2 1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good morning, 2 ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the Oyster Bay 3 Town Board meeting of Tuesday, July 10, 2018. 4 Welcome to Town Hall. 5 To lead us in prayer, please welcome our friend, Pastor John Yenchko of North Shore 6 7 Community Church in Oyster Bay. 8 (Whereupon, a prayer was recited by 9 Pastor John Yenchko.) 10 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Pastor 11 Yenchko. 12 Under your direction, North Shore 13 Community Church in Oyster Bay has continued to 14 advance its mission to celebrate, communicate and 15 cultivate the glory and the love of God in the 16 North Shore community, and we thank you very much. 17 Next, I'd like welcome Brian Parker of 18 Adopt-A-Battalion based in Massapequa Park, who 19 will lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance. 20 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance 21 was recited by Brian Parker.) 22 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Brian. 23 And before we sit, I ask that we all 24 pause for a moment of silence for our men and women 25 in the United States Armed Forces serving here and

serving abroad, as well as recognition of the men 1 2 and women in law enforcement. 3 (Whereupon, a moment of silence was 4 observed.) 5 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you very much. 6 7 Thank you to Brian. 8 Today marks the culmination of the Town 9 of Oyster Bay's Annual Soldier Collection Drive, 10 which takes place and donated supplies from Town of 11 Oyster Bay employees and from the public. 12 drive makes provisions to ship these needed items 13 to our troops stationed overseas. 14 Items include toiletries, so many 15 necessities, and even candy to bring some happiness to those away from home and away from their loved 16 17 ones. 18 The initiative was started some ten 19 years ago by Councilman Anthony Macagnone. Thanks 20 to everyone's generosity, it is still going strong 2.1 and it is strongly supported. 22 Councilman Macagnone, the floor is 23 yours, sir. 24 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Thank you, 25 Supervisor.

I don't know if any of you guys, residents ever spoke to somebody coming back from overseas that's received, from wherever it came from, a care package. How much it felt like home to them or it was clean socks or some candy or some shampoo, some soap, whatever it was, it brightened up their day. You know, they are serving us, protecting us, and we made them feel better.

So we started this ten years ago. I have to thank my assistant, Mary Diglio, who basically runs the entire thing for me, and I want to thank Brian Parker from Adopt-A-Battalion who graciously accepts these -- the items and sends them overseas to our troops, and I want to thank our employees and our residents for being so generous.

Supervisor?

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Well, let's have a big hand for Brian Parker, Councilman Tony Macagnone, and his staff.

(Applause.)

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And the generosity of our employees and the public. Thank you, Councilman.

Adopt-A-Battalion is represented here

5 today by Brian Parker, who will be taking care of 1 2 shipping these items, as mentioned. I'd like to 3 invite -- we would like to invite Brian to the 4 podium to talk a bit about Adopt-A-Battalion, and 5 to thank our residents and employees. Ladies and gentlemen, Brian Parker of 6 7 Adopt-A-Battalion. 8 (Applause.) 9 MR. PARKER: Morning, Supervisor, Town 10 Thank you, everybody. 11 This year, third year that I got to 12 work with the Town, and actually, best year yet, so 13 I cannot do anything but thank the Town employees 14 and the residents. 15 Right now, we've shipped 136 boxes as 16 of today and we still have to pick up from Bethpage 17 ice rink, Town Hall South and the Union office. 18 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: And clean out my office, too? 19 20 MR. PARKER: Yes, I can get that, too, 2.1 Tony, thank you. 22 And so we gauging probably we will 23 finish at about 175, 200 packages, which is the 24 best in the three years that we've done this, so I

have to thank the residents and employees for that.

MR. PARKER: I just wanted to give a brief back story about this organization. My father actually started this back in 2004 when my brother was doing his first tour in Iraq, and, you know, like most military, got homesick, so they put it, as Tony was saying, you know, clean pair of socks and T-shirts and candy, so on and so forth, and one of his fellow Marines actually got wind of it so he actually wrote my parents a letter and then they sent him a care package. And it kind of, you know, expanded from them.

Like I said, we've been doing this since 2004 and the number that we've shipped is probably around 15,000 packages since its inception.

The best part is -- or my favorite part is -- the best news is, after 32 years, my brother who got the first care package will actually be retiring a full Colonel from the United States

Marine Corps with two tours of Iraq under his belt in July, so that's the best gift that I can ask for.

(Applause.)

MR. PARKER: If anybody does need any

further information on the -- on Adopt-A-Battalion, we have a website, it's adoptabattalion.org and there's everything that you can want to know on there. There's phone numbers, e-mail contacts, the dates that we ship, who we ship to. There's thank you letters.

And once again, I just wanted to take the time to thank, you know, Supervisor Saladino, Councilman Macagnone, rest of the Town Board, residents, and the employees because without you guys, it's not possible, so thank you very much.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

That was very kind of you, but without our employees and the generosity of the public all involved, this wouldn't happen, and I want to, again, thank Councilman Tony Macagnone, whose commitment to America is applaudable.

We appreciate your efforts to bring this to our Town. We appreciate your staff and Mary and everyone to keep this going. It bodes well to recognize our troops, and in the Town of Oyster Bay, it really shows what we're all about.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Before we get started, there are a few items of news that are very, very important to share, not the least of which is a important message that I would like to call on Councilwoman Johnson to please address.

COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Thank you, Supervisor.

This is in reference to our last Town
Board meeting of June 26, 2018. While praise and
criticism are always expected at Town Board
meetings and at Town Hall, sexual gestures are not.

Sexual gestures are a form of sexual harassment. They're not tolerated in Hollywood, they're not tolerated in society, and they shouldn't be -- ever be tolerated here in Town Hall. Sexual gestures made at the last Town Board meeting by a member of the public were highly offensive and degrading.

These actions broke the rules of decorum for our Town government and our society as a whole. They created a hostile work environment for the Town Board and the members of the public, and I don't think any of us leave our homes on a Tuesday night to come and be degraded and offended, and should never be allowed to happen.

COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: We must have zero tolerance when it comes to sexual harassment, and like all employers, we must take immediate corrective action.

For those reasons, the Town Attorney issued a temporary ban to Kevin McKenna for his lewd and inappropriate and disgusting behavior.

If our rules of decorum are not strong enough to enforce the ban and if Mr. McKenna is unwilling to voluntarily adhere to the ban, then

I'll ask that our rules be strengthened to protect everyone from such harassment and that we have a meeting swiftly to do this.

Instead of allowing such behavior to continue in silence, the media and those present, should have reported on what occurred here two weeks ago.

Rather than report on this lewd and appropriate behavior, stories ran about a public safety decision made by the Nassau County Police Department to ban signs that included wooden stakes from entering this venue and signs that very well may have limited the sight of the camera that actually caught these actions on the camera.

1 Hashtag me too movement isn't just a 2 movement, it's a reality, and it takes all of us to 3 break the silence and stop unacceptance -- stop the 4 acceptance of unwelcome, offensive and degrading 5 behavior. This should never be allowed to happen. 6 This should never ever take place, and none of us 7 should ever be subjected to this ever again. 8 Thank you. 9 (Applause.) 10 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Thank you, 11 Supervisor. 12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, 13 Councilwoman. That's --14 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Thank you for 15 all of your support, and I really feel it's something that needs to be addressed immediately 16 and further. 17 18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I concur. 19 Thank you, Councilwoman. 20 Just to bring you up to speed on some 2.1 other important news as well. We have some news 22 that is clearly some good news for so many 23 residents of the Town of Oyster Bay, especially on 24 the North Shore. 25 Thanks to many people in the community

who came together in opposition, we were able to work with everyone to end New York State's plans to build across Sound Tunnel from Long Island to Westchester.

I thank my colleagues, our State senator, assemblymen, County legislators, Village mayors, Friends of the Bay, coalition, dozens of residents and activists for helping convince

New York State that this was the wrong place for that plan.

All the elected officials and civic organizations helped make the difference in protecting our beloved community.

While this recent decision is a relief, we must remain vigilant. We must ensure that this plan never goes forward in our Town as it would only serve to ruin the character of our local communities, the quality of life, and threaten our environment and our shoreline. The Town of Oyster Bay is the wrong place for a plan of that nature.

While we disagreed with the State on the tunnel, we do agree with them on the need to revitalize Hicksville. Again, we'd like to thank the State for recognizing our vision and awarding the Town of Oyster Bay \$10 million.

Last week, we were proud to join with Governor Cuomo as he selected four projects -- the committee selected four projects for revitalization in Downtown Hicksville. The projects nominated by the Downtown Hicksville Revitalization Local Planning Committee will support increased access to transportation, improve walkability and attract new opportunities for our residents.

I'd also like to specifically thank

Councilwoman Rebecca Alesia, Councilman Tony

Macagnone and others on this Town Board and this

community who have been working on Hicksville

projects and issues for quite some time, and it's

absolutely wonderful when we all come together. We

work together as one team. We won the grant. We

showed that Hicksville is very, very important, and

that the future of Hicksville is bright and we want

to especially thank the Hicksville community for

standing up and joining with us.

So, if gentleman from Hicksville Civic would all take a bow, please.

(Applause.)

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: These projects, along with the MTA's \$132 million investment in the Hicksville Railroad Station will continue to

transform Hicksville into a vibrant downtown for 1 2 everyone. Everyone, including downsizers, empty 3 nesters, senior citizens, millennials. 4 We plan on providing millennials what 5 they have asked for, we plan on keeping them here, and we will continue to succeed to make Hicksville 6 7 the beautiful vibrant template for the rest of the State of New York. 8 9 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Supervisor, if I 10 may? 11 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Yes, absolutely. 12 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: You omitted one 13 very important person, Deputy Supervisor Greg Carman who chaired -- cochaired that committee. 14 15 Greq, you did an excellent job. 16 (Applause.) 17 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, 18 Councilman. 19 Thank you to all of you. Everyone who 20 played a role in this, every member of this Town 2.1 Board, all of our elected officials in Oyster Bay, 22 the communities coming together. 23 You know, Councilman, you remember that 24 meeting that was held in Hicksville High School, 25 and it was in the beginning of my tenure here, and

I thought, oh boy, this certainly is going to be a major rock to climb, but as we went along and as the process unfolded, we saw the participants, our partners in this, we saw everyone working together and this continues to be a shining success and a fine example on government administration, working with the community, working with Albany, and had bringing our best foot forward.

Hicksville will benefit, as well as the entire Town of Oyster Bay. People from all walks of life, people from all communities, people -- the diversity of Hicksville is absolutely wonderful, and we're so happy to have everything that's going on in Hicksville as part of the Town of Oyster Bay, and it is the banner we will continue to fly, so thank you to each and every one of you.

Another group that benefits in Downtown Hicksville is our veterans. Our veterans are exceptionally important to us, as proven on a project that we just recognized, but each and every day. And tonight, we will be joining at John Burns Park in Massapequa for our Annual Salute to America where we will recognize our veterans. It begins earlier than most of our shows, at 7:30 p.m.

Our Salute to America is a patriotic event that will inspire all in attendance.

Everyone is welcome. It's all free. Get there early.

And lastly, I want to remind our residents -- we want to remind our residents that the Town will host a Shootout For Soldiers, which is an amazing event, very exciting. It's a 24-hour lacrosse tournament, and these games will benefit our soldiers, will be played at the Field of Dreams located on Old Sunrise Highway in Massapequa.

This year's Rock-Around-the-Clock event begins in the morning of July 12th at 9:00 a.m. and continues nonstop for 24 hours, until July 13th at 9:00 a.m. The event benefits our veterans and active duty military personnel. The Long Island Air Force Association will conduct a special

We have our first public hearing, which is P-3-18, To consider the application of Beechwood PV Retail, LLC, fee owner, and SLT Plainview, LLC, proposed lessee, for a Special Use Permit to allow the operation of a Pilates studio/fitness center in excess of 1,500 square feet in Building C on the subject premises located in the (GB) General Business District, at the southwest corner of Old Country Road and Round Swap Road, Plainview, New York.

MR. PIZZULLI: Thank you,
Mr. Altadonna.

Good morning, Mr. Supervisor, members of the Board.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good morning.

MR. PIZZULLI: My name is Vincent
Pizzulli with offices at 200 Robbins Lane in
Jericho, representing the applicants, Beechwood PV
Retail and SLT Plainview. Beechwood PV Retail is
the owner of the subject premises and SLT Plainview
is the lessee.

The subject premises is Building C of the Country Pointe Shopping Center located near the southwest corner of Old Country Road and Round Swamp Road in Plainview. The shopping center

2.1

consists of two tax lots, and Building C is situated -- excuse me -- on Section 46, Block E, Lot 759.

Tax Lot 759 contains 9.063 acres and is zoned General Business District. To the north of the premises is an industrial park on properties zoned Light Industrial. To the south is the Country Pointe Condominium development, which is zoned RMF-16, and currently under construction.

To the west is ShopRite and the Future of Golden Age. Residential property is located to the east.

The Country Pointe Shopping Center is still under construction, but it is nearing completion. As you know, ShopRite has opened and is doing very well, thanks, in part, to you.

Trio Hardware, which is located in
Building F, has opened, and Chase Bank will be
opening soon, by the end of the month, in
Building E. The remainder of the shopping center,
Buildings A through D, and they're depicted on the
site plan on the easel to my right, is almost
finished, and various tenant spaces in these
buildings have been leased to several tenants.

Among these are Starbucks, a salon, and

2.1

a confectionery store in Building B, an Italian restaurant in Building A. Leases are also pending for a financial services company in Building B and an organic restaurant in Building C.

The subject application concerns

Building C, in which 1,760 square feet has been

leased to SLT. In the packet that I handed up this

morning, you'll see floor plans for the proposed

tenant space and the tenant spaces highlighted in

yellow on the site plan on the easel.

We are requesting a special permit for a fitness center in excess of 1,500 square feet. The proposed fitness center is a Pilates studio. Pilates, for anyone who isn't aware, is a form of exercise that emphasizes the balanced development of the body through core strength and flexibility training and efficient and graceful movement.

The hours of operation are 5:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Classes are scheduled every hour on the half hour. It's important for the studio to open at 5:30 in order to be able to train students who need to schedule classes before their workday begins.

On a typical day at other SLT studios, which, by the way, the packet will indicate there

are currently 24 locations in the -- I'm sorry, 17 locations in the Metro New York area, 24 total.

There is currently an SLT studio in Roslyn and three on the East End.

On a typical day, there are five to seven consecutive classes beginning at 5:30, followed by a midday break, and three to four sessions in the evening for students who can train after work hours. Only one class is scheduled per hour.

SLT will have 12 exercise stations. It will employ one on-site manager, and eight to ten instructors. Each instructor will teach two or three classes in a row and each class will have a maximum of 12 students, one for each exercise station. At any given time, no more than 13 or 14 people will be on premises. Each session is 50 minutes, so students will leave and arrive during the ten minutes in between each session.

In terms of accessory uses, the SLT will only sell bottled water and branded fitness apparel on the premises.

Parking requirements: By Code, 24 parking spaces are required. One space for 75 square feet of gross floor area. The Code

2.1

requirement is twice the maximum number of students who will attend each class at any given time.

Since the Pilates studio will also share the off-street parking spaces provided for the entire Country Pointe Shopping Center, there will be more than enough off-street parking. In fact, when taken together with all of the other approved and permitted uses depicted on the site plan, a total of 614 parking spaces are required and 741 spaces are provided, so the shopping center has 127 surplus parking spaces.

With me this morning is a representative from SLT, Alana Weinstein, if the Board has any questions of her. Also with me is one of the principals of Beechwood PV, Steven Dubb.

COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Somewhat irrespective of this particular application, but because I have you as a captive audience, I am receiving phone calls from people that are getting nails in their tires after driving on Old Country Road.

Do you think that you -- during construction, do you think that you could assist with getting that cleaned up or some kind of a -- I mean, I know a street sweeper would be on the

County, but since this is clearly construction 1 2 related, it's anecdotal at the moment, but it has 3 been an overwhelming amount of phone calls. 4 MR. PIZZULLI: Councilwoman, I'd be 5 happy to help. When we leave here this morning, 6 we'll contact our construction superintendent and 7 ask him to police those areas. 8 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Thank you. 9 Have you taken a Pilates class? 10 MR. PIZZULLI: No, I have not. I need 11 one, though. 12 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: I feel that it is 13 a less informed presentation without firsthand 14 knowledge. 15 (Laughter ensues.) SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Are there any 16 17 questions from any of the Board? 18 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: No. I just 19 realized the space is 30 by 50. It's not a 20 gigantic gym. 2.1 MR. PIZZULLI: If the space was 260 22 square feet less, we wouldn't be having this 23 hearing this morning. 2.4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Is there any correspondence? 25

9 MR. ALTADONNA: Yes. 1 2 The attorney for the applicant has filed his Affidavit of Service and Disclosure. 3 Communications are as follows: We have 4 5 memos from the Department of Planning and Development. As per present review procedures, the 6 7 application requires a total of 614 parking spaces. 8 The site plan submitted depicts a total 9 of 741 spaces. The Nassau County Land and Tax Map 10 indicates the property as Section 47, Block E, Lot 11 759. According to the Town of Oyster Bay Zoning 12 Maps, the property is located within a (GB) General 13 Business zone. 14 There are no variances or open prior 15 Code Enforcement Bureau cases; however, there are 16 Town Board Resolutions on file. There is no 17 further correspondence. 18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Town 19 Clerk Altadonna. 20 Is there any member of the public that 2.1 would like to be heard on this application? Anyone 22 at all? 23 (No verbal response given.) 2.4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Anyone outside in 25 the lobby?
