## RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief, Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind specific sections of the order, dated September 2, 2021, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. **This order is effective immediately, Wednesday, September 15, 2021** and applies only to the areas described below, except as described in 6NYCRR, Part 41, "Sanitary Condition of Shellfish Lands".

**Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:**

**Towns of North Hempstead and Oyster Bay (north shore):** All the normally certified areas of Hempstead Harbor and Long Island Sound **except**; all that area of Hempstead Harbor lying east of a line extending northerly from the northernmost point of land at Prospect Point to Hempstead Harbor Buoy "2" (R N "2"), and south of a line extending easterly to Hempstead Harbor Buoy "4" (R N "4"), and west of a line extending southerly to the easternmost point of the tower on the Hempstead House (local name, local landmark) at Sands Point Preserve which will remain closed to the harvest of shellfish.

**Note:** All other areas that were designated as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish on September 2, 2021 remain closed for the harvest of shellfish.
