2 1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good evening, 2 ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the Oyster Bay 3 Town Board meeting of Tuesday, October 16, 2018. 4 This is our second meeting today, our 5 7:00 p.m. meeting here in Oyster Bay Town Hall. To lead us in prayer, I'm going to ask 6 7 our Receiver, James Stefanich -- oh, very good. 8 Wonderful. I didn't see you back there. 9 apologize. 10 So we are going to be led in prayer by 11 Deacon Lynne Waldeck of the Trinity Lutheran Church 12 in Hicksville. 13 Deacon, the podium is yours. 14 (Whereupon, a prayer was recited by 15 Deacon Lynne Waldeck.) 16 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Deacon 17 Waldeck. Always a pleasure to see you. 18 While we are still standing, I'm 19 going -- we are going to welcome Robert Gecino, a 20 Personal Specialist and expeditionary Warfare 2.1 Specialist in the United States Navy, to lead us in 22 the Pledge of Allegiance. 23 Looking for Robert Gecino. Okay. 24 Maybe he's running a little bit behind. 25 So, Councilman, would you lead us in

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the Pledge of Allegiance?

(Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by Councilman Macagnone.)

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I'd like to take this moment to ask for a moment of silence for our men and women in the United States Armed Services serving us here in the homeland and abroad, and in recognition of the men and women in law enforcement and all of our first responders who are always in our prayers.

(Whereupon, a moment of silence was observed.)

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you.

Today we are welcoming residents in both the daytime and evening sessions to -- as we host two Town Board meetings on the same day designed to discuss the 2019 proposed Town budget, which I recently submitted to the Town Board for consideration.

Then the next step is this hearing so that the public may hear and the Town Board members may ask questions in regard to our budget and where our Town is headed financially. The budget reflects the successes we've achieved over the past twenty months.

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And I'm going to give a much more condensed version than I gave this morning as an overview, but we have reduced, at this point thus far, we have -- being 2017 and up to this point in 2018 -- we've reduced the Town debt by a record \$135 million while cutting property taxes

1.3 million in 2018. It's the first Town of Oyster Bay property tax reduction in more than two decades and the \$134 million reflects the largest decrease in Town debt throughout the Town's history.

Our overall success was recognized by the Wall Street firm Standard and Poor's global ratings earlier this year when the Town received an upgrade in its bond rating to investment grade.

This proposed budget reflects our successes and the fact that we are holding the line on property taxes, no new taxes in the Town of Oyster Bay in 2019, after coming off of a year, 2018, where we were able to cut taxes.

In the 2019 Budget, we have reduced spending and we have a continuance of the substantial debt reduction. We have improved our Town services, and we are continuing to pave our roads and maintain our facilities. So we're exceptionally proud of the 2019 proposed budget and

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the combination of the 2018 Budget and the 2019 Budget.

By the end of 2019, if passed as is, we will have reduced the Town's debt by a net of \$150 million.

When we came here to the Town of Oyster Bay, the structural deficit in the ongoing -- continued ongoing budget on the operating side, the Town had a \$44 million deficit. Through the 2019 Budget, we are planning to do away with that deficit entirely. So we're working very hard toward that.

We're focused very carefully on the way the Town spends its money and we're on very solid financial footing, but we'll hear more about that.

Again, the 2019 Budget freezes property taxes, provides for tax relief, and gets our finances under control.

So that's the condensed version. We'll be hearing from our Director of Operations and some of our other Town personnel, and you'll get to hear a bit about the budget. And then after that, we'll go to Public Comment where there are a number of people who would like to be heard in the Public Comment section.

1 So without anymore hesitation, I'll ask 2 the Town Clerk to please poll the Board. 3 MR. ALTADONNA: Supervisor Saladino? SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Present. 4 5 MR. ALTADONNA: Councilman Muscarella? COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: Here. 6 7 MR. ALTADONNA: Councilman Macagnone? 8 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Here, Clerk 9 Altadonna. MR. ALTADONNA: Councilwoman Alesia? 10 11 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Still here. 12 Good evening, Jim. Councilwoman Johnson? 13 14 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Here. 15 MR. ALTADONNA: Councilman Imbroto? 16 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: I'm present. 17 MR. ALTADONNA: Councilman Hand? 18 COUNCILMAN HAND: Here. 19 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. So we are 20 going to call our one and only hearing this 2.1 evening, and that's on our proposed budget, and I'd 22 like to ask our Director of Finance, Robert 23 Darienzo, to please step forward for this 24 presentation. 25 MR. DARIENZO: Good evening, Supervisor

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and Town Board members.

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Rob Darienzo. I'm the Director of Finance here at the Town of Oyster Bay.

You gave your condensed version of the budget overview, but I'm going to condense your condensed version.

I have sat in your office for several hours over several meetings where you laid out your blueprint for how you wanted the 2019 Budget to take form, and you had a couple of major points.

Chiefly among them was to ensure that we would not raise taxes in 2019, that we would maintain the tax cut that was put into place in 2018. That was done.

You asked us to ensure that we would be able to reduce total expenses in the 2019 Budget, and we're happy to say that the 2019 Budget contains total expenses of \$299.8 million, which is down from over \$300 million in 2018.

And separate, but related, you wanted to make sure that we continue to reduce debt in a responsible fashion. And right now, we plan to reduce the debt in 2019 by just over \$15 million, taking our three-year total to just over \$150 million of debt reduction.

1 Those are the three key points that you 2 want you wanted us to hit on. We carried out your 3 vision. It's in this book today. Apologies to 4 those of you heard this already, I'm ready to take 5 any questions if anybody has any. SUPERVISOR SALADINO: That's one 6 7 condensed version, especially as compared to this 8 morning. 9 Who would like to start first? 10 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: To be quite 11 honest, I think the Director of Finance was very 12 thorough this morning. Answered all my questions 13 and, once again, you did a good job on this budget. 14 MR. DARIENZO: I appreciate you saying 15 that. 16 Good job or great job? 17 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Come on. 18 MR. DARIENZO: Excellent job? 19 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: We've come a 20 long way, Rob. 2.1 MR. DARIENZO: I'll take good. 22 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Fine job. 23 MR. DARIENZO: Any other synonyms? 24 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Any other 25 synonyms, did you say?

9 1 MR. DARIENZO: Yeah, better than good 2 or fine? 3 COUNCILWOMAN JOHNSON: Terrific. 4 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Humble. 5 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: We thought you were just a math guy. 6 7 Yes, Councilwoman? 8 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Thank you, 9 Supervisor. 10 Rob, I did get a question from a 11 resident in between the two sessions, and I think 12 you actually spoke to this. I think Lou asked a 13 question along these lines, but I just want to 14 clarify for the viewers at home. 15 We had an issue with the single stream 16 recycling contract this year due to situations 17 regarding the market in China, and I just wanted to 18 find out, for a second time, how the budget 19 addresses that in terms of if we're not able to 20 continue the contract that we currently have, 2.1 what's going happen, how is that going to impact 22 this budget. 23 MR. DARIENZO: The budget plans -- the 24 2019 Budget plans for the worse case scenario with 25 regards to single stream versus dual stream, if, in

10 1 fact, we go back to dual stream and we no longer 2 get paid for our recyclables, we've included a line 3 item expense in this budget, I think for \$400,000. We've included no revenues at all for 4 5 the sale of our recyclables. So if, in fact, we go back to the way it was, we have it covered. If we 6 7 do anything better than that, if single stream 8 stays in place, if we get a better price than we 9 had two years ago, then we will have a lower 10 expense and possibly a higher revenue than zero. 11 So we've planned for the worst and we 12 hope for the best. 13 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: What about the I think we sold our fleet so if we had to 14 trucks? 15 go back --16 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: In other words, if 17 we went back to dual stream, we'd have to --18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: But we can bring 19 the Commissioner back up if you'd like. 20 You're asking about the finances of the 2.1 process? 22 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Yes, exactly. 23 we had to go back to dual stream recycling and we 24 had to purchase new trucks, I guess that --25 MR. DARIENZO: We wouldn't need to

11 1 purchase new trucks. The plan -- there is a plan 2 that is being contemplated which will allow us to 3 use packers for both the pickup of municipal solid 4 waste as well as our recyclables. 5 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: So either way, it's covered within the confines of this budget? 6 7 MR. DARIENZO: Absolutely. 8 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: This spectacular 9 budget? 10 MR. DARIENZO: Spectacular, my new 11 favorite. 12 COUNCILWOMAN ALESIA: Thank you. 13 MR. DARIENZO: Thank you. 14 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Who else has 15 questions on this budget? For residents who were not here this 16 17 morning, I'm assuming it's most of you, we had a 18 very thorough budget presentation this morning. Many, many questions, they were all answered. With 19 20 a show of hands so we can gauge how much time to 2.1 spend on this, we're happy to answer your 22 questions, would residents raise their hands if 23 they're here for the budget hearing? 2.4 (No verbal response given.) 25 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. Let the

record reflect that no resident raised their hand.

COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: One in the

back.

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SUPERVISOR SALADINO: One of our employees.

Yes, and I'd be happy to answer your questions if you have them this evening or if you'd like to ask those questions on another day, we'll make sure we get those answered.

Just real quickly because I think everybody has heard me speak more than enough today. Very quickly, we have a multiple-year plan and we have saved at -- over \$10 million alone on the fact that we have reduced our capital debt, so we're saving a lot of money on interest. We had a tax cut last year. We're holding the line on taxes. We're continuing to consolidate.

Councilman Macagnone and the other members had asked for some specifics about moving toward consolidations. We're doing that as well. We've already instituted a number of consolidations. We brought the workforce number down. We've brought our payroll down. We have continued to just make sure that we've done everything properly.

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The Budget doesn't rely on any one-shots. We have underestimated revenues and overestimated expenses to do this in a very proper conservative, and quite frankly, a very detailed way. We have a multi-year plan on our Budget as well as the one-year plan.

We're continuing to work toward more increases in our bond rating. We have been meeting all of the parameters that Wall Street asked for, the parameters and the suggestions made by the State Controller and their audit. We have multiple audits going on, both internally and an external audit.

I mentioned earlier when I came here, there was over \$700 million in debt in the Town and a \$44 million deficit, ongoing deficit on the operating side. We are working very closely on this to eradicate that deficit all together on the operating side and continue to greatly reduce the capital budget, while still doing some borrowing because we realize we have to continue to pave our streets that have -- were left neglected for quite a few years, and we're working on that.

We're continuing to make changes that reduce expenses, changing out to environmentally

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sensitive LED lighting, saving a lot of money in protecting the environment and reducing our carbon blueprint. We are talking to a number of companies about solar installations that, again, will reduce our carbon footprint as well as save the Town a substantial amount of money on our electric costs.

We are making savings throughout. We continue to make the environment one of our highest priorities, whether it's here up in Oyster Bay, whether it's working with the State to remediate the Grumman Navy plume and all of the underground remediations that must take place. We have much more oversight on that, which we've pushed for with our Town Attorney's Office, with our Environmental Department. And we continue to move the Town in a way that financially recovers.

Have I covered most of the highlights?

MR. DARIENZO: That was an excellent synopsis of the budget.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All right then. Enough from me on this.

Does anyone on the Board -- any of the Council members have any questions?

COUNCILMAN HAND: No. I would just like to make reference to the fact that we have

1.5 1 special districts represented here tonight, and I 2 would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge the 3 presence of representatives from the local water districts. 4 5 Thank you for coming. MR. DARIENZO: Thank you. 6 7 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: We would like to 8 thank them. They have continued to be our partners 9 in so many ways. Those who have been around for 10 many years and those who are new, but also bringing 11 a lot of financial experience to their Boards on 12 our water districts. 13 The water districts, by State law, do 14 their bonding through the Town, as do some of the 15 fire districts, so we have a lot of 16 responsibilities, but we have great relationships 17 with our water districts, our fire districts, and 18 our special districts, and those relationships only 19 get better, so it's a pleasure to see you all here. 20 We thank you for your participation and 2.1 we thank you for your stewardship in your individual districts. 22 23 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: And I would be 24 remiss if I didn't acknowledge Councilwoman

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Alesia's birthday two days ago.

20	Well, that sums things up. I guess we
21	did a pretty good job this afternoon.
22	COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: It was thorough.
23	SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Well, thank you.
24	Hopefully, it's one of the most
25	thorough we've been on this.

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I believe, Mr. Darienzo, I thank you very much. I thank all the staff members very much. I see we have our Comptroller here, the heads of our different departments, another opportunity to say thank you. You've been asked by this administration to cut back costs and you all have been finding ways to cut back costs and bring savings.

We recognize that's very important to the forward -- to the future of this Town and you've all been very helpful to protect improve services while cutting the costs, and a big thanks especially in some of our bigger departments, are really doing -- you're all doing a great job, but DPW, amazing job in saving money on our routes, on our equipment purchases, to -- to bring uniformity.

Parks Department, without borrowing any money in 2017, you were able to rebuild many of the bathrooms and the facilities. You looked very carefully into past budgets to find unspent money so we didn't have to do any borrowing.

Our Building Department, revenues are up and projected to be up even higher because of same-day permits that we've instituted in this Town and all the other great work on speeding up the

18 process and allowing more people to get through the 1 2 permit process more quickly. 3 And, of course, with that, comes 4 increased revenue, but I've been talking enough and 5 it seems as though there are no questions for you, Mr. Darienzo. 6 7 MR. DARIENZO: I like that so, thank 8 you very much for your time. We did a good budget 9 this year, and it will be even better next year. 10 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you. 11 MR. DARIENZO: Thank you very much. 12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: May I have a motion? 13 14 COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: Any 15 correspondence, Jim? 16 MR. ALTADONNA: No correspondence. 17 COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: All right. 18 Supervisor, I'll make a motion that 19 this public hearing be closed and the decision be 20 on Tuesday, October 30, 2018. 2.1 COUNCILMAN MACAGNONE: Second. 22 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All in favor, 23 signify by saying "Aye." 24 ALL: "Aye." 25 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Those opposed,
