Considering the recent horrific situation that happened to one of our Town member's dog, we also expect thorough medical records of any dog euthanized for non-treatable terminal illness to be maintained and easily accessible to the public. Obviously, any decision to euthanize a dog for non-treatable terminal illness should not violate New York Agriculture and Markets Law Section 117.4.

Similar to our neighboring shelter, any dog with a treatable illness should be cared for by the Town as their 1.3 million dollar budget can fund a medical treatment. Outreach to fosters is also appropriate.

We have also asked that all dogs receive at least eight months to a year of consistent training before any adverse decision is made regarding any dogs. If an animal has been hit by a car or has an incurable disease and is suffering, it is our responsibility to handle this humane service to take an animal out of its misery.
