We were born within a year of each other and admitted to the bar within a year of each other. We both were practicing for near 50 years. I loved it.

He had a fabulous memory for baseball names and facts. And having served this town in many capacities, he knew its rhythm and its heartbeat.

After Hal became a grandfather a few years ago and we shared grandpa pictures and stories, I got a much clearer view of wear Hal's supposedly missing heart was and how to reach it.

I want to make just one more observation. Every time Hal was asked to

As you all know very well, it's oftentimes not easy to be the decision maker, the vote caster, the policy maker. Much easier to stand on this side of the podium and second guess or criticize. No second guessing from Hal. No Monday morning quarterbacking. He called it how he saw it on Sunday morning.

His courage enacting here in Oyster Bay leaves one to think that Teddy Roosevelt had a Hal in mind when he said, "it's not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who's actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and

Rest in peace, my friend. You not only courageously entered the arena, but commanded it with confidence. Our lives were made more whole because you were in it, and now we may feel incomplete without you, but we were blessed that you

8 spite the national economy experiencing
9 the highest inflation rate in at least 40
10 years.

11 This budget continues to sustain the
12 \$1.3 billion of property tax cut approved
13 by this Town Board for 2018. That means
14 \$9.3 million, \$9.3 million is back in the
15 pockets of our taxpayers, rather than in
16 the coffers of Oyster Bay Town
17 government. This tax freeze is once again
18 possible due to spending restraints and
19 efficiencies, debt reduction initiatives,
20 and many of the initiatives that this
21 Town Board has put into place.

22 The budget continues to pay down our
23 town debt. We have paid off a net of 25%
24 of our town's capital debt, reducing it
25 by a net of \$187 million, while still

paving over a third of our roads, all of the bridges, all of the capital work that we're doing, we're very, very proud of that.

We had an ongoing budget deficit before we came to the Town of Oyster Bay of \$44 million. Yes. A \$44 million multi year budget deficit. That's been turned around immensely and we now have an \$88 million surplus on our ongoing budget.

We have fully balanced every single aspect of our budget. All 13 of the budgets within our overall budget are fully balanced and there is no borrowing for cash flow purposes. Our successes go on and on and on.

People have heard of them: The 12 notches of increases that we've received in our bond rating, 12 notches over the course of eight different critical times when Wall Street told us that we're doing a great job and we're all very, very proud of that.

And finally, not finally, but the

1
2 last thing I'll mention on a very long
3 list of accomplishments, the New York
4 State Comptroller, Tom DiNapoli, gives a
5 rating to every municipality in New York
6 state. It's on a scale of 0 to 100, with
7 100 being the worst. Back in 2017, we
8 were the fourth worst municipality in the
9 state of New York on that scale. In
10 2000, our numbers started with critically
11 high numbers ratings like 91, which is a
12 terrible rating to have.

13 Our 2022 number was just released
14 about a month ago by the State
15 Comptroller's office, and our score is
16 zero; zero fiscal stress in the Town of
17 Oyster Bay. With all of these
18 accomplishments, with all of the
19 improvements to the qualities of the
20 services and to all of the capital
21 improvements from bathrooms to turf
22 fields to road work to bridges to the
23 infrastructure of our town and the list
24 goes on and on.
