10 1 MR. ADELMAN: Good morning, Board, Town 2 Supervisor. 3 The first question I have is the tabled Resolution 281. I'm curious to know what that 4 5 pertains to, so I don't even know if I want to talk 6 about that. 7 MR. ALTADONNA: You want me to read it? MR. ADELMAN: Can the Clerk read into 8 9 the record, please? 10 MR. ALTADONNA: It's a Resolution 11 pertaining to a dock application of Kathleen 12 Austin, 59 Stillwater Avenue, Massapequa, New York. 13 This is a lengthy one. 14 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Is that enough 15 information for you, Mr. Adelman? 16 MR. ADELMAN: I remember. Okay. 17 have no objection to that. 18 I'm hear to talk about Resolution 371, 19 permission for Long Island Uncorked for a waiver of 20 Ordinance 168-22. Nowhere in the Resolution does 2.1 it discuss any fees the Town is charging this 22 organization. 23 As far as I know, this is a for-profit 24 organization. They do charge people to attend. 25 There is no backup data regarding this request.

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I'm curious how this event benefits the residents of the Town of Oyster Bay. I assume there's an issue of Certificate of Insurance yet, because there's be no reason to spend money on that if they don't know they're going to have the affair.

Next, I want to talk about 379

regarding the issue of refunding bonds. This was

110 pages worth of documentation. I couldn't get

through it. I don't know if any of the Board

Members did. I'd be curious if any of you could

get through it. It would be nice if the Finance

Department, whoever is putting forth this

Resolution, had given a two-page synopsis of what

this -- how it really saves us money so we don't

have to go through the whole 110 pages.

My next Resolution I question is
On-Call Engineering Consultant Services regarding
the roof at the Littauer Estate. The request is to
put aside \$93,500 for engineering and architectural
plans.

My question is, the documentation I have shows that we've already drawn down \$53,000 of \$150,000 allotted for this plan and I'm just curious what we've already spent 50,000 on and that

12 we're just planning to spend 93 on architectural 1 2 engineering. 3 Do we have any scope of what the full 4 project will cost to repair or replace the roof on 5 the --COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Littauer --6 7 MR. ADELMAN: The barn, whatever it is. 8 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: It's a house, a 9 mansion. I believe this will come back with the 10 amount. 11 MR. ADELMAN: It doesn't talk if it's 12 slate or --13 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Cedar shakes are 14 on there right now and they're going to replace 15 with cedar shakes. But that's what this consultant 16 is for, to come back with a recommendation. 17 MR. ADELMAN: My question pertains to 18 the requested money -- I left it on my seat. talks about they've already drawn down \$53,000. 19 20 I'm curious who was that paid to. 2.1 Was that paid to the engineering firm 22 as well prior to this request because it's very 23 confusing? I'd like to know what we're spending 24 money on and if it's really legitimate. 25 And, finally, did the Inspector General

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go over the documentation on these things? Let's see what we've got.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you very much.

First of all, let's talk about

Resolution 379. Many know that because of the proper management and the finances of the Town of Oyster Bay paying down the largest amount of capital debt in the history of the Town, we have entirely paid off the -- what was a \$44,000,000 operating budget deficit, before I got here. We have paid that off entirely.

Our independent auditor is coming out with that independent report and -- which will make it very clear to the public that we have entirely paid off the deficit and, indeed, we cut taxes, brought up the bond rating, so by bringing up the bond rating, we have access to better rates.

Quite simply, we took \$3,000,000. We borrowed -- we borrowed \$3,000,000 while relieving that \$3,000,000 -- which was at a higher debt and borrowed it at a lower percentage, lower interest payment and, therefore, we're making appreciable savings on interest.

There is no additional borrowing and

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I'm going to bring Rob Darienzo up for a moment just to confirm the numbers.

Quite frankly, all of our residents are very proud of the much better financial shape -- remarkably better financial shape the Town is in because of the management of this administration and this Board.

MR. DARIENZO: Good evening, Supervisor and Town Board.

The Resolution in question --

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just start by giving us your presence.

MR. DARIENZO: I'm sorry.

Rob Darienzo Director of Finance, Town of Oyster Bay.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

MR. DARIENZO: The Resolution in question mentions borrowing up to \$3,000,000 in refunding bonds.

It's actually 2 million -- \$2,185,000 in bonds that were issued in 2009 will be refunded at the amount of 2,165,000. We're going to save \$20,000 in principal and over \$100,000 in interest over the next nine years. \$53,000 combined will be saved over 2019 and 2020. So this is a very small

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savings compared to the other refinancing we've done in the past, but saving \$100,000 over nine years is better than save nothing.

And the figures have in your backup were issued as of May 30th. Today is June 18th.

We're going to a new bond rating in early July before these figures are finalized. So, if our bond rating goes up between now and the actual present date, we should stand to see additional savings. It's also subject to whatever the market will bear because the market changes every single day.

Right now, what's proposed to us by our outside financial advisors and underwriters told us, hey, if you were to refinance this debt, you'll save over \$100,000 over the next nine years or 50K in the two years, why wouldn't you do it. And so we're going to. And the \$100,000 should be the bear minimum if, in fact, the market stays the way it is when that pricing was done on May 30th.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you very much. We appreciate the detail.

MR. DARIENZO: No problem.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And we're very proud of the good work that you're doing.

16 1 MR. DARIENZO: Thank you. 2 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: The next issue 3 was an issue in regard to -- was that 371? 4 MR. ADELMAN: Yes, sir. 5 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: 371, okay. Commissioner Pinto, are you prepared to 6 7 talk to us on this issue? 8 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Good evening. 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Would you mind 10 starting off by stating your presence? 11 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Joseph Pinto, 12 Commissioner of Parks. 13 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 14 Mr. Adelman has asked about Resolution 15 371 which relates to an event going on much like 16 the many events we have in the Town, whether it's the Oyster Festival that uses facilities and 17 18 properties of the Town and a long, long list of 19 festivals and events that other entities come in. 20 Let's start off by asking, is this a 2.1 not-for-profit organization? 22 COMMISSIONER PINTO: It is not. 23 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: It is not. 24 So, can you tell us a little bit about 25 how we came upon the contract with them?

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COMMISSIONER PINTO: I received a phone call from this gentleman and he went through his plan on what he's done in the past.

At the time, we were hearing from some of the merchants over at Ransom -- across from Ransom - how there isn't as much traffic anymore in that area. And we just thought that if we brought this gentleman in to do this event, we might get some more people into that area and they may start frequencing some of our establishments across the street.

He has reached out to a lot of the merchants over there. He's going to try to get them involved with this group is what he's trying to do. We just thought it would be a good idea to bring him in and see if it works.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Can you make sure that -- can you ask them to reach out to all of the stores and shops that are applicable in that community so that everyone has an equal chance at playing a role in this event?

COMMISSIONER PINTO: Sure.

COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Commissioner, how much are we charging this group to use our facilities?

18 1 COMMISSIONER PINTO: It's going to be 2 \$1,000 for each facility. He is using the deli, 3 Ransom, and Centre Island for parking and so, then 4 if there is any lights or stuff like that. 5 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Thank you, sir. SUPERVISOR SALADINO: So we are 6 7 charging \$1,000 per facility --COMMISSIONER PINTO: Yes. 8 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: -- and the cost of the use of these resources? 10 11 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Yes. 12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And then, in 13 addition to that, we expect it to be helping the 14 businesses there who have been hurt from a 15 multitude of issues including the closing of Shore 16 Road. That really put -- that they came to us and 17 told us that they were hurt by that. 18 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Yes. 19 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: They're paying 20 light you said, security --2.1 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Exactly. 22 Initially, the gentleman wanted to 23 bring food trucks in and we told him he couldn't do that because of the restaurants across the way. 24 25 Then we decided to have him go talk to them and try

19 1 to bring them in. He might bring in some food 2 tasting stuff, but we think it's a positive for the 3 community and for the Town and we hope it's a 4 success. 5 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And they have a positive track record? 6 7 COMMISSIONER PINTO: Yes. From what I 8 understand, yes. 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. 10 Does anybody have any other questions? 11 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: It sounds like a 12 fun event. COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: I think the 13 14 confusion, I'm not sure, but I think he thinks we 15 were waiving the fees, but you're only waiving a 16 part of our code that allows them to bring in 17 alcoholic beverages? 18 COMMISSIONER PINTO: As we do all the 19 other bazaars and feasts that go on throughout the 20 Town. 2.1 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Or if the group 22 wanted to use one of our parks and they wanted to 23 have alcohol there? 24 COMMISSIONER PINTO: We have to have a 25 waiver. It's just normal practice for us.

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1	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you very
2	much.
3	I'm glad we brought clarity to that.
4	(Mr. Adelman raises his hand.)
5	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Yes?
6	MR. ADELMAN: One question regarding
7	the \$1,000 rental, that refers to Resolution, I
8	think, 127-2017. That was the rental rate board
9	came up with back in 2017. I don't know anybody
10	who pays the same rent as they did in 2017. So I
11	don't understand how Commissioner Pinto came up
12	with \$1,000 per location. We have no I can't
13	find any information about this organization. So I
14	would appreciate it if the Commissioner could
15	e-mail me. I know he has my e-mail address.
16	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: You have the
17	Commissioner right here, right now.
18	Why not do it immediately? Sit with
19	him.
20	MR. ADELMAN: I'd love to.
21	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Get some more
22	information from him this evening, and we are happy
23	to provide you the information.
24	Will you be attending and supporting
25	the event?

2.1 MR. ADELMAN: I have no idea. I don't 1 2 know what they are doing. 3 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Wine tasting. SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Yes, wine 4 5 tasting, food tasting and they'll be showing off 6 the best of the best in restaurants and so forth 7 and we hope that many of the establishments in 8 Bayville will participate. 9 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: It's just fun, 10 Arthur. It's just fun. 11 MR. ADELMAN: Okay. 12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All right. 13 Thank you. 14 MR. ADELMAN: Last item. 15 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Which was? 16 MR. DARIENZO: So, on the form, it 19 shows 56,881.33 has been funded to date against 20 Resolution 861-2017. The total authorization was 2.1 for \$150,381.33, leaving a balance of \$93,500. 22 \$93,500 is what's being requested on this form. 23 COMMISSIONER LENZ: Mr. Adelman is 24 asking what this is for.

The \$56,881.33 simply

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23 1 represents any funds that were authorized under 2 this Resolution by this Board prior to this date. 3 I don't have any backup to get to 56,000 but rest 4 assured they were all authorized by this Board 5 previously to this date. COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: You couldn't 19 20 possibly be half that amount. 2.1 COMMISSIONER LENZ: Exactly. 22 So, the first portion of this of 20,000 23 is for the investigation that you were talking

about earlier to investigate what type of roof,

24 have better structure underneath? 1 2 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: What condition 3 it's in. It's an old building. It has been 4 neglected. COMMISSIONER LENZ: The second portion 5 is to -- for the design documents to go out to bid 6 7 and then the third portion is -- the third portion 8 is for the construction oversight of the 9 contractor. That's how this is broken out. 10 Thank you. 11 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. 12 And is the normal process of following 13 the law and preparing to go out to bid, is this the 14 same process that we follow for every other bid? 15 COMMISSIONER LENZ: Yes, it is. We bid 16 all our contracts. 17 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Outside the 18 building being very old and historic, is there --19 it's very old and therefore, it needs special 20 attention and how this process goes about. 2.1 COMMISSIONER LENZ: Exactly. 22 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Is there anything 23 else unusual about this that changes the process 24 from the vast, vast majority of the processes that

we go out to bid with?
