Commercial Permits Are Necessary If...

- I. Any construction takes place
- 2. Any exterior facade or site work (parking lots, sidewalks, etc.) is completed
- 3. There is a change in use or occupancy Note: Places of Assembly must file a new Public Assembly License Application
- 4. Any interior alterations are made to an existing building, including structural or electrical changes, plumbing or gas work, and modifications to the physical layout of equipment, displays, or appliances
- 5. A fire sprinkler, sewer, or new sign is installed
- 6. An existing sign is altered or replaced



To Obtain A Certificate Of Occupancy (CO):

Step I: Submit a completed Building Permit Application to the Department of Planning and Development. Applications are available on oysterbaytown.com by:

- a. Clicking "Resources" and Navigating to "Applications, Permits, Licenses, and Forms"
- b. Clicking "Commercial Building Permits" and "Application for Permit to Build"

Step 2: Once all fees are paid and the application review for Town of Oyster Bay Zoning Codes and New York State Building Codes is complete, the Town will issue a building permit.

Step 3: The Town will then perform building and plumbing inspections.

Additionally, a private electrician who is licensed by the Town will arrange an electrical inspection with a Town-approved outside electrical agency.

Step 4: Once the above steps are complete, a certificate of occupancy is issued, and all approvals are granted, you may call (516) 624-6380 to schedule a Grand Opening.
