3	Oyster Bay's Town Board meeting for May 4, 2021.
4	Leading us in prayer this evening will
5	be Pastor Diane of the True Life Christian Worship
6	Center here in Oyster Bay. She is also joined by
7	Pastor Ray, and we welcome you both to Town Hall.
8	Would everyone please join us in
9	rising?
10	PASTOR DIANE: Dear Lord, we thank you
11	for those you have called to lead in the Township
12	of Oyster Bay. Your word tells us in second
13	Timothy 2:1-2, to pray for our leaders that they
14	may make wise decisions, and that we may lead
15	peaceable lives.
16	We pray for the peace and restoration
17	of our Nation. We seek you, Lord, for peace and
18	unity in our land. Your word tells us that it is
19	good and pleasant for brothers and sisters to dwell
20	together in unity. We pray that we would come as a
21	Nation together, and as this Thursday is designated

11	Keep our leaders from adopting laws
12	that go contrary to your truth. Grant them
13	integrity in their decisions that they reach, and
14	may we live peaceable lives in this land as we wait
15	for the day of your return.

18	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Pastor
19	Diane.
20	We appreciate your participation, and
21	please send our best wishes to everyone at the
22	church.
23	PASTOR DIANE: Thank you.
24	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: We appreciate you
25	and Pastor Ray being here with us.

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1	PASTOR DIANE: Thank you.
2	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And now, to lead
3	us in the Pledge of Allegiance, would you please
4	welcome Andrea Nordquist, President of the Blue
5	Star Mothers New York 14 here on Long Island?
6	Would you please stand in the front of
7	the room?
8	(Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
9	was recited by Andrea Nordquist.)
10	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you very
11	much.
12	We appreciate your being here, Andrea,
13	and we appreciate your son, and we commend him for
14	all of his efforts in the military, and it is an
15	enormous task, so thank you to you and all the Blue
16	Star mothers, but we will be hearing more about
17	that in just a moment, so thank you for Gregory,
18	and thank you for being here.
19	We I'm now going to ask for a moment
20	of silence for our men and women in the United
21	States Armed Forces, those here in the United
22	States and the Homeland and those abroad serving
23	our Nation, protecting our freedoms, and we greatly
24	appreciate and remember, as we recognize the men
25	and women in law enforcement, the fire services,

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1	all of the First Responders, including our health
2	care heroes clearly continuing to move forward and
3	protect us from COVID-19. Allow us to remember all
4	those we have lost across this Town and across this
5	Nation to COVID-19. Their memories will live on
6	forever.
7	Also, please remember New York Police
8	Department Highway Patrol Officer Anastasios
9	Tsakos, a 14-year member of the Force, from East
10	Northport right here on Long Island who
11	passed earlier this week in a tragic accident by an
12	alleged impaired hit and run driver while directing
13	traffic at the scene of a fatal crash.
14	He was only 43 years old and the father
15	of two young children. God bless Officer Tsakos,
16	his wife, his extended family. With each one of
17	these senseless deaths, it takes another hero from
18	us.
19	God bless him.
20	(Whereupon, a moment of silence was
21	observed.)
22	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, all.
23	Please be seated.
24	Ladies and gentlemen, in accordance
25	with New York State Safety Guidelines, the

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1	attendance in this room is limited to 35 visitors.
2	For those watching from home on the Internet, you
3	will have the opportunity to be heard on matters
4	brought before the Town Board tonight, during a
5	public comment period for 10 days following this
6	meeting.
7	As always, this meeting, like all
8	others, is being live-streamed on social media and
9	on the Town's website, oysterbaytown.com. These
10	proceedings are recorded and later transcribed.
11	Please know that your voice is very
12	important to us. Statements, comments, input from
13	the public relative to our meetings, our
14	hearings, and our resolutions are always
15	welcomed and respected as part of the record.
16	To submit comments by e-mail, please
17	send them to publiccomment@oysterbay-ny.gov, or
18	mail us at the Office of the Town Attorney,
19	54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, New York 11771.
20	So for our first presentation we
21	actually have so many announcements but to get
22	to our presentations, I do want people to know that
23	we've made a great breakthrough in terms of COVID.
24	Through COVID-19 and the spread of this
25	infection, the Town of Oyster Bay is happy to

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1	embark on the first ever saliva testing mass
2	saliva testing program where it's 99.7 percent
3	accurate and this very effective program allows our
4	residents to be tested at the Hicksville Community
5	Center. It also allows sports groups to continue.
6	Our high school students can continue their games.
7	It's a quick test, and they can have the results
8	downloaded on their cell phones, so we've reached
9	out to school districts to partner with them on
10	this test no fuss, no muss it's a saliva
11	test. Quite frankly, it's the only place kids can
12	spit and not get in trouble.
13	(Whereupon, there was some laughter
14	from the audience.)
15	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: But this has been
16	a breakthrough, and now we're providing
17	vaccinations at this same site. They will be
18	available this evening until 8:00 p.m. and then
19	again on May 11th from 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
20	It's one-stop shopping for protection
21	from COVID brought to you by our Town Board and the
22	Town of Oyster Bay, staying ahead of this pandemic
23	and protecting our residents.
24	So that's at the Hicksville Community
25	Center tonight and then May 11th from 3:00 p.m. to

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1	8:00 p.m., but the saliva testing continues.
2	All of this information is on our
3	website, which is oysterbaytown.com.
4	For our first presentation this
5	evening, the Town of Oyster Bay is pleased to
6	welcome Andrea Nordquist, President of the Blue
7	Star Mothers NY 14 on Long Island. She is also
8	joined by the First Vice President, Sandy Lachman.
9	So we appreciate the two of you being here. We
10	know that Lynn Chiarello was going to join us, but
11	sends her regards and congratulations to the two of
12	you. We're here to say thank you.
13	The Blue Star Mothers of America is a
14	not-for-profit organization that provides amazing
15	support for mothers who have sons or daughters in
16	active service in the United States Armed Forces.
17	Andrea's son, Gregory, is a Nassau County police
18	officer and serves in the United States Air
19	National Guard, so we thank you very, very much for
20	all you do.
21	As a matter of fact, you were helpful,
22	just recently, when I joined with Councilwoman
23	Michele Johnson and my colleagues and the community
24	in Locust Valley for the renaming of the corner of
25	Birch Hill and Forest to Robert Hendriks Way. We

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1	were proud to join with you.
2	Wasn't that an amazing opportunity?
3	COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: It was
4	beautiful. There were so many people there and
5	such love and support from the community. I was
6	just proud to be there, and I hope that the family
7	was touched by it. The outpouring was incredible.
8	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Absolutely.
9	Thanks for your help with that, thanks
10	for what you do with all the Blue Star moms. So
11	both of you, Andrea and Sandy, we appreciate you
12	very much for your outstanding work, and on behalf
13	of all of those in your organization, on behalf of
14	our community, on behalf of our Town, but also on
15	behalf of our Nation, this is an amazing program,
16	so we're honored we are honored to have you
17	here, and my colleagues on the Oyster Bay Town
18	Board and I are proud to present you with a Town
19	Citation recognizing your amazing work, but it is
20	specifically the Town's highest honor to bestow
21	upon you, so please come forward, Andrea both of
22	you and Councilwoman Johnson, will you assist us
23	in this presentation?
24	Will everyone join us at the rail?
25	(Whereupon, a Town Citation was

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1	presented to Andrea Nordquist and Sandy Lachman,
2	and a photo session was taken.)
3	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Please put your
4	hands together for our Blue Star Mothers.
5	(Whereupon, a round of applause
6	ensued.)
7	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Congratulations.
8	MS. NORDQUIST: Thank you so much.
9	Just a quick word about Blue Star
10	Mothers. We're a new chapter. We're part of a
11	major national organization, but we're a local
12	organization in Nassau County.
13	We cook dinner for Veterans who are in
14	need. We send packages to our deployed. We do
15	parades. We also put the flags out on Memorial
16	Day. We're looking for help with that because the
17	cemetery is doing that this year they did not do
18	it last year but the flags will be available
19	this year for Memorial Day, and we put those flags
20	out to remember our fallen heroes. We do the
21	wreaths at Christmastime what else do we do
22	we basically will work with any Veterans
23	organization to help them and support them because
24	when you work together as groups, you can get a lot
25	more accomplished, so anything that any group needs

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1	to do, any Veterans that need help, any current
2	military that need help, we're there for them.
3	We also give a big support to our
4	fellow mothers. It's very hard when you send your
5	young children off to battle. It's very scary.
6	Sandy's son is in Japan right now, and he's been
7	gone for quite a while. I'm lucky enough that my
8	son was in the Air Force, but now he's in the Air
9	National Guard, and when he's not there, he's a
10	Nassau County cop, so I just worry about him
11	constantly.
12	(Whereupon, there was some laughter
13	from the audience.)
14	MS. NORDQUIST: So, you know, all our
15	mothers have sons and daughters that are either
16	current or former, and we do offer that support, so
17	if anybody ever knows of any Veterans that need
18	anything, we have a lot of contacts, and we will
19	make those contacts and put people in touch.
20	There's a lot of Veterans that are
21	homeless. There are a lot of Veterans that are
22	just barely getting by, there's a lot of current
23	military that are really struggling, so if anybody
24	knows of anybody that needs any help, let us know,
25	and we will make those contacts and get them the

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12 1 help that they need. 2 I just want to thank you. I grew up in 3 Oyster Bay, so I love Oyster Bay, but we thank you 4 for letting us be here and thankful for the 5 Citation and your support. We do appreciate it. Thank you. 6 7 (Whereupon, a round of applause 8 ensued.) 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Next, we have an 10 important presentation that was lobbied for, or 11 recognized, by my colleague on the Town Board, 12 Councilman Steve Labriola. 13 This is something that fills our hearts 14 with pride as we welcome Massapequa resident, Brett 15 Moore, and his family to Town Hall. 16 Brett and his wife, Stephanie, along 17 with their daughters, Haley and Sage, initiated a 18 Go Fund Me project that enabled them to install 19 American flags on telephone poles along Block 20 Boulevard between Sunrise Highway and Merrick Road 21 in Massapequa Park. 22 It's a wonderful program and, guite 23 frankly, it's a very patriotic activity. It was originally planned to coincide with Memorial Day 24 25 weekend, and the impressive display of these

13 symmetrical flags has been very popular with 1 2 Massapequa Park residents. 3 Brett, thank you so much for your 4 patriotism, for caring about the community, for 5 setting a wonderful example for your daughters. You and Stephanie are that family that is the Town 6 7 of Oyster Bay, and we're so proud to welcome you 8 here to Town Hall and to thank you. 9 And with that, I'd like to ask 10 Councilman Labriola, who first witnessed this very 11 patriotic service, to say a few words, and then he 12 and we will present you and your family with the 13 Town of Oyster Bay Citation. 14 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Thank you, 15 Supervisor Saladino. 16 You said that so well, and the Town of 17 Oyster Bay is, indeed, a very patriotic town, and, 18 in particular, our neighbors in Massapequa have 19 shown themselves time and again throughout all of 20 our history in the Massapequas at being patriots. 21 And I want to say that when Brett and 22 his daughters came down my block -- and it was my 23 block, of course, they did it on, which is how I 24 found out about it -- I saw it in my mailbox --25 this request to raise money for this project, and

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1	the first thing I did was get on the Internet and

7	and to install them himself with his family, and
8	with any other monies that were leftover, he
9	contributed to the Wounded Warriors Project, and
10	I'm sure that they were just as thrilled as we are
11	in Massapequa to see the results of your efforts.
12	And now when you drive down our block,
13	I'm sure that Brett's chest swells with pride, and
14	he knows it's something he did himself, and I know
15	I have that feeling too when I drive down my block,
16	and I'm sure that many of the neighborhoods, many
17	of the streets in the Town of Oyster Bay are
18	following suit, and you see our Hometown Hero
19	Program has started to become unveiled, and the
20	Supervisor is going to announce that closer to
21	Memorial Day, but you'll see that there is the
22	spirit of patriotism alive and well.
23	Brett is a true patriot, and he loves
24	his Nation and those who serve in it. Once the
25	financial goal for the American flags was met,

2 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Will the Town 1 2 Clerk please call the next hearing? 3 MR. LaMARCA: This hearing is to 4 consider a Local Law entitled, "A Local Law to 5 Amend Chapter 173 - Peddling and Soliciting, of the Code of the Town of Oyster Bay. 6 7 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good evening. 8 MR. PRESTON: Good evening, Supervisor, 9 and Members of the Board. 10 My name is Andrew Preston. I am an 11 attorney at the law firm Bee, Ready, Fishbein, 12 Hatter & Donovan. We act as outside counsel to the 13 Office of the Town Attorney. 14 Before you tonight is a proposed 15 amendment to Chapter 173 of Local Law, which is 16 entitled, Peddlers and Solicitors, more 17 specifically, a subsection of that, which regulates 18 mobile vendors. 19 This revision comes after my office 20 worked with the Office of the Town Attorney, 21 Planning and Development, the Office of the Town 22 Clerk, and Public Safety, and I believe that the 23 revisions contained in this law will improve the 24 Town's ability to enforce mobile food vendors that 25 operate without a permit from the Office of the

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      Town Clerk.
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                  I am happy to answer any questions you
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      have about specifics of the Local Law.
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                  SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Are there any
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      questions from the Board members?
                   (Whereupon, there were no questions
6

      from the Board.)
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                  SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Would you like to
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      expand a little further on its scope?
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                  MR. PRESTON: Yes, of course.
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                  One of the modifications to this law is
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      that it allows the Town to temporarily seize
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      vehicles that operate without a permit.
                  The current Local Law allows for
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      penalties to be issued, but that has not proven to
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      be effective enough in stopping mobile food
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      vendors, which for whatever reason choose not to
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      request and receive permits from the Town Clerk.
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                  Those mobile food vendors operate
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      without oversight from the Department of Health,
21
      and they operate without oversight from the Town,
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      as they're unregistered.
                               These amendments will
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      allow the Town to effectively enforce mobile food
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      vendors that operate outside the law.

                  SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I understand
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4 there has been a long history of complaints 1 2 including from the long-serving establishments that operate legally in that community. 3 MR. PRESTON: That's my understanding 4 5 as well. SUPERVISOR SALADINO: As well as our 6 7 residents who have complained. 8 MR. PRESTON: Yes, sir. 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. 10 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Mr. Preston, 11 haven't we had a long history with specific vendors 12 that we have issued multiple citations to without 13 any success because for a lot of them it's just the 14 cost of doing business to pay their fines to the 15 Town and continue operating? 16 MR. PRESTON: I agree with you. 17 I think that a deficiency in the 18 current law is that it makes more sense for that 19 food vendor to simply pay fines than it is to 20 comply with the laws, and the result is, in 21 perpetuity, food vendors operating without 22 registration. 23 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Counselor, in 24 practice --25 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: I'm sorry.

5 This is Councilman Imbroto. I forgot 1 2 to identify myself --3 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Councilman Imbroto. 4 5 We appreciate your --COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: -- has been 6 7 discussed over the years that's come up many times 8 with the Quality of Life Task Force meeting and 9 something that I was very frustrated with myself 10 when I was the prosecutor for the Town, trying to 11 get rid of some of these illegally operating 12 vendors who have no regard for the law, no regard 13 for the Town regulations, don't bother to get a 14 license, don't follow the Department of Health 15 codes, have no oversight whatsoever. 16 It's been a source of great frustration 17 over the years, and I'm very glad that we were able 18 to create this law so that we can have a little bit 19 more teeth to protect our residents' quality of 20 life and eliminate these illegal vendors. 21 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Counselor, in 22 practical application, would these peddlers or 23 mobile vendors -- would the law be carried out by 24 the -- and enforced by the Nassau County Police 25 Department?

6 MR. PRESTON: Section 173.34 speaks to 1 2 that. 3	MR. LaMARCA: The last hearing tonight
4	is to consider the 2021 Hydrant Rental for
5	Glenwood-Glen Head Fire Protection District and the
6	New York American Water Company, Inc.
7	MS. FAUGHNAN: Good evening,
8	Supervisor, Members of the Town Board.
9	Elizabeth Faughnan, Deputy Town
10	Attorney, Office of the Town Attorney.
11	I'm going I'm here every year I
12	come to you for three different approvals for
13	hydrant rental agreements for a hydrant rental
14	agreement with the Oyster Bay Water District, a
15	hydrant rental agreement with the Plainview Water
16	District, and, in this instance, a rental agreement
17	and payment for hydrant rental with New York
18	American Water.
19	And if I may just give you a little bit
20	of background, I know you are all very, very
21	familiar with it and know the details, but in order
22	to make the record clear, I just need to so I
23	apologize, but just to refresh your recollection,
24	as you know, water districts and water providers
25	provide water service to their residents, to

	3
1	businesses in their district. Fire hydrants are
2	not needed for purposes of providing water. Fire
3	hydrants are available for purposes of fire
4	protection and ancillary services.
5	The State has ruled that the fire
6	districts, or the users of the fire hydrants,
7	should pay a rental fee to cover that cost.
8	In most instances in the Town of Oyster
9	Bay, and, quite frankly, throughout the County of
10	Nassau, there is a fire district with elected
11	commissioners elected by the residents of that
12	geographic area, and there is also a water district
13	with commissioners elected by the residents of that
14	geographic area as well.
15	In these three instances, and more
16	specifically today, there is no fire district with
17	elected fire commissioners. There is what is
18	called a fire protection area. It is known as the
19	Glenwood-Glen Head Fire Protection area. It is
20	actually a special taxing district of the Town of
21	Oyster Bay, and the Town Board members serve akin
22	to as the commissioners would in an elected
23	water district so that is why I come to you
24	today the very long story way I come to you
25	today to request your authorization for an

4 1 agreement, and more importantly, payment to 2 New York American Water for the provision and 3 maintenance of fire hydrants in that fire 4 protection area. 5 There are -- this year there are 229 hydrants. In the past, we have always rented 224. 6 7 In the past few years, New York American Water has 8 added five hydrants. We have obtained the list of 9 the hydrants so that we are sure we are getting 10 what the Town is paying for, so it's part of the 11 new procedures that are involved in the Town 12 Attorney's Office and through the Comptroller's Office to make sure all of the "i"s are dotted and 13 14 "t"s are crossed, so that is why you may notice 15 that there is an increase in the number of hydrants 16 this year. 17 As you also know, New York American 18 Water is a private company. It is not a municipal 19 district. It is a for-profit company. They are 20 required under State law to go to the New York 21 State Public Service Commission for approval of 22 their rates, both for water rates and for hydrant 23 rental rates. 24 The State Public Service Commission had 25 approved a small increase in the cost of hydrant

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1	rental this year, and they had also approved
2	various surcharges, the incremental property tax
3	surcharge, about six different charges that come
4	across on the bill. In fact, given an estimate of
5	where we think the surcharges will be at the end of
6	the year, there is a very small increase over last
7	year's, and it's a decrease in the amount from
8	three years ago.
9	So just so the Board is aware, in 2019
10	the fee per hydrant we had estimated would be
11	\$1,145. Last year it was \$896.31 that the Town
12	Board approved, and this year we are requesting
13	approval for \$898 per hydrant, 229 hydrants, for a
14	total of \$205,642.
15	Again, the Town Attorney's Office has
16	no ability to negotiate these rates. They are set
17	and approved by the New York State Public Service
18	Commission, so it's kind of like we have to sit
19	here and eat it. This is an estimate.
20	Last year we did not spend the amount
21	requested. We worked with New York American Water,
22	and we left a little bit in case the State had
23	increased some of the surcharges, which they did
24	not. We hope not to spend this full amount of
25	money, but we are requesting authorization in case

6 1 a worst-case scenario. 2 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 3 MS. FAUGHNAN. Thank you, Supervisor. SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 4 5 And we do appreciate you going over all of the information, especially with the PSC. 6 They 7 mandated that every ratepayer, including 8 governments, pay the full taxes --9 MS. FAUGHNAN: Yes. 10 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: -- on the water, 11 and it's very frustrating to us, and we continue to 12 join with community members to lobby for drastic 13 change in the way that those who receive their 14 water resources from New York American Water --15 more change coming forward -- we will continue with 16 that process and continue our lobby efforts. 17 MS. FAUGHNAN: I'm glad, Supervisor, 18 that you pointed out that the Town pays that tax. 19 The incremental property tax surcharge is 20 actually -- or was actually 19.12 percent, which is 21 on top of the actual rate, and then there's also a 22 rate levelization surcharge of 1.13 percent so --23 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: So the message is 24 to New York State to make these changes and bring 25 down the cost of water for those who are currently

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receiving this life-sustaining resource from a 1 2 private for-profit company, so I continue with our 3 efforts, and I'm joined by my colleagues in the Town Board who are extremely frustrated about this 4 5 situation but are doing something about it. Thank you. 6 7 Do any of the Board Members have any 8 questions on this hearing? 9 (Whereupon, there was no response from 10 the Board.) 11 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. 12 May I have a motion, please? 13 Is there any correspondence? 14 MR. LaMARCA: We have Affidavits of 15 Posting and Publication. 16 There is no other correspondence. 17 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I have no slips 18 on this. 19 (Whereupon, a member of the audience 20 raised a hand.) 21 Yes? 22 Would you like to ask a question? 23 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yes. 24 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Please come 25 forward.

I can't believe 4 it. 5 A question about the hearing regarding fire hydrants rented to Glenwood-Glen Head fire 6 7 company for almost \$900 per hydrant. 8 I was just curious, do they detail what 9 comes with the rental? Is it the maintenance, the guaranteed 10 11 shoveling out during snowstorms, flushing of the 12 lines, and does American Water have uniform -- I 13 don't know what they're called -- but when the fire 14 department comes to turn on the hydrant, I 15 understand -- I saw something recently -- one of 16 the companies couldn't open a hydrant because they 17 didn't have the right lock for the --18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Key? 19 MR. ADELMAN: Key. I understand that 20 they're different all over. Not only the Town of 21 Oyster Bay but Nassau County, Long Island, the 22 State, everywhere. 23 I'd like to know if anybody's working 24 on a uniform key for all hydrants. 25 Anyway, about American Water, what is

9 1 their responsibility in the rental agreement? 2 Is there any -- did they detail it? 3 Thank you. 4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 5 MS. FAUGHNAN: Thank you, Supervisor, Members of the Board. 6 7 In the past -- I want to say in the 8 past two years, we haven't done an actual agreement 9 with New York American Water -- a contract specifically for the hydrant rentals. We've simply 10 11 worked back and forth if there have been any 12 issues, and simply paid bills. We haven't had an 13 exact contract. 14 It is their responsibility to maintain 15 the hydrants and make them available for 16 firefighting purposes. 17 With respect to the key or the 18 connector that you are referring to, actually, I'm 19 learning a lot. Working with the fire departments, 20 the LOSAP, and the hydrant rentals, apparently 21 there are two pretty standard connectors. 22 Just so everybody's familiar with 23 this -- one's called National Standard and there's 24 another connector that's called New York Pipe -- I 25 think that's what they are -- New York Pipe and

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1	National Standard.
2	In this particular instance, there
3	is I don't want to say it's unique because it
4	may be used in some other municipality but the
5	connectors that are used here are not National
6	Standard and are not New York Pipe.
7	In the Sea Cliff area, that is covered
8	by New York American Water. The Glen Head area
9	uses, and now I'm going to forget which one it
10	is whether it's New York Pipe or National
11	Standard but the Sea Cliff area uses what is
12	unique to our locality, so the local fire companies
13	are aware of who has what connector, and I've been
14	told by various chiefs in the different companies
15	that they do have the different connectors on their
16	truck, and they believe it's folk law or assumed
17	that New York American Water, one of its many
18	predecessors, was Sea Cliff Water and that it was
19	privately owned by an individual and, quote, he
20	didn't want anybody to "steal the water," so he had
21	what was essentially a unique connector so that
22	other people couldn't hook up to his hydrants, and
23	over the years, no one has ever brought them to
24	New York Pipe or to National Standard, so it may be
25	unique to our community, but, in fact, the fire

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companies that go to Sea Cliff know that they have 1 2 to use, quote, "the Sea Cliff connector," and when 3 Sea Cliff goes to Glen Head or Locust Valley or 4 Glen Cove, they know that there is a different 5 connector to be used. So you might get somebody who's new, who's not aware of the fact of what each 6 7 community has, but apparently the firemen that are there are aware of which communities use which 8 9 connectors, and they are available on the trucks. 10 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Ms. Faughnan, they 11 have an adaptor, so it doesn't matter which 12 connector. 13 They have the ability to connect to all 14 of them, correct? 15 MS. FAUGHNAN: Yes. 16 I was saying connectors you're saying 17 adapters, Councilman, but that's what I'm trying to 18 say anyway. 19 Yes, so they can all get to each 20 other's hydrants. 21 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 22 We appreciate learning the history, 23 too. 24 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: -- all the fire 25 hydrants no matter which type of connector they

ADELMAN: But the other increases 15 was -- one is for -- in the Receiver of Taxes, a 16 cashier got a 14 percent increase from 42K to 17 almost 48K; one in CYS, a recreation aide, from 42K 18 to 48K; another CYS employee, Group Worker I, 19 received an increase from 50,000 a year to 57,000 a 20 year. 21 These 14 percent wage increases, I 22 think, are out of line with what's going on in the 23 regular world today, and you'll comment on that 24 later. 25 Next, I was --

We should be advertising this the day 23 before the meeting. 24 You, Council folks, are supposed to 25 speak up and advocate to follow the law, and you're

27 not doing that, and people will take that into 1 2 account this coming November. You know, I'm 3 certain of that. You know, why -- if you're able to --4 5 if you're able to put this list, which I don't even know if you all saw -- if you are able to -- if the 6 7 Town Attorney or whoever put it in the booklet at 10 after 7:00, if he was able to put this in the 8 9 book at 10 after 7:00, why couldn't this be published in the backup yesterday with the other 10 11 backup? 12 When I sit down, I'd really appreciate 13 it if you could answer that question so I don't 14 have to come back and ask you the same question at 15 the next meeting. 16 Now, what I don't want to have happen 17 is I don't want you, Mr. Supervisor, I don't want 18 you to cost the taxpayers any additional money in 19 legal fees. I have been holding back and not 20 filing legal action, an Article 78, over you 21 consistently violating this New York State Open 22 Meetings Law. 23 The Town of Oyster Bay, I think it was 24 before your time, I think it was before your 25 time --

28 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Excuse me, 1 2 Mr. McKenna. 3 MR. MCKENNA: Yes, sir. 4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: We ask that you 5 follow the rules and keep your comments germane to the business of the day. 6 7 MR. McKENNA: Well, I'm talking about 18 this Resolution, which is pertinent to the day, and 19 what I'm saying is that this was supposed to be 20 published yesterday with the other backup. 21 When I sit down, if I'm missing 22 something as to why you don't do that, please 23 explain. Maybe I'm missing something. 24 Do you disagree that it's part of the 25 law to publish this, and the names are not on this

Open Meetings Law states and I sent
a copy of this to you all recently from New York
State Office on Open Government I sent you the
opinion that says that you're supposed to put the
names, not just for us, the public, but for the
Council for the Council people the Council
people that are supposed to represent the public,
you should be making sure that the names are on
this sheet if you're doing your jobs.
So if you want to continue to violate
the law, I'm going to give you, actually, one more
meeting, I'm going to I'm going to wait until
the next meeting. If you follow the law at the
next meeting, then I will not need to have you,
Mr. Supervisor, cost the taxpayers money to defend
a legal action that I will bring. I've already
proven to you that I can bring them and win them,
and I will do it again.
Resolution 255. Actually, maybe you
could maybe you could help me, and I know
there's other members of the public that are very
interested in this because somebody not me
somebody the other day happened to come across a
Resolution that the Town passed last year that

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1	nobody was aware of, that had to do last year with
2	changing the law about apartments over buildings,
3	and it's on Facebook right now. Somebody posted
4	it it wasn't me and basically the poster said
5	that nobody knew about this law that you did last
6	year, and now I see 265, it looks like, and I could
7	be wrong, it looks like it's pertaining to the same
8	topic, and I'm wondering if you're changing now
9	what you did last year that the public didn't know

11	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Mr. McKenna
12	MR. McKENNA: and I'm being sincere
13	right now. I don't know what it's about.
14	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: of course.
15	Thank you for choosing this moment to
16	be sincere
17	MR. McKENNA: With that, I'm going to
18	give you my 15 seconds, and I'm going to wait for
19	your answers.
20	Thank you.
21	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Resolution 265
22	has been tabled, but thank you for your help and to
23	answer your questions.
24	We adhere to the law. We adhere to all
25	rules and regulations as it relates to Civil

31 Service Law, it's what you're seeing examples of 1 2 that, and we adhere to our contract with our 3 workforce. 4 We are very proud of the Town 5 workforce. They've done an exceptional job over and over, whether it is the routine functions of 6 7 Town government, whether it is dealing with this 8 pandemic, whether it is their commitment to provide 9 the best services of any Town, so we are adhering 10 to all Civil Service Law, all of our regulations as 11 they relate to our Town contract, and we recognize 12 that we have in place a system by which when 13 employees reach their two-year anniversary, that's 14 when the contract calls for these changes that 15 we're addressing tonight. 16 So, I thank you. 17 AUDIENCE SPEAKER: How about the Tax 18 Receiver's class? 19 MR. PRAVATO: I don't know what you're 20 talking about. I have no idea what you're talking 21 about. 22 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I don't believe 23 this is related to the Tax Receiver. 24 Is that a Public Safety issue? 25 AUDIENCE SPEAKER: Actually --

2	McCaffrey, Commissioner of Public Safety.
