According to our policy, dogs can be put up for adoption after their seventh day at the shelter. All adoptable cats and dogs are held indefinitely.



## **Closed Sundays & Holidays**


Residents experiencing animal problems after regular business hours, and on Sundays and holidays, should contact their local police precinct.

## How to look for your lost dog or cat ...

Call the Town of Oyster Bay Animal Shelter (516) 677-5784. If we do not have your pet, we will take all of your information for our lost animal book. The lost animals book is checked by Animal Shelter staff whenever new animals arrive at the shelter.

2. Check the Town of Oyster Bay

Facebook page. The Town of Oyster Bay Animals Shelter posts all found animals on our Facebook page at Facebook.com/ TownOfOysterBay as well as Facebook. com/LostandFoundPetsLongIslandNassau SuffolkCounty.

- 3. If you advertise a lost pet, be sure to include the following information:
  - Date and area lost
  - Breed, sex, color, and markings of pet
  - If the pet was microchipped or wearing a collar. If the pet was wearing a collar, state color and list any I.D. or license on it.

- 4. Check with local lost and found groups. Check with your mail carrier and neighborhood children.
- 5. If you lost your dog or cat in the Town of Oyster Bay close to the border of other towns (Hempstead, North Hempstead, Babylon, Huntington), make sure to check the animal shelters in these towns:
  - Hempstead.....(516) 785-5220
  - North Hempstead.....(516) 767-4615
  - Babylon......(631) 643-9270
  - Huntington......(631) 754-8722

\*No matter what area of the Town of Oyster Bay you live in, you should check all nearby shelters.



- 6. You should check with the highway departments of these neighboring towns, since they are responsible for picking up roadway animal fatalities. State and county highway departments pick up deceased animals on state and county roads. Town and village highway departments pick up deceased animals on town and village roads.
- 7. When you find your pet, we advise having them microchipped. The Town of Oyster Bay Animal Shelter and most veterinarians offer microchipping services. Also, all dogs in the Town of Oyster Bay are required to be licensed. When you license your dog, you will be given a tag that must be placed on their collar that can help identify them in the event they are lost. Please let us know when you find your dog or cat se we can remove it from our lost animals book.
- 8. Call and check all local vets within a 3-5 mile radius of where you live.
