                COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: And I second that  
25      motion.

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SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All in favor,  
enthusiastically, please signify by saying, "Aye."

ALL: "Aye."

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Those opposed,  
"Nay."

(Whereupon, there were no "Nay"  
responses from the Board.)

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And with this  
gavel, I close this meeting on an incredible report  
to the people of this incredible Town.
