

## PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE is hereby given that the Workforce Development Board (WDB) of the Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove Workforce Development Area (representing the Towns of Oyster Bay and North Hempstead and the City of Glen Cove) has developed a proposed Local Plan under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title I-B and Wagner-Peyser Programs. Total Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act funding for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019 is \$1,659,552, including \$479,332 for services to youth, \$709,524 for services to Dislocated Workers, and \$470,696 for services to Adults.

The proposed Plan will be submitted to the New York State Department of Labor following a statutorily mandated 30-day local public review and comment period. The proposed Plan continues the development of a One-Stop service delivery system in order to:

1. Ensure universal access to workforce development services for business and job seeker customers.
2. Prepare unemployed, underemployed, incumbent workers and youth for a high performance workplace.
3. Provide multiple levels of service and multiple access points.
4. Provide customer choice in service and service delivery.
5. Address the service requirements of special needs and target populations.
6. Establish a continuous improvement system to ensure customer satisfaction.
7. Implement a comprehensive accountability system.
8. Establish system-wide, performance-driven, outcome based measures.

The Oyster Bay-North Hempstead-Glen Cove WDB is committed to the principles of Affirmative Action and Equal Employment Opportunity and hereby reaffirms that commitment.
