For those joining us this morning, you 6 7 have the opportunity to be heard on matters brought 8 before the Town Board as well as during the public 9 comment at the end of the meeting. 10 As always, this meeting is 11 live-streamed on social media and on the Town's 12 website, oysterbaytown.com. Your voice is very 13 important to us. To submit comments online, you 14 can also e-mail publiccomment@oysterbay-ny.gov or 15 mail us at the Office of the Town Attorney, 16 54 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, New York 11771. 17 To lead us in prayer is our dear 18 friend, Pastor Ray, of the True Life Christian 19 Worship Center right here in Oyster Bay. 20 We began -- since we took over in this 2.1 Town in 2017, we begin all of our Town Board 22 meetings with prayer, and I think that's very 23 important. 24 So God bless you, Pastor, for being 25 with us today.

3 If you'd all kindly rise. 1 2 PASTOR RAY: Psalm 33:12 -- Blessed is 3 the nation whose God is the Lord. 4 Lord, we humbly seek you in prayer for 5 our leaders this morning, to guide the decisions of this meeting with your wisdom. We also ask that 6 7 you would impact the direction of this Nation from 8 the bottom, up. We submit our upcoming election to 9 you, oh, God. We ask you to rid our land of this 10 virus and restore us to unity and peace among our 11 people as one Nation under God. 12 We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen. 13 ALL: Amen. 14 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you, Pastor 15 Ray. 16 We greatly appreciate all you do for 17 us, and you are a credit to the Town, the 18 community, and to your congregation. 19 Thank you so much. 20 To lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance 2.1 this morning is United States Army Retired Colonel 22 Anthony Hartmann of VFW Post 3211 in Hicksville. 23 Colonel Hartmann is a resident of East Norwich and served from 1979 until 2019 and was in 2.4 25 Iraq serving from 2003 until 2004.

Colonel, the honor is ours, and the 1 2 floor is yours. 3 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance 4 was recited by Colonel Hartmann.) 5 COLONEL HARTMANN: Thank you, all. 6 Have a great day. 7 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Thank you so 8 much, Colonel Hartmann for being here and for all 9 you do. We greatly appreciate it. 10 Please, everyone, take a seat. 11 Before we begin our regular duties of 12 the day, the Town Board and I take great pride in 13 recognizing two amazing student-athletes from 14 Syosset High School. 15 We are joined by Syosset High School Athletic Director Drew Cronin and Track Coach 16 17 Nicole Hoffman. So thank you so much to Drew and 18 Nicole for joining us here this morning and for all 19 you do in support of student-athletes. They excel 20 because of your efforts and the support of their 2.1 parents and family. 22 So this morning, the Town of Oyster Bay 23 is very proud to honor Syosset High School senior, 2.4 Lilah Grubman, who is the Girls 2021 Nassau County 25

High School Class AAA High Jump Champion.

5 1 awesome. 2 (Whereupon, a round of applause 3 ensued.) 4 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And Syosset High 5 School senior, Samantha Smith, who is the Girls 2021 Nassau County High School Class AAA Pole 6 7 Vaulting Champion. 8 (Whereupon, a round of applause 9 ensued.) 10 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just amazing. 11 These athletes receive so much support 12 from dedicated coaches like Nicole Hoffman as well 13 as proactive and committed school administration 14 like Athletic Director Drew Cronin and, of course, 15 their dedicated parents. Their parents, their 16 family, the community. You don't get there by 17 yourself, but, ladies, your dedication to the 18 practice, to the training -- something very special 19 is going on in Syosset to produce not one, but two 20 champions, and you are a great motivation to young 2.1 women and to all student-athletes because of your 22 achievements. 23 So we're very proud to honor these 24 crowning achievements. October including Breast Cancer Month where we encourage our loved ones to go for a mammogram or screening. I'm wearing my pink. Tom Hand is wearing his pink as well. Just as all of these items -- just to remind you, please, ask your loved ones to get a screening, get a mammogram. So important, and we continue to encourage people in order to save lives.

October is also Fire Prevention Month, and my colleagues and I remind our residents to practice fire safety and exit drills regularly, have fire extinguishers in your home working and checked, and change the batteries in your carbon monoxide and smoke detectors every Fall and Spring.

Along the same lines, we take very special pleasure in recognizing a heroic couple:

Antonina Barry, a resident of Massapequa Park, and her gentleman friend, Daniel Shea.

On the afternoon of Saturday,

July 24th, they were setting up for a backyard

graduation party when they noticed that a

neighbor's house on Violet Street in Massapequa

Park was on fire.

Without hesitation, they raced next door to alert their neighbors. Nassau County fire

officials said it was the quick actions of Antonina and Daniel that enabled the neighbors, Joann Russell and her grandsons, Ryan and James Zanelotti, and the black lab called Mia, to vacate the house in the nick of time, and they saved their lives.

Almost immediately after evacuating, the backyard propane tank exploded sending a fire ball into the house. So this was a very, very serious situation, very dangerous.

The enormity of the blaze required

firefighters -- who are our heroes -- from South

Farmingdale, North Massapequa, Massapequa,

Farmingdale, and later, mutual aid support from

Plainview, Wantagh, Bethpage, Hicksville, Westbury,

Levittown, Syosset, and two departments from

Suffolk to respond.

If that doesn't speak to how serious a fire this was, so because of the decisive actions of Antonina and Daniel, they are truly lifesavers. Had they not responded quickly, the outcome would have been tragically different.

So on behalf of our Town Board, and the elected officials of the Town of Oyster Bay as well as all of our residents, we're extremely proud to

9 publicly acknowledge and commend Antonina Rose 1 2 Barry and Daniel Shea for demonstrating the ability 3 to act courageously when fellow citizens are in need. I come to you this morning requesting and recommending the Town Board enter into a contract for fire protection with the East Norwich Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 for calendar year 2021.

This is the last outstanding fire protection contract that the Town enters into annually, and very briefly, but for the record, as you all know, throughout the Town of Oyster Bay there are many fire districts with elected commissioners who provide fire protection. They set their own taxes, and that's how those fire departments are funded.

In the community that we refer to as

East Norwich, which is actually an unincorporated

area in the Town of Oyster Bay with the postal

designation East Norwich, there is no such fire

district, so the New York State Town Law requires

that the Town Board contract for fire protection so

that the residents are protected in case of an

emergency.

The Town enters into an agreement with East Norwich every year to provide fire protection

2.1

for the residents there. I will say that the East Norwich Volunteer Fire Company provides fire protection in four municipalities: In the Town of Oyster Bay, in the Village of Upper Brookville, in the Village of Muttontown, and in the Village of Brookville.

And from time to time, the municipalities review the percentages paid by each municipality. So in this case, the agreement amount this year is a little bit higher than in past years, but that's only because the Town's percentage increased as compared to the other municipalities, and as reassessment occurs, those numbers are looked at from time to time and readjusted appropriately.

So at this time, the Town Attorney's Office would request that the Town enter into a contract agreement for \$384,450.

MS. FAUGHNAN: Yes.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Just to reiterate this to the public, this is because of State law, which mandates the Town must be involved in and be the representative board of these fire districts

for these fire companies as well as water districts 1 2 and so forth in terms of their bonding. This all 3 comes from State law. 4 MS. FAUGHNAN: It comes from State law, 5 Supervisor. 6 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: It's mandated by 7 the State law. MS. FAUGHNAN: Correct. 8 9 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: And it doesn't 10 affect all of the taxpayers of the Town, just the 11 people who live in the designated area that 12 receives the services. MS. FAUGHNAN: Correct. 13 14 For instance, I live in Locust Valley. 15 I pay my taxes to the Locust Valley Fire District. 16 I would not pay this cost. This only goes to the 17 residents that receive this fire protection. 18 SUPERVISOR SALADINO: Okav. 19 Wonderful, thank you. 20 MS. That means, in total, \$6.5 million will be 2.1 back in the pockets of taxpayers rather than in the 22 coffers of government. 23 This tax freeze is, once again, possible thanks to the spending restraints, 24 25 efficiencies, and debt reduction initiatives put in

2.1

place by the Town Board. The proposed budget for 2022 continues to pay down record amounts of Town debt while enhancing the delivery of the quality Town services.

Since first taking office, we have successfully reduced the Town's debt -- capital debt -- by a \$165 million net while also eliminating a \$44 million multi-year deficit that existed before we took office. No more deficit at all in the Town, and as of now, we have the highest surplus -- totaling nearly \$50 million of surplus -- and that's why our bond rating continues to go up.

Our A+ credit rating means that we saved taxpayers significant money each time we bond for roadway improvements, infrastructure projects, even when we bond to help water districts with the equipment they need to keep drinking safe water.

The Town of Oyster Bay is delivering better services than ever before, even during the COVID pandemic, and we will continue to do so. We are keeping costs to, on average, \$144 per month for the average homeowner, and that's less than your monthly cable bill.

And we are very proud -- I am very

5 proud to be voting "Aye" on all of these 1 2 resolutions including this resolution to move the 3 proposed budget forward in the process. 4 MR.
