The Town of Oyster Bay and its continuing commitment to protect the quality of

life in our local communities demolished a delipidated and abandoned home in Massapequa last week. This vacant eyesore, which had not been maintained for many years, was a long-time blight in the community.

Since I came on board in 2017 and with the help of our Town Board, we created a Quality of Life Task Force in the Town of Oyster Bay to address this important issue. We worked with the Department of Planning and Development and the Town Attorney's office to change the Town code.

In addition, we have maintained -mandated that banks and lending institutions must
advance a \$25,000 fee to be placed in an escrow
account so the public is no longer responsible to
pay for cleanups of the properties, nor do they pay
for the demolition and removal of debris of these
problem homes.

We will continue to work with the Town Board, our Building Department, our Town Attorney's office, and all in the Town of Oyster Bay to keep the cleanups of zombie homes among our highest priorities.

In other news, we'd like to thank the Parks Department. I know our Commissioner Joe

Pinto is here.

Thank you, Commissioner, and your entire team and the department for the very successful Try Hockey For Free program held last week at the Town's ice skating center.
