On Saturday, November 4th, 2023, at approximately 7:55 p.m., Officer Lewis observed smoke and flames coming from the rear of a house at 25 West Cherry Street in Hicksville. After notifying the Town's Operations Center and requesting backup and response from the Hicksville Fire Department, Officer Lewis entered the burning building and assisted all six occupants safely out of the house. The occupants were not aware that a fire was underway in their home. And that's one of the most dangerous situations because as those of you who are in firemanics understand how quickly a problem can turn into a deadly situation when they're not even aware.

Soon afterwards, members of the Hicksville Fire Department, who are also

all heroes, arrived on the scene extinguished the fire, which caused significant damage to the house.

Those on hand noted that Officer Frank's decisive actions were life saving. Had he not responded so quickly, so skillfully, had he not cared the way he cares, the outcome would have been tragically different.

Our Town Board colleagues and I are exceedingly proud and publicly acknowledge and commend Town Public Safety Officer Frank Lewis for demonstrating an ability to act quickly, courageously, to follow the protocols, knowing exactly what to do, and doing it when fellow citizens are in dire need. These selfless and alert actions are exemplary and exceptionally worthy of the Town's highest commendation.

So, Frank, we have this Town Citation for you. Michele Johnson, our senior councilwoman, I'm going to ask you, along with all of us to make this
