1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Good morning,
2 all, and welcome to the Town of Oyster Bay Town
3 Board meeting for Tuesday, October 5, 2021.

4 Good morning. Welcome, all of you, to
5 Town Hall.

6 For those joining us this morning, you
7 have the opportunity to be heard on matters brought
8 before the Town Board as well as during the public
9 comment at the end of the meeting.

10 As always, this meeting is
11 live-streamed on social media and on the Town's
12 website, oysterbaytown.com. Your voice is very
13 important to us. To submit comments online, you
14 can also e-mail publiccomment@oysterbay-ny.gov or
15 mail us at the Office of the Town Attorney,
16 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, New York 11771.

17 To lead us in prayer is our dear
18 friend, Pastor Ray, of the True Life Christian
19 Worship Center right here in Oyster Bay.

20 We began -- since we took over in this
21 Town in 2017, we begin all of our Town Board
22 meetings with prayer, and I think that's very
23 important.

24 So God bless you, Pastor, for being
25 with us today.

1 If you'd all kindly rise.

2 PASTOR RAY: Psalm 33:12 -- Blessed is
3 the nation whose God is the Lord.

4 Lord, we humbly seek you in prayer for
5 our leaders this morning, to guide the decisions of
6 this meeting with your wisdom. We also ask that
7 you would impact the direction of this Nation from
8 the bottom, up. We submit our upcoming election to
9 you, oh, God. We ask you to rid our land of this
10 virus and restore us to unity and peace among our
11 people as one Nation under God.

12 We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.

13 ALL: Amen.

14 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Pastor
15 Ray.

16 We greatly appreciate all you do for
17 us, and you are a credit to the Town, the
18 community, and to your congregation.

19 Thank you so much.

20 To lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance
21 this morning is United States Army Retired Colonel
22 Anthony Hartmann of VFW Post 3211 in Hicksville.

23 Colonel Hartmann is a resident of East
24 Norwich and served from 1979 until 2019 and was in
25 Iraq serving from 2003 until 2004.

1 Colonel, the honor is ours, and the
2 floor is yours.

3 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
4 was recited by Colonel Hartmann.)

5 COLONEL HARTMANN: Thank you, all.
6 Have a great day.

7 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you so
8 much, Colonel Hartmann for being here and for all
9 you do. We greatly appreciate it.

10 Please, everyone, take a seat.

11 Before we begin our regular duties of
12 the day, the Town Board and I take great pride in
13 recognizing two amazing student-athletes from
14 Syosset High School.

15 We are joined by Syosset High School
16 Athletic Director Drew Cronin and Track Coach
17 Nicole Hoffman. So thank you so much to Drew and
18 Nicole for joining us here this morning and for all
19 you do in support of student-athletes. They excel
20 because of your efforts and the support of their
21 parents and family.

22 So this morning, the Town of Oyster Bay
23 is very proud to honor Syosset High School senior,
24 Lilah Grubman, who is the Girls 2021 Nassau County
25 High School Class AAA High Jump Champion. That's

1 awesome.

2 (Whereupon, a round of applause
3 ensued.)

4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And Syosset High
5 School senior, Samantha Smith, who is the Girls
6 2021 Nassau County High School Class AAA Pole
7 Vaulting Champion.

8 (Whereupon, a round of applause
9 ensued.)

10 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just amazing.

11 These athletes receive so much support
12 from dedicated coaches like Nicole Hoffman as well
13 as proactive and committed school administration
14 like Athletic Director Drew Cronin and, of course,
15 their dedicated parents. Their parents, their
16 family, the community. You don't get there by
17 yourself, but, ladies, your dedication to the
18 practice, to the training -- something very special
19 is going on in Syosset to produce not one, but two
20 champions, and you are a great motivation to young
21 women and to all student-athletes because of your
22 achievements.

23 So we're very proud to honor these
24 crowning achievements. On behalf of my colleagues
25 on the Oyster Bay Town Board, we proudly join with

1 our residents to commend 2021 Nassau County High
2 School Class AAA High Jump Champion Lilah Grubman
3 and 2021 Nassau County Girls High School Class AAA
4 Pole Vaulting Champion Samantha Smith.

5 So if you could just poll vault from
6 your seat right to the front of the room, I'm going
7 to ask my colleagues in government, including Lou
8 Imbroto -- Councilman, and Councilman Tom Hand, to
9 assist us in presenting these Town Citations to
10 you.

11 Let's give them a hand.

12 (Whereupon, a round of applause
13 ensued.)

14 COUNCILMAN IMBROTO: Congratulations,
15 girls. That's amazing.

16 (Whereupon, Town Citations were
17 presented to Lilah Grubman and Samantha Smith
18 followed by a photo opportunity and a round of
19 applause.)

20 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Again, let's hear
21 it for Lilah and Samantha.

22 (Whereupon, a round of applause
23 ensued.)

24 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Folks, October we
25 celebrate and recognize many, many things in

1 October including Breast Cancer Month where we
2 encourage our loved ones to go for a mammogram or
3 screening. I'm wearing my pink. Tom Hand is
4 wearing his pink as well. Just as all of these
5 items -- just to remind you, please, ask your loved
6 ones to get a screening, get a mammogram. So
7 important, and we continue to encourage people in
8 order to save lives.

9 October is also Fire Prevention Month,
10 and my colleagues and I remind our residents to
11 practice fire safety and exit drills regularly,
12 have fire extinguishers in your home working and
13 checked, and change the batteries in your carbon
14 monoxide and smoke detectors every Fall and Spring.

15 Along the same lines, we take very
16 special pleasure in recognizing a heroic couple:
17 Antonina Barry, a resident of Massapequa Park, and
18 her gentleman friend, Daniel Shea.

19 On the afternoon of Saturday,
20 July 24th, they were setting up for a backyard
21 graduation party when they noticed that a
22 neighbor's house on Violet Street in Massapequa
23 Park was on fire.

24 Without hesitation, they raced next
25 door to alert their neighbors. Nassau County fire

1 officials said it was the quick actions of Antonina
2 and Daniel that enabled the neighbors, Joann
3 Russell and her grandsons, Ryan and James
4 Zanelotti, and the black lab called Mia, to vacate
5 the house in the nick of time, and they saved their
6 lives.

7 Almost immediately after evacuating,
8 the backyard propane tank exploded sending a fire
9 ball into the house. So this was a very, very
10 serious situation, very dangerous.

11 The enormity of the blaze required
12 firefighters -- who are our heroes -- from South
13 Farmingdale, North Massapequa, Massapequa,
14 Farmingdale, and later, mutual aid support from
15 Plainview, Wantagh, Bethpage, Hicksville, Westbury,
16 Levittown, Syosset, and two departments from
17 Suffolk to respond.

18 If that doesn't speak to how serious a
19 fire this was, so because of the decisive actions
20 of Antonina and Daniel, they are truly lifesavers.
21 Had they not responded quickly, the outcome would
22 have been tragically different.

23 So on behalf of our Town Board, and the
24 elected officials of the Town of Oyster Bay as well
25 as all of our residents, we're extremely proud to

1 publicly acknowledge and commend Antonina Rose
2 Barry and Daniel Shea for demonstrating the ability
3 to act courageously when fellow citizens are in
4 need. Please come forward --

5 (Whereupon, a round of applause
6 ensued.)

7 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: -- and I'm going
8 to ask my colleagues, including Massapequa Park
9 resident, Steve Labriola, please, if you would
10 present one of these awards, and Rich LaMarca, our
11 Town Clerk, to present this award to Dan.

12 (Whereupon, Town Citations were
13 presented to Antonina Rose Barry and Daniel Shea
14 followed by a photo opportunity and a round of
15 applause.)

16 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Curt's a
17 firefighter with the North Massapequa Fire
18 Department, and when I see his face, he's had 30
19 years of experience, and said, that was a bad fire.

20 So, your courageousness, your wit, your
21 ability to think quickly -- to think and act
22 quickly saved these lives. God bless you.

23 Let's hear it for Ms. Barry and
24 Mr. Shea.

25 (Whereupon, a round of applause

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ensued.)

1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay. If
2 Mr. LaMarca would now please poll the Board?

3 MR. LaMARCA: Supervisor Saladino?

4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Present.

5 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Johnson, I
6 think, is going to be a little late.

7 Councilman Imbroto is here, but he had
8 to step out for a few minutes.

9 Councilman Hand?

10 COUNCILMAN HAND: Present.

11 MR. LaMARCA: Councilman Labriola?

12 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Present.

13 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Maier?

14 COUNCILWOMAN MAIER: Present.

15 MR. LaMARCA: Councilwoman Walsh?

16 COUNCILWOMAN WALSH: Present.

17 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Everyone's
18 present.

19 I also want to point out -- I was
20 talking about the importance of recognizing October
21 as Breast Cancer Awareness Month, I also want to
22 point out that it is also Hispanic Heritage Month.
23 Kudos to all of our blessed friends and colleagues
24 and our residents who are Hispanic, and it is also
25 Italian Heritage Month, which coincides with

1 Columbus Day, so congratulations to all.

2 Before we get started, I want -- we, as
3 a Town Board, want to commend the work of our
4 employees and the public who participated.

5 On Sunday, the Town of Oyster Bay
6 held -- I believe it's our third car show since we
7 began the process -- it broke all records. The
8 Town of Oyster Bay, we can be very proud, has the
9 largest car show on Long Island, and one of the
10 largest on the East Coast. There were almost 1,500
11 cars participating. Many, many friends, residents,
12 neighbors, people coming out. It just was a
13 wonderful program.

14 I'd like to thank the Parks Department
15 under Commissioner Joe Pinto and his team,
16 including Andy Rothstein, and everyone who worked
17 on the car show. It was phenomenal. Kudos to all
18 of you.

19 Okay. Now, would you please call the
20 first hearing?

21 MR. LaMARCA: Today's hearing is to
22 consider the 2021 Fire Protection Agreement with
23 East Norwich Volunteer Fire Company No. 1.

24 MS. FAUGHNAN: Good morning,
25 Supervisor, Members of the Town Board.

1 Elizabeth Faughnan, Deputy Town
2 Attorney, Office of the Town Attorney.

3 I come to you this morning requesting
4 and recommending the Town Board enter into a
5 contract for fire protection with the East Norwich
6 Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 for calendar year
7 2021.

8 This is the last outstanding fire
9 protection contract that the Town enters into
10 annually, and very briefly, but for the record, as
11 you all know, throughout the Town of Oyster Bay
12 there are many fire districts with elected
13 commissioners who provide fire protection. They
14 set their own taxes, and that's how those fire
15 departments are funded.

16 In the community that we refer to as
17 East Norwich, which is actually an unincorporated
18 area in the Town of Oyster Bay with the postal
19 designation East Norwich, there is no such fire
20 district, so the New York State Town Law requires
21 that the Town Board contract for fire protection so
22 that the residents are protected in case of an
23 emergency.

24 The Town enters into an agreement with
25 East Norwich every year to provide fire protection

1 for the residents there. I will say that the East
2 Norwich Volunteer Fire Company provides fire
3 protection in four municipalities: In the Town of
4 Oyster Bay, in the Village of Upper Brookville, in
5 the Village of Muttontown, and in the Village of
6 Brookville.

7 And from time to time, the
8 municipalities review the percentages paid by each
9 municipality. So in this case, the agreement
10 amount this year is a little bit higher than in
11 past years, but that's only because the Town's
12 percentage increased as compared to the other
13 municipalities, and as reassessment occurs, those
14 numbers are looked at from time to time and
15 readjusted appropriately.

16 So at this time, the Town Attorney's
17 Office would request that the Town enter into a
18 contract agreement for \$384,450.

19 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: One quick
20 question.

21 MS. FAUGHNAN: Yes.

22 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just to reiterate
23 this to the public, this is because of State law,
24 which mandates the Town must be involved in and be
25 the representative board of these fire districts

1 for these fire companies as well as water districts
2 and so forth in terms of their bonding. This all
3 comes from State law.

4 MS. FAUGHNAN: It comes from State law,
5 Supervisor.

6 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: It's mandated by
7 the State law.

8 MS. FAUGHNAN: Correct.

9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And it doesn't
10 affect all of the taxpayers of the Town, just the
11 people who live in the designated area that
12 receives the services.

13 MS. FAUGHNAN: Correct.

14 For instance, I live in Locust Valley.
15 I pay my taxes to the Locust Valley Fire District.
16 I would not pay this cost. This only goes to the
17 residents that receive this fire protection.

18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay.

19 Wonderful, thank you.

20 MS. FAUGHNAN: Thank you, Supervisor.

21 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: I don't see
22 anyone signaling for questions, so at this time may
23 we have a motion, Councilman Hand?

24 I'm sorry. Are there any postings and
25 correspondence?

1 MR. LaMARCA: We have Affidavits of
2 Posting and Publication.

3 There is no other correspondence.

4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okay.

5 May I have a motion?

6 COUNCILMAN HAND: I make a motion to
7 accept as discussed by the attorney, and vote at
8 the end of the day.

9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: May I have a
10 second?

11 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Second.

12 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: All those in
13 favor, please signify by saying, "Aye."

14 ALL: "Aye."

15 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Those opposed,
16 "Nay."

17 (Whereupon, there were no "Nay"
18 responses from the Board.)

19 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: The "Ayes" have
20 it.

1 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Being that there
2 are no other hearings, would you please call the
3 regular Action Calendar?

4 MR. LaMARCA: May I have a motion,
5 please, to suspend the rules and add Resolution
6 Nos. 575 through 577-2021?

7 **RESOLUTION NO. 575-2021;** Resolution
8 authorizing retention of Outside Counsel in
9 connection with *South Farmingdale Water District v.*
10 *The Dow Chemical and New York American Water*
11 *Company v. The Dow Chemical.* Account No. OTA A
12 1420 44110 000 0000. (M.D. 9/28/21 #15).

13 **RESOLUTION NO. 576-2021;** Resolution
14 granting request from Americans of Pakistani
15 Heritage, Inc. for Town assistance in conducting
16 their Walk with Husayn Day Parade to be held
17 October 10, 2021, for use of parking field H-14 in
18 Hicksville and for use of various Town equipment
19 for the event. (M.D. 9/28/21 #17).

20 **RESOLUTION NO. 577-2021;** Resolution
21 ratifying the 2021 Memorandum of Agreement between
22 the Town of Oyster Bay and the CSEA. (M.D. 9/28/21

24 On the motion:

25 COUNCILMAN HAND: So moved.

1 MR. LaMARCA: Motion made by Councilman
2 Hand.

3 May I have a second?

4 COUNCILMAN LABRIOLA: Second.

5 MR. LaMARCA: Seconded by Councilman
6 Labriola.

7 On the vote:

8 Supervisor Saladino?

9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Before we begin
10 this, I am -- I do have a statement as it relates
11 to our vote on today's Calendar, to let you all
12 know that today, the Town of Oyster Bay votes to
13 forward the proposed budget for 2022 and consider
14 it at a public budget hearing scheduled for later
15 this month.

16 This is the fourth consecutive tax
17 freeze budget proposed by this administration.
18 This budget continues to sustain a \$1.3 million
19 property tax cut approved by this Town Board in
20 2018. That means, in total, \$6.5 million will be
21 back in the pockets of taxpayers rather than in the
22 coffers of government.

23 This tax freeze is, once again,
24 possible thanks to the spending restraints,
25 efficiencies, and debt reduction initiatives put in

1 place by the Town Board. The proposed budget for
2 2022 continues to pay down record amounts of Town
3 debt while enhancing the delivery of the quality
4 Town services.

5 Since first taking office, we have
6 successfully reduced the Town's debt -- capital
7 debt -- by a \$165 million net while also
8 eliminating a \$44 million multi-year deficit that
9 existed before we took office. No more deficit at
10 all in the Town, and as of now, we have the highest
11 surplus -- totaling nearly \$50 million of surplus
12 -- and that's why our bond rating continues to go
13 up.

14 Our A+ credit rating means that we
15 saved taxpayers significant money each time we bond
16 for roadway improvements, infrastructure projects,
17 even when we bond to help water districts with the
18 equipment they need to keep drinking safe water.

19 The Town of Oyster Bay is delivering
20 better services than ever before, even during the
21 COVID pandemic, and we will continue to do so. We
22 are keeping costs to, on average, \$144 per month
23 for the average homeowner, and that's less than
24 your monthly cable bill.

25 And we are very proud -- I am very

1 proud to be voting "Aye" on all of these
2 resolutions including this resolution to move the
3 proposed budget forward in the process.

9 of what we've been hearing all over our Nation
10 about a \$3.5 trillion spending plan from our
11 President and the current Congress and that they
12 are claiming that this actually will cost the
13 taxpayer zero, well, in the Town of Oyster Bay,
14 this budget plan actually costs the taxpayers zero
15 additional dollars. So there's a little bit of a
16 fact in truth when it comes forward here in our
17 local government.

18 I'm very proud of this budget. It's
19 a -- I guess you'd call it a boring budget. It's a
20 flat budget. It doesn't -- it spends what it needs
21 to spend, but it doesn't spend unnecessarily on
22 items that the public does not support, and I'm
23 sure that as they learn more about it as we go
24 forward, as the rating agencies take a look at what
25 we're doing, and as our credit rating continues to

1 improve, we, in fact, are building back better.

2 Thank you, Supervisor, and thank you,
3 all, for the administration and the team that
4 you've put together here.
