2 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good morning, 1 2 ladies and gentlemen. 3 Welcome to the Oyster Bay Town Board 4 meeting for Tuesday, May 5, 2020. We welcome you 5 all here virtually on the Internet as we continue to socially distance due to the coronavirus 6 7 pandemic. 8 I'm joined here by our Oyster Bay Town 9 Clerk Rich LaMarca who is situated a safe distance 10 away and is continuing to handle all of his 11 responsibilities with these proceedings as well as 12 his responsibilities as Town Clerk. 13 Also, at a very safe distance, joined 14 by our Receiver of Taxes Jeff Pravato and, 15 obviously, our stenographer. 16 Thank you for being here with us today 17 as well. 18 The entire Town Board is all recorded -- the Board meeting is all recorded for the 19 20 public's review. 2.1 We are also joined by the members of 22 the Oyster Bay Town Board by phone who are actively 23 participating in this meeting, meeting all the 24 requirements of the law so that we can continue

government for you, our residents.

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Since our last meeting we received some good news. Long Island has witnessed some of the lowest COVID-19 statistics in weeks, thank God.

It is still a very difficult time. Our hearts go out to all of the families who have suffered by losing their loved ones to this disease because of those who are sick and suffering and, of course, all of our heros on the front lines, our medical personnel, our emergency responders, all are tremendous heroes, our medical providers in health care. We appreciate them very much.

Remind us that we are in this together and that our own needs come second to working as a community to protect one another. God bless those health care workers. God bless everyone with the strength to continue on and know that we have each other to lean on, to talk to, and to be supportive of, continue to support each

other.

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And God, please get us through this pandemic safely. God bless all of those who have passed. God bless all of the families. Please give them strength as they deal with this terrible tragedy. God bless each and every one of you and thank you all for being very strong, respectful and helpful during these difficult times. Amen.

Now, I'm going to ask for a moment of silence as we recognize the work of the front line health care workers, recognize the work of the first responders, the EMTs, everyone in the fire safety services and the emergency response businesses, all of our front line essential workers, everyone for all they're going through and remember our veterans.

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started with the business of the day, I ask -- I remind all Board members every time you speak, please start off by saying your name so we know who is speaking, the public knows who is speaking.

I'm going to hand the floor over to our Receiver of Taxes Jeff Pravato who has some announcements in terms of the collection of taxes which is going on and will share with us a number of ways we've changed things to protect the public and our employees.

MR. PRAVATO: Thank you, Supervisor.

With the help of the Supervisor and our other friends in the County and the Town of Hempstead and other towns around Long Island, we have gotten the Governor to extend the school -- the second half school tax to June 1st.

So, that will be without penalty to

June 1st. We're also working on the last couple of

days here, we're going to set up a walk-up window

here at Town Hall North and then again at Town Hall

South.

So, be prepared for an announcement of that. We're just trying to get everything -- the final things figured out with that and the residents will be able to walk up outside, come up

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to the outside window, you'll be able to pay by check, money order or credit card. There will be no cash accepted at the outside window.

Also, don't forget that you can pay by eCheck online. It's only 75 cents. We negotiated that rate down, but you can also pay by credit card. The credit card company still charges the rate that they do. They would not reduce their fee.

You can still also mail it in. As usual, our staff is there answering questions all day, answering e-mails and taking the payments in on mail. We've been getting a lot of calls. We know the hardships that are out there for the taxpayers, the residents and the businesses. We are trying to help you in any which way we can, that I can. God bless, everybody. Be safe. Stay healthy and, as the Supervisor said, keep social distancing.

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I have to thank you, but it also reminds us about all of our Town employees. Town employees have continued to do their jobs.

There's been no missing -- whether it's garbage, Sanitation pickup, recycling, all of the different functions you've continued to process in the Tax office, the checks, you continue to process and the Town Clerk's office and all our Board and all the employees continue to work full throttle for our residents, and we thank them all just like we've been thanking our health care workers, doing a phenomenal job and we're going to join with all our Town residents tomorrow which is Wednesday, May 6th. It is National Nurses Day and, frankly, the week of May 6th through May 12th is National Nurses Week and National Hospital Week.

Of course, these dates take on a tremendous added meaning. We are all so grateful for their work done in the hospitals. You know, they've been compared to -- this has been compared to a war. I will take it a step further, and we have enormous respect for our Veterans, everything they do for us, and we can only begin to understand what they go through with the bullets coming at them.

A Resolution on our contract for MSW which is Municipal Solid Waste. We entered into a contract for three five-year terms. We are beginning the third five-year term, but now we're going to break it out by year, so if the Town wants to change the way in which we collect Municipal Solid Waste, we're not responsible for a five-year contract; just one year at a time which is the appropriate way to do it.

As we've stated in the past, we are

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looking at all alternatives and all of the best practices, state of the art practices for recycling and Sanitation to be in line with our residents.

There's a Resolution to enter into the bid construction phase for the restoration of improvements at Alhambra Park that is being paid for entirely by state and federal funding. It's New York Rising Funding and people can understand our frustration.

The hurricane was in 2012 and the Town has been following all the rules and making sure that we're adhering to everything as part of New York Rising program, but the State is -- well, it makes the process very long.

The Town has done everything in our power to keep this program moving. We will have a new park with new bulkhead and make it more storm resistant and that is being paid for, as we said, not from Town funds but from they moneys from grants as part of New York Rising Community Restoration Construction Program.

We have some installation of piping in Bethpage. It's part of continuing to protect our residents from the Grumman Navy Plume and pushing that along, as well as the fire protection
