Let us take this opportunity to thank them for the courage for their leadership, not only in this community, but quite frankly, around the world. They are national heroes to us because of the role that no one would want, but a role that they have embraced with strength beyond compare.

You are very special to us, but the message is most important, and we join you in making sure that every resident of the Town of Oyster Bay, resident of Nassau County, resident of America and across the world. Here's your message, a very important message that we must embrace.

The two of you and your son, Daniel, are exceptional. You're incredibly strong human beings. And please know you will

always have a love. You will have our support. You will have our commitment to join with you to protect everyone, including our Jewish residents. We will work to protect the rights of religious freedom, the rights of safety, and the pursuit of happiness for everyone, including our Jewish residents. That's been your message all along. It hasn't only been for Jewish Americans, hasn't only been for the people of Israel, but has indeed been for everyone. But we do appreciate what you mean to our nation and to the nation of Israel.

Your son was a hero, plain and simple. Your son has made sure that everyone here in America, in Israel and around the world, understands a commitment and the definition of responsibility.

So with that, please accept our thanks. It is so important for our Jewish residents to know that they have peace and safety, and they have the full right

to practice their religion, not only here at Hanukkah time, but every day of every year.

So with that, would you please step up to the microphone and take this opportunity to address us and address the residents of the Town of Oyster Bay.

MRS. NEUTRA: So we are here today to say thank you to the Town, to the town residents, to the Board.

Before that, I know many of you who know us, but just in a few words to share who we are and who our son was. We moved to the Town of Oyster Bay when our son was a year old from Queens, and it's been our home since. And our son Omer grew up here. He rode his bike on the streets. He played basketball with his friends.

Like many, many, many other children here in the town, Omer grew up within a very warm Jewish community. Both Ronen and I are descendants of Holocaust survivors on both sides. We have a very big family in Israel, and so he grew up

2 understanding the shared values between  
3 the United States and Israel and  
4 protecting democracy, protecting liberty,  
5 and making sure that the State of Israel  
6 is a strong force for the world, really,  
7 but also for the Jewish people, of  
8 course.

9 When he was 18, he felt the need to  
10 be part of this ethos and protect the  
11 Jewish state, and he became an IDF  
12 soldier and commander. And on October  
13 7th, he was one of the first to rush as a  
14 first responder to protect the border of  
15 Gaza and the different villages that were  
16 along that border. Unfortunately, the  
17 events of that day were not -- he was  
18 lost on that day. He fought and he was  
19 murdered and he was taken into Gaza and  
20 kept there for over two years. For 421  
21 days we did not know if he was alive. And  
22 we thought to return head together with  
23 the remaining 250 hostages that were  
24 taken that day. Over 1200 Israelis were  
25 murdered that day, and Omer was one of

them.

On day 421, a little bit over a year ago, on December 1st, we learned that he was killed. Up until that time, we thought we were fighting to bring it back home alive. And at that moment, our minds pivoted, and we understood that we need to make sure that not only the live hostages are returned, but also the deceased hostages, including Omer. There were many more, unfortunately. And at this point in time, thank God almost everyone has been returned. There is one hostage that has not been returned yet. He was a police officer that was also a first responder to rush and protect; that was his instinct. He was himself wounded on October 7th, and he left his hospital when he was prepping for an operation. His name was Ran Gvili. He too, unfortunately, was killed that day. And his remains are still in Gaza. And we need to make sure that his family receives the closure that we were lucky

to receive, and that he is buried with  
dignity in the land as well.

MR. NEUTRA: It's been a very tough  
two years. And this community and you,  
the leaders of this community have been  
all along among our side. We felt it. We  
felt the love. We felt the support.  
Without it, we wouldn't be able to do  
what we did. We traveled the world. We've  
been in Qatar, in Europe, over 50 times  
in Washington dozens of times in the  
White House, including lighting the  
candles just a few days ago with  
President Trump. And we really appreciate  
the standing of the United States, both  
administrations, for Israel, for the  
hostages, and making sure that people in  
the world understand that taking hostages  
is not something that should be done.  
It's not. It's against any value,  
anything that we stand for as humanity.  
We have seen tremendous support and we're  
so much more to say that we're  
appreciate.

So we just want to say thank you. In the name of our families and the name of our community, and in the name of the Israeli people and the Jewish people all

You know, in his own small circle of friends, but also his very, very active in a youth group. So many youth across the nation knew him, and he always made sure that people were seen, that kids that, you know, weren't very socially involved were brought into the fold and could experience what he was experiencing.

And in his life, we pray and hope that this community remains tolerant as it is, inclusive as it is, and a beacon to other parts in the country and in the world, for what it means to live together and be inclusive and tolerant with each other, because it's so necessary in the world (applause).

MR. NEUTRA: Is it okay if I come forward and give it to you.

SUPERVISOR SALADINO: We're going to
